Don writes: Overall, the conditions on MW appear to be improving over the past few years. Many of the signals were not as good as in September or March, but the improvement in signal strength of a few (notably Majuro, Kirabati, and Tonga) was a welcome change. Notable also were strong hets on Kwajalein, Tuvalu, Samoa (various) and 1557 - Heatwave, as the sunset occurred at the local transmitter. Hopefully the signals will improve as the sunspot cycle heads toward the lows. (Surprised to see NO het on 666.) John Bryant accuses me of "drift net dxing" as I run 8-10 receivers with MDs at the same time. More about this in a later article. ;-)

As a brief re-intro, I'm 37, and drive a delivery truck for an auto parts store here in the Big 0. The signal was surprisingly good through WDAF. I also noted XEWA 540 is now using the "W Radio" slogan in Spanish; I wonder if that's true of all stations on the XEW network. I've yet to check that out on 900. As of 11/27/02, my current totals are 759 stations logged from this QTH. 73 and good DX from Eric (NOUIH).

It's been a while since I've sent in a forum so I thought the time has come. Some news on local radio has found longtime music AM station WCWA-1270 having the adult standards format blown off in favor of more tripe talk. It was an ugly corporate decision based not on poor ratings numbers but a decision that smacks on considering its audience too old to be a viable demographic. Of course, Clear Channel's official position has been no comment, but my inside sources tell me that the standards format was an "embarrassment" to try and sell. WCWA was ranked 2nd among Toledo's AM stations, 3rd if you include Detroit's WJR, and 12th out of 24 total market survey stations, FMers included. Their ratings were in the plus 2 to just under 4 share depending on the particular period book you look at in recent years. The latest showed a 1600 AQH and 24,900 average weekly listenership. Not bad when you analyze it. I've found myself in the midst of fighting this action, taking my campaign to getting signatures on petitions to convince another station or company to take on WCWA's old format, contacting advertisers, sending out letters to newspaper editors in a 50-60 mile radius of Toledo and lining up listeners to call and write local broadcasters to urge someone to do the right thing by a large segment of disenfranchised listeners, (rce. you would be a good candidate for my "army of supporters" if you lived near Toledo, hi!) So far, I've acquired over 250 signatures representing over 20 area communities. I'm trying for 1600 to reach the WCWA average quarterly hour listenership. I may not be able to break the back of the big corporate moguls on this one but I feel a line must be drawn in the sand. Trust me none of your favorite stations is now safe; big corporate companies are only out for profit and care nothing what product they put out for the public. I'll keep you updated on this effort. I've been amazed at the response I've gotten so far to my undertaking. The WCWA change took place on 11/1/02, so I'm only 2 1/2 weeks into my petition campaign. In spite of this time consuming campaign I have gotten a few new stations in recent weeks dating back to late August, Among them have been WFAD-1490 VT, CJWI-1610 PO, WIOJ-1010 FL,, WOBM-1160 NJ, KRJO-1680 LA (My 5000th station received across the 3 band total of AM-FM-TV stations logged!), WXAM-1430 KY. The latter was by itself with WMYS Indy pest (now WNXT--rce) seemingly off, no great loss if it was off, right rce! (agreed--rce) This one was gotten in early am of both 11/3 and 11/4. Might be a good one to keep an eye out for, very good sounding with the traditional country-stands out like a sore thumb, sort of like WCWA with its standards & live jocks. Maybe that's why it had to go. Oh well, so do I, out of time & out of space, hi! 73s and have a nice Thanksgiving and holiday season ahead, and new year in case I don't get in before the palindromic 2002 ends. P.S. keep an eye out on 660 also, XEEY Aguascalientes, Mexico has been heard so loud here on occasion that I thought I had an adobe hut set up just down the road from them!
