980 KJOX WA, Selah 12/2 0722-0805 poor under CKNW with KRKT QRM. ID at top of the hour as "K-USA." Ads for Apple Valley Mortgage and Mid Valley Insurance. I had thought it might be KFWB. Thanks to Larry Godwin's DX tip a few issues ago, for clearing this up. (DP-OR)

- 1050 KMAP CA, Frazier Park 11/29 1857 Radio Disney programming, jingle ID at 1900 including local ID "AM 1050 KMAP Frazier Park – Bakersfield." New for me, after earlier tentative loggings. (NP-AB)
- KTCT CA, San Mateo 11/29 1951 ads, sports talk, ID "The Ticket 1050." Virtually vanished at 2000, so likely pattern/power change. (NP-AB)
- KTBL NM, Los Ranchos de Albuquerque 11/29 2000 call letter ID heard through KTCT and others. (NP-AB)
- 1060 KTNS CA, Oakhurst 12/1 1930 local ads, NOS tunes, ID's as "Kittens AM 1060." Happy to get this one that's new for me, as I was away when they did the recent DX test. (NP-AB)
- KBGN ID, Caldwell 12/5 1955 end of religious program, ID "At AM 1060, this is KBGN Caldwell-Boise." (NP-AB)
- 1290 KKDD CA, San Bernardino 12/6 0754 fair under KUMA and KPAY with usual Radio Disney high pitch kid talk, ID at 0800. New. (DP-OR)
- 1360 KFIV CA, Modesto 11/29 1945 ad for realty company, ID as "AM 1280 the Lighthouse and Newstalk 1360 K-Five." (NP-AB)
- 1370 KSOP UT, Salt Lake City 12/6 0831 good with news, traffic and "Utah's best country." (DP-OR)

- 1620 KSMH CA, Sacramento 11/17 0915 loud, conducting Sunday morning Catholic mass. (MS-CA)
- 1660 KTIQ CA, Merced 12/1 0900 sports talk, ID as "KTIQ Merced, The Ticket 1660." (NP-AB)

VENEZUELA: Radio Nacional de Venezuela was celebrating its 66th anniversary in August. Radio Nacional has 4 channels: on 630 kHz, Radio Nacional Informativa, with politics and other topics; on 1050 kHz, traditional music; on 91.1 MHz, an 18-hour classical music broadcast; and they are announcing the international channel on 9545 kHz (used to be

9540-gh), but this frequency is not on the air. In the early 90's, there was a project on Medium Wave, which was called "La Voz de Venezuela", a radio station with 500 kW transmitters in Paraguan=E1 (Falc=F3n State). The radio station was supposed to broadcast programmes in English, Spanish and other languages to Central America, the Caribbean and the northern part of South America. What really happened: the project was never carried out and those transmitters on 1240 kHz where used as a mere relay of 630 kHz. Nowadays, 1240 is off the air. ARMENIA: Yerevan is active on 234 kHz! Heard it with a stable signal at 1843 with 35333. // freq is 1395, but signal on it is weaker and more noisy, 22222. Song in French. Nx at 1845, mentioning Robert Kocharyan, Azerbaijan, Karabakh, etc. A long listing of locations and frequencies (including FM) read after 1850. It coninued even at 1858, when I left the frequency. A kind of DX progr, hi... (Dmitry Mezin-RUS, DXsignal Sep 23 via HCDX)

AZERBAIJAN: Acc. to a press release of the Azerbaijani Ministry of Telecommunications, the Baki transmitter on 612 kHz (50 kW) was taken out of service in July, in connection with improved FM coverage in the area. This tx used to carry AZR1. (Bernd Trutenau-LTU, mwdx e-mail reflector 8 Oct 02)

CYPRUS: Radio Sawa, the United States Government mouthpiece in Arabic, has begun testing from Cape



Greco in southeastern Cyprus on 981 kHz mediumwave. IBB Monitoring tells DXing.info that currently tests are conducted without a fixed schedule, but once completed, the transmitter will air Radio Sawa programming 24 hours a day. The new 600-kilowatt transmitter is primarily aimed at Egypt and countries of the Levant, the Eastern Mediterranean. Vladimir Titarev in Ukraine was the first DXer to pick up the station on August 27, and on August 28 it was heard as far away as Finland. A sample station ID is in the audio section: http://www.dxing.info/audio/cyprus/981_Sawa.rm The station has begun testing, from the same location as RMC Cape Greco. Picked it up here in Finland on Aug 28, best around 2112 UT, but heard already over an hour earlier, promoting its website at <http://www.ibb.gov/radiosawa/> Radio Sawa is a 24-hour, seven-day-a-week, Arabic-language service of the International Broadcasting Bureau (IBB) aimed at listeners under 30. It was launched in March 2002. Before Cyprus, Radio Sawa has already used mediumwave transmitters in Kuwait (1548 kHz) and Rhodes, Greece (1260 kHz). An additional AM transmitter in Djibouti is expected to be operational in 2003. The station is also heard on

shortwave and via Nilesat, Arabsat and Eutelsat Hotbird. Radio Sawa programming consists of a mix of Western and Arabic pop music with newscasts at 15 and 45 minutes past the hour (DXing.info, August 28, 2002 via DXLD)

In an e-mail message to me Radio Sawa say that they are going to move from 981 kHz to 990 kHz from next Tuesday. (Björn Fransson, island of Gotland, Sweden, Sept 15, hard-core-dx via DX Listening Digest)

FRANCE: Today the Toulouse transmitter on 945 switched to France Info. It no longer carries France Bleu City Radio. The frequency plan issued by Radio France is now accurate, only Paris-Villebon on 864, Strasbourg-Sélestat on 1278 kHz and the two Corsican transmitters on 1404 and 1494 remain with France Bleu. About AFN feeds: AFRTS progming is fed to Frankfurt via the Intelsat bird on 1 degrees west (this *could* be the bird IBB uses to call AOR) in Musicam format with 128 kbit/s only. (Kai Ludwig-D, BC-DX Sep 13 via MWC)

AFN Europe progming is distributed from Frankfurt to the other AFN stns via Eutelsat Hotbird, using Musicam 128 kbit/s, too, resulting in noticeable delays of txs elsewhere in Germany compared with Frankfurt 873 / 98.7. All satellite links are encrypted of course. When listening to the 98.7 outlet recently I found the audio quality of both satellite-fed and locally produced stuff remarkably low; some clips contained so much noise that one could believe they were recorded with the cheapest ghetto-blasters. (Kai Ludwig-D, BC-DX Sep 16)

IRAN: Voice of the Islamic Republic of Iran (VOIRI) observed on 1161 with a service in Arabic, //1080, 6200, etc. First noted on 7th October. The frequency 1161 is not included in a schedule of the Arabic service published on web page of IRIB/VOIRI. Maybe VOIRI installed a new more powerful transmitter? Too strong signal for 10 kW of listed power. The Arabic service on 1161 kHz heard from the beginning at 1630 until fading out at 0300, including Voice of Palestine-Voice of Palestinian Islamic Revolution which was at 1930-2030 UTC. (Robertas Petraitis, Lithuania in an email (9/10-2002) via DSWCI)

IRAQ: General Program is now a regular on 846 after RAI left the frequency. The transmitter closes down at 2325. Another Iraqi transmitter on 908.94 is audible too, despite some BBC QRM. It relays General Program too and it does not close down at 2325. WRTH lists Baghdad with 300 kW, EMWG gives no site or power. (Karel Honzik, mwdx/mwc 14 Oct)

LEBANON: A new 1MW tx was installed in May 2002 at Hamat which is between Batroun and Tripoli. It will operate on 837 (with a directional antenna) and replace the existing transmitter (100kW?) at Amchit. It was not possible to use Amchit for the higher power because of safe RF levels outside the site. The Amchit MF will close down. I think there is still a 10kW tx in Beirut (at the studio). (Bernd Trutenau, mwdx reflector 15 Oct 02)

MACEDONIA: New schedule for R Macedonia Ext Sce via new MW tx 1200 kW on 810 kHz.

MOLDOVA: Radio Pridnestrovye [Radio Dniester Region] is using a new freq - 549 instead of the previous 1467) for its broadcasts from 0800-0830 and from 2000-2030 [presumably LT] in the Russian, Ukrainian and Romanian languages. The latter two languages have returned to MW after a lengthy absence. And on 1467 kHz from 0600-2030 R Mayak from Moscow is now broadcasting. (Aleksandr Mak-UKR, VoRussia DX Klub, CRW Aug 28)

OMAN: Looks like the BBC has moved over completely to the new site at A'Seela. According to the B02 full use is being made of this facility and nothing is coming from the old Masirah Island site. Evidently the new site is using 800kW on MW and 250kW on SW. Coordinates for the new station are 59E27 and 21N57. A'Seela is located near the town of Ashkirah in the South East of Oman. The statement I made was based on looking at the info supplied by the BBC so could well be open to discussion :) . It's about time this relay was opened, it's been in the pipeline for long enough! This is the current state of BBC operations in Oman: The Masirah Island site has stopped all HF feeds and are now being dealt by the Oman Relay. Masirah Island are still transmitting MF feeds, however that is due to cease by the end of the year, and Oman will then transmit those as well. (Sean G4UCJ, HCDX 25.10.02)

SWAZILAND: Thought this info from TWR Swaziland might be interesting. We have 3 X 100 kW SW txs and 1 X 50 kW MW tx. The stn is fully automated. We receive progrming via microwave link from Manzini office 35 km away. Manzini plays out from satellite rxs, studio and computer recorded material. Info regarding the Swaziland Commercial R stn. The two SW txs are no longer on the air. Only the 50 kW MW tx. It is running on low power as the Power Supply filter capacitor blew and they have borrowed some spare, lower voltage ones that TWR had, just to get the 1377 kHz, MW tx going again. This MW tx is only on the air in the evenings and early morning. (Sean G4UCJ, hcdx Oct 8)

UKRAINE: Was surprised by the absence of Ukrainian R 1st progr on 207. Absolutely no UKR signals on 24 Sep at 1604, also nothing on 25 Sep at 0530. Due to that, in the evening 24 Sep I managed to hear Deutschlandfunk, Aholming, Germany. Another catch: at 1615 R Rossii, via Kaliningrad tx, heard on 171, with S=2, under more loud signal of Chechnya Svobodnaya. The current pattern is as follows. Since 28 Sep, only two txers from Kharkiv site are active in SW, using 7320/7410/11950/12045/13590. LW/MW stns on 549 and 207 are off-air, too. (Vyacheslav Oleinik-MDA, DXsignal Sep 25)

[11/4] Greetings! I'd like to talk about two controversial topics. First, I'm frustrated with stations that don't power down or s/off when they should. But there are two sides to this issue. On the one hand, nearby stations that do this block DX from emerging. On the other, distant stations that do this create great DX opportunities for those of us who live some distance away. So I'm trying to remain tolerant, thinking the good offsets the bad. But I made an exception with daytime KKGR-680 in Helena, in my back yard. I phoned the CE of KNBR twice and he phoned KKGR to request they stop running at night. This cleared up the problem for several weeks. But in mid-November, KKGR again began to broadcast illegally. So I phoned the manager and told him if I hear it once more after dark interfering with KNBR, I'll notify the FCC, adding that I've made tape recordings to back up my complaint. I

also called KMTX in Helena and advised the manager of KKGR's illegal operation, pointing out that businesses advertising on it after dark are taking away revenues from the legitimate operators. Hopefully this will solve the problem. The second controversy concerns club DX reporting policies. The other club I belong to asks that reports always contain some mention of material that would help others log the station, e.g., type of program, type of music, commercials, etc. It discourages tips that simply indicate the DXer heard an ID. I agree it's best to include besides-the-ID material if possible, but sometimes QRM or timing preclude hearing anything meaningful except for the ID. The point I'd like to make is that the fact a DXer is able to hear the station at all is a valuable tip, without additional detail. If Nigel Pimblett heard WTIC-CT-1080, I wouldn't care that they ran ABC News on the hour. I'd be intrigued that maybe I could log it for a new state. The other club also requests that a member report a DX tip only once per season, unless there's been a format change, etc. When I hear WQEW-NY-1560, to me it's interesting DX to share, even if I report it four times a season. The fact I report it more than once may alert others this isn't a flash-in-the-pan tip, but one that recurs with some consistency. Besides, I don't want the added burden of combing through my previous reports to the bulletin to make sure I'm not violating club policy. In conclusion, I'm happy the IRCA DXR and DXWW editors permit us to report DX without strings attached, rather than confine tips to a certain type that inhibits the sharing of helpful information. 73 and good DX.
