Bruce Portzer reports: "From former NRC member Bart Cronin, Irecently learned of the death of long time BCB DXer **Roy Millar** of Marysville, Washington. Roy passed away in September from an apparent heart attack. He had been a DXer since at least the mid 1950's, and had been a member of both the NRC and IRCA at various times. Roy had logged and verified all sorts of impressive DX, including some amazing Trans Atlantic catches during the low sunspot years of the mid-1960s From what I understand, he sent his large QSL collection off to the CPRV several years ago. I would have to rank him as one of all time greats in the hobby, especially from this part of the country."

DX Tests

Here's the results of the most recent DX tests that have been received here:

CFAN-790, Miramichi, NB - tested Sunday, January 26, 2003-Saturday, February 1, 2003 from 12:00-6am AST daily. No reports on this test received here.

WBMJ-1190, **San Juan**, **PR/WIVV-1370 Vieques**, **PR**-tested Sunday, February 2, 2003 from 12:00-2:00am AST. According to WBMJ-WIVV Operations Manager Bert Johnson, this test DID run as scheduled; but, no reports of reception for it were received here. There were, however, several reports of non-reception, such as that from **Stephen Howe** in St. Albans,

VT, Mike Battalino in Madison, NJ, Gerry Bishop in Niceville, FL, RC Watts in Louisville, KY, Steve Francis in Alcoa, TN, Tom Jasinski in Shorewood, IL, Randy Stewartin Battlefield (Springfield), MO, Mark Connelly in Billerica, MA, Les Rayburn in Helena (Birmingham), AL, Rick Kenneally in Wilton, CT, Patrick Griffith in Westminster, CO, Joe Rocchino in Cuddy (Pittsburgh), PA, Russ Edmunds in Blue Bell, PA, and Pete Taylor in Tacoma, WA

CHWO-740, Toronto, ON - tested Sunday, February 2, 2003 from 12:30-1:30am EST. This test was heard with more success. Stephen Howe in St. Albans, VT heard the test with code IDs and mentioned CHWO's signal was much stronger than the station's anniversary broadcast on 1/8/03. **Mike Battaglino** in Madison, NJ says CHWO is a bit of a pest for him, and the same was true during the test. Joe Rocchino in Cuddy, PA heard the test, but found the signal was weaker than expected, with some QRN and fading, along with a sports station. Gerry Bishop in Niceville, FL says he heard the test loud and clear - aside from some co-channel Spanish, CHWO was all there was on 740 kHz. Mike Brooker in Toronto, ON, had no problem hearing the test (naturally!), but in Alcoa, TN, Steve Francis found that CHWO's signal was mostly buried by KRMG's basketball game, but the code IDs were noted ok. RC Watts in Louisville, KY heard CHWO's test, and mentioned that the station is a regular for him. Gordon Bell, just west of Troy, NY, sent a detailed report of his reception of the CHWO test. Tom Jasinski in Shorewood. IL also heard the test, both voice and code IDs. and mentioned that CHWO was a regular for him. However, Randy Stewart in Springfield. MO mentions that while CHWO usually competes well with KRMG at his QTH, the test wasn't heard by him. Les Rayburn in Birmingham, AL, also had no luck hearing the test. **Kevin Redding** in Mesa, AZ tried for the test with no success, and it was the same for **Patrick Griffith** in Westminster. CO and **Pete Taylor** in Tacoma. WA - Pete mentions that while their was something there, it was drowned out by some noise and a strong CBX - their was a weird splatter all over. That's all for now...

FRANCE: A few weeks ago I mentioned that the 1557 transmitter in Nice would close and be replaced by one on the former Radio Monte Carlo site in Fontbonne. The new unit has now gone into operation. It is still on reduced power but will eventually operate with 150 kW. The new station is not omnidirectional like the old one. It beams its signal towards the city of Marseille. The old station will come back on for a couple of days this month when engineers make the final adjustments on the new site and will then be silentfor good. (Rémy Friess, Montbéliard, France, via mwc)

The CSA, the French radio regulatory body, has announced that it is soon to release information about the upcoming MW stations in this country. The stations concerned have already been informed that they will be awarded a license. This was not to be made public but some information has leaked already:

- There will be 30 licenses issued, six of them for the Paris area, two in Marseille, two in Strasbourg, two in Montpellier and two in Toulouse. Other cities will receive a single license. There is no mention yet of stations getting access to the air in more than one area (Ciel AM and RMC Info, among others, have asked for several outlets).
- Among the new licenses will be some high power stations (the powers mentioned are radiated power, not transmitter power): Nice will receive a 2.6 MWatt station. A station in Marseille and another in Strasbourg will be allowed 1 MWatt. The stations in Paris will get 5 kW, but the CSA is looking into the possibility of granting 10 kW.
- Here is the frequency plan. The country is divided into five areas.
- 1. The Paris area: Six channels with 5 kW each, with a possibility of 10 kW daytime if the CSA gets clearance from the ITU. The channels are: 981, 999, 1062, 1080, 1314, 1575.
- 2. The Rennes area: Brest 1485 (1 kW), Nantes 1584 (1 kW), Brest or SaintBrieuc, or Rennes or Lorient: 1071 (160 kW)
- 3. The Toulouse area: Montpellier 1071 (300 kW), 1584 (1 kW); Nimes 1602 (1 kW); Perpignan 1584 (1 kW); Toulouse 1161 (160 kW), 1485 (1kW)
- 4. The Nancy area: Metz 1584 (1 kW); Mulhouse 1584 (1 kW); Nancy 1485 (1 kW), 1350 (160 kW); Reims 1485 (1 kW); Strasbourg 1584 (1 kW), 1161 (1 MW, 63 kW at 90°130°)
- 5. The Marseille area: Ajaccio 1161 (20 kW); Bastia 1071 (20 kW); Marseille 675 (1000 kW), 1485 (1 kW); Nice 1350 $(2.5 \text{ MW}, 300 \text{ kW} \text{ at } 220\text{-}230^\circ, 100 \text{ kW} \text{ at } 80\text{-}100^\circ)$; Toulon 1584 (1 kW)

All outlets on a given high power channel will carry the same program. This plan reflects almost exactly the situation we had before France Inter left the MW band. Only the low-powered stations are new.

Whether they will find applicants for the big boys is another story. For instance RMC Info would certainly like to use 160~kW on 1071 in Rennes or 1161 in Strasbourg or 1350 in Nancy... But if they apply for 1071 they will also have to use it in Bastia and in Montpellier, which are already served by the LW transmitter, if they take 1161 they will also have to use it in Toulouse, also served on LW and FM, if they take 1350 in Nancy they will have to use the 2.6~kW station in Nice, which duplicates the LW transmitter exactly...

Also, and strangely enough, two channel that might have been used, 963 in Paris and 585 in Marseille have not been awarded. The original plan mentionned 30 channelsand not 28, so I guess these might be added...

Anyway, don't expect anything on the air before next summer at the earliest... This leaves you harcore DXers plenty of time to hunt for stations on the newly awarded frequencies, and me time to think about which of the 6 presets on my car radio to reassign to the new programs... ;-) (Remy Freiss, mwc)

ITALY: Radio Speranza, a religious station, is currently broadcasting on the local transmitter on 1494 with a very good signal. It is located between Bologna and Modena. (mwc)

LITHUANIA: On 19 Dec, the transmitting centre in Sitkunai conducted a second test transmission on 1557 (150 kW, ND) in cooperation with Radio Baltic Waves International (Vilnius), in order to determine the coverage area. The program aired was a Chinese language broadcast of China Radio International at 1800-2000. Current relay schedule of Vilnius 612, provided by Baltijos bangu radijas (Radio Baltic Waves):Daily in Belarusian: 0400-0600* & 1400-2200* R.Svaboda (RL), 2200-2230 R.Polonia. Other relays: Sat 0600-0700 Fundamental Broadcasting Network in English, Sat 2230-2300 Universal Life in English. Power: 50 kW, except *)100 kW.

NAMIBIA: The AM frequency 594 (Tsumeb) is not in use any more. (Markus Weidner, currently in Namibia, as published in the German ML ADX via Willi Passmann, DXLD)

SVALBARD: NRK days are numbered? There seems to be some uncertainty regarding the future of the NRK Svalbard transmitter in Longyearbyen, 1485. NRK primarily wants to



close this 1 kW outlet, but the local communities have objected to this. The original decision to close on January 1, 2003 now seems to have been postponed while the operator, Norkring, calculates the costs of upgrading the transmitter mast. NRK Ingøy 153 does cover the western and southern parts of Svalbard. The rest of the Svalbard archipelago does not receive Ingøy well, and RFI problems in the

Longyearbyen center also prohibit reception of Ingøy. However, the major Svalbard communities do have satellite-fed FM relays of the NRK networks. NRK Svalbard mostly relays NRK P1 programming, including the local service from NRK Troms. During the winter night, NRK Svalbard is often heard with good strength in Scandinavian locations north of the Arctic Circle, especially on the shores of Arctic Norway. At 78 degrees North, NRK Svalbard is probably the northernmost ordinary broadcast station in the world. UNITED ARAB EMIRATES: Radio Farda - a new Persian-language radio station aimed at the broad mass of people under 30 in Iran - began broadcasting in Dec 2002, the Broadcasting Board of Governors (BBG) has announced. Radio Farda will complement the VOA's existing Farsi service on shortwave, which has a strong following in Iran. Radio Farda will be broadcast on medium wave (AM) as well as on shortwave, digital audio satellite and by the Internet. (BBG Press Release via MWC e-mail news 29.11.2002)

R Farda 1539. I listened to 1539 early this morning and was able to sort out R Farda from the Sp stn. R Farda was on 1539.08, so most likely they are using the Sharjah facility, at least for the time being. (Olle Alm-SWE, BC-DX Dec 22)

Ras Al Khaimah R is about to switch on a new tx. Crown Prince Sheikh Khalid bin Sagr Al Qasimi has already officially opened the new stn at Al Jazerah Al Hamrah, but it will not come into operation until 11 January. Ras Al Khaimah R will be off the air on 9 and 10 Jan. The move to a new tx location was necessary due to concerns for the health of girls at a school near the old site. The 200 kW tx operates on 1152. At the inauguration ceremony, the Crown Prince revealed that being hours will be increased to almost 22 per day, but the stn will no longer be non-Arabic progrmes such as Hindi, Urdu and Malayalam. Sheikh Khalid said he will personally chair the weekly meetings of the board and implement new ideas. "I will dedicate one day a week to spend at Ras Al Khaimah R to monitor progrmes," he said. ({c} RNWMN NL 31 Dec)

There is a radio stn called Radio Asia in Ras Al Khaimah, one of the seven emirates that constitute the UAE, that has been being in Malayalam lang from 11am to 4pm local time (4 hrs) on 1152 MW. The stn has now annd that it will be in Malayalam 24 hrs a day beginning at 6am on 1st Jan 2003 on 1575 MW. It claims that it will be the first radio stn in the world to be in this lang round the clock. (P. Sreevalsan Nair, DX_india Dec 30) Radio Asia noted on 1575 with Malayalam songs around 2300 UT on 3 Jan and following days. This station moved to this frequency from 1152 on January 1, 2003 and is broadcasting 24 hours in Malayalam which by the way is my mother tongue. There are lot of expatriates speaking this language in the Middle East. Malayalam is the mother tongue of the people of the Kerala state in South India (Jose Jacob, Hyderabad, DXLD)

UKRAINE: On 15 Nov the transmitting centre in Kopani (near Mykolaiv) was reactivated on shortwaves; at the same time also the MW transmitter on 1431 (500 kW) was again put into use for relaying Voice of Russia, a.o. in Russian and Arabic. (Bernd Trutenau via MWDX 15.11.2002) Updated schedule of Voice of Russia broadcasts via Ukrainian MW facilities: 936 - 1500-2000 Sodruzhestvo; 2000-2100 VoR Russian; 972 and 1278 - 1400-2000 Sodruzhestvo. (Alexander Yegorov-UKR, RUI Nov 20) 549 in Kyiv is silent. Transmitter in Brovary on 207 is active since 6 Nov, but uses 50% power of 250 kW only. (Alexander Yegorov 20.1.2002 via MWC e-mail news 29.11.2002) 936 and 972 carry Sodruzhestvo sce by the VoRussia already at 1200. Probably the same could be observed on 1278, but transmitting power is lower on the latter, and it doesn't propagate to Kviv so early. At 1300 VoRussia WS in Russian is bc on 936, 972, 1278 - all acc to the schedule (Bernd Trutenau-LTU. 8 Dec)

UKOGBANI (Isle of Man): The long awaited 279 radio station licensed in the Isle of Man, has finally had the last hurdles overcome, which has prevented the station from setting up its proposed transmission site The High Court has dismissed the Petition of Doleance brought by the Bride Commissioners against the Department of Transport's award of a Siting Licence for the long wave transmission facility in Ramsey Bay.

The Petition raised seven objections to the licence, most of which were dramatically withdrawn halfway through the court hearing. The Department of Transport as landlords of the seabed are responsible for all activities taking place on or over it and the Bride Commissioners claimed they ought to have been consulted, as the platform will be only four Kilometres from their coastline. "It's good news for Ramsey and good news for the Island," said Paul Rusling, the project's founder. "We can at

last get on with building the facility and get the radio station on the air, hopefully during the Summer." (from www.ukradio.com, via John Williams, mwc)
