Pat Martin of Seaside, OR. passes on the following info re status of KVAN-1550 Vancouver, WA call change to KKAD, and status of KTFH-1680 Seattle, WA:

(From **Don Kaskey** of San Francisco, CA):

Putsying around with Radio Locator I clicked on KVAN-1550-Vancouver WA's website. What came up was 'Advice Radio KKAD-1550'...... Question? Has KVAN changed calls to KKAD? I'll have to listen later tonight.

(Pat answers:) I just checked. No KTFH on 1680 and 1550 is still KVAN. Why they would change from the historic calls I'll never know? KVAN used to be a 1 KWer on 910 in the 50s. The station changed to KISN. The calls went to 1480 and were there for a few years. Then in the 70s they ended up on 1550.

(**Bruce Portzer** of Seattle, WA. adds an input): A few seconds ago, I caught their legal ID and it was still KVAN. They even used the slogan K-Van. No mention of Advice Radio or KKAD at the ToH Maybe a change is coming. A search for KKAD on 100000watts.com came up empty.

(Rich Toebe of Davis, CA. adds more on the subject): I checked the Portland Radio Message Board (www.pdxradio.com), where someone asked about the KKAD calls situation-- the reply was that if you check the FCC Call Sign Query, the call change was effective 3/25. Someone should tell the station...

(And Pat adds his comments): If this is true, it is news to me.

(Update from Pat): I noticed this morning (4/14) that KVAN is indeed KKAD now "Advice Radio KKAD" is the slogan. 1680 is still running SS music testing stage I guess. They are on today again.

"Welcome to our sister station, The Ticket 1050, which will be known as KNBR 1050 from now on, making us truly - The Sports Leader. Why have we done this? Greetings to all IRCA members across the fruited plains (w/apologies to Rush Limbaugh! hi!). Let me begin with a hello to Gary Larson. My last lament in this Forum resulted in recordings and a letter from him "out of the blue". As a result, we have begun a casual exchange of brief remarks and cassette recordings. I have enjoyed the "west coast sound" and hope he has enjoyed my return submissions. Richard, as far as the war coverage was concerned, my local news/talk station, WSB AM 750, carried a lot of CNN audio plus

updates every 15 minutes. The local talkers, Neal Boortz, Clark Howard, Royal Marshall (all on WSB) covered the war from all talk perspectives. I also relied on Shaun Hannity (also on WSB), the "Godfather" (i.e., Rush) to balance out the more liberal CNN coverage. By far, the big "winner" on war coverage goes to Fox News Network. With Direct TV, I could and did watch it for hours on end. I haven't heard Fox News Radio anywhere here. Don't know if they have any Atlanta outlet. WGST AM 640 was heavily into ABC news, with a nightly special at 1900-2000 ELT. After recent revelations, I think there may be a move away from CNN Radio News towards Fox News Radio. I plan to contact Ms. Candace Pressley at Cox/WSB in Atlanta to suggest a change from CNN News to Fox News. WSB format is conservative - perhaps they need a less liberal news affiliation? The lack of oldies on AM has been solved somewhat. First, I found out that the FM on my stereo was damaged by a near-miss lightning strike. So, I piggy-backed another small boombox to the video input of the stereo. Better, but noisy. A 50' wire out to a mte - problem solved. Now I can choose from three stations. Of interest to DXers is "Cool 105.7" WMXV in Canton, GA. Ex-WGST FM, owned by Clear Channel (also owns WGST, et al). They are "teasing" Cox Radio, who owns ex-WFOX 97.1, now "97 Jams" for abandoning oldies fans for more UC, rap and dance music. "Cool 105.7" has same sound as WFOX. Using a PC sound card for SSB/CW/AM demodulation

If you've been in the market for a receiver in recent years, or have just been dreaming about it, you're aware that a number of the more expensive units extol the virtues of Digital Signal Processing (DSP). This is simply the use of computer algorithms to perform functions, such as bandpass filtering, which have formerly been taken care of by analog circuits. In such receivers, the analog signal is sampled at some point in the signal path, usually later on in the IF strip, and converted to digital data, whereupon a dedicated DSP microprocessor performs various computations on the data which can filter it and demodulate it to baseband (what we in the real world would regard as equivalent to an audio signal). Then the processed data is converted back to audio, so that we can actually listen to it. The advantage of DSP is that simply by changing variables in a program, you can obtain a greater number of functions, such as different filter bandwidths, than you could ever afford to do using hardware. A programmer employed by the manufacturer figures out ways that you can control those variables without your knowing anything about DSP.

The TenTec RX-320 is an example of a receiver which uses DSP to perform many of its functions, and it isn't too expensive, but some of the stand alone receivers with DSP are quite pricey. However, you don't have to break the bank to experiment with DSP, though you will need some technical skills, and some familiarity with the generic mixer and volume controls for your PC sound card.

Until fairly recently, dedicated DSP microprocessors were the only way to perform real-time DSP on any but the slowest digitized signals. Ordinary computers would not have been fast enough, especially as the PC processor is not optimized for the "multiply and accumulate" instructions needed for DSP. However, even the cheapest new computer boasts clock speeds well in excess of 1 GHz, so, in fact, a "normal" PC can easily perform near real time DSP instructions on data which is derived from well above audio frequencies. In addition, the standard computer is equipped with a sound card that includes an analog to digital converter for incoming signals of up to 22 kHz and a digital to analog converter with a similar frequency range. Combine that with a reasonably fast computer, and you already have the makings of your own DSP system.

What you need is the software to make your computer and its sound card act like a DSP enhanced receiver. If you go to http://www.detomasi.it/en/project.html you will find exactly this software, namely "IFDSP", as well as details on its implementation and use. It is free of charge and its developer, Italian radio amateur Vittorio De Tomasi, IK2CZL, is interested in getting comments from users. The software itself is quite painless to operate, but you will need to have the technical ability to build some hardware to make it work.

Although the software uses the PC sound card, it does not perform its processing on a demodulated audio signal from the receiver. Rather, the input to the sound card is at an intermediate frequency (IF); it replaces the receiver's detectors and adds to the receiver IF functions. There are two problems. First, the IF of most receivers is is likely to be 455 kHz




Figure 1 -- the IFDSP control panel

or even higher, but a sound card functions only up to 22 kHz. The user must provide a new IF signal of 10 to 18 kHz; fortunately, Vittorio provides a diagram on his web site for a simple circuit to convert your receiver's IF down to an IF suitable for input to a sound card. Secondly, most receivers do not provide an IF output on the back panel. If yours does, you are in business, otherwise, you will need the confidence (or a technically astute friend) to get inside your receiver and create a buffered 100 mV output from its IF stage.

Figure 1 shows the software's control panel. As Vittorio describes on his web site, the software provides:

- a level meter for measuring the IF signal level with 1 dB accuracy and 100 dB of range.
- an AGC control with three different time constants
- a volume control
- two buttons for starting/stopping/exiting the program
- a mode selector: AM is demodulated using a true square law detector, while the SSB and CW modes use a product detector. ECSS is "enhanced carrier selectable sideband", for superior demodulation of AM signals. When ECSS mode is selected, a self-synchronized notch is also inserted, which takes care of removing any interfering carrier(s) present on the frequency you are receiving.
- a BFO control allows adjustment of the BFO frequency with a resolution of 1 Hz
- a bandwidth control changes the selectivity of a group of cascaded filters from a minimum of 10 to a maximum of 6000 Hz. This bandwidth is continually tunable; these are not discrete steps.
- an IF Shift control allows the user to detune the filter center frequency, and enhance signals present in one or other of the sidebands.
- an indicator shows you how much CPU time your PC is using for DSP functions

To hear the output audio from this program, you use headphones or amplified speakers connected to the audio output jack of your sound card.

Vittorio occasionally comes to British Columbia on business trips, and on his last visit a few months ago, I was fortunate enough to get together with him and try out his software using the 455 kHz outputs from an AOR AR-7030 receiver, as well as from my homebrew receiver. Although I have mentioned fast PCs in connection with running this software, Vittorio runs it on a laptop with a 166MHz Pentium and Windows 95; it runs even more easily on faster PCs. Although he prefers to run the IF signal to the line input of the sound card, we were able to make it run successfully on the microphone input of a laptop which lacked a line input. One just has to be careful not to overdrive the sound card input with too much signal, and to be assured that there is no DC voltage provided by the microphone input, as that could damage the converter.

Although this software is a work in progress, the results were quite impressive. We were able to get at least as good quality audio from the software as the receivers alone provided, and on signals that were bothered by noise or interference, we were able to use the flexible controls to occasionally tease a bit more readability out than that of which the receiver alone was capable.

If you don't have IF shift or passband tuning on your receiver, find that you would like more IF bandwidths than your receiver provides, or an accurate signal strength meter, this may be a way for you to inexpensively add these functions to your present receiving setup. Vittorio is interested in improving the "IFDSP", as he points out that he is only using a fraction of the PC processing power available to him to provide the present features. Although he is planning on improving the shape factors of the present IF filters, the really interesting future development will be in providing superior demodulation schemes to that which we are used to in our present receivers. This may allow us to hear signals that are presently unreadable due to noise and interference.
