WTMT 620 Louisville KY drops ESPN sports for regional Mexican as "La Buena.".

WDAF 610 Kansas City requests new calls for its soon-to-launch sports format: KCSP. (The WDAF calls and country format live on at 106.5 Liberty MO.).

WSVG 790 Mount Jackson VA signed back on with standards (partially simulcast with WAMM 1230 Woodstock VA); WSVG had been silent since last November.

KSZL 1230 Barstow is dropping standards for CNN Headline News.

KTMP 1340 Heber City UT flips from oldies to classic country.

WBJX 1460 Racine WI is off the air after vandals toppled the station's tower sometime early Monday morning. The Regional Mexican station hopes to be back on the air at low power by the end of the week (8/27/03-ye ed.).

KTLK 620 Portland OR becomes KPOJ with its new oldies format; KIST 1340 Santa Barbara CA takes the KTLK calls.

KKGT 1150 Portland OR is being sold to Amador Bustos; applies for new calls KRMZ to match its "Romantica" format.

WCOJ 1420 Coatesville PA owner Lloyd Roach has formed a new company called "Route 81 Broadcasting," which he's launching by acquiring stations up and down (and nearby) the Interstate highway through eastern Pennsylvania and central New York: WNAK 730 Nanticoke PA, WKJN 1440/WCWI 94.3 Carbondale PA, WAZL 1490 Hazleton PA, WHYL 960 Carlisle PA, WENY 1230/WENY-FM 92.7 Elmira NY, WCBA 1350/WCLI 1450/WCBA-FM 98.7 Corning NY and WGMM 97.7 Big Flats NY. WNAK comes from Seven-Thirty

Broadcasters, the other Pennsylvania stations from Citadel (thinning that company's huge Scranton/Wilkes-Barre cluster considerably) and the New York stations from Eolin.

KSEO 750 Durant OK drops oldies to join the KREF sports network.

WCOL 1230 Columbus OH is coming back to life. The one-time top 40 giant has gone through a series of calls and formats, most recently doing talk and sports as WZNW; it relaunches this afternoon with the WCOL calls and an oldies format similar to Clear Channel's WSAI 1530 Cincinnati and KTLK 620 Portland OR.

WPLC 1050 Silver Spring MD/Washington DC drops Genesis talk for business talk.

WNTF 1580 Bithlo FL returns to the air, simulcasting the Spanish programming of WLAA 1680 Winter Garden FL.



WPHT 1210 Philadelphia will drop Don Imus from mornings next month (Sept.-ye ed), moving Michael Smerconish from afternoons to morning drive and opening a potential live clearance for Sean Hannity there. Imus moves to WWDB 860 Philadelphia.

WGEE 970 Superior WI/Duluth MN completes the format merry-go-round there, dropping most of its hot talk (except "Loveline") for the ESPN sports

displaced from sister WDSM 710 when it picked up the talk programming bumped from WEBC 560 when it went sports.

KCUV 1510 Littleton CO flips to satellite standards from talk // KNRC 1150; this is a temporary format as KNRC attempts to sell the 1510 facility where its format started before moving to 1150.

WDSM 710 Superior WI/Duluth MN flips from sports to talk, adding Rush Limbaugh and several other shows displaced in last month's WEBC 560 Duluth flip from news to KFAN-sports.

WULM 1600 Springfield OH drops much of its talk programming for R&B oldies as "Classic Rock & Soul."

Progress report on Enid's new x-bander on 1640 KMKZ from owner Hiram Champlin, Chisholm Trail Broadcasting, Aug 13: The site has been moved to some 8 miles east of

Hennessey on Highway 51, two towers, directional. Should cover OKC as well as Enid with lobes in both directions. This is between Enid and OKC, but not as far toward OKC as the same company's 96.9 FM which was moved from Enid to west of Crescent. Concrete is being poured, the transmitter and phasing unit have been ordered. Programming format has not yet been decided. If all goes well, hopes to be on the air by the end of September; the renewed CP expires in December. (PM-OR)

KPLS Goes From Right to Spanish (August 29, 2003) Orange County's KPLS (830 AM), the home to Don Imus and George Putnam, is being sold to a new Hispanic radio network, according to

a report at NewsMax.com. Subject to federal approval, the 50,000-watt station will be purchased by L.A.-based RadioVisa LLC. Radio Visa is headed by Stephen Lehman, who

founded Premiere Networks - the home of talk radio giants Rush Limbaugh and

Dr. Laura Schlesinger. The mostly bartered and conservative talk station is being sold by the Catholic Radio Network, which once planned to use KPLS as the anchor station for its defunct Catholic Family Radio Network. The sale price for KPLS is reported to be \$38 million. (DG-CA and DG2-CA)

According to this item from Northwest Broadcasters CKBL-1150 Kelowna has dropped C&W and reverted back to CKFR with Oldies. (DS-BC)

GRAYLAND DXPEDITION LOGS (Part - 1) John Bryant Thursday-Sunday, September 4-7

Don Nelson and I were able to schedule a brief DXpedition at our favorite Grayland DXpedition site for the first weekend after the American Labor Day holiday. This was my first time DXing at Grayland in early September and I was curious as to whether wed experience the summer-time Down Under propagation, or the Fall circuits to East Asia or, more likely, some combination of the two. As it turned out, our time there was spent mostly monitoring the edges of East Asia, with just a sprinkling of DUs appearing just at band fade, usually 30 minutes after full dawn at Grayland.

One of the main highlights of the trip was catching KTWG. Agana, Guam just at their signoff (first spotted by Don who also managed Agana's KGUM. As the weekend unfolded, the propagation spotlight seemed to slowly drift eastward, with conditions to Japan and Korea improving nightly. A second highlight for me was hearing three new stations in South Korea.

Signal levels in general seemed to have increased significantly over those suffered through for the past two years or so. It was very nice to, once again, be amazed at some of the dawn enhanced signal levels, even on 10 KW commercial stations from Japan. This augurs well for the Fall Season and beyond.

A final and less welcome highlight was experiencing an encampment of The John Wayne Society in the field just to our south. There were at least as many horses as people, with attendant flies and a distinct ambience, especially when the breezes were from the south. Yee-Haw!

WIOK simulcasts much of its daytime programming on WYGH-1440 (Central Kentucky Gospel) of Paris, KY. Damage estimated to be \$40-50,000. They blame it on an attack by Satan. (Could be!)
