Mike Stonebridge from Alberta writes "A short, but tantalizing opening to Europe. Most signals were very poor, but some were strong enough to put good hets on adjacent domestics. Strangely, Norway 1314 was absent as were the longwave Euros. Several catches were revisits, but the sesson did produce one new one."

- 747 UNID, 9/15 at 0314 UTC Man talking in what could have been FF. Nothing listed for France on this frequency, but there is one in Holland which is next door, so to speak. Poor. (MS-AB)
- 756 UNID, 9/15 0320 man and woman talking in what could have been FF. Very poor (MS-AB)
- 774 **UNID**, 9/15 0321 woman talking in unknown language. (MS-AB)
