PLEASE NOTE: Even if you don't hear a test, be sure and drop a card, letter, or e-mail to the station personnel, thanking them for going to the trouble to run a test!

Saturday, December 20, 2003 - WMOX-1010, Meridian, MS will conduct a DX test from 12:00 am - 1:00 am CST (UTC 0600-0700). The test will include Morse code IDs. Also, the code will be played 12:04am-12:06am, 12:30am-12:34am and 12:58am - 1:00am. Between the code breaks, the regularly scheduled program, "Coast to Coast AM", will be broadcast. Also, between the code breaks, local operator Jim Myrick will verbally identify himself and WMOX AM 1010 at various times, as in "This is Jim Myrick and you are listening to AM 1010 WMOX Meridian, Mississippi". WMOX is scheduled to broadcast at 10 kW during the test.

PAN-AMERICAN DX ROUNDUP

A few weeks ago an illegal pirate radio station west on the air from Tijuana. They were located at 550 khz, which destroyed the listenership to K-SURF at 540 KHZ. The mexican government has now taken them off the air (They moved to 560 PM). Saul Levine, owner and GM of 540 Tijuana "We're back to normal again. This hurt us because we were doing a tremendous job with 2/3s of the audience of Clear Channels KPOP San Diego. People in LA were using 540 as fill-in in areas where 1260 was not strong. And we've just totally lost that. It has been a tremendous burden, but fortunately they've been taken off the air (But moved to 560.PM). 540 is back and now heard all over the Southland. We're just very grateful that the Mexican government moved in and stopped this", reported by Saul Levine. (This was sent to me by Jim Hilliker-CA)

- t550 **MEXICO**, Tecate, BCN XEKT, 11/24 1039 UTC, Romantica and Mexi-pops underneath or level with KMVI, faded out at 1044 and returned at 1045. Thought I heard C&W mx at 1053 (KUZZ?). Poor to very poor. Loggings in DX onitor Nov 29 point to XEKT (5P-HI) (Dale, you caught them before they moved to 560. PM)
- 560 **MEXICO**, Tecate, BCN XEKT, 12/13 at 0100 UTC with ID "Radio Romantica" and other slogans including call ID "XEKT" in SS, mentions of Tijuana Tecate and San Diego in ID. Totally wiping out KSFO at times. I heard there was an old CP for Tijuana on 560 that was never built. So I wonder if this is the permanent spot for XEKT. I am sure KLBU and KSFO sure don't like it. KSFO no longer has a decent signal here in the NW. Generally it is a total mix of the two making neither good, but sometimes it is all XEKT. (PM-OR)

Frank Merrill joins us this issue with a slew of XE loggings and Nick Hall-Patch reports in to us from the Atlantic Ocean aboard the R/V Oceanus. Ahoy mates!

*** TRANS-ATLANTIC DX ***

- 162 **FRANCE** Allouis, DEC 4 2054 - Audio traces here already, definite FF talk by 2106; no TA carriers on MW. This had no more audio by 2131. Also heard 0207 Dec 04 w/FF talk, fair; only LW broadcaster at this time. Heard again 0150 Dec 5. [NHP - 41N 76W]
- 207 **MOROCCO** RTM A, Azilal, DEC 5 0239 - Poor signal u/"CL" beacon w/Arabic singing [NHP - 41N 76W]
- 531 **ALGERIA (t)** Ain-El-Beida, DEC 3 0306 – Likely Algeria with woman talking way down in local noise. [NHP - 41N 76W]
- 684 **SPAIN** RNE 1, Sevilla, DEC 5 0314 – Fair strength w. man in SS o/u splatter. [NHP - 41N 76W]
- 855 **SPAIN** RNE 1 synchros, DEC 5 0318 – weak in splatter, but SS talk readable. [NHP - 41N 76W]
- 1521 **SAUDI ARABIA (t)** BSKSA, Duba, DEC 4 2152 – man in AA chant briefly in splatter. Also noted chanting poor in splatter 0322 Dec 5. [NHP - 41N 76W]

*** PAN-AMERICAN DX ***

- 530 **TURKS & CAICOS** R. Vision Cristiana, DEC 3 2110 – SS talk, fair to good, mentions of Cristiana. This one was audible during the day (e.g. 1633 Dec 3), though fighting with a TIS or two. [NHP - 41N 76W]
- 690 **MEXICO** XEN, Cd. de Mexico, DF, DEC 8 0804 – noted with full legal ID, trying for XEMA. [Merrill-IL]
- 720 **MEXICO** XEDE, Saltillo, Coah., NOV 30 0908 – full legal ID (address, power, etc. – typical in Mexico). “Desde Saltillo, transmite... XEDE...” noted atop KSAH with WGN off. Looged “barefoot” on GE Superadio. [Merrill-IL]
- 750 **MEXICO** XERASA, San Luis Potosi, SLP, DEC 1 0115 – ad for free fair or festival in SLP, with local phone #'s given – quickly faded to nil. [Merrill-IL]
- 900 **MEXICO** XEWB, Veracruz, Ver., DEC 8 0300 – strong “echo” on XEW noted now and for much of the next few hours, and another XE under there w/ rancharo (domestic or XEOK?) [Merrill-IL]
- 1090 **MEXICO** XEMCA, Panuco, Ver., DEC 8 0220 – no slogan heard, only “10-90 MCA” between canciones. Quite strong but amazingly fast fade. Aurora ate mega-pest KAAY. [Merrill-IL]
- 1130 **MEXICO** Radio Lobo, XETOL, Toluca, Edo. Mex., DEC 1 0310 – quite strong with “Radio Lobo” jingle. This one, from a fairly rare Mexican state, should be widely heard where 1130 is available. KWKH totally eaten by aurora. Reporting this one in GMT is a drag, as it doesn't show up as an 1130 logging on 11/30, hi. [Merrill-IL]
- 1170 **MEXICO** XERT, Reynosa, Tamps., DEC 8 0150 – very strong, Tamps. Mention then McAllen ad in EG, full XERT legal ad in SP then back to Killer Bee's hockey in EG. Yes, *hockey* on a Mexican *daytimer* in *English*! I swear I'm not making this up. This should even get to WI and Winnipeg in good aurora. [Merrill-IL]
- 1250 **MEXICO** XESJ, Saltillo, Coah., DEC 1 0052 – a mere “XESJ” in SP between 2 tropical songs, no slogan given. Not in for very long. I never logged anything from Saltillo in 43 years of DX'ing (except on FM/TV), then I hear 2 of them on the same date (in Maccomb)! GMT reporting splits the date on this and XEDE-720. [Merrill-IL]
- 1290 **MEXICO** XEDA, Cd. de Mexico, DF, DEC 8 0339 – with “Radio Trece” slogan and the phone #. First time logged from anywhere, though this may be my nightly 1290

dominant on the 205° wire. One to look for if your 1290 is available, even up north (is Winnipeg off?) [Merrill-IL]

One of the easiest XE's to ID, uses call letter liberally... have I ever heard a call letter SID from Mexico before? [Merrill-IL]
- 1330 **MEXICO** XEWQ, Monclova, Coah., DEC 8 0155 – weak in auroral mix but just enough to hear spoken “WQ” between norteña songs. Sweet! [Merrill-IL]
- 1340 **MEXICO** UNID, DEC 8 0247 – twice heard SID between Christmas songs (temp. format?): “[2-syllable word] 13-40” in SP. Too short a jingle for XESL “Cancionera 13-40” – my cassette recorder wouldn't work! Ouch. [Merrill-IL]
- 1430 **MEXICO** XEWD, Cd Miguel Aleman, Tamps., DEC 1 0204 – “musica... en la W.D.” and “WD” heard later, format more youthful (dance music, etc), nearly ruled 1430 all night. Probably cheating with full power. This one might even make it to Winnipeg. This and XEAM-1310 were my first non-domestics ever logged on 1310 and 1430 in my 43 years of DX'ing, and BOTH heard since! [Merrill-IL]
- 1470 **MEXICO** UNID, DEC 1 – Who is the tropical music format here? Heard 12/1 and since, a near-dominant on freq, but I have yet to catch them talking or advertising, no dice even near TOH. In the past few days, Mexicans on odd frequencies like 600, 610, 1050 (u/ XEG), 1080(!), 1150, 700, 1120, 1100, 1280, 1350, 1390, 1460 have gotten away – and I don't think 1350, 1460 are Texans. [Merrill-IL]

- KHJ, Los Angeles, the iconic Southern California top-40 AM outlet
- WTEM (formerly WRC), Washington D.C.
- Cedar Hill, Texas, home to Dallas-Fort Worth’s FM and TV signals and one of the biggest tower clusters in America
- WBT, Charlotte, N.C., the only site in the world with three diamond-shaped Blaw-Knox guyed radio towers
- A tribute to the broadcast facilities destroyed in a fire on Mount Washington, N.H. in early 2003

In addition to tower photos, the calendar’s monthly pages include significant dates in radio and television history as well as civil and religious holidays and major industry trade shows and events.

The high-quality, professionally printed calendar will ship in early December, but orders are being taken immediately.

Like the 2003 edition, the 2004 calendars cost \$16 each, postpaid (\$17.28 including sales tax for New York State residents), and can be purchased by check (payable to “Scott Fybush”) or money order to 92 Bonnie Brae Avenue, Rochester NY 14618.
