(continued from last week...) Some of you may have even noticed the national attention that a petition campaign out of Philadelphia got from a listener balking at the early start of the Christmas music over her local airwaves. While I like Christmas music, I understand where she is coming from when most of the reason for doing this is profit motivated and not related directly to public preference. I wish my campaign could have gotten this kind of attention. The best I could do was to get half a column in the local Toledo Blade newspaper media column. For those who have access to a computer check this under Toledo Blade com. go to columnists and select Russ Lemmon and go to the Nov. 10th column choice to see that story. I spoke with both marketing directors and got nowhere for different reasons, but both had everything to do with money. I suspect in the future there will be more such campaigns like mine out there. Locally WFRO-900 switched from Real Country to ESPN sports talk on 9/22. Another loss on the radio dial. Disney also plans to take this one dark within the next year or so when they get WFDF-910 repositioned to Detroit, all so they can get "Radio Disney" into that market. How is that for preserving good local radio. Note to Larry Godwin: I can understand your beef over your near local East Helena on 680, but did you ever consider 1) that many DX'ers could use KKGR in their logs away from your area, 2) while not approving of a station running out of parameters, the pain you inflicted on a small local radio operator to benefit a big corporate giant, i.e., KNBR is a wonderment. KNBR must have a huge Montana audience. They'll likely just take over KKGR, sign it off so as to not have to deal with this intrusion into their vast coverage area again, and 3) there are plenty of other stations the FCC cares little about both big and small running out of parameters. Besides KKGR is a decent oldies station. What does KNBR provide that any other big AM station in a big market news and talk-wise doesn't? There certainly are many to tune in, trust me. Oh well, I've said my piece. Have a great new DX year and enjoy the holidays. 73s.

EUROPE, AFRICA, AND MIDDLE EAST

CHAD: The country of Chad is situated in the heart of the African continent. The total land mass of Chad is about one and a quarter million square kilometers. Most of the northern areas of Chad are desert.

The history of Chad goes back a long way and it was an important segment of several large African empires on several earlier occasions. In the 1800s, European explorers and traders moved through the area and the French gained access to the territory with a formal treaty that was signed in 1897. Chad finally gained independence from France on Aug 11, 1960.

Chad has a population of nearly eight million inhabitants with roughly six persons per square kilometer. The languages spoken in Chad include French & Arabic as well as a host of vernacular languages. The capital city is N'djamena (n-JAH-men-a) and it is also the largest city in the nation with a population of half a million.

The national radio of Chad is "Radiodiffusion Nationale Tchadienne", RNT, with its headquarters in N'djamena and it was established in November 1955. RNT is government owned and it is the only body permitted to broadcast in Chad on the shortwave and mediumwave bands. Radiodiffusion Nationale broadcasts to the entire country of Chad on the shortwave frequency of 6165 via its 100 kW transmitter located in Gredia, a suburb of the capital city N'djamena. RNT is also active in N'djamena on the FM frequency of 94.05.

RNT has also established four regional stations which broadcast occasionally on mediumwave but are now more active on the FM band. These stations produce local programs in various languages for their audiences living in the various regions. However, the regional stations also carry the major programs from RNT N'djamena on relay, such as the national news and other major features.

In 1999, the government of Chad liberalized broadcasting on the FM band thereby making it possible for groups and individuals to establish FM stations in Chad. Today, besides the government owned RNT FM station, three local non-government controlled FM stations can be heard in N'djamena.

Also heard in N'djamena are the local downlink relays on FM from several other countries. These FM relay stations include Cameroon Radio Television (CRTV), Africa No.1 from Gabon, RFI Afrique from France, and the BBC African Service. There are half a dozen other privately owned FM stations in Chad, mostly in the south of the country.

Radio BCing is crucial for the dissemination of information in Chad. It is the main source for news and entertainment right throughout the country for most people due to the fact that the national television station in Chad, "Teletchad", is available only in the capital city area.

As a finale to this report from Livinus Torty in Chad, we might mention that it seems to be very difficult to obtain a QSL from the SW station in their capital city. The AWR collection in Indianapolis contains not even one QSL from Chad (AWR Wavescan Aug 10 via DXLD)

FINLAND: The YLE transmitter on 558 airs 3-minute local inserts! This means programming which is broadcast only on this specific AM frequency (even though the content of programming isn't local in its nature). A local insert begins with the official interval signal of YLE then followed by some announcements that vary from day to day. These can be heard on weekdays from 0627-0630 (8.27-8.30 local time) and on weekends 0557-0600 (7.57-8.00 local time). I haven't seen any news about these inserts on any DX media and thus I was somewhat surprised when I heard these in my car radio a few days ago. Later on a look at YLE web page confirmed that the inserts are indeed marked in their schedule. Best regards & good DX (Vesa-Jussi Rinkinen 27.1.2003, via Arctic)

A new mediumwave station is planned to go on the air in Finland in spring 2004. Swedish salesman and radio enthusiast Roy Sandgren has received a permission to launch a radio station in the Åland Islands, an autonomous region in Southwestern Finland. The station doesn't have a name yet, Sandgren says to DXing.info, but it will be on the air "in spring, I hope," using the frequency of 603 kHz and a power of 2.5 kW. Unlike first told, the station would be stationed on land and not offshore. (dxing.info Dec 23)

FRANCE: 1080 TDF Meudon is now testing this frequency for transmissions in the Paris area. Using the same tape as earlier for 1062 kHz. Heard in Växjö with excellent signal 2003-12-09 at 0545 UTC. Power estimated to 5 kW as signal strength is approx same as 585 kHz. (Info via Thierry Vignaud, Paris via BE/Arctic 18 Dec 03)

GERMANY: Jülich 702 and Nordkirchen 855 were put on tender. These frequencies were once allocated to VIVA Radio, a joint venture of the VIVA TV company with Radio NRW, the content supplier of the local stations in Nordrhein-Westfalen. This project never materialized, obviously the license was quietly returned by both companies in the meantime (I think a withdrawal would have came to our attention). The transmitters (both 5 kW) exists, 855 was already heard with a test tone while 702 was noted testing with nonstop music and

Megaradio audio. The DRM test project "531 digital" concluded on Dec 31; the transmitter at Burg was switched off. The 531 channel will be put on tender. A project office responsible to promote digital broadcasting states that Europe 1 intends to start DRM transmissions (of a German program, not the French one aired via 183) on Burg 261 later this year. (Kai Ludwig, Germany, Jan 1, DXLD)

IRAQ: A new station noted in Baghdad on 657 kHz with ID "This is Baghdad FM Radio" with music, news and reviews. Unofficial sources say it's another station under the umbrella of (IMN) Iraq Media Network. At the beginning of the transmission they announce the frequency of FM 98.3 MHz and never mention the MW frequency of 657 KHz. Playing a lot of the latest Arabic hits, like Sawa format but no pop/rock English hits. News on top of the hour with some talk shows about the current situation in Iraq with the Americans around. (Tarek Zeidan, Cairo, via mwc)

IRELAND: The launch of regular broadcasts on 252 kHz longwave by Irish public broadcaster RTÉ has been put back another three months. Originally planned for 1 Oct 2003, RTÉ then announced a new target date of 1 Jan 2004. Now the RTÉ Web site says "At present test transmissions are being carried out with a planned launch date scheduled for the end of the first quarter of 2004. This channel will carry the same programming as the RTÉ Radio 1 medium wave service." # posted by Andy @ 13:46 UT Nov 27 (Media Network)

LATVIA: Radio Gold 945AM in Riga will start 24h transmissions on 945kHz in the very next time. The station bought a 2.7kW BLYTH transmitter which is recently being installed at the transmitting center in Ulbroka. (Bernd Trutenau, mwdx)

LUXEMBURG: One of the highest power transmitters in Europe seems to have DRM capability now. Noted for first time on 1440kHz at 2330 11/12/03. (Steve Whitt,)

MONACO: 1467 Superloustic: Early 2003, was announced like a test transmission 0630-1830 CET from 20th January for 4 months. (Thierry Vignaud via Bengt Ericson, Arctic) (which is why this transmission is no longer heard. (BE))

RUSSIA: Starting from Dec 28 our Radio Rossii - the main state broadcasting network in our country - has resumed its old program format for various time zones here in Russia on all bands including some SW frequencies:

"Dubl' 1" for the Russian Far East: 1800-1400 UTC

"Dubl' 2" for Eastern Siberia: 2000-1600 UTC

"Dubl' 3" for Western Siberia: 2200-1800 UTC

"Dubl' 4" for our region between Volga and the Urals: 0000-2000 UTC

and one relay for our European part at 0200-2200 UTC as earlier.

Don't forget that Radio Gardarika will have its latest SW transmission in 2003 this night at 1900-2200 UTC on 6245 kHz (St.Petersburg-Popovka, 200 kW, 268 degrees for Northwest Europe). (Mikhail Timofeyev, St.Petersburg, Russia HCDX)

UNITED KINGDOM: The former Laser 558 ship, MV Communicator, is returning from the Netherlands to the United Kingdom. The ship is due to arrive in Lowestoft on December 20, 2003, according to a press release of the owner, the Super Station. The Super Station says the ship is to play a crucial part in its plans to create a new radio station in 2004. Once repairs to the ship are complete, the company aims to launch a live 24-hour station, broadcasting a mixture of AC and soft rock.

The MV Communicator has played an important role in offshore radio history. Between 1984 and 1987 Laser 558 and Laser Hot Hits broadcast to the UK and Europe. Since 1987 the ship has changed hands many times. The Super Station acquired the ship in 2002 from Clear Channel. ASIA AND PACIFIC

AUSTRALIA: this outlet has been running continuous orchestral music with no announcements for at least the last 24 hours (14 Dec). this morning 2300z Radio 2 Brisbane 1620 is back to open carrier but for some time I have been hearing a little audio underneath and finally made the effort to identify it. I had assumed that it was another semi-local co-channel, since with the beverage's ground wave reception is pretty good (2NTC 1611 is a lovely clear signal during the daytime, while at night fading & co-channel QRM mess it up).

but the audio turns out to be 4RPH 1296. this is not an rx spur, noted on r8/spr4/ic746; possibly a tx cross-mod spur but the audio is nice & clean whereas tx spurs tend to be muddied. audio level on 1620 is miles below carrier, I am guessing well below 5% am modulation. you really need to go into SSB & swing the passband well off the carrier to recover useful audio. My guess is that 4RPH and Radio 2 share tx site & likely even the same mast. the audio would then likely be simply crosstalk into the Radio 2 tx modulator (15 Dec). Radio 2 Brisbane 1620 carrier is now gone altogether, based upon monitoring all this morning. Leaves Radio 2 Toowoomba 1620 in the clear on the 750m 6m 100degT & with just a trace of SAH on the 150m 3m 50degT (presume Radio 2 Sunshine Coast?) (Sam Dellit, MWOZ)

CHINA: Harris Corporation has successfully conducted China's first over-the-air demonstration on the Medium Wave broadcast band. The demonstration, conducted in late August at the SARFT transmitter site outside of Beijing, confirmed that Harris DX® Medium Wave radio transmitter systems can be converted quickly, easily and cost-effectively to deliver high-quality, over-the-air DRM performance. According to Don Spragg, director of high-power radio and programs for Harris Corporation's Broadcast Communications Division, a Harris DX200, 200kW transmitter was prepared for DRM transmission in less than an hour for an extended over-the-air DRM broadcast. "The testing purpose was two fold: to assist SARFT with the first MW DRM demonstration in China; and to prove that Harris' DX line of 10kW through 2000kW transmitters operating in the field are indeed DRM ready." (Press Release on Harris website, via Bernd Truteneau, mwdx)

NEW ZEALAND: The installation of a new transmitter at Palmerston 's Radio Puketapu 954 AM means listeners from Oamaru to Mosgiel can tune in according to technical controller Lawrence McCraw. The transmitter was operating on 400W and the station hoped to increase its power to 1000W before Christmas,to overcome interference from the Southern Star Network station in Christchurch.(Steven Geenyer, NZDXRL)

Counties Manukau Radio 936 and FM 95.8 left the air Oct 10. (Gordon Mathieson, NZDXRL)

Five AM frequencies are up for tender in the 18 November radio spectrum auction. The successful tenderer will have use of the frequency for a 7 year period ending in April 2011. SRI LANKA: The Sri Lanka International Radio using Trans World Radio transmitter is now heard in B-2003 period on 882 kHz (ex 873) between 0135-1120 UT in Tamil. Earlier Trans World Radio use to operate on 882 kHz and the same transmitter was used at other times on 873. (Jose Jacob, India, Nov 14, Cumbre DX via DXLD)

TAJIKISTAN: 801 Frequency change of Deutsche Welle via Dushanbe transmitter: 1900-1915 Dari, 1915-1930 Pashtu 801 kHz, 1000 kW, ND ex 972 kHz (valid 01.12.2003). (Herman Boel-BEL, A-DX Dec 2)

VANUATU: I cannot name where I got this from except Santa overflying Vila.. 7260 is on 4kw of juice and the MW freqs are on 400watts (John Wright, MWOZ)

The once-dilapidated station, on the verge of shutting down in 1992 due to runaway debts and equipment failures, again has a vibrant ministry in this strategic country.
