Here's the results of the most recent DX test that have been received here:

Sunday, January 11, 2004 - WKDK-1240, Newberry, SC tested 5:57-6:00am EST:

This was the second of 2 brief DX "tests" done by Powell E. Way III at WKDK (the first was over the Holidays). Success in hearing it varied - Jim Myrick in Meridian, MS reported he tried for the test but due to lots of interference on the frequency, was unable to hear it. Rick Robinson in Hendersonville, NC, about 120 mi NW of Newberry, heard the Morse code from the test clearly enough to detail the letters. Russ Edmunds in Blue Bell, PA, had no luck, as was the case for Bruce Collier in York, PA, Bruce Winkelman in Tulsa, OK, and Saul Chernos at Burnt River, ON. Les Rayburn in Helena, AL recorded the test, and says that after analyzing the recording, it appears he partially copied the test. Gerry Bishop in Niceville, FL and Ron Gitscher, also in FL (Palm Coast?) reported that they heard the test, though Ron says it was a jumble.

WRIB-1220, Providence, RI is testing daily, from 2:55am-3:05am EST - A few reports of this have been received, tho I have yet to get a report of a positive reception, just that Morse code needs to be used, as there's a lot of QRM on that frequency.

Charlotte, NC 1660 is now "WFNA, The Franchise" per repeated mentions around 1645 this afternoon. Per CDBS change granted 12/9/03 (although the same source shows it as a "CP Not On the Air") (Russ Edmunds, Blue Bell, PA) (PM-OR)

THE TECATE 550 KHZ STATION HAS MOVED TO 560

Tecate 550 kHz was off the air for a day or so, and on December 11, 2003 moved to 560 kHz. (I guess they are working their way up the dial!) Now 570 kHz is unlistenable. The San Diego Observer 560 kHz station is XEKTT and runs 20 kW day and 10 kW night, non-D both times, according to an informed source. The tower is said to be 448' tall, and the transmitter is a HarrisDX-25U. (KR-AZ)

Finally heard the digital noise from 1030 WBZ-HD. It was on my car radio while on the road though, so I didn't get a chance to really check it out on a DX receiver. The noise was actually louder on 1010 and 1050 than it was on 1020 and 1040 kHz. (Bruce Conti) (via PM-OR) (Additional note from Pat: they are QRM'ing to Chicago, IL. now!)

WZZJ-1580 has changed from a Christian music format to talk radio. The station will feature programming from USA Radio Network. (AB-CA)

Bonneville and Simmons has a deal involving trade of 15 AM and FM stations, including KBLI-AM, KZNI-AM, KZNR-AM, KDXU-AM and KUNF-AM. (FA-ID)

This morning (which morning??? - pb) around 0630 MST on 700 kHz I was hearing a station that I thought sounded a lot like XEETCH with the slow talking announcers, fiddle music, etc. Then I heard the ID -- it *was* XEETCH. I heard several IDs -- the slow, clearly enunciated X-E-E-T-C-H every few minutes. Apparently XEETCH has moved from 1130... (Mike Westfall-NM) (PM-OR)

West End: New owner silences Forks radio stations (12/29/03) by JEFF CHEWFORKS --Mayor Nedra Reed expects to find out today just why the city's two radio stations were silenced with short notice after a Houston-base broadcast company finalized purchase of KVAC-AM 1490 and KLLM-FM 103.9 (Forks, WA-ye ed). (AB-CA)

Clanton radio station sale finally done... by Jason Green CLANTON - Great South RFDC Wireless has taken ownership of WEZZ FM and WKLF AM in Clanton. On Dec. 1 a deal two years in the making was completed which took ownership rights from Clanton City Councilman Jack Dennis to Scott Alexander and his ownership group based in Greenville. Alexander also owns three stations of his own in Selma. (AB-CA)

TWO MORE AM STATIONS BEING BUILT IN TIJUANA: 780 & 920 KHZ

CGC Communicator readers are already familiar with XEPE (formerly XEKTT), the new 560 kHz station near Tijuana that is causing massive interference to U.S. broadcast signals (see CGC #609). XEPE is authorized to run 20 kW day and 10 kW night and is non-directional, real flame thrower.

Reliable sources in Mexico indicate that two more AM stations, 780 and 920 kHz, are under construction at Rosarito Beach and may be on the air as early as mid-February 2004. The stations are said to be 20 kW day/10 kW night, same as XEPE, and will also be non-directional. The transmitter site is reported to be approximately two miles north of the famous 1090 kHz array. These new stations are also expected to cause massive interference to U.S. broadcast interests. (PM-OR)

Liberal talk network lands Chicago outlet (January 14, 2004) BY ROBERT FEDER SUN-TIMES COLUMNIST

Progress Media, the fledgling radio network conceived as a liberal antidote to conservative talk formats, has identified a Chicago station as it first broadcast outlet. WNTD-AM (950), a Spanish-language station that is in the process of being sold by Radio Unica Communications to Multicultural Radio Broadcasting, will carry the new talk radio network, under terms of a local marketing agreement announced Tuesday. (AB-CA)

Some nice LW TA tips from Nigel and Mike this week.

Nigel writes" This past weekend (Jan 11), I was up in Lamont (near Edmonton) DXing with Don Moman, Joe Talbot, and Mickey Delmage. Most of out success was on shortwave, but we also enjoyed an opening on longwave. The LW highlights of the weekend was likely my first reception of a European longwave station in our local morning hours, when Norway on 153 khz was very clear on first tuning in at 1330 UTC on 11 Jan, gradually weakening to fade out around 1500. Given their northern location, I've considered such reception quite feasible during mid-winter, and have indeed noted very weak signals, but haven't detected enough of a signal previously to confirm it was Norway. Also logged a number of Europeans at the more conventional time the previous evening between 0400 and 0800 UTC, January 11."

DXpedition to Ocean City – Guy Atkins

I was fortunate to hit a window of decent weather for this 2-night DXpedition to Ocean City State Park, WA. This park is north of the Grayland DXpedition location, and across Gray's Harbor from the fishing village of Westport. See map for location: http://short.uigui.com/524 The previous weekend, a major snowstorm hit the Puget Sound area and even the coast was 2 to 3 inches deep in snow with temperatures in the 20's. However, within a couple of days the weather returned to the more seasonal upper 40's temperatures for the WA coast during the winter.

This was my first DC-only DXpedition in nearly three years, so I spent considerable time making sure I had all the power cables, connectors, etc. needed, and that my two deep-cycle RV batteries could still hold a good charge. (Since the "technology boom" hit Pacific NW DXpeditions a few years ago, the total power requirement for "necessary" equipment <g> has skyrocketed.) I fired up my flameless catalytic propane heater to make sure it still worked, and also bought a new set of foul weather raingear to help me survive the sideways rain that often blows across the Washington beaches in winter.

Propagation on this outing was definitely in favor of shortwave, despite repeated bandscans on mediumwave throughout the DXpedition, looking for juicy possibilities. Reception mostly favored the Pacific Islands region on mediumwave, but the countries heard included: New Zealand, Japan, China, Tahiti, Kiribati, Tonga, Marshall Islands, South Korea, Thailand, and a Papua New Guinea beacon on 1737 kHz.

I was expecting the usual longpath African reception from the coast this time of year and I wasn't disappointed. Unfortunately, DX didn't linger long enough after local sunrise to provide any West Africans other than Nigeria on 4770.

- 738 **TAHITI** RFO Papeete, Jan 12 0349 Het first noted at 0349, one hour prior to Papeete local SS. Low-level audio noted at 0509, and into good level of French talk at 0940 recheck. (Atkins-WA)

- 4770 NIGERIA, 1703-1707, V. of Nigeria Jan 12 Lagos and Nigerian news items in English read by man to V. of Nigeria ID at 1705. Good level. (Atkins-WA)
- 4800 LESOTHO, 1711-1713, LNBS Jan 11 Presumed, with African choral music; fair level, but in background of strong swisher interference. Much better on Jan. 12 with very good signal of African choral music overpowering the swisher QRM. (Atkins-WA)
