IRCA President's Report

February 2, 2004 - Nick Hall-Patch, 1538 Amphion St., Victoria, BC, Canada V8R 4Z6 (nhp@ieee.org)

Following is Proposal 21.1.3 from **Phil Bytheway**, and the votes of the Board:

"As current EiC/Publisher, I need to raise dues in order to continue publishing DXM from Seattle. Therefore, I am proposing the following dues increase of \$5/year... effective March 1 2004. Renewals and new members joining at the old rate will be PRO-RATED after March 1.

Negotiated costs in Seattle are: printing 0.05/page (no quantity limits), folding/stapling - \$20/issue (negotiated down from \$22.50). Dues proposal is based upon publishing 30 issues of DXM, 24 "small" issues (16 pages) and 6 "large" issues (32 pages). Five "double" issues are scheduled (which tend to be large)... so I figured in another biggie just in case.

Some underwriting of DXM is being provided by SDXM fees (about \$3/member/year)... but this is less than the \$5/member/year that has been used in the past. Basically, I figured I better not raise the dues over \$30/year.
