Dan Sys passes on the following info: CFRP-620 in Forestville, Quebec is the latest to apply for a flip to FM. http://www.crtc.gc.ca/archive/ENG/Notices/2004/pb2004-4.htm#1 (DS-BC)

Art Blair sends along the following: A New Jersey-based radio group that's buying 11 radio stations in Maine is also expanding into New Hampshire. Nassau Broadcasting of Princeton says it has completed its purchase of a half-dozen New Hampshire radio stations with listeners from the Lakes Region to the Massachusetts border. Terms were not immediately disclosed and the sales still must be approved by the Federal Communications Commission. In Maine, Nassau has purchased a six-station network of classical music stations as well as the five radio stations in the WMTW broadcast group. (AB-CA)

Art Blair also sends along the following: Saga Communications has entered into agreements to acquire the assets of WISE/AM-Asheville, NC and WOXL/FM-Biltmore Forest, NC. Subject to FCC approval, the transactions are expected to close during 2004. Saga is currently providing programming to WISE/AM under a time brokerage agreement and to WOXL/FM under a sub-time brokerage agreement. The company already owns WOXL/AM-Asheville, NC. Saga Communications owns or operates 49 FM and 27 AM stations, two state radio networks and one farm radio network. Additionally, Saga has entered into an agreement to acquire three FMs serving the Springfield/Northampton, MA and Brattleboro, VT markets. (AB-CA)

Dan Sys sends along the following: All is done doom & gloom over the loss of CKY though. In Montreal (Laval) the old 1570, abandoned by CKLM about a decade ago, has come back to life. CFAV is now testing & will hit the air in a matter of days with an Adult Standard format (in French). http://www.nostalgie1570.com/ (DS-BC)

Dan Sys sends along the following (note: 100000watts.com reports that CKY was to stay on 3 months after date below to sim. CKY-FM before leaving 580): One of Western Canada's radio legends comes to an end this Wednesday. 580 CKY Winnipeg will close up shop as owner Rogers Communications flips the station to the FM dial in hopes of boosting ratings. and becoming more competitive in the Winnipeg market. CKY started broadcasting in 1923 at 665am with about 2000 watts of power. By 1948, the station would increase to 15kw, and move to 990am before being sold to the CBC - becoming what is now CBW-AM today. In 1949. Llovd Moffat launched a new Winnipeg radio station using the CKY call letters at 580am. The station started out with 5000 watts of power (daytime, 1000 watts nighttime). By 1960, the station would be a 50kw flamethrower... CKY was a station you could hear anywhere in southern Manitoba - pretty much the only Winnipeg station that really had a provincial reach from border to border -- and beyond. My assumption (alas, being too young) is that in its heyday, CKY was *the* Top 40 rocker in Winnipeg (and a popular one at that). By the time I came along in the 1980s, the station was pumping out Soft Rock before a late 1980s flip to Oldies - a format its stuck with to this day. This Wednesday, legendary morning man Don Percy will crank out the final show (according to MMU)... it'll be a sad occasion, but CKY will live on at 102.3 FM - the only guestion now is which format it'll take on (moving oldies is out of the question due to CRTC hit/non-hit regulations.). (DS-BC)

Ye editor passes on the following (from Radio & Records): A non-profit group called Rootswork plans to start a radio station in the Mad River Valley in March. Rootswork will launch the low-power WEW/WMRW Radio for broadcast to Warren, Waitsfield, and some of Fayston. The Federal Communications Commission awarded Rootswork a construction permit for the station, said Rootswork representative Roger Hussey. "WEW is going to start off sort of inexpensively, maybe broadcasting at 40 watts initially, and maybe add more equipment as we get more expertise," he said. The station will broadcast 12 hours a day, every day of the week, with live programs and local music, he said. "If you've always dreamed of having a radio show, now is your chance to take a crack at it," he said. "When we get enough money we will have equipment for call-in shows and we will also present radio plays, `Singing the News,' and other entertaining and useful shows." WEW has an equipment budget of \$2,000 now, and an annual operating budget of \$2,000. The station is raising that money now. (RW-CA)

Ye editor also passes on the following (from Radio & Records): FCC Grants Upgrade To WHOO/AM-Orlando Genesis Communications has received an FCC grant to upgrade "ESPN 1080" WHOO-Orlando to 19,000 watts. The station is currently licensed for 10,000 watts daytime and 41 watts pre-sunrise and post sunset. Genesis Communications OM Jeff Taylor stated, "This will be one of the strongest AM stations in Central Florida. The dominant daytime signal will cover more than double the area it currently covers in the Central Florida I-4 corridor from East Tampa to Daytona Beach. This is one of the fastest growing populated areas in the State."Genesis Communications owns and operates five Florida stations. (RW-CA)

Dennis Gibson of Santa Barbara, CA. sends along the following (note: this format was temporary, now simulcasting KKZZ-1400- ye ed): KUNX no longer Spanish/R. Unica, now comedy on the "All Comedy Radio Network". Sounds like a clone of the old KMDY-850! I'm sure they'll be changing call letters as well. Wonder if the rest of the R. Unica network is also changing formats as well (such as 1470 Palmdale and Tiajuana)? Looks like Santa Barbara area now has just KEYT and KBKO again for SS. (DG-CA)

Dennis also passes on the following: KNX-AM (1070) has decided to loosen its tie. The Infinity Broadcasting Corp. news station, which last fall dumped longtime general manager George Nicholaw, has snatched weekend cooking and computer shows from rival KFI-AM (640) and made other moves as part of an ongoing bid to tweak its staid reputation and attract new listeners and sponsors. (DG-CA)

Dan Sys passes along the following (from Radio Vibes): Noticed on Friday Jan 23 while enroute to Montreal that Astral has flipped 1360 CKBC to 104.9 FM. The station is HOT AC, billed as MAX 104.9, Today's Best Music, using David Kaye ID's. (DS-BC)

Art Blair passes along the following: Harlan Communications, operator of KUBA-AM, is merging with Grass Valley-based Nevada County Broadcasters, which has KNCO-AM and KNCO-FM, better known as Star 94.1. (AB-CA)

Dennis Gibson passes along the following: KKOM 1590 AM Ventura, (Simulcast KKZZ 1400 AM), 2284 Victoria Avenue, Suite 2-G, Ventura, CA 93003 ,805-289-1400, Adult Standards (DG-CA)

Pat Martin sends along the following: WORLD'S FIRST TALK RADIO STATION FOR GUYS MAKES CANADIAN DEBUT OF 'ALL COMEDY RADIO', January 28th '2004 –Toronto. Toronto's Talk Radio Station for Guys - MOJO RADIO - The Home of The Toronto Maple Leafs and The John Oakley Morning Show has announced the addition of "All Comedy Radio" to its weekly stable of exclusive programming. In a deal struck with Infinity's "All Comedy Radio" in Los Angeles, the Toronto talk radio station for guys has acquired access to the All Comedy Radio Network and will air it's exclusive comedy programming overnights and on weekends on MOJO RADIO. (Note: this is AM 640 in Toronto-ye ed.) (PM-OR)

Pat Martin sends along the following (from CG Communicator): XEKTT UPDATE, AND RELATED INFORMATION. A high level telephone call between the FCC and the SCT (Mexico's FCC) reportedly took place on Tuesday of last week. Put simply, the SCT is said to have promised swift action in eliminating the interference that XEKTT (XEPE), 560 kHz, Tecate/Tijuana, is currently causing to U.S. stations. Meanwhile, more broadcasters are joining the list of companies concerned with the interference. Concern for Mexico's planned operations on 780 and 920 kHz (XESS and XEDD respectively) in the vicinity of Tijuana continues to mount. A hard copy of the authorization for 780 kHz has surfaced and confirms that operation with 20 kw day and 10 kW night is in fact sanctioned by the SCT, with non-directional facilities both times and a quarter-wave tall broadcast tower. This confirms the

power figures published in CGC #610 and establishes that we are dealing with more blow torch situations. (PM-OR)

Tim Noonan of Madison, WI. sends along the usual call letter change list from the FCC. Thanks, Tim! (TN-WI)

Pat Martin sends along the following (confirming earlier info on CHMJ-730): Vancouver's CHMJ-730 will be dropping its Guy Talk format this Monday and going All Sports. They will apparently be retaining their MOJO RADIO identity though. (PM-OR)

Ye editor passes along the following (from Radio & Records): Radio Formula Takes Over Former Radio Unica AMs. Radio Unica's last day of live Spanish News/Talk programming was Jan. 30, and the 24/7 network went to best-of shows before shutting down for good at midnight on Feb. 5. At least eight of the former Radio Unica O&Os that have been sold to Multicultural Radio Broadcasting have picked up Radio Formula's 24-hour Spanish News/Talk programming, Radio Formula President/GM Elias Chavando tells R&R, thanks to an agreement between Radio Formula and Multicultural. Among the stations new Radio Formula affiliates: KAHZ/Dallas, KWRU/Fresno, KXYZ/Houston, WJDM & WWRU/New York, KIDR/Phoenix, KIQI/San Francisco and KQTL/Tucson. WNTD/Chicago and KBLA/Los Angeles will air Radio Formula programming until the debut of Air America Network; WNTD has already been named Air America's flagship, and it is believed the forthcoming "Progressive Talk" network will add KBLA as its first West Coast affiliate. (RW-CA)

Dennis Gibson passes along the following (also confirming earlier info on KZER-1250): Since the new owner is Lazer Broadcasting Corporation the selection of new call letters is appropriate. They're only 1250's third call letters since signing on in 1937. Accoring to the FCC web site they were KTMS (Thomas M. Storke) until changing to KEYT on 7/20/98, and KZER on 1/20/04. (DG-CA)

Mike Hardester passes along the following (note: earlier info in column shows WLNR silent per 100000watts.com): 1230 WLNR NC Kinston - 2/13 1110 - Not silent, but possible transmitter problems. Noted with Spanish language programming, woman announcer, ranchera music, and fair signal. Frequent "ID" that sounded like "Radio Local." Signal on/off. This in Greenville, NC (about 10 miles away). Noted open carrier while driving through Kinston at 1930, and off air/no signal on return trip through Kinston at 2230. If desired, I can follow up further. (MH - NC)

MELBOURNE MW BROADCASTERS

Melbourne's second 24 hour sports mw station opened officially on Monday, January 18, 2004. It has the slogan "1116 SEN on the AM dial", operated by the Sports Entertainment Network, using 1116. It replaces the failed talkback 3AK, 1116 which only had 1.2% of Melbourne's listeners. It uses 2 KW from a site in northern Melbourne suburb of Eltham. SEN has a three year lease, commencing November 2003, on the former 3AK license for 3.55 million Australian dollars, from radio operator Data and Commerce limited. The primary target audience is males, aged 25 to 54, and it will compete directly with the radio-focused Sport-927 (927 MW), and with football focused 3AW (1278 MW) and ABC Melbourne (774 MW). Melbourne now has 18 mw stations, all operating 24 hours daily.
