We've arranged for WRIB-1220 in Providence, RI (tough state to hear!) to raise power to 1kw non-D every night at 2:55 to 3:05am. This will run through at least March, and will have a recorded ID at 3am. Hopefully a special ID with morse code can be added in the near future. Sunday, February 15, 2004 - WQMA-1520, Marks, MS tested 12:00-2:00am CST:

This test was heard throughout a large part of the US and Canada - many times, it was the code that got thru. Many DXers reported hearing the test; the station had said they were giving an award for the longest distance reception, but I have been unable to find that information on their log page. From the information I have received here, it appears that the farthest reception reported was in Seaside, OR, by DXer Pat Martin on a Drake R8 with terminated 1500' Eastern beverage, followed by Saul Chernov in Burnt River, ON, and Jeff Falconer in Clinton, ON. - 1270 KBZZ NV, Sparks 2/18 0200 top of hour ID "Howard Stern, Don and Mike, Tom Lykis 12-70 The Buzz, KBZZ Sparks-Reno," over CHAT and KTFI. (BB-ID)
- 1300 KAPL OR, Phoenix 2/14 0100 ID into religious talk show, choppy and weak. (GH-OR)
- 1370 KENT HI, Honolulu 2/6 2247 back on the air after a month, with relay of KAIM-FM, using slogan "95.5 FM The Fish" and airing Christian contemporary music. However, the station ID mentioned "KJPN AM 11-70." So KAIM-FM is being heard on two MW channels, neither of them being KAIM-870. Called station owner Salem Communications but they referred questions to the GM, who was out of town. (5P-HI)
- 1450 XECU SIN, Los Mochis 2/20 0400 booming in on top of 1450 with very nice ID "Equis-eh-ceh-uh, catorce sinquenta, Los Mochis, La Rancherita!" Frequency change ex-1450 for me, logged in San Jose on 1470. (RW-CA)

- 1650 KBIV TX, El Paso 2/20 0030 heard at loud level while DX'ing with Bob W. Classic country slogans and tune by Kenny Rogers. Mixing with KFOX and sometimes on top. Caught legal ID at 0300. Possible Denver in there as well. (MS-CA)
- +2/20 0030 nice ID on half hour fading over KFOX/KBJD as "All of your favorites, are here on Classic Hit Country 1650 AM," ID heard later 2/20 0300 driving back from Upland, CA with Mike Sanburn in my car, nice ID "KBIV, El Paso" heard. New, not logged from anywhere in past! (RW-CA1)
