A tentative test of WNNR 970 Jacksonville, FL will start at midnight, Sunday, March 14th 2004 Eastern Time. Test duration: At least one hour. I am trying to talk the GM into two hours. He may do it, but couldn't nail him down. The test will be simulcast on WVOJ 1570 Fernandina Beach, FL.

The programming will be strictly test material, no normal programming to be heard. Morse Code and Tones will head the bill of fare. Jingles. Maybe some surprise messages or PSAs if I can get them solicited/submitted.

I don't know if I can do the test live. This may be a loop instead. I'd like to do it live to air call-ins... but I only have the keys to Fernandina and not the Jacksonville studios. I want to do the simulcast so that we have the 1kw 970 signal in there for those who desire an other-than-armchair signal to fish out. WVOJ 1570 will be 10kw starting midnight, non-directional. The tower is in a salt-marsh and it rips the ionosphere pretty well (I'm told).

**BRAZIL:** Radio Clube de Pernambuco is the first radio station of Brazil. Radio Clube de Pernambuco was founded in 1919. I want to show to the world that the first radio station of Brazil is Radio Clube de Pernambuco (1919), not Radio Sociedade do Rio de Janeiro (1923). **DOMINICAN REPUBLIC:** Observations made by Don Trelford, NRC on a visit to La Romana 18-23.10.2003: 690 HIAW R Progreso, Sto Domingo ex R Guarachita, 1300 HIKQ R Dos, Santo Domingo, ex R Radio (Arctic)

**EL SALVADOR:** Observations made by Tetsaya Hirahara, visiting El Salvador 2-20.12.2003: 630 YS.. R Promesa "La sintonía que lleva a Dios", San Salvador. Officially inaugurated on December 14, 2003. Sked: 1100-0600. Address: 75 Av. Norte, Prolongación Juan Pablo II, Col. Jardines de Escalón, final Pasaje KL, San Salvador. The station is housed in a transmitting facilities. At the entrance of the site, there is an old iron gate showing call-letters "YS\*L. (The third letter was dropped off). FM Monumental, which formerly used 630, belongs to Cadena YSKL. With this in fact, the "Pasaje KL" seems to have been named after the transmitter site of YSKL. 1240 YSMT R Metapán: According to the phone book 2002 the address is Calle Principal, costado norte Centro Judical, Col. Lomas de Montecristo, Metapán, Dpto Sta) (Arctic)

#### **ASIA AND PACIFIC**

**AUSTRALIA:** 31/01/04 - Radio station 1593 in Melbourne continues to frustrate the narrowcasters with its poor transmission quality and overmodulation on 1593 AM. Rete Italia in Melbourne causes interference to everything +/- 27 away, in the northern suburbs of Melbourne, with casualties including 3XX (1611), Radio 2 (1629) and more. There have been formal complaints registered with the ACA however all seems to get worse. The 1593 technical transmission standard is so bad that it is almost impossible to hear it on its own frequency. A spokesman for Rete was not willing to comment and believed the issue was an over reaction. More to follow soon. (David Onley, MWOZ)

If you haven't had a nice drive past Cambellfield during January, you don't know what you've been missing out on. And all you had to do was tune your radio to either 1593 or higher. Not only was the audio on Rete Italia not sounding as clear as it should, their transmitter was splattering their signal over to 1611, 1620 and even up to 1629. But thankfully, that has been changed, with the ACA stepping in, at long last. This means, for those in the Northern Suburbs, there will be no more splattering from Rete Italia (1593) This means, you can now listen to 1611 (Double X), 1620 (Hillside Radio), and 1629 (Radio 2) without this consistent hiss over the top (http://www.surfnetvic.cjb.net/ via David Onley, MWOZ)

**CHINA:** Two new MW stations from Beijing. Maybe some of you are looking for a new DX catch? China Radio International has started test transmissions in Beijing on 846 and 1008, with a 24 hour English looped service. I believe 846 is 10 kW and 1008 1 kW. I'd be interested to see where it can be heard! Good luck! (Connor Walsh, Beijing, Jan 25, dxing.info via DXLD) I guess I should have mentioned in the first post, there are two existing MW outlets for CRI in Beijing. The main one is 1251, which relays the domestic 91.5 FM

service, and 900 which carries the Hit FM service from 88.7 FM. This is mostly pop music presented in Chinese, with news in different languages. This doesn't broadcast throughout the day, rather there are some pauses. The 900 transmitter doesn't sound very powerful, while the 1251 is one of the strongest signals on the broadcast band here. With a longwire on a Sony SW7600GR and a Degen 1102, it overloads and pops up all over the shortwave bands (Connor Walsh, Beijing, Jan 26, ibid.)

# **EUROPE, AFRICA, AND MIDDLE EAST**

**CYPRUS:** 990 BBG went on the air in August 2002 with a new 600 kW solid state S7HP transmitter installed at the RFI Cape Greco station, where RFI had a S7HP 1200 kW transmitter in operation since 1998. A picture of the site shows a 4 mast array for RFI and a three mast array next to the tip of the peninsula for BBG. (From Thales Radio News #9, Autumn 2002 by Olle Alm, Arctic)

**DJIBOUTI:** IBB's 600 kw MW transmitter in Djibouti will begin test transmissions on 1431 at 1600-0400 from Feb 1, 2004, carrying one of the Radio Sawa streams in Arabic. (Dan Ferguson) - Radio Sawa transmissions have been confirmed. (ARC)

Following the award in 2002 to supply a new 600 kW MW transmitter for their Djibouti broadcasting centre, IBB/VOA once again contracted Thales Broadcast & Multimedia to deliver a new antenna system for the station. The 3-tower directional MW transmitting antenna will be designed for 1431 and 600 kW transmitter power. Thales scope of delivery includes antenna masts and insulation, ground screen and aerial main and secondary feeders. Thales will deliver and take the new antenna into operation in only 6 months time after definitive contract award. (Thales press release, September 12th, 2003) - The IBB website shows 1431 as currently nondirectional- (Alm, ARC)The reported location of 1431 is 'Arta, which is located some 25 km west of Djibouti city, not in the south of the country as previously reported. The local RTD site, which is to be upgraded, is located at Doralé, 10 km west of Djibouti city. (Various)

IRELAND: After a delay of two and a half years due to planning difficulties, Irish religious broadcaster Solas AM is finally able to go ahead with construction of its transmitter site. Irish media site Radiowaves reports that the station has been given a 20 year permit to erect a 61m high transmitter mast together on a site located within the grounds of Orlagh College in Rathfarnham, South Dublin, owned by the Augustinian Order. The decision was made on appeal following the rejection of a previous planning application by South Dublin County Council. The Broadcasting Commission of Ireland awarded Solas AM a license in July 2001 for a 10 kW MW transmitter, which is expected to operate on either 531 or 1143. At one stage, the station investigated buying the longwave site of Radio Tara, which is now owned by RTE. (Andy Sennett, Jan 20, Media Network via DXLD)

**FRANCE:** Although they were not awarded a license last year when the CSA picked the stations that would be allowed to broadcast on MW, Littoral AM are planning to go on they air sometime this spring on a 9 month temporary license, the same kind of license Ciel AM used in Paris a couple of years ago. So far the license has not been issued but Littoral AM are very likely to get it, since the regulatory body is very keen to see some stations go on the air at last. With several of the planned stations likely to hand back their licenses due to the generally negative response in the public to the use of the MW band, the CSA want to get the thing going, and the sooner the better, as a kind of real-scale feasibility test, just like Ciel AM was. Littoral will broadcast from the small town of Lamballe with 10 kW on 936. The aerial will be a 65 meter-high single mast. The coverage area will be most of French Brittany but the station should also be heard well in the south-west of the UK, roughly speaking west of the Isle of Wight and of course in the Channel Islands. The address of the station is: Littoral AM, BP 531, 22405 Lamballe Cedex, France. (Rémy Friess MWC Jan 19 2004)

In the Exhibition SALON DE LA RADIO 2004 of Paris last weekend the Managers of Radio Superloustic have announced officially the transmissions on MW Band will start from next 21 March on 999 Paris and 675 Marseille. Also the Managers of Radio CIEL FM have announced officially they will start from 15 Feb to operate on 981 from Paris. for more news visit: http://www.superloustic.net/english/english.htm, (Dario Monferini, DXLD)

711 Yesterday (Saturday 17th Jan) I came across the local Breton programming of Rennes on 711, thanks to a tip from Hans-Dieter Buschau. Heard from tune-in 1147 till 1300. WRTH 2004 lists this program Saturdays 1000-1100. The correct time is 1200-1400 hrs local time, 1100-1300 UTC in winter. All this according to <a href="http://www.radiofrance.fr/sites/bleu-armorique/station/ecoute.php">http://www.radiofrance.fr/sites/bleu-armorique/station/ecoute.php</a>. Lots of beautiful Breton folk music was played. (Martin A Hall, MWC Jan 20 2004)

TdF have started testing on 1575 from their Paris-Meudon site. This is the third Meudon channel. Previous tests were on 1062 and 1080. The license for 1575 is held by Radio Nouveaux Talents. (Rémy Friess, MWC)

HUNGARY: The media authority has adjudged the former medium wave frequency of Radio Petőfi to the Hungarian Catholic Radio Corporation. It starts at Whitsun on medium wave, of which broadcast will be able to be heard almost all around Hungary. The frequencies of MW broadcasts: 810 Lakihegy, 1341 Siófok, 1341 Szolnok. At present the broadcasts of the Magyar Katolikus Rádió (MKR) (Hungarian Catholic Radio) can be heard on 4 FM frequencies in northern Hungary for 24 hours. (EDXP via Ray Bauernhuber)

MALAWI: In a recent letter to Finnish DXer Jyrki Hytönen, Mr Abraham E Nsapato, Controller of Transmitters- Malawi Broadcasting Corporation, mentions some major changes/additions compared to WRTH-2004: Kasungu 1278 1 kW, Chitipa 1404 10 kW, Matiya (Žomba) 1422 10 kW. 540 and 756 are 1 & 10 kW, respectively, due to tx problems. (Jarmo Patala via Mauno Ritola, Arctic)

MALDIVES: 1449 Maldives has been on through the night for some time now. At 1740 approx. Radio Maldives sign-off with the National Anthem, then Radio One (Radio Eke) takes over until 0020 when it stops and R. Maldives starts the sign-on procedure. Now is it Voice of Maldives!!! (Victor Goonetilleke in Sri Lanka via Jose Jacob, India, Feb 8, DXLD)

NETHERLANDS: Dutch transmission services provider Nozema today issued a statement on its Web site ensuring listeners that Arrow Classic Rock will continue to be received throughout the Netherlands on 675. Following last week's meeting which agreed how the Lopik transmitter site will be used in the future, Nozema says: "With the local authorities, the Province of Utrecht and the Ministry of Economic affairs. Nozema signed a declaration of intent over the lowering of the total power output from the MW masts at Lopik from 240 to 140 kW. This lower power will not affect the reception of Arrow Classic Rock's transmissions. The so-called "power budget" even provides room for back-up transmissions of [public network] 747 AM. But the lower total power means that in the future it will not be possible to operate any other backup transmitters at Lopik." This statement was necessary as Nozema's original press release had specifically stated that the plan "had consequences for listeners of the current client as the coverage area is reduced." In fact, both statements are true. Reducing the power on 675 will reduce the signal by a couple of dB, which in practice will not be noticeable within the Netherlands. Quality Radio by, which holds the license for the former Lopik frequency of 1395, has already indicated that it will contest the decision reached last Wednesday, (via Mike Terry, MWDX 20,1,2004) 1395 has been on all night for some time. (Olle Alm. ARC)

NORWAY: Was informed today, that DRM-tests are scheduled from Kvitsoy 1314 ending 2/19. Tests will be in the "old" version of DRM, so software-upgraded receivers will not be able to pick it up. The transmissions will be a pure DRM-signal, with no AM simulcast. (Bernt Erfjord, mwc 2/16)

RUSSIA: Russian International Radio (RIR), the joint service of Voice of Russia and Russkove Radio is currently aired on MW acc. to the following extended schedule:

SWITZERLAND: SRG will not lodge an appeal against the decision concerning the Beromünster transmitter. MW service of Musiqualle 531 will cease from 2009 "at the latest", i.e. the Beromünster site will be closed by the end of 2008 or even earlier. (http://www.srg.ch/de/home/de\_textarchiv\_210104.html via Kai Ludwig, via Arctic)

TURKEY: Thales has won an order from Turkish state broadcaster TRT to supply a 300 kW MW transmitter for its site at Diyarbakir in the south east of Turkey. The fully solid-state tx will replace an old valve-based unit. (Thales press release 12 Sep 2003 via Arctic)

UKRAINE: The following MW transmitters have been reactivated on 1 February: 675 (25) Uzhhorod (Korytniany), UR; 711 (50) Dokuchaievsk, UR1; 936 (3) Starobilsk, UR1; 1134 (5) Luhansk, UR1; 1242 (50) Oktiabrske, UR2/3 (Info: Alexander Egorov in open dx, 5 Feb 2004, power details added by BT, Arctic) NB: the UR1 tx's may carry also regional prgr's. (Bernd Trutenau via MWDX 5.2.2003)

711 Dokutchayevsk (DO) a few days ago (very likely on Feb. 1) reactivated after few years of keeping silence. UR1 0400-2300, intermittent with Regional insertions, noted at: 0610-0630, 1610-1700, 1800-1830 (I guess others "standard regional times" too) Most curious that regional sce is NOT "Radio Donetchina" (which would be quite logical), but Golos Kyyiva (Voice of Kyiv), i.e. Kyiv's regional state broadcaster (currently scheduled on IRT FM + wire net) I think it may be the result of continuous 'war' between RRT (keeping government transmitting facilities in UKR) and regional (also state-owned) broadcasting companies. Cf 648 Oktyabr-skoye/R.Krym/Ŕ.Kherson. (V.Titarev, Kremenchuk vid MWDX 4.2.2004)
