- 800 CHAB <u>SK</u>, Moose Jaw 3/7 0531 fair with weather, then nice singing ID followed by a song from Nilsson. New. (DP-OR)
  - +3/10 may longer be "Country," as I heard it strong with oldies and ID at 0901. (LG-MT)
- 810 KBHB <u>SD</u>, Sturgis mixing with KGO 3/8 at 0850 with agriculture talk and an ad for equipment company in Belle Fourche. Kind of neat because as a kid I grew up in Belle Fourche! (DN-UT)
  - KTBI <u>WA</u>, Ephrata very good 3/4 with religious program, gave network stations of the "American Christian Network" of KSPO/KTBI/KBBN/KYAK+, went into Christian news at 2059 then seemingly turned off their transmitter right at 2100 in the middle of a sentence. Assume the other stations on the net with nighttime authorization kept broadcasting. (DN-UT)
- 830 KUYO WY, Evansville 3/8 0900 way on top with religious program. (DN-UT)
- 870 KFLD <u>WA</u>, Pasco 3/4 with KFLD at 2105 then into the Jim Rome Show, good signal. (DN-UT)
- 880 KJJR MT, Whitefish 3/9 0830 with AP network news. (DN-UT)
- 890 ?KLFF? <u>CA</u>, San Luis Obispo assumed to be the one with Greg Laurie religious program. Heard 3/4 2111 then suddenly lost at 2115, possible cut to nighttime power/pattern. (DN-UT)
- 940 KICW <u>OR</u>, Bend here with decent signal 3/5 at 2048 with ESPN programming and "ESPN Radio 9-40 KICE Bend" on the hour. (DN-UT)
  - KNNZ <u>UT</u>, Cedar City 3/9 0836 far from common here in the Salt Lake City area. News and local ads heard. (DN-UT)
- 990 KRKS <u>CO</u>, Denver 3/10 2000 with very poor signal, directly into religious programming after the top of the hour. (DN-UT)
- 1010 ?KXPS? <u>CA</u>, Thousand Palms 3/4 2121 with "Sporting News Radio" programming. No ID heard. (DN-UT)
  - CBR <u>AB</u>, Calgary 3/8 0400 with a sort of ID after running CBC Overnight programming with a woman announcer saying "This is CBC Radio One." Had snippets of what sounded like news from South Africa but maybe from New Zealand? by the accents of the people speaking. Was very weak and under KXEM in a bit of a null. (KR-AZ)
- 1040 CKST <u>BC</u>, Vancouver 3/10 2340 another Canadian surprise on top of the frequency with sports and ad for Staples Business Depot. ID's as "10-40 Sports Radio." (DN-UT)
- 1130 CKWX <u>BC</u>, Vancouver 3/5 0211 news and WSX on the 1's, downtown temperature was 5C and expected low of 4C. Slogan was "News 1130." (KR-AZ)
- 1140 KZMQ <u>WY</u>, Greybull good late afternoon reception 3/4 1830 with C&W, ID "We're the only one playing real country, AM 1140 KZMQ." (DN-UT)
- 1150 KXTA <u>CA</u>, Los Ángeles poor in KSL splash 3/10 1100 with "11-50 KXTA" ID on the hour then back to the San Antonio vs. Clippers game. (DN-UT)
- 1170 KLOK <u>CA</u>, San Jose 3/10 2006 buried KSL splash with Spanish programming, first time heard in Utah. (DN-UT)
  - KJJD CO,. Windsor 3/12 0759 s/on in English & Spanish in the clear. (LG-MT)
- 1210 KUNF UT, Washington finally heard with very weak signal 3/5 at 2009 with ads and into Nat King Cole NOS music. (DN-UT)
- 1220 ?KLVZ? <u>CO</u>, Denver 3/11 0900 believed the Spanish-speaker that looped in that direction. What seemed to be a religious program ended, then ID that sounded like "Radio N Victoria, 1220 AM." There was no call ID. I haven't heard KLVZ in Spanish before, though. (LG-MT)
- 1260 KZNI ID, Idaho Falls 3/10 with Michael Medved show at 1940, and "KZN 6-90, 12-60" ID's. Checked for KZNR-690 an found it to be there and // but much weaker and in KALL-700 splash. (DN-UT)

- 1270 KBZZ <u>NV</u>, Reno 3/10 0800 "The Buzz" extraordinarily well with the Howard Stern show. Full top of the hour ID with mention of Reno and Sparks. (DP-OR)
- 1290 KUMA <u>OR</u>, Pendleton 3/6 0200 finally ID'd, "The Voice of Umatilla County," news and ad for Avacor. Big strong signal, better than ever heard before. (GH-OR)
- 1310 KEIN <u>MT</u>, Great Falls 3/2 0130 NOS type music and ID fair to poor fighting it out with Radio Disney (probably KMKY) but mostly on top. Not heard for a while. (GH-OR)
- 1330 KOVE <u>WY</u>, Lander blasting in at sunset 3/10 1931 with "KOVE Country 13-30" ID's and C&W music. (DN-UT)
- 1350 KSRO <u>CA</u>, Santa Rosa 3/5 0040 sports talk show with fair signal above KRLC fluttering in & out underneath. NC-109 and Sanserino loop. (GH-OR)
- 1380 KRKO <u>WA</u>, Everett 3/4 0100 All Night radio show with Tom Wright, ESPN format. Fair to good signal, deep slow fades, all by itself. Drake with RS loop. (GH-OR)
- 1390 KLGN <u>UT</u>, Logan a semi-local but not easily heard south of Salt Lake. Noted 3/10 at 1922 with oldies/NOS and "Memories 13-90 KLGN" ID's. (DN-UT)
- 1400 KNND <u>OR</u>, Cottage Grove 3/4 0130 C&W music with ID's. Really scratchy in & out of the pileup, poor at best with Drake and RS loop. New! (GH-OR)
- 1420 KUJ <u>WA</u>, Walla Walla 3/10 0800 ended ESPN program and ID's. This is an apparent format change. (LG-MT)
- 1460 KARR WA, Kirkland 3/9 0959 very strong with call ID and mention of Seattle. (LG-MT)
- 1490 KCID ID, Caldwell 3/10 0700 fair, working its way out of the mush for a top of the hour ID mentioning Caldwell and Nampa, followed by news. (DP-OR)
  - KBSR <u>MT</u>, Laurel 3/12 0900 strong and on top with ID as "Big Sky Radio, KBSR, Laurel-Billings." Rarely heard. (LG-MT)
  - KBKR OR, Baker 3/10 0631 good for several seconds then gone, with Eastern Oregon weather. (DP-OR)
- 1570 KPRO <u>CA</u>, Riverside 3/5 1956 with religious programming and CNN Headline news at 1957, then back into Harvest Ministry program. (DN-UT)

Well, it's been ages since I've contributed to this column so perhaps a re-intro is called for. I've been DX-ing since the late '70's concentrating mostly on the MW band and SW utilities. My exposure to radio, however, started way back in the late '50's when my Dad bought me a Hallicrafters S-108 SW receiver for Christmas and I spent many, many long hours scanning the SW bands being absolutely stunned that I was hearing stations halfway around the world. Radio interests fell by the wayside when I discovered girls and cars in high school and most of my college years were spent studying and surfing. I got back into radio sort of by accident when I was trying to hear the local college basketball team on the radio. Tuning the AM band to the station I thought was carrying the game, I was astounded to hear the game being broadcast by the opponent's station 800 miles away; I never knew about long-distance AM reception. Anyway, since then I've been hooked on MW DX. Being a scientist by profession and an experimenter by nature. I soon started tinkering with radio circuits with the result being that I started Radio Plus+ Electronics in the mid-'80's. For those who don't know. I manufacture and sell the Quantum Loops, Phaser, Q-Stick, etc. and have a website (www.dxtools.com) if you are interested in checking out what's available. Which brings up a couple of points...Some of the components of the loops in particular are getting increasingly difficult to find so I'll be changing the circuit of the Quantum Loops before next season and will, unfortunately, have to raise the price by, I'm guessing, 5%-10%. The prices have been the same for several years now but my costs are increasing, sometimes dramatically, and I just have to pass them along...sorry. Club members, however, will continue to receive a 10% discount off the list price. The big news around here is that as of March 1st I am officially retired from my job as a government scientist...hooray. Working for 25 years in an underground laboratory is enough to drive anyone insane. The good news is that I'll now have more time to devote to the radio hobby and Radio Plus+ in particular. I've had a couple of SW products in the prototype stage now for many years and hope to introduce them by next season now that I'll be working only one job instead of two. Heck, I might even have time to DX again, hi. Let's see, what else? Oh yeah, my shack has a slew of radios but my favorites are the Drake R-8 (for MW DX), the Palstar R-30CC (for SW utilities) and the JRC NRD-535D (for general SW listening). Of course I have all manner of antennas, experimental and otherwise, that feed the rigs. Finally, on the local radio scene, WECM-1490 last week changed its format from religious to oldies. It ID's as "WECM, Memories 14-90, Milton, Pace, Pensacola; Radio the way you remember it." That's about it from here. 73...GT

I've heard all the hype about DRM (Digital Radio Mondiale), and I'm simply not impressed with any digital radio system that proposes to desecrate the shortwave bands. DRM signals are incompatible with our current receivers, and I think that we, as shortwave listeners, should stop the DRM consortium from desecrating the shortwave bands with hash that sounds like a Cuban "bubble jammer" obliterating Radio Marti. The sound quality of digital radio is very poor; analog radio is far superior. What is needed is to push alternatives to digitizing the shortwave bands, including requiring all shortwave, mediumwave and longwave receivers to include DSP (Digital Signal Processing) circuitry. There's one digital system that is even worse; it's being pushed by the FCC and the National Association of Broadcasters (NAB). This digital system is called IBOC-DAB, or In-Band, On-Channel Digital Audio Broadcasting. IBOC-DAB is being tried on both MW and FM; the results, so far, have been disastrous. First of all, this system is spectrally inefficient. One MW station in the St. Louis area. KFUO (850 kHz) is testing this system. At my QTH, ten miles from KFUO's transmitter site, the sidebands from the IBOC system used by KFUO wipes out everything from 820 to 870 on a typical receiver (even my hollow-state National NC-60 Special); the sidebands also interfere with the signals of WHB Kansas City, MO (810 kHz), WCBW Highland, IL (880 kHz) and WLS Chicago, IL (890 kHz). The sidebands take up to 80 kHz of spectrum space, while analog only takes up 20 kHz of space. With a typical car radio at close range (one mile from the transmitter site), IBOC-DAB is even more inefficient. At this range, 810 and 890 are wiped out, and 880 suffers from severe interference. On FM, IBOC-DAB can take up over 800 kHz of spectrum space; analog FM takes up less than half the spectrum space of IBOC-DAB. IBOC receivers, like DRM, will be priced out of the range of most consumers; the prices won't go down. The IBOC receivers that have become available are for mobile applications, and cost at least \$900. IBOC's sound quality is very poor; sounding more like an Internet radio station as it's heard via dial-up connection. Analog audio quality also suffers when in "hybrid" mode: the frequency response is worse than analog radio. I am more impressed with AM Stereo and FM Stereo broadcasting; they already produce CD-quality sound. Therefore, the perceived "need" for IBOC-DAB is moot, as there is no market for this failed system. The LW, MW, SW and FM bands are simply not suitable bands for digital radio. As a community, shortwave listeners should also actively fight against the proposed desecration of the MW and FM bands by the technically inferior IBOC system by writing to the FCC. the NAB and the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB), indicating our opposition. For more information on how this system will destroy MW and FM radio, the Virginia Center for The Public Press has a Web site set up at http://www.digitaldisaster.org/. I've been listening to shortwave more often in recent years, due to the lack of listenable and tangible programming available on commercial MW and FM stations in the United States. The concentration of radio ownership on corporate conglomerates (such as Clear Channel, Viacom and Cumulus Media) has diminished the number of viewpoints and tangible music formats I can listen to. The U.S. radio industry is slowly becoming more of a corporate-controlled version of radio in the former Soviet Union. I strongly believe that the broadcast industry should be pushing shortwave as an alternative to low-quality programming on MW and FM, especially in the United States. The FCC should realize that the Cold War is long over, and it's safe to require all radios for mobile and home use (even the best stereo systems) to include the shortwave bands on their radios. They should also realize that digital radio is already a failure on MW and FM: they should look for a separate band (above 1000 MHz, or 1 GHz) for digital audio broadcasting using the proven Eureka 147 system. It's also high time for the FCC and the NAB to de-emphasize excessive profit in their decisions, encourage increased competition, and return radio to being an instrument of community service, regardless of whether it's the local, regional, national or global community. The threat of desecration of the longwave, mediumwave and FM bands by digital radio is a serious concern; we should be active in telling the FCC and our elected officials of this threat. We should actively oppose the use of digital radio systems on LW, MW and FM: DRM and IBOC both threaten the integrity of the aforementioned bands. 73 and good DX from Eric (N0UIH).

Bruce Bacon, N7BWB has a webpage that goes into detail on his radio hardware at http://www.rottieweb.com/Bruce/Radio/RadioPage.htm.

Professor John Bryant of Oklahoma State University encompasses his main interests: architecture, polar exploration and technology, including radio. There's a section on Zenith radios, and a great deal of information on Japanese radio broadcasting, including a comprehensive list of MW stations updated to 2001. Lee Freshwater's BCB DX Logbook covers AM stations in the USA and Canada. Stations are broken down by K- and W- calls, by frequency, by city and by state or province.
