Heard in Westchester. Did note signs along I-405 freeway near airport urging drivers to tune to 1700 for traffic info, but nothing heard. (5P-CA)
- 540 XESUR BCN, Tijuana 5/21 0633 very weak with oldies under CBK. (DN-UT)
- 550 KUZZ CA, Bakersfield 5/7 0350 in fair with KUZZ ID. (CM-CA)
 - KOAC OR, Corvallis 5/7 0400 in poor with "KOAC Corvallis." (CM-CA)
- 570 KVI WA, Seattle 5/7 0405 in poor with KVI ID. (CM-CA)
- 600 CJWW SK, Saskatoon the surprise of the night! Heard briefly 5/2 0044-0047 with C&W music, then quick ID for CJWW Saskatoon. Took call or request from caller in Saskatoon then back into C&W music. KOGO soon killed this one but it was nice to hear if only briefly. (DN/MR-UT)

 - KFXD ID, Boise 5/9 0059 call ID, stations competing, KFI-640 carryover. (RA-NV)
- 670 WSCR <u>IL</u>, Chicago 5/8 2330 noted with sports talk early. Decent signal on top of KBOI. (DN-UT1)
- 680 KNBR CA, San Francisco 5/17 0657 network ads, ID "KNBR San Francisco-Oakland" and "This is KNBR 6-80 San Francisco" into AP network news. Had been noted the day before at 0800 with local non-sports current affairs magazine. Poor, KORL-650 running open carrier. (5P-HI)
 - KWKA NM, Clovis 5/19 0000 very weak but fighting KNBR with oldies music and ID on the hour "KWKA, Your Good Time Oldies Station," then into Simon & Garfunkel song. First new station I've heard on 680 in 15 years! (DN/MR-UT)
- 690 KRCO OR, Prineville 4/29 0757 atop CBU with ID "AM 690, KRCO Country." (LG-MT)
- 720 ?KDWN? NV, Las Vegas 5/15 0711 man said "Cut 33" followed by three pips and news actuality, poor under KUAI which was playing "I Need Love" from Seal, then a C&W song; interesting contrast between news and music. (5P-HI)
- 760 ?KGU?<u>HI</u>, Honolulu 5/20 0155-0200 suspected to be the one with organ music and religious programming under KFMB and I believe KKZN on the Beverage. (DN/MR-UT)

- 770 KTTH WA, Seattle 5/8 2310 Lars Larsen show with guest Luis Palav. Fair signal with KKOB? Underneath. Not heard since October. Drake & RS loop. (GH-OR)
- 790 KGMI WA, Bellingham 4/27 0100 news & talk show in the mix mostly on top. Not heard since February. Poor signal with NC-109 & Select-A-Tenna loop. (GH-OR)
- 800 CKOR <u>BC</u>, Penticton 5/9 0100 AdCon/EZL format and ID. Good signal. Very seldom does this one get over semi-local KPDQ. Rare! NC-109 on E-W wire. (GH-OR)
- 810 KBHB SD, Sturgis 5/19 noted on late, well after sunset at 2045-2105 with almost continuous music and no ID's. Weather just before the hour and then KBHB quick ID and back into music. Completely looped surprisingly weak KGO. (DN/MR-UT)
- 820 WBAP TX, Fort Worth 5/7 0455 in poor with WBAP ID. I don't hear them all the time from Vacaville due to the Mexican on the frequency. (CM-CA)
- 830 WCCO MN, Minneapolis 5/20 Mike caught this one first but it is the first time I have heard them in Utah. 5/20 0121 with sports talk, mixing with CKKY.

- 840 KSWB OR, Seaside 5/6 0105 man said "Memories on the Oregon Coast 840 K-S-W-B," NOS format. Fair to poor. This one seldom gets over the Coast Range.

 Drake with N-S wire. (GH-OR)
- 870 KFLD <u>WA</u>, Pasco 4/27 0045 heard ID and talk program in severe 860 KPAM splatter. Weak but stable with Drake on E-W wire. (GH-OR)
- 900 CKBI SK, Prince Albert 4/27 0030 man said "You're listening to Country 900 CKBI," then wild sounding instrumental on the fiddle. Drake on N-S wire. (GH-OR)
- 920 KVIN CA, Ceres 5/7 0500 in fair with oldies music & KVIN ID. (CM-CA)
 - KPSI <u>CA</u>, Palm Springs 5/1 0615 with an interesting program called Cowboy Corner with stories about the old west and western themes. (KR-AZ)
 - KXLY WA, Spokane 4/27 0000 talk show with faint ID in the jumble. Weak with NC-57B & Sanserino loop. (GH-OR)
- O30 CJCA AB, Edmonton 5/6 0030 suddenly up out of the mix with ID and inspirational music. KSEI underneath, fair to poor with Drake on e-W wire. (GH-OR)
- 990 KATD <u>CA</u>, Pittsburg 5/13 had poor signal and played New Age music with call ID at 0800. In again at 0759 on 5/20 with rap/rock music and ID that sounded like KITS San Francisco and KATD Pittsburg-Sacramento. CBW had faded and I had XECL nulled. (LG-MT)
- 1030 (TIS) CA, 4/26 Emeryville 1845 TIS in Emeryville and Vallejo (WTEI434) not noted while driving through the area. (5P-CA1)
- 1050 KCAA CA, San Bernardino 4/30 1810 tape-delayed Air America Network program "The O'Franken Factor." Heard poor in Pasadena. Also heard with fair signal 5/2 1458 in Irvine with announcer apologizing for power failure interrupting religious program, said they were broadcasting from Carousel Mall in San Bernardino. Used slogans "The Talk Radio Express" & "Where We Leave No Listener Behind." Used NBC sounder before local newscast. This used to be KBBV Big Bear Lake. (5P-CA)
- 1150 KSEN MT, Shelby 5/16 s/on (no SSB) strong at 0758. Sunday s/on is later than usual. (LG-MT)
- 1160 KSL UT, Salt Lake City 4/26 2221 local ads, back to "Sports Final" snow on "Newsradio 11-60 KSL." Fair. (5P-CA2)
 +5/8 0106 out of extreme KXTA-1150 carryover, mentioning ad for Riverton Music Stores (4 locations), call ID "KSL Newsradio 1160," into a talk show. KXTA QRM returning. Very rare. (RA-CA)
- 1170 KFAQ OK, Tulsa 5/8 2345 another station heard clearly in Provo (20 mi south) with talk. I guess that 20 miles further away from KSL definitely makes a difference. (DN-UT1)
 - +5/21 best signal ever as KSL was doing a very quiet talk show and splash was minimal. Political talk program heard at 0648. Interference from KCBQ and unID station with religious programming. (DN-UT)

- 1190 KVCU <u>CO</u>, Boulder 4/25 fair at 0800 and very strong 4/27 at 0900 with same ID by woman. There was xylophone music, and then she said "Radio 1190, K-V-C-U, Boulder." (LG-MT)
 - KEX <u>OR</u>, Portland 5/8 0044 Mother's Day ad, back to talk show. Extremely weak fighting through local KXMX and other stations competing. (RA-CA)
 - XEMO BCN, Tijuana 5/15 0706 completely alone in tight KBEE null. (DN-UT)
- 1220 KGYN OK, Guymon 5/9 2330 ending of a C&W song, ID, actor Leslie Neilson announced a talk show was coming on Came out with stations competing. (RA-CA2)
 - CJRB MB, Boissevain while continuing to unsuccessfully chase the WRIB test, have often recorded classical music on this channel, but never any ID. Finally heard "Classics till dawn...this is CJRB..." by man, fair strength, dominant but not as dominant as the 1230/1210 splash, at 0300 on 4/26. (NHP-BC)
- 1240 KQEN <u>OR</u>, Roseburg 5/1 0130 sportstalk in the mix with unID playing oldies.

 Assumed Canadian, gave temperatures in Celsius. Heard once before back in January. (GH-OR)
- 1250 KZER CA, Santa Barbara 4/23 0000 good on top with ID "KZER, Santa Barbara," ID as "Radio Lazer." (RW-CA)

- MARSHALL IS V7AD, Majuro MAY 20 1032-1040, woman in English apparently reading news, mostly in noise with occasional peaks. Easily identified as it nulls at about 290 degrees, much further north than the down under stations. Not needed. [Moore-FL]

Must be new station as I check this frequency daily and haven't heard a trace of a carrier for some time. - 1475 SABAH Kota Kinabalu (presumed) APR 17 1048-1054 strongest TP carrier ever heard here in Florida. At 1049 threshold level audio with snatches of music and woman's voice, then for about 30 seconds at 1050 a soft woman's voice rose out of the noise. It was not strong enough to determine the language. From there until 1054 occasional traces of music and woman's voice down in the noise. Local sunrise this date 1102. Modulation seems to be very low on this station. It is going to be difficult to pin this one down with no parallels and weak modulation. I believe this station comes in via a very rare gray line propagation. It has a bearing of 330 degrees from Florida and would normally be heard only November to February as the Japanese stations

- are. However I have logged strong carriers or audio from this station on thirty-one mornings since 1998, thirteen times in August and September, fifteen in March and April, two in October and one in November. Checking www.spacew.com/www/realtime I find a perfect gray line from Florida to Sabah during August, September, March and April. The signal peaks between nine and seventeen minutes before Ft Myers sunrise. I have read that gray line reception rarely or never occurs on the broadcast band but I can't find any other explanation for this anomalous reception pattern. Incidentally, this gray line runs from Florida through Georgia and up through Chicago/Milwaukee area. [Moore-FL]
- NEW ZEALAND Radio Sport MAY 3 1034-1054, excellent signal but not 100% readable due to frequent bursts of static from nearby thunder storms. Discussion about recent and upcoming matches in England and Australia. Not sure which sport, possibly Rugby. Mention of Black Cats versus England. Mention of the Advertiser newspaper and commercial for cleaner floors. Threshold level audio also noted MAY 11, 13, 16, 17, 18. [Moore-FL]

May 17, 2004 was a somber day in St. Louis radio. Chuck Norman, owner of WGNU 920 Granite City, IL, passed away that morning in his penthouse across from the station's studios in the Senate apartment building (the old Senate Hotel) in St. Louis' Central West End. Norman, who was in his mid-80s, owned WGNU since its inception in 1961. He started his radio career shortly after the end of World War II as an advertising salesman for WTMV 1490 (now WESL) in East St. Louis; he would eventually move over to WIL 1430 (now WRTH) in St. Louis, where he hosted a late-night talk show called "Norman's Nite Cap". In 1961. WGNU signed on the air as a 500-watt daytimer with a mix of free-form talk and middle-ofthe-road music (or MOR). Four years later, WGNU added an FM outlet at 106.5; one of the first FM Stereo stations in the St. Louis market. The FM side spent the first several years of its existence broadcasting country music. When the AM side went full-time in 1978 by adding 500-watt night service, Norman put WGNU-FM up for sale. While the FM has passed through several owners over the last quarter century, Norman held on to the AM station, which became the voice of St. Louis public opinion. He took a special interest in the day-to-day operations of the station until just a few weeks before he passed. Not only was Norman involved with the station, he was also very involved in the St. Louis community, volunteering with numerous charities. He also became famous for his billboards, always starting out with "Chuck Norman says". His last billboard campaign, started after the terrorist attacks on New York and Washington, DC on September 11, 2001, had them saying "God Bless America". He was also known for his Christmas parties, which raised money for over 50 charities dealing with children with disabilities. I had the honor and privilege of working for him during late 1996 and early 1997 as an engineer and news reader. WGNU was one of the last radio stations in the St. Louis area owned by a single individual; the last FM station owned by a single individual, WFUN-FM 95.5 (the station I worked for after my brief stint at WGNU), was sold in 1999. The station will pass to the employees. On May 20, 2004, WGNU broke from their regular free-form talk format to broadcast the old MOR format from 0700 to 0100 ELT.

Several radio and TV stations in St. Louis also paid tribute; I dedicated the Thursday morning show on WSIE 88.7 (where I was filling in that morning) to the memory of Chuck Norman. I can tell you several stories of my brief time at WGNU, but they would make this Forum too long. St. Louis has lost an icon of local radio. God bless Chuck Norman. 73.

Passive Broadband Phasing including Mini-DXP-5 phasing unit design

Phasing units that have been used widely in the medium-wave (AM broadcast band) DXing and 160-meter amateur radio communities have largely been either of a broadband design using active circuitry (e.g. ANC-4, MFJ-1026, Quantum Phaser, DXP-3) or of a tuned design using passive or active circuits (MWDX-5, Superphasers, etc.). What has not been generally available is a phaser encompassing broadband shifting and passive circuitry. Broadband and tuned approaches both have advantages and disadvantages. The same can be said of passive versus active circuits.

Broadband phasing allows the operator to move about the band without needing to make continual adjustments of the phasing unit controls. This also helps when checking for the same broadcast on parallel frequencies. With some antenna combinations, a null set up on one frequency in a given direction may be fairly effective plus or minus 100 kHz (or more) from that operating frequency.

Tuned phasing can sometimes provide better sensitivity and, more importantly for urban users, reduction in the strengths of off-frequency stations that could otherwise cause mixing spurs / images.

Passive circuits are recommended in areas where overloading is likely to be a problem. Passive and tuned would be the way to go in the most hostile urban receiving situations. The MWDX-5 [reference 1] offers this capability. In addition it has an amplifier that can be switched in for more sensitivity at sites with a less aggressive blend of incoming signals. Up to now, most passive phasing designs have been of the R-L-C tuned style.

Active circuits offer higher sensitivity, gain, and - if properly designed - improved noise figure. Since all variations of the phasing process involve some signal loss, having amplifier gain - preferably ahead of the shifting components - will preserve the ability to hear threshold-level signals presented from the antenna system components. Low-noise FET's used with L-C tuning in a preselector configuration on each of the two antenna inputs give the best possible signal-to-noise ratio: in some cases superior to that of the receiver itself. The

penalty is the lack of frequency agility inherent to tuned-circuit approaches. Broadband active phasing - to now the only common implementation of the broadband approach - has many advantages. Amplifier gain can largely mitigate the deleterious effects of phase-shifter insertion loss. The result is a noise figure nearly as good as what could be had with a direct antenna to receiver connection. The broadband phasing advantages of frequency agility and potentially wideband nulls towards a noise or "pest station" direction can be obtained. In recent years, some very popular phasing units using broadband active operation (notably the Quantum Phaser and the MFJ-1026) have become available. Many of these are in use throughout the world and results are usually positive. Hams and broadcast DXers can now create directive patterns and null out interference in ways that were not always achievable with loops or other previous methods.

The big "caveat" with all of the active broadband designs is the likelihood of spurious signals (intermodulation distortion products) caused by the overloading of amplifier circuitry. This has been the single biggest complaint raised by users of these units. Some have, of necessity, been driven back to the tuned R-L-C approach as the only feasible method in their high-RF areas.

Passive Broadband Phasing: another solution

If the advantages of broadband phasing can be presented in a circuit that is passive (and therefore overload-proof), users in strong signal areas can have the benefits of frequency agility / wideband nulls without the "headache" of spurious responses popping up all over the place. This concept is introduced in the Mini-DXP-5 Phasing Unit, described in this article.

Mini-DXP-5 Phasing Unit (variants: DXP-5, DXP-5A, DXP-5B, Super-DXP-5)




Figure 1: input section Mini-DXP-5 schematic





Figure 2: output section Mini-DXP-5 schematic

The Mini-DXP-5 is similar to the previous DXP-3 design [reference 2] except that a 9:1 stepdown transformer replaces the buffer amplifier used to convert the high impedance at the summing junction (arm of R3 phase shift potentiometer) to a low impedance suitable for a 50-ohm receiver input. To provide a lower probability of spurious responses, homebrew transformers using binocular cores are used in place of the small Mini-Circuits types used in the DXP-3 and some of the other similar designs. Figure 3 shows the binocular core and Figure 4 shows the method of winding transformers on one of these cores. The 2-turn primary and 2-turn secondary shown in Figure 4 are merely for illustration. Different numbers of windings are used on the Mini-DXP-5's actual transformers (T1, T2, and T3) as noted on the second schematic page (Figure 2). Figure 1 is the first of the two Mini-DXP-5 schematic drawings. This is such a simple circuit that parts lists and hole-drilling tables are not included. Those provided with DXP-3 should give a reasonable starting point for the experienced homebrewer.

As noted in other articles, the object of a phasing unit is to combine the contributions of two antennas at a 180 degree phase relation in order to null out a dominant signal (or noise) and let otherwise-inaudible weaker co-channel and adjacent channel signals come through from directions away from the general compass bearing of the null.

Mini-DXP-5, as shown, is optimized for medium wave (300 to 3000 kHz) operation. Reducing the values of C6 and C7 from 820 pF to something like 330 pF will give better nulling adjustment at frequencies above 3 MHz. Increasing the values of these capacitors to something on the order of 2200 pF each and increasing transformer turns some (while keeping roughly the same ratios) will improve usability down in the longwave range (i.e. 125 to 500 kHz). Phase shifting is wideband in nature: tuning is not required. With broadband phasing, a null set up in a given direction is often effective plus or minus 100 kHz or more from the set-up frequency.

The two antennas used should be somewhat different in directional pick-up characteristics (e.g. loop versus whip) if physically close to each other. Similar antenna types may be used if they are separated by at least 30 m / 100 ft. along the axis pointing towards signals to be nulled.



Mini-DXP-5 DXpedition Phasing Unit Figure 1 : Input Section

The Mini-DXP-5 allows independent observation of each input line as well as providing two combined signal (null) positions. This enables the user to balance amplitudes accurately, at least if the receiver has an S-meter, before adjusting the phase for a null. For good null depth, each of the two input lines must have a similar strength of the signal to be nulled.

There is an input (J6) for DC power on the Mini-DXP-5 even though the unit is passive. This is provided so that power may be provided to external active antennas (such as the MFJ-1024 whip) or to line amplifiers following low-gain antennas such as Pennants. If you never expect to use active antennas, you can simplify the design by deleting C3, C4, C5, J3, J4, J6, RFC1, and RFC2: all of these components are used to support the operation of active antennas or external line-amps.

Mini-DXP-5 DXpedition Phasing Unit Figure 2: Output Section

In high-signal urban areas, one could benefit from passive L-C preselection on each of the two input lines ahead of the unit. This can be accomplished with an **MWTU-1** outboard accessory on each input (see **Accessories**, an appendix to this article). In most cases, this isn't necessary.

Another accessory that may be usable is an external antenna amplifier, at least when you're using the Mini-DXP-5 in rural areas or with low-signal antennas such as Flags, Pennants, or BOG's (Beverage-on-ground). The **XA-1 Transfer Amplifier**, shown in the **Accessories** section, can fulfill this need. Its transfer feature couples the antenna through passively if DC power is not provided via choke-coupling to the coaxial center conductor. If power is provided, the amplifier, with about 20 dB of gain, kicks in. XA-1 has different input transformers to accommodate a variety of antennas including those in the terminated-loop family (Pennant, Flag, Kaz, Ewe, K9AY, etc.), broadband closed loops, noise-reduced slopers, verticals, Beverages, random wires, etc.

Operating the Mini-DXP-5

Practicing on stable daytime medium wave groundwave signals is the best way to become familiar with the unit's operation. When starting out, choose a frequency having some evidence of a second station under the dominant one.

Initial set-up:

- Connect a passive (unpowered) antenna to J1, or connect an active antenna (such as an MFJ-1024 whip) to J3.
- Connect the second antenna to J2 (if passive) or J4 (if active).
- Connect a DC power source of +12 volts (min.) to +18 volts (max.) to J6 if you had connected anything to J3 or J4.
- Connect the receiver, via coaxial cable, to J5.
- Set R1 and R2 fully clockwise.

Amplitude Balancing:

- Set R3 to center.
- With S1 on 1, observe the level of the dominant signal (or noise) to be nulled. Also
 do this with S1 on 2.
- If the signal level had been greater in the S1 = 1 position, adjust R1 so that the signal level measured with S1 on 1 is equal to that obtained with S1 on 2.
- Conversely, if the signal level had been greater in the S1 = 2 position, adjust R2 so that the signal level measured with S1 on 2 is equal to that obtained with S1 on 1.

Nulling:

- Set S1 to Null-a and adjust R3 for the best reduction of the dominant signal to be removed. Also do this R3 adjustment with S1 set to Null-b. Leave S1 on the null position which gave the deeper, better-defined null.
- Finish up the null by small interactive adjustments of R3, R1, and R2.

Occasionally it may help to set R1 and R2 "fully clockwise minus 1 hour" (e.g. pointers at "4 o'clock" if fully clockwise is "5 o'clock") and then go back to the "Amplitude Balancing" section and proceed forward from there.

Variants: DXP-5, DXP-5A, DXP-5B, Super-DXP-5

DXP-5 is a more complex version that contains two switchable input amplifiers similar to what would be used in the external XA-1 accessory. **DXP-5A** contains a switchable output amplifier which can be selected instead of T3 after the summing junction. This is of a high-to-low impedance / gain type such as BBVA-A or BUF-B. **DXP-5B** contains a pair of switchable input amps and the single switchable output amplifier (i.e. features of both the DXP-5 and DXP-5A). **Super-DXP-5** contains all the above and also provides switchable L-C tank circuits on each input, similar to what using the MWTU-1 external accessory would achieve.




Figure 5: MWTU-1 passive medium-wave tuner accessory





Figure 6: XA-1 transfer amplifier accessory




Figure 7: other amplifiers that can be used in the XA-1 box
