also from the IRCA eGroup: THREE TIJUANA-AREA AM STATIONS ARE CHANGING FREQUENCIES

This week our email inbox was much abuzz with reports of Mexican AM stations changing frequencies. The reason for the changes is that the FCC and the SCT (Mexico's FCC) have reached an agreement on how interference from Mr. Bonilla's three AM stations is to be resolved. CGC's consulting office has seen copies of the actual SCT authorizations, so here, authoritatively, is what is going on with respect to the Bonilla frequencies and power levels:

XEKTT from 560 to 1700 kHz, 10 kW fulltime

XESS from 780 to 620 kHz, 5 kW fulltime

XESDD from 920 to 1030 kHz, 5 kW fulltime

XEKTT has already moved to 1700 kHz but is reportedly having trouble loading such a short wavelength into their very tall tower. XESS' operation on 620 kHz has been intermittent; more will be said about this station in an upcoming Communicator. Finally, XESDD has reportedly not been on the air on 920 kHz due to a frequency conflict within Mexico, and so far the station has not lit up on 1030.

Enquiring minds are asking why Mr. Bonilla would switch one of his Mexican stations to 1030 kHz when he already operates a 1040 kHz station (KURS) in San Diego. The mutual sideband interference should be interesting.

In other news, the U.S. and Mexico have reportedly agreed to reduce or adjust XEMO(AM)'s parameters to bring that station's operation into compliance with the U.S./Mexican AM agreement. XEMO operates on 860 kHz. No details of that settlement are available at this time.

Grayland DX Report – Guy Atkins

Another enjoyable Grayland DXpedition is in the history books. Taking part were John Bryant, Don Nelson, Walt Salmaniw, and myself. This Thursday through Sunday DXpedition coincided with Grayland's annual kite festival; we had good fun trying to impress the kiters with the DXing hobby, and vice-versa. Did you know that some kites cost as much as a Ten-Tec RX340? You do now!

Mediumwave reception was the worst overall we've ever experienced in 15 years of DXing from the Washington State coast, so I roamed the tropical bands most of the time. However I did manage to log the rarely heard, 2 kilowatt 8RN stations in Darwin (657 kHz) & Katherine (639 kHz), both in the Northern Territory. 657 was clearly parallel to R. Australia on 9580, and 639 was parallel the ABC (VL8A) on 2310.

On the shortwave side of the spectrum, Walt and I were determined to get an ID out of RPDT Manggarai (2960v). However, in 3+ hours of monitoring this tantalizing signal we never noted an ID. Catholic Radio Network (4960) in Papua New Guinea boomed in with excellent reception on July 11th, providing 100% readability during a live broadcast of the Catholic Bishops Conference of PNG. It was interesting too, to hear advertisements on CRN on July 9th-ads with local flavor just like those found on the PNG regionals.

I have not yet logged any references to place names. Going back over my UNID logs for this frequency for the past few months I find one entry which included many "Radio 91" ID's. Another included a bachata vocal. I assume these logs are from the Dominican station. A very unique situation I think where 2 different LA harmonics are audible on basically the same split frequency in different parts of the world. (Mohrmann-VT, HCDX)

AUSTRALIA: 2KY Racing Radio / 'SKY Racing' has commissioned a new outlet on 1593 to serve the Tweed Valley, Murwillumbah, South Gold Coast. The transmitter site is at Terranora over looking the Tweed River. Co-sited with the ABC's 2ML. Power is 400 watts but doesn't do as well here as 2ML due to the wavelength. Heard it this morning at 1930z announcing: This is a test transmission from 2KY / Sky Racing... if you are experiencing any interference please call....". This program is satellite feed from 2KY Sydney. The top loaded anti fade radiator for 2ML doesn't suite this new broadcaster! (Chris Martin, MWOZ)

KOREA (SOUTH): The following is the schedule for HLAZ-1566. I got this from their sign off announcement in KK on 26 March at 1100. CC1100-1230, JJ1230-1345, CC1345-1730, RR1730-1800, KK1900-1100. (Bill Harms)

MARSHALL ISLANDS: 1224 AFN Kwajalein is the new name for the former Central Pacific Net work, which in turn replaced the last remaining active WWII Jungle Network callsign WXLG some years ago. As 1220, WXLG was frequently heard in NZ during the 1950's and even conducted a special DX program for their Kiwi listeners and were swamped with reports. These days, AFN Kwajalein operates on 1224 with 1 kW, a channel covered in both Australia and NZ, but a long shot possibility for those able to null the locals involved. The program format is easy to recognize, being a 24 hour relay of National Public Radio sent via satellite from Huntsville, AL. Local IDs are inserted during program breaks, but the only local programs on the atoll now come over the 101.1 FM outlet during mornings and afternoon. Rest of the time, the 3 FM relays all carry AFRTS music channels from Huntsville. Well worth having a crack at this one around 1100-1500, even earlier in winter. (David Ricquish, Mar 2004 NZ DX Times)

NEW ZEALAND: Expressions of interest in broadcasting on the reserved community frequency of 810 AM in Auckland have been called by the Ministry for Culture & Heritage who control such channels. Must be a new format, have funding in place and operate as a non-profit with maximum 50% income from advertising and owner can't hold another license in Auckland. Successful bidder is announced June 30 and station must be on air by September 30. 810 ran 2kW as Access Radio before moving to FM as Planet FM several years ago. My personal pick is an Asian access station with predominately Korean and Japanese language programs, and Korean religious programming. No doubt based in the North Shore/ Takapuna area. I hear such groups have been unsuccessfully trying to buy time on Planet FM for several years. On a population basis, Auckland still warrants another Asian AM. (David Ricquish, MWOZ)

SOLOMON ISLANDS: Radio Hapi Isles (Solomon Islands Broadcasting Corporation) reactivated the Radio Temotu regional broadcast last week, with a new Taiwanese funded transmitter on 1386 AM from Lata. Previously operated as 5kW on this channel but has been silent for some 4-5 years because of lack of parts, no funds and a collapsed civil society. Lata

currently relays the National Service from Honiara //5020 SW, but is investigating local programs once housing for local staff arranged. SIBC is using a standby generator because of poor local power supplies in Lata. This signal should easily get into Australia, but the 10kW Radio Tarana on 1386 in Auckland makes NZ reception difficult. Another indication that things are getting more stable in the islands after the Australian/NZ intervention force took control - UCB's Christian FM station in Honiara is also now about to come on air according to the SIBC website. SIBC also uses 1035 AM from Honiara (10kW) and 945 AM from Gizo (10kW) as well as Radio Wantok on FM in Honiara. (David Ricquish, MWOZ)

BELGIUM: RTBF-1125 at La Louvière no longer carries Radio 21 but instead VivaCité now. VivaCité is the former, recently relaunched Fréquence Wallonie. I understand that further reshuffelings of programs and FM frequencies are in preparation, also involving the current Radio 21 still carried on Liège 1233 and Marche 1305. (Kai Ludwig, March 7). In a few weeks' time, Radio 21 will be split into two radio stations: Classic 21, which will carry older pop and rock music, and Pure FM, a new youth station. The latter will be carried on 1233 and 1305. (Herman Boel, Belgium, March 7, MWC via DXLD)

CYPRUS: Radio Monte Carlo - Moyen Orient (RMC-MO) officially confirmed that the mediumwave transmitter in Cape Greco on 1233 is operated with 600 kW (which is half of the installed 1200 kW), both during the transmissions of RMC-MO and during relays of TWR. (Bernd Trutenau, Lithuania, Feb 25, MWDX via DXLD)

HUNGARY: Magyar Katolikus Rádio (Hungarian Catholic Radio) on 1341 is very strong here. The station seems to start at 0300 (tuned in at 0303 and heard an identification). They play mostly classical music at this early morning hour. (Karel Honzik, mwc)

Same here, they put out an enormous signal. Heard them with a test loop consisting of church organ music, religious choruses and IDs in Hungarian on 29.5 from 1945 to 2015 hours. On a Sony ICF2001D placed in a loop antenna rock-solid SINPO 55555. No beep of Lisnagarvey left. Sounds like more than 135 kW. (Martin Elbe, mwc/mwdx)

It can be noted the planned power is stated here with 2.5kW, while the organizer's website www.amradio.nu is currently claiming both "2500 Watts" and "25 kW" in different versions of the text. Hi from Sweden; have to correct your info about Radio Scandinavia having financing problem. No such problem, but it takes time to get transmitters, antennas and studio equipment in right place. Will start up with 1000 watt, and then we have to find a place for the big mast of 60m. The 25 kW transmitter is on it way to England to be adjusted from 1143 to 603. The parts are coming from Canada. An antenna has to be mounted on the ship and adjusted for 603. Roy Sandgren in an email (8/4-2004). (Ydun Ritz MW News)

FRANCE: 603 R Notre Dame des Ondes via RF Lyon. Only Sundays until 1800. Heard with church sce and with local ID before closing down and over to RF. (Bjorn Fransson-SWE, dswci DXW Mar 25 via BCDX)

Superloustic has started its first program today [24 March] at noon on Paris area on 999. web : **www.superloustic.net**. They have an audio stream 96 k stereo on their web site. The station will start in Marseille area (south east of France) on 675 in May. (Thierry Vignaud via Bengt Ericson) The 5 kW transmitter, operated by Télédiffusion de France (TDF), is located in Villebon-sur-Yvette, Southwest of Paris. Superloustic is targeting children of 7-11 years of age, and much of the programming is children's music - modeled after the success of Radio Disney in the United States. Later on the station plans to launch a transmitter in Marseille on 675 (1000 kW), but another proposed transmitter in Nice on 1467 is used by MC One from Monaco. Superloustic used to be a national FM network created in 1987 in Lyon, but was shut down in 1992 because of financial problems. The station is now hoping to make a comeback on the mediumwave band. Superloustic was licensed a year ago (see DXing.info Mar 2003). (via DXing.info, Mar 23, updated Mar 27)

1314 This frequency, which will be used by Loisirs AM from the Villebon site, has started its tests. (via Steve Whitt, MWC e-mail news 1 Apr 2004)

Today I received a confirmation letter from RNT 1575. It is a very nice letter, telling that it is a surprise to receive my reception report. In the near future they will have their website **www.radiont.com.** Because of 10 other reception reports they received they have the idea to open a special DX page on their website and they asked me the authorization to quote my name on this page. However, they also write they will change to DRM within about 24 months!!!! Not such a nice idea for DXers. (Max van Arnhem, MWC 24 Mar 2004)

GERMANY: I just received an official message from SWR Cont.Ra (dated 04.05.04) that their medium wave transmitter in Heidelberg on 711 has been closed down. They now advise listeners to tune to 1017/711. Further to the same announcement, the transmitter in Mühlacker on 576 is active. (Herman Boel, mwdx)

IRELAND: Details from Catholic Radio Update about Solas Radio, which is still in the planning stage. Solas Radio. (AM freq. unkn.) (10,000 watts). Solas Raidio Teoranta, Ltd., The Liturgical Centre, Whitecross, Newtownpark Ave., Stillorgan, County Dublin. E-mail: **croninjd@indigo.ie**. Ecumenical station. Not on the air; projected 24 hr.

RTE revamp will see Radio 1 on long wave. RTE is making a number of changes in how it broadcasts its radio services, with the introduction of the long wave service which will broadcasts radio all of Ireland and parts of Britain. Radio 1 will cease broadcasting on medium wave for three to five months from July while engineering work takes place on the transmitter in Tullamore. This transmitter may be replaced in the next two to three years, allowing the station to use emerging technologies. The State broadcaster yesterday said that it would no longer broadcast 2FM on medium wave. This service had cost up to £500,000 a year but only 4pc of the station's audience listen on this frequency. RTE plans to shut the music station's medium wave service completely in April, while medium wave broadcasts of 2FM in Dublin ceased in January.

The 55-acre site of the Athlone medium wave transmitter, which has been used for such services since 1932, may be sold off in part, while plans for a regional production unit and museum are being considered. In preparation for the break in Radio 1's medium wave service, RTE is launching Radio 1 on long wave 252 on St Patrick's Day [MARCH 17] at an annual cost of around £650,000. Programming will include sport and religious content currently available on medium wave. This long wave service will be provided indefinitely and is not being launched as a commercial venture. (Samantha McCaughren, The Irish Independent, via Steve Whitt, MWC e-mail news 5 Mar 04)

Medium wave transmission of RTÉ 2FM is set to close on Monday. This is according to engineering announcements which are interrupting 2FM's medium wave service every hour advising of the impending closure. The announcements are being aired on both of the two remaining 2FM medium wave transmitters - 612 from the historic Athlone transmitter site, and the low-powered Cork transmitter on 1278. The transmitter serving Dublin on 1278 was closed last December. (radiowaves via Mike Terry, mwdx 11 Apr 04)

An automated station which has been broadcasting on medium wave from Dublin's southside for a number of months has gone live and identified as Energy Power 1593AM. Playing a mix of music old and new, the station's powerful signal should breathe life into the ailing MW band. (Radiowaves, 18 Apr 04, via Mike Terry, mwdx)

ITALY: According to announcements on the air, from May 15 RAI will broadcast on MW only Radio 1, along with regional opt-outs and special programs (e.g. programs for the blind). Radios 2 and 3 will continue on FM only. (Stefano Valianti, mwc)

Andrea Borgnino reports: Radiotelevisione Italiana (RAI), the national broadcaster of Italy, is closing down dozens of transmitters on the mediumwave band. RAI has been broadcasting its three national radio networks on mediumwave, but starting May 15, only one combined AM service will remain. RAI has been using a total of 127 mediumwave transmitters, including one located in France on 702. According to Italian DXers Enrico Callerio and Dario Monferini, only 46 transmitters will remain. Of the many frequencies used by RAI, 846, 981, 1305, 1332, 1512 and 1602 are expected to be vacated, while the number of transmitters on the remaining frequencies will be reduced dramatically. Also the 702 transmitter in France will bond. (Media Network, via dxing.info)

LUXEMBOURG: Confirming rumours circulating in the UK over the past few months, Luxembourg-based commercial broadcaster RTL Group has released a promotional DVD which sets out its strategy for using Digital Radio Mondiale (DRM). One of the options under consideration is reviving the English service, which ran until the early 90's on mediumwave 1440. A chart showing requested usage of longwave, mediumwave and shortwave for DRM indicates that RTL has requested a shortwave frequency covering the UK, while mediumwave and longwave are under consideration. Other DRM expansion plans include a shortwave service for transcontinental/eastern Europe, a mediumwave service for Belgium and the Netherlands, and a fourth RTL network for France. RTL says it expects DRM consumer receivers to be shipping in quantity by the second half of 2005. http://medianetwork.blogspot.com/. (see website for chart) (5 May via mwdx)

MONACO: 702 Rai Radio 2, via Col de la Madone, Montecarlo, has disappeared. The transmitter was in use 0500-2300 serving a vast area from Rome to Barcelona along the Mediterranean Coast from Italy to France and Spain, also in daytime. From a phone call with Montecarlo Radiodiffusion I learned Rai had not renewed their contract with them and the transmitter is off since about Mar 01. Rai has not issued any news about this fact. As a consequence we can now listen to Turkey on the freq at night (Luigi Cobisi, Firenze and Paolo Morandotti, Milano, Mar 13, DSWCI DX Window March 24 via DXLD)

NETHERLANDS: Quality Radio has lots of format ideas but no transmitter sites Thursday, March 18, 2004 As the June 1st deadline looms for holders of broadcasting licenses in the Netherlands to get their stations on the air if they haven't already done so, Dutch company Quality Radio says it has plenty of formats in mind. Director Ruud Poeze has told media site radio.nl that one will be a station playing traditional Dutch music. He also wants to start a "jammin' oldies" station playing music fom the 60's and 70's. Quality Radio believes these two formats will work on mediumwave, for which it holds six licenses. Poeze says he is in talks with various potential business partners. He believes advertisers focus too much on the under 35's, when more than half the population are 35 and older. That's the sector that Quality Radio is concentrating on.

In the future, Quality Radio would also like to start an adult alternative and a talk station, and if possible a station playing jazz and swing from the 30's and 40's. Poeze says that he doesn't plan to lease any more frequencies to other broadcasters, like the deal for 1395 with Radio 10 Gold. He says this was an exceptional case because Radio 10 Gold was the big loser in the 2003 frequency allocations. The biggest problem is finding sites for the transmitters, says Poeze. (Andy Sennitt via Mike Terry, MWDX 18.3.2004)

1008 Radio London 1008 set to launch by June deadline. The new English-language station Radio London, which is licensed to broadcast from the Netherlands on 1008, looks set to get on the air before the deadline of 1st June 2004, the date on which licenses that haven't been activated are automatically annulled. The station now has a Web site 'under contruction' [sic], including a draft program schedule. As well as 1008, Radio London will also broadcast to the UK via Sky Digital. In fact, the satellite license was issued in June 2002, a full year before the company learned it had been successful in getting a mediumwave license in the Netherlands. According to the Web site, the station will feature "some familiar voices and some fresh new ones too!" The Web site also says "We've been very busy making sure that when Big L launches later this year, it'll sound just right! Capturing the atmosphere and some of the magic which is missing from today's radio." (RNW MN NL via via BrDXC-UK Mar 24)

SYRIA: After checking Syria for a while here is my report about the MW frequencies of both networks coming from Syria: program one (Radio Syria) "Idha'at aljamhouria Alarabia alsourya min Dimashq", IS starts at 0315; around 0325 the program starts with the national anthem of Syria, followed by the list of frequencies as follows:

TUNISIA: No more regional sce. from Tunisia on MW: Radio Sfax (720) is inactive since last year, now it's inactive also Radio Monastir (603). (Roberto Scaglione, via S Whitt, mwc)

UNITED ARAB EMIRATES: Acc. to info from VT Merlin Communications, the transmitter in Dhabbaya on 1314 is carrying 24h BBC programming since at least autumn 2002, in Arabic, Farsi, English and Pashto. There are no relays of Emirates Radio or VOA/RFE-RL. This transmitter has a power of 1000kW and is used with directional antennas at 46 and 316 degrees (depending on the service carried). It is owned by Emirates Media and operated by VT Merlin Communications. (Bernd Trutenau, mwdx)

UNITED KINGDOM: All 40 BBC Local Radio stations across the English Regions are to be streamed on the internet - meaning that listeners who log on can access their local service no matter where they are. The announcement follows last year's decision to broadcast all the national and regional variations of BBC ONE to audiences across the UK on the digital satellite platform and, like that move, reflects the BBC's strategy of making its local and regional services as widely available as possible.

Āndy Griffee, Controller, BBC English Regions, says: "More and more people are listening to radio through the internet, especially on their office desk tops. Until now local radio stations were not part of the BBC's online distribution. This breakthrough means that listeners across the UK now have greatly increased choice of BBC stations. It will also provide us with the opportunity to create new program formats and content spanning different local stations."

The service will be phased in later this year on the BBC's Where I Live sites and will be accessible to people with both narrowband and broadband connections.

BBC Radio Scotland, Radio Nan Gaidheal, Radio Wales, Radio Cymru and Radio Ulster are all streamed on the internet already and are also available on Digital Satellite and Freeview TV. BBC London 94.9 is already available on the internet. (from **ukRadio.com**, via John Faulkner, mwc)

TenTec RX340 vs. AOR AR7030, Racal RA1772 and ICOM IC-R75 by Jan Alvestad

The purpose of this comparison is to attempt to find out which of these fine receivers is the most capable at locations with nearby strong or very strong transmitters. With my main DX interest geared toward the reception of weak trans Atlantic stations on the mediumwave band, the main focus will be on how well the receivers perform in this band. The 1200 kW NRK Kvitsøy transmitter on 1314 kHz, just 30 kilometers to the north-northwest of my location, is a real challenge for the front end of any receiver. During the test I've used various antennas ranging from a high signal level beverage pointed to the southwest to a small Pennant. While the Pennant usually has 1314 kHz at the S9+50dB level, the beverage normally pulls in Kvitsøy with S9+75dB. At and near local sunset even stronger signals have been noted with the most extreme level at S9+95dB.



RX340 vs. AR7030





Before I got the TenTec RX340 on loan, my only receiver was an AOR AR7030. The RX340 is deceptively simple to use. Mastering the basic functions is easy, however, it will take days and weeks to discover how to best utilize this receiver in a particular listening session. My first impression was that this was a superb receiver well suited for mediumwave DXing. The RX340 is excellent for Sync AM scanning and detects faint carriers both visually and audible, even in the presence of strong nearby signals. Its passband tuning capabilities is another of the strong points. With time I came to discover that this receiver has several shortcomings, some of them serious. It is a shame that the excellent Sync AM detection capability is let down by the inability to keep the sync on those weak signals. SSB DXing is unpleasant when using filter widths narrower than 4.0 kHz, mainly because of the much poorer than expected audio but also because the digital filters do not exhibit impressive ultimate selectivity. The main shortcoming is, surprisingly, the inability of the front end to handle very strong signals.

In the table below I've compared some of the important DX related features of the RX340 and the AR7030. I've used a scale ranging between 1 and 10 where 1 is useless or very poor while 10 is excellent.

Mixing products were noted on all 9 kHz spacings above 1611 kHz. Only white noise (no audio) was noted on 1314 kHz! With lower signal levels the RX340 performed well and I could occasionally hear trans Atlantic stations on 1300 and 1330 kHz, something which was never possible with the AR7030. |

Racal RA1772



The RA1772 was produced by Racal for a relatively short period in the 70's, just before the transition to microcontroller-based receivers. In several ways it is the ultimate of what was possible to achieve at the time. Even today there are not many receivers which will outperform the RA1772. Of course, user friendliness has become better over the years and features such as memories and fixed (user selectable) step scanning are simple not there. The successors RA1778 (in particular the US version RA6778), RA1779 and RA1792 were the next steps towards more modern receivers.

Icom R75

The R75 has been on the market since 1999. This is a fairly small receiver which packs lots of features at a low price. The DSP module with its automatic notch filter is a must. The DSP noise reduction facility could perhaps have been more efficient. What makes this receiver attractive in addition to its low price is that most of its shortcomings can be eliminated. An otherwise excellent design has a few weaknesses, several of which are addressed by the modifications offered by Kiwa Electronics. With those modifications installed this receiver has good audio, a usable sync AM feature, and is at least as sensitive for mediumwave DX as any other receiver I've tried. Surprisingly the receiver has a better front end than most other well regarded receivers, particularly when considering that the MW attenuation pad has been completely removed. The addition of good crystal filters in the second and third IFs will make this set hard to beat.
