Saturday, October 22, 2004 - WRCG-1420, Columbus, GA will conduct a DX test from 12:00 am - 1:00 am EDT. The test will include Morse code IDs. The station normally runs a news/talk format. A loop of the code and the voice version of the code will be played, with the two alternating code/vocal/code/etc. The station regularly runs at 5 kW ND.

- 2. Central DX Roundup -- west of the following "85 degrees longitude through Canada, Michigan and Indiana. At the point where the 85 degree line touches the Ohio River, the boundary becomes the Ohio, and to the south, the Mississippi River" to 110 degrees longitude.
- 3. Western DX Roundup -- west of 110 degrees longitude.
- 4. Eastern DX Forum -- East of Mississippi river and the Manitoba-Ontario border.
- 5. Western DX Forum -- West of Mississippi river and the Manitoba-Ontario border.
- 6. Members living on or adjacent to the boundary lines will be permitted to report to the section they feel more closely represents their conditions, subject to provision 7.
- 7. Provision 6 is not to be interpreted to permit a member to switch back and forth between two sections. In that event, such member's permanent section will be decided by the two editors involved. Their judgement will be final."

- 540 **JAPAN**, Syncros, JJ talk here, Network 1 //531 in the jumble at 1410 10/10. (PM-OR)
- 558 JAPAN, Kobe, JOCR good as usual with woman in JJ and pop music 1415 10/10 (PM-OR)
- 594 **JAPAN**, Tokyo NHK 1 10/5 1332. Heard with a possible newscast by serious sounding JJ ancr. Good signal. (GA-WA)
- 657 UNID, odd sounding CC type language at 1410 8/8, o/DRK. May have been China or Taiwan. Fairly strong. (PM-OR)
- 693 JAPAN, Tokýo JOAB NHK2 10/5 1335 Good signal with male and female JJ ancrs presenting EE lessons //747. (GA-WA)
- 738 CHINA, Hunan PBS 9/25 1355, Female ancr in CC, with generic "Zhongyang Renmin Guangbo Diantai" ID noted at 1400 and found // 4990 shortly thereafter. Fair to good. (GA-WA)
- 747 **JAPAN**, Sapporo JOIB NHK2 9/25 1345. Male and female ancrs with amusing EE lessons. Good signal during peaks. (GA-WA)
- 774 **JAPAN**, Akita JOUB loud and clear with EE News 1422 UTC, some 15 minutes after the sun came over the mountains.//828 seemed to fade out by 1415. (CN-BC)
- 328 JAPAN, Osaka JOBB 10/2 1314 man in JJ //774 Noted with orch mx at 1322. (NP-AB)
- 864 JAPAN, one of the commercial stations dominating the channel at 1430 10/10. (PM-OR)
- 891 AUSTRALIA, Adelaide 5AN 10/3 1327. Phone in pgm, into ABC News 1330. (NP-AB)
- 891 **THAILAND**, Bangkok, beautiful signal with woman in Thai and nice chimes at 1359 10/10. Armchair copy. (PM-OR)
- 918 UNID, odd sounding Asian language pretty much buried in the splatter at 1420 10/10. Cambodia is on here with 120 KW, which I am still looking for. (PM-OR)
- 963 CHINA, CRI 10/5 1345 Fair signal of CC music and male ancr in RR. Presumed: CRI is usually the one with RR language on 963. (GA-WA)

* Also noted quite well with Chinese music and woman/man in RR at 1420 10/10. (PM-OR)
 972 REP OF KOREA, HLCA KBS Liberty 1 10/5 1355. Female and male ancrs in KK at tune in.

- Signal peaking nicely at the TOH with more talk, short orch piece, anmts (ID?) (GA-WA) 1053 UNID? 10/3 1307. Two men in a reading of some sort (sounded JJ, so JOAR seems likely) over a iammer sound. (NP-AB)
- 1062 **PHILIPPINES**, Metro Manila DZEC, good with man in Tagalog at 1420 10/8. This still continues to be the most common filipino logged these days here. (PM-OR)

I listened to a little bit at SS on 10/9 and picked up a good signal from WHKY-1290 but then had to leave. Rats. Looked like it might have been halfway decent. 73.

This season is shaping up to be pretty reasonable for Asiatic DX. However, one thing I've noticed over the years is the increasing interference from domestic splatter which makes it very difficult to actually log anything other than time pips and snippets of talk. Some of the splatter is of course due to there being more domestic stations, at least in the US, on what used to be clear channels, but I do wonder how much is due to more vigorous modulation. Perhaps one of the club's resident broadcast engineers could sound forth on that subject?

Since early September, John Bryant on Orcas Island, WA, Guy Atkins in Puyallup, WA and Walt Salmaniw in Victoria, BC have been keeping records of signal strengths of trans-Pacific signals at local sunrise. I've joined from time to time, but usually I leave for work before the sunrise enhancement starts. When I have joined, I've been mortified to note that I'm really not hearing that well, compared to the others. Lots of carriers, but little audio, a trend I've been aware of for a number of years now. Now, John has a super KAZ antenna, and a reasonable rural location with a nearby water path up Georgia Strait for Asian signals, and Guy has a 500' Beverage, but heck, he's in metropolitan Seattle. And, Walt is about a mile further away from Japan than I am, but uses a K9AY to hear the DX. I'm using loops and a sloper at home, same as I have for years. The common point for success: an antenna with a null towards domestics. So I threw together a ragtag Flag antenna, and by gosh, the splatter level dropped at least 6 dB on that clip-leaded monster, allowing me to start actually hearing some TP audio. Now I've got to put together a serious Flag, that you can't trip over, and isn't about to fall down with the slightest breeze.

So, if like me, you don't have many (any) domestic signals to the west of you, and are complaining about the domestic splatter, maybe it's time to do something about it, and put up one of the uni-directional antennas. And no, it doesn't have to be a Beverage.

MONGOLIA: During a recent visit to the Mongolian Radio Transmitting Centre at Khonkhor, 30 km east of Ulan Bator, the director, Mr. GantumurTumurbataar, told me that the domestic SW tx upgrading project, funded by the Govt of Japan, has been completed. New antennas and NEC txs were installed at Ulan Bator-Khonkhor 7260 (50 kW), Altay 4830 (10 kW) and Murun (or Moron) on 4895 (10 kW). Sainshand (4865) will be switched off for good in September after which the three mentioned SW stations will be the only ones to cover the country. The central Radio Broadcast Station at Khonkhor (164 500 kW and 7260, x4850), and Radio Broadcast Stations each located in the following provinces: Bayan-Ulgii (Ulgii 209 30 kW), Gobi-Altay (Altay 227 75 kW and 4830), Khuvsgul (Murun 882 75 kW and 4895), Umnugobi (Dalanzadgad 209 75 kW), Dornod (Choibalsan 209 75 kW) and Dornogobi (Sainshand, x1233 and 4865). (excerpt; Maarten van Delft visiting Mongolia and Russia, dswci DXW Aug 25)

VANUATU: Just heard from a certain source that Radio Vanuatu 7260 has got a few problems so if you're not hearing it, it's only on around 200 watts; also 1179 same thing. That's why it was weak up at Kingaroy last week. (Johno Wright, ARDXC via dxld Sept 2)

FINLAND: Radio Scandinavia has got off to a shaky start in Finland. Sporadic test transmissions on 603 kHz have taken place during the summer with a power output of "200 watts or much less," says station manager Roy Sandgren in an email to **DXing.info**. Mike Spenser, producer of Pirate Radio 603, says that the first tests were carried out in mid-May, and officially the station was launched on June 1 with 250 watts of power. Radio Scandinavia is broadcasting from Mariehamn, capital of the autonomous region of Åland. Although the station has been heard across the Åland Islands, DXers elsewhere haven't been able to pick up the weak signal. As soon as the transmitter power is increased to 1 kW, Sandgren expects the interim transmitter to be heard within a radius of 100-150 kilometers from Mariehamn.

Besides technical problems with the station delaying its launch, the station's founding team is breaking up. Sandgren says that business with Spenser and Klaus Hansen, owner of radio ship St Paul, will end on September 1, and that he is now willing to lease airtime to anyone in batches of three months or more.

The studios of Radio Scandinavia are located on board St Paul in the harbor of Korrvik in Mariehamn. In an email to **DXing.info**, Spenser says that the ship is "sound" and that he hopes to sail and broadcast from the ship by next spring - currently the transmitter is on land. Sandgren however says that the ship costs too much to repair, and is now for sale. (**DXing.info**, August 21, 2004, edited on August 23)

ITALY: Closure of medium wave txs in Italy: Many Italians continue to miss Radio 2 and Radio 3, and articles on the subject continue to run in newspapers. A case without precedent, Quotidiano Nazionale had a front-page article, "RadioRai, holed networks", and two full pages inside. In an interview, the Minister of Communication said that RAI has been forced to close down the txs because of electrosmog (which was clearly deceitful, as many low power stations has been closed down, along with more powerful ones, and electrosmog would not explain why the lease contract with Radio MonteCarlo of the 702 tx in French territory has not been renewed).

That the long-term solution is digital radio (very long-term solution indeed, as WRTH 2004 says that "the general feeling today is that the process [of moving radio broadcasting from the FM band to DAB] may begin by 2010 and may be complete by 2015"); that many existing transmitting facilities will be renovated and relocated (and this is partial good nx we now know that Florence on 1368 and Pisa on 1062 will be closed down and a new tx will broadcast from Pisa on 657 with 100 kW, and also Roma Monte Ciocci with 6 kW on 1107 will be replaced by a 600 kW-er at Roma Blera). [and 846 + 1332 too?, wb.] With regard to 657 kHz, this choice is far from enlightened: with so many deserted or quasi-deserted formerly RAI freqs, a 100 kW-er on 657 from Pisa will clash - at 0620 UT winter - with regional programmes broadcast from Bolzano. Naples and Turin.

And with regard to the following programmes of 50 years ago, has anyone ever logged Caltanissetta on 6240 and Palermo on 6260? Both freqs would look rather out-of-band by today allocations, and moreover, I can't remember reading about a SW station in Palermo before. RAI Programma Nazionale [in 1954] MW 566-656-899-1061-1331-1484-1578, SW 6240 and 9420 from Caltanissetta. RAI Secondo Programma [in 1954] MW 845-1034-1115-1448-1484-1578, SW 6260 from Palermo. (Stefano Valianti-I, BDXC-UK "Communication" magazine August) Last LW in Italy, 189 kHz in Sicily, closed Aug 7, 2004. (Paul Gager, WoR, dxld Aug 12)

NETHERLANDS: The northerly MW mast at the Lopik tx site is to be demolished on Sat 21 Aug, four months after the signing of a covenant promising to restrict the total power transmitted from the site. The 165 metre mast, which was erected in 1938, will be removed with explosives. For safety reasons nobody will be permitted within a 300 metre zone around the mast. The mast that will be removed was used during the Nazi occupation of the Netherlands to broadcast the programmes of

Radio Bremen. From 1945-1980 it was used for the national MW sces Hilversum I and II, until these sces were transferred to the new site at Flevo. In a press release, txion provider Nozema says that a special live Internet stream on its Web site will show the demolition of the mast http://www.nozema.nl (RNW MN NL, via BrDXC-UK Aug 19)

MW tower at Lopik demolished! "There are not many Saturdays when you can watch an explosion. Not many when the explosion involves the symbolic demolition of a MW tx tower. I got up at 6 am to make the short trip down the road to Lopik, on the South side of Utrecht..." Full story, video and photographs of this dramatic event at http://medianetwork.blogspot.com/. POLAND: Since 1 July, the 200 kW transmitter in Raszyn on 198 is transmitting Polskie Radio 1 as filler instead of PR Radio BIS. As before, this frequency carries primarily the Polskie Radio parliamentary channel "Radio Parlament", as well as a number of special transmissions like church masses on Sundays. The transmission times are limited to 0600-1600 UT during summer months (DST), 0700-1700 UT during winter months (Bernd Trutenau, Lithuania, mwdx yg via DXLD)

SLOVAKIA: MW changes in Slovakia. From 6 Sept, Slovakia makes another step in its plan of changes. The Presov tx on 1071 is no more, and it empties the channel quite a lot, at least here in the middle of Europe. Iran and Euzkadi heard last night (5 Sept 2200... midnight CEST when Presov left the frequency), but signals were not too strong, giving hope for some Asia...? (Karel Honzik-CZE, mwdx Sept 6)
