**WB3XNN 1620khz Milford, PA TEST**. Date(s): About December 15th thru end of January. Time: Non-Critical Hours 09:15AM EST until 14:45PM EST. Modes of Operation: 1KW Daytime Non-Directional. Programming: Un-Modulated Carrier with ID's at TOH.

Test is being conducted by Digital Radio Engineering for field intensity experiments concerning area ground conductivity. A full DX Test will be conducted (hopefully at night) before the competition of measurements in January.

Below is the full text received from Dave Schmidt:

WB3XNN - 1620 kilohertz should be on the air about December 15th. This station licensed to Milford, PA is being operated for field intensity measurements of the ground conductivity in the area. This will be operating during non critical hours (approx. 0915 til 1445) with an unmodulated carrier, ID's given on the hour. Power will be 1000 watts into a 50 foot top loaded single tower. (For those in to tower currents, that adds up to 8.8 amps at 14 ohms!) Tests should continue through the end of January.

In what may be the first of its kind in the country, a Chicago area radio station is about to switch to a full-time format of talk shows devoted strictly to health, wellness and fitness. Starting Monday, Koyas Communications' west suburban WKKD-AM (1580) will call itself "Health Radio 1580" and become a 24-hour, seven-day-a-week outlet for the programming of Health Radio Network. Health Radio Network was founded last summer by three longtime Chicago radio executives, Tom Disa, Darrel Peters and Rick Jakle, through north suburban-based Independent Radio Services. WKKD has been airing the syndicated health talk programming on weekends since September. Overseeing the format switch and ongoing operation at WKKD will be Greg Batton, the former WLS-AM (890) talk show host who recently became the network's director of special projects. Along with his wife, Yvonne Greer, Batton doubles as co-host of "Hot Mamas," a show geared to helping women get in shape physically, mentally and emotionally. Other talk shows on the network's lineup, hosted by a variety of doctors, fitness experts and other health professionals, include "The Deborah Ray Healthy Talk Radio Show," "Skin Deep," "Mind and Muscle Fitness," "Global Medicine Hunter," "Body Talk," "Naturally Good for You," "Duke and the Doctor," "FitWits" and "Dead Doctors Don't Lie." The only similar venture in the country is believed to be WWNN-AM in Pompano Beach. Fla. Billed as the Health and Wealth Network, it consists mainly of time-brokered shows on health as well as finance. (AB-CA)

BIZradio1320 will have a special verification letter for all correct reports received on the first day of broadcasting on Tuesday, February 1st, 2005. If you live in Houston we welcome your report as well. The report does not have to be from the high rise. BIZradio1320 is trying to find out how well are signal is received in the high rise buildings that are spread around the city. It will help in future plans for a power increase if necessary to better penetrate high rise buildings in the city. Monday, Jan. 31, 2005, KGO/San Francisco, 49'ers Split

The NFL team and ABC Radio's market-leading News/Talker have ended their relationship after 18 years together. The split comes with two years left on the station's current five-year deal with the 49'ers, who finished 2-14 this season. KGO President/GM Mickey Luckoff, who characterized the current deal as a money-losing proposition for the station, reports that KGO tried to renegotiate but told Bay Area newspapers that the team "wasn't willing to do that." KGO's decision to exercise its right to end the deal leaves both the 49'ers and the Oakland Raiders without radio homes in the Bay Area, though KGO clustermate KSFO carried the Raiders last season under a one-year contract and is currently negotiating a new deal. No word yet on whether Susquehanna Sports/Talker KNBR/San Francisco could enter negotiations for the rights to either of the Bay Area NFL teams. (Ye editor)

Wednesday, February 2, 2005, In the Northwest: Liberal voices turning up the volume on the radio. By JOEL CONNELLY, SEATTLE POST-INTELLIGENCER COLUMNIST

Over the past four decades, one law of mathematics has ruled AM hot talk radio in America: Liberal equates to loser. The golden throat of former New York Gov. Mario Cuomo was among many to choke on a format long dominated by angry, blustery, occasionally witty right-thinking voices. Out of Fargo, N.D., however, has come the voice of a former football player named Ed Schultz, who has gone from two radio outlets to 77 just in the last year. "I'm prairie-dwelling, pro-union, pro-health care and pro-education. I hunt and fish, and I don't fly on Lear jets and I don't smoke Cuban cigars," said Schultz, in a not-too-subtle poke at the rarified tastes of such right-wing populists as Rush Limbaugh. Schultz has taken over the noon-to-3 p.m. slot on AM 1090, KPTK radio, launched in late October as a liberal-progressive alternative to the ubiquitous voices of the right. The station finished 26th in the fall Arbitron ratings. Winter ratings will tell a far different story, say industry sources. Schultz is catching on, especially among sought-after male listeners in the 25-to-54 age group. "Schultz is the most interesting of the liberal talkers because he's a former Republican and is running against the trend of left-of-center people moving rightward as they (and their kids) age," said John Carlson, toprated drive-time host on KVI radio. Schultz, 50, has experienced a personal epiphany, thanks in part to his second wife. "Oh yea, I was a conservative," he said. "I was probably hard-line, preoccupied with how much money I would make and how far I would go. But I began seeing a lady who directs a homeless clinic in Fargo.

"One of our first get-togethers was to a Salvation Army dinner, where I met some jobless Vietnam veterans. It started my transition, opened my eyes. I investigated veterans benefits, and began to discover where we are coming up short as a society." "Finally, in 2000, I declared on the air: I'm a Democrat, I'm a liberal." Schultz's show is a product of Democracy Radio, a New York-based non-profit group headed by Tom Athans, a former Democratic congressional staffer and husband of Sen. Debbie Stabenow, D-Mich. Democracy Radio found out about Schultz from Sen. Byron Dorgan, D-N.D. "Democrats are trying to help them with access to big players the way the GOP did for the Washington Times and Fox," Carlson noted. Unlike some hosts on the right, however, Schultz regularly crosses swords with the other side. Last week he hosted Republican National Chairman Ken Mehlman. Independent-minded GOP Sen. Chuck Hagel of Nebraska is a frequent guest. Competition—in ideas, consumer products, newspapers and the airwaves—makes America a better place. KPTK is occupying a historic place on our local radio dial, once the home of KING-AM in days when the

Bullitt Family made King Broadcasting a national leader in public-affairs broadcasting. In the 1960s. erudite, liberal Seattle attorney Irving Clark Jr. spent weekday nights on AM 1090 crossing verbal swords with then-outgunned conservatives. The late 1980s saw the arrival of Mike Siegel, a talker who relished controversy. Usually lining up on the right, Siegel stoked public anger at a proposed congressional pay raise. He was, in turn, reviled in Washington's congressional delegation. "Does Mrs. Bullitt listen to KING radio?" then-Rep. Al Swift, D-Wash., demanded, when broadcast brass arrived on Capitol Hill for what they thought was a peaceful breakfast. The Bullitts listened and made Siegel move on. Today, he holds forth in the early morning on 770 KTTH. Liberal talkers have finally broken through in the past year. Two groups, Democracy Radio and Air America, are in friendly competition. After a rocky start, Air America is now airing programs on 44 stations. Democracy Radio is up to 80 outlets, with Schultz on stations in 16 of the country's top 20 markets. "We don't have the structural connection with the Democratic Party that the Republican Party has with talk-show hosts of the right," Athans said in an interview. "Certainly among Democrats, there is excitement for what we're doing. It stands to reason why. Democrats have been demonized over the last 15 years by right-wing talk-show hosts." Schultz did give \$2,000 apiece last year to Dorgan and Democratic Senate leader Tom Daschle, who lost. He raised money on the air to support Christine Gregoire's bid for a hand recount in the Washington governor's race. Why has Schultz succeeded while other liberal voices have croaked? The answer is similar to why Limbaugh took off on the right: Unlike some super-serious liberals, Schultz has a sense of humor, and knows how to inform AND entertain. "I'm not prepared to be governor of New York," he joked. "I'm a radio guy; I do a radio show. A radio show is entertainment. You need to move it along. When does a politician move anything along?" The 6-2, 250-pound Schultz -- who once made the Raiders' roster -- bridles at talkers on the right who describe themselves as populists, or claim to be "looking out for you." "Bill O'Reilly doesn't care about the little guy. He's on an agenda just like any other right-wing commentator," Schultz said of the mighty mouth of Fox. "These people call themselves journalists. Nonsense! What you see on Fox News and hear from right-wing talkers comes from the basement of the White House." Nor does he think highly of fellow Fox voice Sean Hannity. "My goal is to beat Hannity; I'm going to beat that SOB," he said. "He distorts, he lies, he is a fraud." All of this is going to make early afternoon an interesting time for radio in the Emerald City. Hannity holds forth from noon to 3 p.m. on KVI 570. Conservative critic Michael Medved matches wits with guests on 770 KTTH. Schultz, Hannity, Medved: It's the radio version of a rut featuring three male rhinoceros, with KIRO p.m. host Dori Monson in the role of the tick bird. (DP-HI)

### OCEAN CITY STATE PARK DXPEDITION - Feb. 7-8, 2005

What a difference a week makes! Seven days earlier, trans-Pacific MW reception was at the best level since the amazing reception of last September and October.

A few of us in the Pacific Northwest listen for TP hets or audio from our Victoria, BC and Tacoma, WA area homes for signs of Asian or Down-Under signals. Last week we were wishing we were at Grayland or another coastal DXpedition site, knowing that our good conditions inland were equivalent to excellent reception at the coast. I couldn't get away until Sunday the 7th (UTC), and unfortunately the propagation conditions were degraded due to a recurring sunspot region and associated geostorms. Still it was an enjoyable trip, with sunny weather and spectacular ocean sunsets. The DX highlight was morning longpath African reception on 60 meters lasting far past local sunrise.

Mediumwave was almost entirely DU; the only Japanese station heard was JOAK Tokyo on 594. All signal levels were modest, without the strong, long reception that characterizes better openings. On this DXpedition, it was common for a station to rise above the noise for a half minute or less, and then fade back into the muck for long stretches of time.

Except for the longpath Africa reception, the tropical bands were below average. The Papua New Guinea regionals were at low levels on the 7th, and stronger the next night. However, the weaker Indonesian targets like RPDT2 Manggarai (2960) and RSPK Ngada (2899) were totally absent.

Ocean City State Park is north of the well-known Grayland DXpedition site, and across Grays Harbor on the sandy, flat Ocean Shores pennisula. Most visitors head straight for the resorts and casinos of the pennisula, but the smart ones do their gambling by stringing out a Beverage antenna and DXing! An empty logbook is cheaper than an empty wallet if things don't work out...

- FIJI R. Fiji One, Feb 7 1445 Low level island music of acoustical guitar and choral singing; woman announcer in pres. Fijian. Noted parallel to 639 and 684, all with weak signals. I found it interesting that all three frequencies began and ended their long fades into the noise at the same time, and then rose again at 1454. More guitar and choral singing over the top of the hour. (Atkins-WA)
- 594 AUSTRALIA 3WV Horsham, Feb 8 1550 Poor-fair, with woman announcer in English, and parallel to 738 2NR Grafton. (Atkins-WA)
- JAPAN JOAK Tokyo, Feb 8 1523 First and only Japanese MW station of the DXpedition, in at a poor-fair level. Man and woman with talk in Japanese interspersed with English comments; seemed to be discussing aviation or flight. Even without a northwest Beverage, the Japanese and other North Asian stations are usually heard on a west Beverage antenna also (although at weaker level) if propagation permits. (Atkins-WA)

- INDIA, 1615-1620, AIR Bhopal Feb 7 Noted in passing, with fair signal of woman and man announcers in Hindi. (Atkins-WA) PAPUA NEW GUINEA. 1041-1048. R. Manus Feb 7 Announcer in Pidgin with US pops tunes: seemed to be a music countdown program. 'R. Manus' ID noted at 1106 recheck. Fair.
- SOUTH AFRICA, 0303-0312, R. Sonder Grense Feb 8 Two men with lively discussion in Afrikaans. Fair to good, and improving as sunrise approaches South Africa. (Atkins-WA)

- PAPUA NEW GUINEA. 1057-1101. R. Simbu Feb 7 PNG pop music 1057; male announcer at 1059 with announcements in Pidgin: 'R. Simbu' ID at 1100 with mentions of 'province'. Suddenly off without fanfare at 1101\*. Other PNG stations still on, though, Poor-fair signal.
- INDIA. 1620-1633. AIR Delhi Feb 7 Presumed, with English announcers; orchestral music 1625, and woman with mention of India at 1632. Weak, noisy signal at 1+ hour past local sunrise (Atkins-WA)
- PAPUA NEW GUINEA, 1048-, R. East New Britain Feb 7 Male announcer in Pidgin with slow, casual talk. Time check in English 'five minutes until 9 o'clock' at 1055: phone number and poss, guick ad for restaurant. Initially a poor-fair signal, but a recheck at 1107 revealed a good level with Pidgin language hymn and male chorus. (Atkins-WA)
- PAPUA NEW GUINEA, 1105-1111, R. New Ireland Feb 7 Presumed, Male announcer in Pidgin with mentions of 'tok tok' and 'come up long hearim...'. Poor level signal, with strong co-channel ham QRM from the New England Weather Net. No evidence of RRI Merauke on the frequency (Atkins-WA)
- 3935.07 NEW ZEALAND. 1116-1121. ZLXA Levin Feb 7 Tentative. Threshold level of female announcer in English (seemed Kiwi accent) with monotone talk. Very weak with occasional ham QRM. Only audible on southwest Beverage antenna. (Atkins-WA)
- INDONESIA, 1120-1127, RRI Pontianak Feb 7 Male announcer with poss, talk of regional politics, with mentions of Indonesia and Pakistan. Female Indo vocals at 1127. Excellent signal, but some co-channel ham interference. (Atkins-WA)
- INDONESIA, 1125-1135, RRI Kendari Feb 7 Two Indonesian announcers with talk and occasional mentions of Kendari. Good signal. The notch filters on the 756Pro are the best I've ever encountered, and did a great job on the big het that's usually present on this frequency. (Atkins-WA)
- 4604.95 INDONESIA. 1135-1147. RRI Serui Feb 7 Male announcer with 'RRI Serui' ID at tune-in. followed by brief news items with mentions of Indonesian cities and pauses in-between. Orchestral anthem at 1142, and into C&W style Indonesian music and vocals, Excellent signal. (Atkins-WA)
- 4760 INDIA, 1647-1653, AIR Port Blair Feb 8 Presumed, with sub-contintental vocals over/under TWR Swaziland. Good signal and best on west Beverage. (Atkins-WA) SWAZILAND, 1647-1652. TWR Mpangela Ranch Feb 8 Male preacher in African vernacular. over/under AIR Port Blair's sub-contintental vocals. Fair-good level and best on southwest Beverage. (Atkins-WA)
- NIGERIA, 0510-0537, R. Nigeria Feb 7 Very tentative. I first tuned 4770 at 0510 and found a weak signal with threshold English language. Later checks revealed an African-sounding language as sunrise approached Lagos. The signal never improved, but stayed threshold. Gabon 4777 also in at a very good level. (Atkins-WA)
- 4774.95 SWAZILAND, 0409-0420, TWR Mpangela Ranch Feb 8 African choral music that sounded like a hymn at tune-in; religious organ music 0413; brief talk or meditation by man in what sounded like the German language (per WRTH sked), and into a series of short hymns by choir with organ accompaniment. Language switched to English at 0430, also per schedule. Faint signal. (Atkins-WA)
- GABON, 0538-0605, R. Diff. TV Gabonaise Feb 7 Very good signal of French pop music and male announcer in French. Fading considerably at 0550, and almost gone by 0555. However, signal improved somewhat at 0558. ID at 0600 and into presumed news, with mentions of Libreville and Gabon. (Atkins-WA)
- BRAZIL, 0520-0531, R. Club do Para Feb 7 Brazilian music to 0529 ID by male announcer with promo and mentions of meter band and frequency. Good signal. (Atkins-WA)
- ZAMBIA, 1634-1708, ZNBC Radio One Feb 7 Male announcer in African language, with sermon; numerous mentions of 'Janni' or 'Juani' and 'Patmos', which was likely a Bible story relating to the apostle John who was imprisoned on the Island of Patmos. Announcer with voice-over organ music at 1656; hymn and choir 1658; 2+1 time pips at 1700. Female announcer with possible ID and mentions of Lusaka 1701, followed by news items read by a man, mentioning Zambia, Angola, Malawi, and other locations, Choral anthem or national song at 1704. Bassy modulation. Very good signal, with AIR Jaipur faintly in background 1634-1650 with sub-continental music. Surprisingly strong even at 1 hour 40 minutes past local sunrise and peaking at 1705, which is Lusaka sunset. Still in at a fair to good level at 1735 recheck, 2+ hours past SR with fast-paced advertisement mentioning many African music styles such as makossa, soukous, mbganga, hilife, and others, Also heard 2/8 with a good signal. (Atkins-WA)
  - 0327-0338, ZNBC Radio One Feb 8 Fading up nicely with Afropops music and cheery male announcer in vernacular at 0330: mentions of Zambia and 'ZNBC'. I heard a clear mention of 'Radio Three' just before 0333; perhaps a promo for another network (?). 2+1 time pips at 0400 and into short vocal selection by female chorus. Good signal. (Atkins-WA)

- 4920 INDIA, 1702-1705, AIR Chennai Feb 8 Exotic subcontinental music, with male announcer in Hindi or Tamil at 1704. Much stronger than faint Xizang PBS (China) signal co-channel in background. (Atkins-WA)
- 4925 INDONESIA, 1145-1201, RRI Jambi Feb 7 Playing a mix of Indonesian pops and US music; male announcer with 'RRI Jambi' ID 1159 and into Love Ambon tune briefly, then more pop music at 1200. Good signal. (Atkins-WA)
- BOTSWANA, 1709-1730, VOA Feb 7 Very good longpath signal at Botswana sunset. Man and woman announcers in African language giving news items from around Africa, and mentions of many regional locations. Brief mabira music selection 1711, and back to news or political talk. Woman with mention of 'Washington DC' at 1713, followed by '909 AM' and 'shortwave 11975 and 17895 kHz', and what sounded like 'Voi Amerika' or similar at 1714. Man with 'Washington, DC' at 1729, and 'This is the Voice of America' by woman in English at 1730, and into English programming with mention of upcoming features and news. Surprisingly strong at more than two hours past local sunrise. Also heard VOA Botswana at a very good level on 2/8 at 1657 with VOA NewsNow report on human rights in Laos. (Atkins-WA)
  - + 0338-0346, VOA Feb 8 Various news items in English read by different male announcers, including a US envoy travels to Pakistan, fighting in Afghanistan, and others. 'VOA News' IDs 0343. Good signal as Botswana sunrise approaches. (Atkins-WA)
- 4960 PAPUA NEW GUINEA, 1112-1116, Catholic Radio Network Feb 7 Talk or interview about Catholic and family planning issues. First noted at 1035 with Christian contemporary music. Poor-fair level, but seemed to be slowly improving. Also heard at 1707 on 2/8 with choir music; weak signal. (Atkins-WA)
- 4965 **TAJIKISTAN**, 1603-1612, V. of Russia, Yangiyul Feb 7 While searching for R. Christian Voice, Zambia, I came across Voice of Russia on the frequency. Female newscaster with world news, VOR ID at 1607, and into light jazz. 'VOR World service' ID again at 1609 and 1611 by male announcer. Good. (Atkins-WA)
- 4965 ZAMBÍA, 0346-0355, Radio Christian Voice Feb 8 Tentative. Weak signal of Black Gospel music; traditional African choral music (hymn?) at 0348, but signal lost to the noise by 0355. (Atkins-WA)
  - + 1706-1715, R. Christian Voice Feb 8 Presumed. Woman in English giving web address ('www..' something) at tune-in; Christian contemporary music 1707; short prayer or devotion 1712, and into Black Gospel music. Weak signal, nearly two hours past local sunrise. (Atkins-WA)
- MADAGASCAR, 1617-1633, R. National Malagasy Feb 8 Probable. Man and woman with discussion or interview in heavily African accented English, over/under AIR

  Thiruvananthapuram in Hindi. Good signal, but very difficult to follow due to the Indian at equal level. Language changed to pres. Malagasy 1628 with announcements by a man; brief drumming, then woman in French at 1631with possible mention of 'Malagache' beneath AIR's subcontinental music. I was surprised to hear English on this frequency at tune-in; unfortunately the level was so low I couldn't make out the subject or topic. (Atkins-WA)
- 5019.9 **SOLOMON ISLANDS**, 1737-1740, SIBC Feb 7 Honiara still in at a good level with BBC news relay in English, 2-1/2 hours past local sunrise. Panel discussion about economies of Middle Eastern countries. (Atkins-WA)
- 5985 CONGO, 1713-1750, R. Congo Feb 8 Fair to good level at Brazzaville sunset (1715). Male announcer in African vernacular; into French at 1723 with 'lci Brazzaville, Congo' ID at 1731. Enjoyable Soukous music selections starting at 1732, but unfortunately by 1740 the signal was weakening and getting noisy. However, Congo was still listenable with a fair signal even past 1800 (10am local time PST). Strongest on southwest Beverage. (Atkins-WA)
