Dave Marthouse and the DX-Friendly staff at WODI 1230khz put on an impromptu DX test while conducting transmitter maintenance.

Despite the crowded channel, equal power, and less than stellar conditions, the test was well heard. Thanks to Dave and the folks at WODI.

WODI 1230khz Brookneal, VA DX Test Results April 30, 2005

Steve Francis got us started early, with his successful reception of the test from his home in Alcoa. TN. Followed immediately by Scott Fybush in Rochester, NY who not only heard the test, but called the station!

Curt Deegan added Florida to the list of states hearing the test with his successful reception on the JRC NRD-535D. Barry McLarnon also logged the test from his home in Ottawa, Ontario, as did Willis in Old Fort, TN, Jerry Bond and Dave Hochfelder in Rochester, and Ira Elbert in Watkinsville, GA.

Dave Norment in Hagerstown heard them on a barefoot YB-400 despite heavy interference from nearby WJEJ 1240. The famous NRC sweep tones were able to make it through the din to Bob Foxworth in Tampa, FL, while Duane Whittingham reported success from his home in Macomb, IL.

Russ Johnson in Lexington, NC reported hearing the sweep tones as well, "First time I have ever heard the sweep tones. Very effective!" He also heard faint Morse Code ID's.

Tom Jansinski of Shorewood, IL heard the tones and code, as did Lester in Spartenburg, SC, and Bruce Collier in York, PA who pulled the test in on his 375'BOG using the Drake R8B. New one for

Rick Shaftan had joy in NW New Jersey, logging both sweep tones and Morse ID's. Other happy listeners included Mike Hardester of Jacksonville, NC, Wade Smith in Chipman, New Brunswick, and Bill Dvorak in Madison, WI. Bill also talked to Dave Marthouse briefly on the air during the test!

Using a Kiwa loop allowed Michael Diers of Huntington Station, NY to pull in the test. Other DX'ers in luck included Michael Procop of Bedford, Ohio, Neil Wolfish of Toronto, and Brett Saylor who reported hearing the test "easily" in Central PA.

The test also marked a new one in the log for Bill Harms who heard the test clearly, including voice ID's, phone calls, etc from his home in Maryland. Fred Vobbe had only partial success hearing sweep tones, and bits of code from his home in Ohio.

Mike Brooker logged Morse Code IDs from his home in Toronto, Ontario, as did Russ Edmunds in Blue Bell, PA, Gerry Bishop in Niceville, FL, and Rene Tetro in Lafayette Hill, PA.

The WODI test was a very special success for Bill Patalon of Baltimore. Bill reports that this is his first logging of a scheduled test since returning to the MW DX hobby. Welcome back Bill!

While many enjoyed success, some of us were disappointed including your editor, Les Rayburn from his home in Central Alabama. Also failing to hear the test were Jim Renfrew in Byron, NY, Bruce Winkelman in Tulsa, OK, and Ben Dangerfield who was unable to try for the test. Ben did want to go on record as being thankful for the efforts of Dave Marthouse, as do we all!

A big thank you for this test to WODI. Hope we can count on another one next year!

Some thoughts on DX Tests in general, and issues with QSL's...

At least during the recent past, both clubs have always offered to provide QSL services to any station that does not wish to handle the chore. To date, only two have taken us up on the offer.

In the future, we'll try to more "strongly suggest" that stations take that option. However, I am always reluctant to see posts that complain about the lack of a QSL response on the e-mail lists. I think that anything that comes across as a complaint or a demand on the part of DX'ers makes it more difficult to get stations to test at all.

My goal as Broadcast Test Coordinator is to make it as easy as possible for a station to say "yes" to a test request. Like any negotiation that means making as few demands on the other party as possible.

Members can rest assured that we always start off requesting tests with plenty of advance notice, daytime power/pattern, clear QSL routes, etc. Sometimes we end up with tests that don't meet our "perfect" scenario, but remain grateful for whatever the station can provide.

I strongly believe that "beggars cannot be choosers". And encourage members to treat stations with kid gloves when approaching them about tests, QSLs, or suspected problems. Try to be good ambassadors for our hobby at all times.

Likewise, I want to encourage all members to adapt to the changing landscape of radio. DX'ers have to use new tools, technology and techniques.

While IBOC, fewer tests, more stations per channel etc. all make DXing more difficult these days, we also have a bevy of new tools to combat those problems.

If you're not a member of the NRC "DX Tips" e-mail list, for instance, shame on you! My cell phone routinely goes off in the late evenings with tips from my fellow DX'ers. Alerting me to many new stations that I otherwise might have missed.

When I'm at the dials, I also try to bring up **#mwdx** at **www.starchat.net**. Identifying a station halfway across the country is easy when you can compare notes with someone closer to the station in real time. Plus it's just tons of fun!

I use Total Recorder to capture TOH ID's every night of the week, and www.1000000watts.com to help identify those recordings the next day. Think of what our members of 20 years ago could have accomplished with these tools.

And most importantly, be thankful to those hard working, under paid station engineers who put up with our hobby. We're blessed to have many of them on this list, and never want our comments to be misunderstood.

I'd also like to thank the many members who have approached their personal contacts within the broadcast industry to help arrange for tests. If you're interested in trying to set up a test in your area for next season, please contact me first.

We can provide any interested member with all kinds of tools including form letters, test material, and QSL's. Our goal is to make it as easy for the station as possible.

KSUD 730 West Memphis AR drops EMF "K-Love" contemporary Christian for ESPN sports.

KDJQ 890 Meridian/Boise ID signs on with R&B oldies as "DJ Radio."

KIRL 1460 St. Charles MO returns to the air with EWTN Catholic religion.

Pat Martin and Dale Park both send along the following:

From a note on the Northwest Broadcasters site, I found this; article below, URL is http://seattlepi.nwsource.com/tv/223797_radiobeat12.html. When the conversation turns to

conservative talk radio in Seattle, it usually involves Entercom's KTTH-AM (770) and Fisher's KVI-AM (570). But there's actually a third local station in that segment -- Salem Communications' KKOL-AM (1300). KKOL often is left out of the conversation, and rarely shows up in the overall Arbitron ratings because it doesn't have the prominent local or national hosts that the others do. It also has been hampered by a weak signal. Ever since losing its lease with the Port of Seattle on a Harbor Island site in 2002, Salem has been looking for somewhere new to put its transmitter. In the interim it has been broadcasting at a reduced power of 1,000 watts from a boat moored near Salty's on Alki. Salem had hoped to locate its antenna in the Kent Valley near Auburn, but that proposal ran into local opposition. So now Salem is trying something different. David Fitts, general manager for Salem's five Seattle AM stations, says the company has signed a lease with the Port of Tacoma for property in Pierce County. The station is awaiting Federal Communications Commission approval for the move, which Fitts hopes will occur by the end of this year. When it does, KKOL will be able to boost its power from the current 1,000 watts to 50,000 watts. To allow for that power boost, Salem bought a Port Angeles station at 1290 on the AM dial; that station is currently simulcasting KKOL and will go dark once KKOL goes to full power. To go with the greater regional coverage the signal boost will provide, Fitts says changes could be coming in KKOL's weekday lineup of hosts, currently consisting of the nationally syndicated Michael Gallagher, Dennis Prager, Dave Ramsey and Hugh Hewitt shows. "Hopefully we'll have some local presence," he adds. "It would give us instant credibility." (PM-OR)

For some reason, there are false reports in DX mags and elsewhere that WBMD 750 and WBGR 860 are on the air with Family Radio programming. The truth is that they are currently off the air PENDING a format change. Family Radio purchased these outlets as part of format shuffling in the Baltimore area. They are not on the air as of 14 May 2005. Please note this correction. (BH-MD)

Pat Martin sends along the following:

This is from Robert Gonsett's outstanding "CGC Communicator" newsletter, and may help explain why some of us have been hearing those new Tijuana-area signals much louder in southern California (and beyond) than we should be. And better yet - the PDFs have nifty tower pictures!!! It's a lengthy download, but well worth it to see just how much happens across the border and doesn't get busted right away!

MAJOR OFFENSIVE AGAINST BONILLA'S CROSS-BORDER AUTHORITIES

A major offensive has been launched on the Section 325(c) cross-border program transmission authorities associated with Jaime Bonilla's XHBCE-FM, 105.7 MHz, in Baja California North. By using an airplane and flying to the coordinates published for XHBCE's Class B operation, nothing but wild brush and grass were found. There were no power lines, roads or trails serving the site, and a picture was provided to demonstrate that point. Further, there was "no physical evidence to suggest that a transmitter was ever built there" or anywhere nearby (a search was made). Thus, it is claimed, the transmitter site that XHBCE has reportedly been using all these months does not exist, so all 325(c) requests relative to that site constitute fraud. The real XHBCE transmitter was discovered on Cerro Bola mountain 10-miles away and at a much higher elevation than the authorized Class B site. A number of technical questions have arisen regarding the facilities found there. But there is more. Mr. Bonilla's XEKTT, 1700 kHz, should be using two towers of equal height, but two towers of "grossly unequal height" were found instead, calling into question the nighttime radiation pattern of that station. XESDD, 1030 kHz, should be using a three-tower directional antenna array to beam its signal away from the U.S. both day and night, but was photographed using one tower (presumably omnidirectional) instead. And XESS, 620 kHz, should have been sharing that same three tower array to protect the U.S. full time, but XESS' transmitter had mysteriously migrated 21 miles closer to the U.S. and was discovered at the XEKTT site, virtually right on the U.S./Mexican border, without the required three tower array. To see and read more, open the two pdf documents below. The first doc contains an Engineering Statement with colored photographs of the numerous alleged technical transgressions; the second doc is a copy of the complete legal and engineering package filed with the FCC as a formal complaint (the engineering photos did not reproduce properly in this, the only pdf doc available to us at this time, hence the separate posting of the Engineering Statement). There is much more to this story, probably one of the biggest stories to break in the local broadcast community in years. From this one 325(c) case, a number of legal actions may follow including demands for massive power rollbacks at some or all of the Bonilla properties, and retractions of all 325(c) permits. Keep in mind that the charges made so far are only allegations and that the Bonilla organization needs to be given an opportunity to respond. There may be mitigating technical factors at work or special agreements between the U.S. and Mexico of which we are unaware. Our experience indicates that there are many fully compliant broadcast facilities in Mexico and that this case - if the allegations hold - is not representative of the Mexican broadcast industry as a whole, and should not reflect negatively on the many fine people in Mexico who strive for excellence.

Pat Martin sends along the following from Deane McIntyre of Calgary, AB

The move of CHUC Cobourg ON to FM (107.9 MHz, 1.03 kw) has been approved by the CRTC: http://www.crtc.gc.ca/archive/ENG/Decisions/2005/db2005-205.htm.

The decision referenced by the above URL is lengthy and thus I will not post it here; it is interesting in that the reason for not moving to 1580, as approved some time ago, was not implemented is given. In short, the application to 1580 was made as no suitable FM frequency was available. Later, to quote the decision "the Department of Industry (the Department) has subsequently revised the "spectrum guidelines" such that the FM frequency now under consideration became available." Well it's been an incredibly busy month. DXing 'Over Your Shoulder' with Beverages

A Comparison Test: March 2005 John H. Bryant

Over the past 15 years, I've been using relatively short Beverages, *unterminated*, at my home QTH in Oklahoma, USA. These low wires (average height about 6 to 8 feet) vary in length from 450 to 750 feet. I've found that such wires were useable directional antennas with very good lobes off of each end. For about four of those years, I operated a "half-wagon wheel" of Beverages of that general length with the wires running East, SE, South, SW and West from a central point in my back yard. At the time, I was primarily interested in SWBC DXing on the Tropical Bands (from 2.5 to 5.5 MHz.) and could use each antenna directly, of course: that is, I could use the SE wire to look to my southeast for South America and for southern Africa. Happily, I could also use that SE antenna "over the shoulder" to look to my *northwest* along my Great Circle route to East and South Asia. In essence, by leaving the Beverages unterminated and thus bi-directional, I was really operating quite nearly as if I had twice as many Beverages spread out in a full wagon wheel.

Using a simple unterminated single-wire Beverage antenna[1] as a bi-directional device is well known in the literature, of course, and carries with it at least two inherent penalties:

- By its nature, an unterminated Beverage is bi-directional and thus does not reject anything
 off the backside.
- The signals coming "over the shoulder" from the normal backside of the antenna travel the
 length of the Beverage, going away from the receiver, hit the far end and are reflected back
 to the receiver. There is an inherent signal loss in this reflection and longer trip.
 Authorities and modeling programs differ slightly as to how much the "backside" signal is
 attenuated, but most tend to focus on 4 to 6 dB.

Over the past year, my Northwest MW DXing buddies and I have become quite interested in reverting to "12 Volt DC DXing" from automobiles and campsites on the Pacific seashore. Our beloved Grayland Motel is for sale and we are anticipating the loss of that near-perfect layout, with antennas of optimum length running in the correct direction and terminated virtually in the surf at high

tide. We foresee many situations where we can get our vehicles quite close to the shore, but where we will be so close that there simply is not room to run a Beverage out toward the sea. There are a number of familiar venues, however, where we could be DXing very near the shore itself and run antennas directly inland through the scrub or forest behind the beach itself. Unterminated, we could then use these antennas to DX the far Pacific shore "over the shoulder."

As we discussed these issues, there was quite a bit of disagreement as to just how much loss this "over the shoulder" approach might entail. Some of us held with the published "4 to 6 dB" figure... and felt this to be a negligible amount, while others held with equal sincerity that the loss could be much greater. I volunteered to run a field test this winter in my home area of central Oklahoma where the roads run, literally, straight for mile after mile and where it is more or less one big flat cow pasture.... ideal for testing directional antennas.

Test Arrangement

My automobile/DX shack was parked at the crest of a very gentle hill, with the antennas extended North and South from the vehicle, along the roadside tree line and suspended from the lower branches. The road runs absolutely North-South. The antennas were two new 500 foot Beverages. When laid side-by-side, one was about 3 feet longer than the other, but was not trimmed (the South antenna was the longer). The slope of the hill was equal in both directions and was such that the far end of each antenna was about ten feet lower than the automobile. The Beverages each went to one of a matched pair of new impedance transformers, then through identical 6' lengths of coax to an antenna switch and thence to an NRD-535 which was used to compare signal strengths on each antenna for a number of stations.

The stations to be measured were selected to be spread across the MW dial and to be those lying directly to the North or South of my location. Each station measured put in a moderately strong signal, varying in strength from 1280-Arkansas City, KS which came in at around S-8 to 640-Norman, OK, which put in an S-9+10 dB signal.

The tests were run at solar noon, with no thunderstorms present or audible on the band. The signals were exceptionally steady and were each the only station audible on the channel. The signal strengths were measured twice, about 10 minutes apart and are (both) presented below in a relativist chart.

NOTE: Two tests were also done to the side: 1600 kHz, Cushing, OK to the due East came in about 3 dB better on the North antenna, while 960-Enid OK, to the West-Northwest also came in better on the North antenna by about 2 or 3 dB.

Discussion


With the exception of the slope of the ground (DX shack at crest of gentle hill, each antenna sloping parallel to the ground downward about ten vertical feet over the 500 feet) the two antennas were virtually identical, but running in opposite directions. Given that the signals were fairly equal on both antennas and that the measuring instrument (NRD 535 S-Meter) was fairly crude, precise results were not expected. In fact, the relative strength measurements of the stations to the SOUTH were about exactly what I expected: two of the three stations were stronger on the southerly antenna by 3 to 6 dB. The measurements of stations to the North, however, presented a real surprise: four (580, 1280, 1330 and 1580) were 3 to 6 dB stronger on the South Beverage that pointed away from them. This was so surprising to me that I exchanged the (two lead-in + impedance transformer) combinations prior to taking the second set of measurements. The results were identical except for a 3 dB drop in the 580 kHz reading.

One could still argue that, for some reason, the southern Beverage was just "working" better. That was my reason to measure the only two nearby signals that come in from nearly straight East and West. As you see from the note above, the two side signals were received better on the *North* antenna!

Just exactly why these anomalous readings came about could be the subject of endless speculation. Happily, that discussion is not at all relevant to the purpose of this particular field test. The goal was to determine whether the backside losses of relatively short Beverages were negligible

or large enough to be significant when forced to DX "over the shoulder." Based on this comparison test, I feel comfortable using a short Beverage and DXing over my shoulder, when better, more classic arrangements are not possible.

In Practice



Above is a two-layer photo-montage of the new campsites now under construction at Grayland Beach State Park on the Pacific Coast on Washington State. Foot and vehicular traffic on the beach. even at night, prevents us from running antennas on the beach itself. As you may note from the montage, the new campsites are too close to the beach to allow us to deploy a full array of classic terminated Beverages from any single new campsite in the park.

The array of blue lines at the upper-right of the montage indicate a deployment of the three beverage pattern that we find most effective for DXing from the Pacific Coast (NW, West, SW). Each antenna, as indicated is 500 feet long. The antenna running to the NNW is a classic terminated Beverage, the other two are "Over the Shoulder" unterminated affairs.

Finally, some readers will surely ask why we do not simply adopt more compact beach-side antennas, such as the K9AY, Flag or KAZ large loops. We have done some rather careful comparisons between some of these antennas and our normal Grayland Beverage array and have repeatedly found that the Beverages were superior. This was true even when the same antenna comparisons had been judged "similar/equal" at inland locations. Additional comparisons will be made

[1] Victor Misek, John Devoldere and others have published several similar designs for true bidirectional or switchable direction Beverages. These usually entail either two parallel antenna wires or coaxial cable lead-ins running to each end of the antenna. These designs may be quite suitable for fixed installations; the interest here, however, is in investigating the use of a single lead-in and a simple, single-wire Beverage.
