Ye editor sends along the following from the Lahonta Valley News (Fallon, NV):
 Northern Nevada's newest planned AM classic country radio station, the HOG, will soon hit the airwaves with a grand opening of Nevada dignitaries. KHWG, located at 750 on AM frequency, will hold a grand opening and ribbon-cutting ceremony on June 2. On hand will be Nevada Secretary of State Dean Heller and country music singer Lacy J. Dalton, said Dee Gregory, owner of the Wayne Dubbs Agency, which is developing the new station. Other country music artists may attend if their schedules permit, he said. The station begins broadcast and testing in May, using an automation mode to play pre-selected tunes. The station plans 24-hour operation by mid-May. Live DJs will be phased in later, with the possibility of 24-hour live radio, Gregory said. KHWG's 265-foot antenna has been installed about three miles south of Fallon off U.S. Highway 95. The station's 10,000 watts of broadcast power allow reception across Northern Nevada, reaching from Battle Mountain to Truckee, Calif., and south beyond Hawthorne, he said. Power will be turned down at night, but the station will be picked up in Churchill, Lyon and Pershing Counties. The station's format will be dictated by community events, listener requests and may include local country artists, Gregory said. "It's a format that if somebody wanted to play something, we'll play it," he said. "We will absolutely not be driven by the record labels." Sunday will feature a country and Southern gospel format. The station's studio at 1050 W. Williams Ave. will be a venue for residents to interact and request their favorite music, he said. "I know that Fallon is going to be pleasantly surprised at this format," Gregory said. "The fact we're downtown with a big 'ol picture window in the studio, we invite people to step on in and say hi or honk their horn as they drive by. We invite that kind of community interaction." KHWG is seeking names for its mascot, a pig dressed in cowboy attire. Send suggestions to KHWG, P.O. Box 143, Fallon, NV, 89407. The HOG presents a new competitor to Fallon's long-time, local radio station, KVLV. Competition is the name of the game in the radio business, said Lynn Pearce, co-owner of KVLV, which has broadcast in Northern Nevada since May 9, 1957. "We've always known for years that sooner or later we'd have another local stick in the air," Pearce said. "Right now, I think we compete for listeners with 28, 29 or 30 stations that serve the Reno-Sparks-Carson City area. It's just another radio station." KVLV's adult contemporary signal, 99.3 FM, will begin 24-hour broadcast in the near future, Pearce said. The Federal Communications Commission has approved the change. The classic country signal, 980 AM, broadcasts from 6 a.m. until two hours past sunset. Besides extended FM hours, KVLV has no plans for format changes, he said. Pat Martin sends along the following from Adam Myrow of NRC:

WREC 600 AM is now running IBOC. I'm not sure when they started, but I noticed it this morning. The hash is audible on the adjacent channels as usual, and it is also slightly audible on channel with headphones when listening with my Yacht Boy 400 PE. If I tune up or down 1 KHZ, it becomes more apparent. With a Radio Shack radio (catalog number 120-0795,) it is difficult to tune the station in to avoid the hash. Apparently, the hash is only canceled out completely if you are dead on frequency, and have a fairly narrow filter. WMC 790 seems to have narrowed their audio recently, as they used to splatter all over the place, so I wouldn't be surprised if they start up IBOC next. WREC has been running 5KHZ audio for some time now, and I always suspected they would go IBOC. So, don't let them fool you when they claim that they are narrowing the audio to reduce interference. They are preparing for IBOC! I wish there were a reasonably-priced portable that could decode IBOC. I'd really love to do some real-world tests with it, and see how it handles things like thunderstorm static and interference from power lines. What little I've heard doesn't sound promising, but I'd like to be able to test it out for myself. If IBOC fails miserably when a thunderstorm comes along, and dies when you pass under a power line, then it will never fly on AM. If, on the other hand, it can cope with that, then it may actually have a chance. (PM-OR)

Air America lands on Fresno's radio dial (Updated Thursday, July 7, 2005, 4:45 AM)

Infinity Broadcasting, owner of KMJ, AM 580, the local home for conservative radio voices from Rush Limbaugh to Ray Appleton, now is offering a liberal viewpoint. KOOR, AM 790, one of the seven stations owned by Infinity in the Fresno market, switched formats Tuesday. The Spanish-language radio station is now broadcasting a liberal news/talk format made up of programs from Air America Radio and Democracy Radio. The new call letters are KFPT. Patty Hixson, vice president and general manager of Infinity Radio Fresno, says, "We believe there is a large and enthusiastic audience for progressive perspectives, and AM 790 will serve that audience. The audience that AM 790 will attract is extremely educated and affluent and very underrepresented in this market. "Our goal at Infinity Broadcasting is to develop products that reflect the voice of the community and the people we serve. AM 790, Fresno's progressive talk, will represent that audience." Does that mean powerhouse KMJ has not been a reflection of the community? Wouldn't its position as the top-rated radio station in this market for years suggest that it has an appeal to a lot of people? Having the two talk stations with such diverse viewpoints makes it look as if Infinity is talking out of the left and right sides of its mouth. "Infinity is a business, and this was a business decision. We're taking an AM radio station and changing it from a format that was struggling in the market. Research showed us that there is an audience without a voice, without a station, without a forum for their particular views," Hixson says. "There is a segment of the Central Valley and Fresno that is not being served. "We feel that we are simply providing a group of radio stations that offer listeners and advertisers the whole pie and not just one slice." Air America, which uses the slogan "radio ... only smarter," has provided a different slant to politics and the news in the 14 months it has been on the air. Local radio listeners have been looking for alternatives to KMJ's lineup since KMPH, FM 107.5, dropped its news/talk format in March. The only other nonsports radio talk-show alternative is Dale Julin's two-hour weekday show from 1 to 3 p.m. on KIRV, AM 1510. Hixson doesn't expect any KMJ listeners to bolt just because Infinity is now offering another opinion. "KMJ listeners aren't going to be interested in KFPT programming, and vice versa. These are two stand-alone stations with completely different viewpoints and philosophies and have nothing whatsoever to do with one another, other than being under the Infinity umbrella," Hixson says. The new KFPT lineup includes "Morning Sedition," 3-6 a.m.; "The Stephanie Miller Show," 6-9 a.m.; "The Al Franken Show," 9 a.m.-noon; "The Ed Schultz Show," noon-3 p.m.; "The Randi Rhodes Show," 3-7 p.m.; "The Stephanie Miller Show," 7-10 p.m.; and "The Mike Malloy Show," 10 p.m.-midnight. Infinity is looking at the possibility of replacing the morning time slot with a local news/talk show. No details on that move have been released. The deal is not good news for the Fresno Grizzlies. KOOR has broadcast the minor-league baseball team's games in Spanish for the past two years. Grizzlies management, notified Friday about the format change of KOOR, is looking for a new station to broadcast the remaining games. (GJ-CA)

Dale Park sends along the following:

Format flipping bounces listeners around AM dial, Saturday, July 16, 2005, Clint O'Connor, Plain Dealer Reporter

An Akron flip-flop and other summer switches have left radio listeners confused. Liberal talk has replaced sports, sports has replaced liberal talk, and Fox Sports Radio has died and been reborn. Twice. A quick tuneup for your fine-tuning: WJMP AM/1520 made a big splash in May when it became the first Greater Cleveland affiliate of "Air America Radio," the liberal talk and humor network of Al Franken and Randi Rhodes. A daytime station based in Kent, and hard to pick up for many Clevelanders, WJMP played the "Music of Your Life" format for several years, but its owners, Media-Com, believed liberal talk would be a successful contrast to the conservative talk shows that dominate radio. Just not for long. Last week, WJMP dropped Air America and picked up Fox Sports Radio, formerly heard on Akron's WTOU AM/1350. The sports network was available because WTOU had dumped Fox in favor of liberal talk at the end of May. For years, Clear Channel-owned WTOU had carried Fox Sports Radio, which features several Los Angeles-based shows including Jim Rome (Rome's syndicator, Premiere Radio Networks, and Fox Sports are both owned by Clear Channel). "We couldn't believe 'TOU gave it up, so we grabbed it," said Bill Klaus, vice president of Media-Com, which also owns WNIR FM/100.1 and two TV stations. The new-new WJMP features Steve Czaban, mornings from 6 to 9, Van Earl Wright and Andrew Siciliano from 9 to noon, Jim Rome from noon to 3, and Chris Myers from 3 to 7. Fox Sports must be appealing. Starting today, WEOL AM/930 in Elyria will add Fox on weekends and weeknights in and around its news, talk and sports programs. "It seemed to be a good fit for us," said Gary Kneisley, president of Elyria-Lorain Broadcasting, owner of WEOL and smooth jazz "The Wave" WNWV FM/107.3. WEOL also recently picked up Glenn Beck's syndicated show, dumped in March by Clear Channel's WTAM AM/1100 when it added TV sleazebanger Jerry Springer. Beck is on weekday mornings from 9 to noon.

Here's the weekday talk lineup for WTOU (after FCC approval it will become WARF), which bills itself as "Radio Free Ohio - Talk Radio for the Rest of Us": Bill Press, 6 a.m. to 9. Stephanie Miller, 9 to noon. Al Franken, noon to 3. Ed Schultz, 3 to 6. Randi Rhodes, 6 to 10. In other dial doings, Cleveland lost one of its nicest radio personalities, Caroline Eckles, who is headed to pharmacy school at Ohio State University. "My dream of becoming a doctor has turned into this," said Eckles, 35. "I won't have to go a quarter-million dollars into debt, only \$150,000 into debt." Since 1992, Eckles had been host of several eclectic music shows on Cleveland State University's WCSB FM/89.3, where she served stints as general manager and business manager. Her most recent show was the weekly, alt-country heavy "Cowboy in Sweden." Eckles also played bass in a couple of local bands with her twin sister, Barb, who is joining her at pharmacy school. If nothing else, they'll have a cool name for their next band: Pharmacy Twins. (DP-HI)

Pat Martin sends along the following from Deane McIntyre of Calgary, AB.:

The CRTC has approved a new AM station for Vancouver:

In this decision, the Commission approves the application by I.T. Productions Ltd. for a broadcasting licence to operate a new ethnic AM radio station at Vancouver at 1200 kHz. The applicant proposed a service that will be directed predominantly to Vancouver's South Asian communities. The applicant made a commitment to provide programming directed to a minimum of 11 different ethnic groups in 17 different languages in each broadcast week. All of the station's programming would be devoted to ethnic programming, and 95% of this would be in third languages. A minimum of 73% of all programming would be in the Hindustani and Punjabi languages. The applicant's proposal indicates that approximately 93% of the service would be directed to underserved groups in the Vancouver market, namely its South Asian communities, and that a further 1% would target other underserved ethnic groups. For the purpose of this calculation regarding the amount of programming that I.T. would devote to underserved ethnic groups, the Commission has considered to be "underserved", ethnic groups that, according to the data contained in the CRTC Broadcasting Policy Monitoring Report 2004, currently receive five hours or less of programming per week from existing Vancouver ethnic radio stations. The Commission accordingly approves the application by I.T. Productions Ltd. for a broadcasting licence to operate a commercial AM (ethnic) radio programming undertaking at Vancouver, at 1200 kHz, with a transmitter power of 25,000 watts.

From the Industry Canada database, it appears that this station will operate with the same parameters day and night - 25 kW into two 79 degree towers spaced 90 degrees, the second tower oriented at a bearing of 323 degrees relative to the first (reference) tower. The power ratio is 1:0.9 for the two towers, the phase difference being -96 degrees for the second relative to the reference tower. I am sure that someone on the list can compute the pattern based on this data. The coordinates are 49 09 55 N, 123 02 28 W. OK, I had a look at the application on the CRTC website, it appears that the main lobe is broadly directed to the NW, with nulls to the SE to protect WOAI. On another note the CBC has applied to the CRTC for drop in FM stations in Edmonton AB to rebroadcast CHFA-680 and CBX-740, and in Saskatoon SA to rebroadcast CBK-540, noting problems due to QRM to the AM signals in the core of these cities. Posted on Fri, Jul. 15, 2005, LIBERAL TALK-RADIO DOUBLE SHOT COMING, Two Central Coast stations to begin programs next week

By BETTINA ADRAGNA, Coming soon to the airwaves near you: liberal talk radio.

In an apparent coincidence, a Watsonville AM station and a Carmel Valley AM station will convert to liberal talk radio formats next week, giving comedian/liberal commentator Al Franken two outlets to reach a new audience on the Central Coast. Up first Monday will be KOMY AM-1340, a sister station to right-leaning KSCO in Santa Cruz. Then, Thursday, Spanish-language talk station KRXA AM-540 in Carmel Valley, further left on the dial, makes the switch under new ownership. The station was acquired Friday by Washington, D.C., lawyer Hal Ginsberg and Peter Collins, who will host a talk show. KOMY will feature six hours of programming from the liberal Air America broadcast network. The new lineup will include Franken, author of "Lies and the Lying Liars Who Tell Them" and "Rush Limbaugh is a Big Fat Idiot and Other Observations"; commentator Randi Rhodes; Alan Colmes; and Santa Cruz lawyer and Democratic Party activist Paul Sanford, who will be involved with programming 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. every day. KOMY and its conservative counterpart, KSCO, are owned by Michael Zwerling. "We want to give the people what they want, and what they've been asking for... is more hosts with a liberal, progressive political leaning," Zwerling said Thursday. His KSCO has been local home to the likes of Rush Limbaugh, Michael Savage and Michael Reagan. KOMY will be "primarily a radio station for liberals, and KSCO will primarily be a station for conservatives," said Zwerling. KRXA, formerly known as KXME, will include political comedian Stephanie Miller broadcasting live from Los Angeles; Ed Schultz, author of "Straight From the Heartland," and Collins, who has worked for talk show stations in San Francisco for almost 30 years, including KGO, KNBR and KSFO. "We're going to be presenting the antithesis to the right-wing rants that are generally on talk radio," said Ginsberg. At the same time, "it won't be a situation like NPR, where we have talking heads or pundits. We will definitely be challenging our guests." Ginsberg and Collins acquired KRXA from People's Radio Inc., which owns two other radio stations in the Monterey area. "We chose Monterey because it's a beautiful place... and we also believe that there's just a very strong interest among the people who live here in hearing more than right-wing voices," said Collins. How do they feel about competition from the Zwerling operation? "We welcome that," said Collins. "We think that there's room for a lot of different voices on the radio dial." The two commercial stations also will compete, at least at times, with public radio station KAZU in Pacific Grove. KAZU General Manager John McNally said he welcomes the company. "The more variety one has in the market, the better. Listeners will have more choice," he said. He said he doesn't think the stations will compete with public radio, because "people listen to public radio because of the style that it's presented." Local lawyer and educator Bill Monning,

who has hosted talk shows as a volunteer on KAZU and at public station KUSP, said, "I think it's great that the non-public radio airwaves will also include a greater diversity of opinion and perspective. The Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) has released its sixth annual Broadcasting Policy Monitoring Report. This report assesses the impact of its regulations, policies and decisions on the Canadian broadcasting industry, in light of the objectives of the Broadcasting Act. Beginning this year, publication has been moved up several months so that data contained in the report will be available to the Canadian public and the regulated industries on a more timely basis. The report deals with the radio, television, and broadcast distribution sectors, as well as social issues and the Internet.

Radio: Canadians have access to 1,158 radio services, of which 867 are in English, 253 are in French, and 38 are in third languages. In 2004, Canadians listened to radio an average of 19.5 hours per week, which represents the same number of hours as in 2003. Revenues for Canadian private radio stations exceeded \$1.2 billion in 2004, and profits before interest and tax came in at \$224 million. Since the adoption of the CRTC's commercial radio policy in 1998, Canadian radio stations have spent more than \$156 million on Canadian talent development.

DXWW-W SPECIAL

Fellas, I thought you'd be interested in some interesting loggings up here on the Queen Charlottes, just to the south of the Alaska panhandle. I'm still learning the lay of the land, and my equipment.

Running battery power, with 2 mini-Beverages of approx. 350' each. One is N/S, and the other is towards Australia. Still working out the bugs, though. Internet access is dreadfully slow in the town of Masset, and intermittent. The days are very long with darkness not happening until after 23:00 local, and light is before 0500 local. Conditions were poor this morning, compared to 2 days previous. On a positive note, after DXing this morning, I donned my wet suit, and went out into the ocean to catch some big Dungeness crab, abundant in these waters (very cold, but nice with the wet suit). I'll be trying for Australia on MW more often, as well as Alaska. Here is a selection of my loggings. Good DX to you all! Walt Salmaniw, near Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC, Canada.

7/21. Fellas, the first morning of the round the world virtual expedition is under my belt. Results were rather mediocre, in my opinion for MW, and more interesting on the Tropical bands. I did hear a few new Alaskans. I don't think there was anything new for me for Trans Pacific. I'll be looking forward to reading how the others fared, and I'm hoping that tomorrow will yield more interesting DX. Here's my catch. Incidentally, I used 3 antenna (well really only 2 for MW: 2 mini-Beverages measuring 350 and 400' respectively, aimed 170/350 and 30/210 degrees. Still using 12 volts, although the power should be hooked up very soon.

7/22. Well another morning has passed, and conditions were MUCH superior to yesterday's for sure! I began dxing a bit later at just before 11:00 UTC and immediately found the bands to be alive. Most split frequencies had good hets on them. The big difference was the value of my short 120' random wire running very close to E/W. This was the best wire for many split frequencies, mostly because of the attenuation of North American signals, allowing for the numerous TP signals to propagate. That short length of wire provided excellent dx right up until sunrise at which time the ambient noise on that antenna rendered it useless for MW. This is in stark contrast to yesterday when that antenna was next to useless except on SW. My number 1 big puzzle (please help!) is 1575, which generally was stronger than the usually stronger 1566 HLAZ. I tuned in 1575 just before 13:00 to hear: "National Anthem", followed by a short possibly an anthem. Faded down quickly, but thought I heard "Armed forces" as well. Could this be one of the Japanese AFN stations? Generally I heard reasonably good signals from all over the Pacific, without any one region dominating. Perhaps Japan was best if I had to pick.

I've considered the antenna issue again. Wanda won't tolerate easily visible wires obstructing her views. The wire I have in ample supply is a white teflon coated multistrand wire, identical to that used at Grayland, WA. I had purchased many miles of the stuff and various other odds and ends including coax, ground cable, etc, all for about \$35 at a government auction. No choice on wire colour. Sorry Wanda! While exploring yesterday our neighboring properties, I realized that the lot on the east may be an ideal place to conceal some wires. EWE, Kaz, or Pennants could very easily be put on that property, and fed with a short length of coax back to our home. Furthermore, I suspect some mini-Beverages up to 400' in length could also be run. Having traversed the site, it would be a very difficult property to develop, so I'm hoping it will remain "dormant" for many years to come. Of course if it is developed, then I'm back to some of my earlier plans to erect antennae across the road to the south of the property, for example. Furthermore, with many tall Spruce trees on the property, one could erect some traditional antennae such as dipoles and delta loops, and have them high enough that they wouldn't be noticed, at least not by Wanda!

To end this segment of my DX adventures, here are some loggings from last night and this morning. I'm taking part in a world-wide virtual coastal expedition, linking dxers from the United States, Canada, Scandinavia, South Africa, Australia and New Zealand, and perhaps elsewhere. I'll be eager to read their loggings!

7/23. Well, another night and morning of dxing here on the Queen Charlotte Islands. Reception was not great on MW, at least initially and was totally dominated by Japan. One abbreviated session tomorrow morning, and I'll be heading back to Victoria.

7.24. Well, this morning was slightly abbreviated as my Father-in-law picked me up at 06:45 local, and I had to be totally packed by then. Again, Japan practically had the entire MW band to themselves yet again. I will be very interested in ascertaining whether this is a local phenomenon characteristic for the Charlottes, or more an issue of propagation conditions in general. I did have some fun hearing many more aeronautical voice LW beacons. I do need a better database, though. Today's beacon logs will have to be identified later as I left my list in my luggage (I'm typing this sitting in YVR, Vancouver airport waiting for my connecting flight to Victoria). Again I was pleased with my short random wire running close to due E/W (120' or so). If this antenna continues to perform in it's very quiet manner, basically nulling many of the lower 48 stations that spoil much of the Beverage antenna characteristics here, then I'll very likely erect one across my property near the sand dunes, and run it across the property to my east to achieve a "mini-Beverage" length. Assuming this property remains undeveloped (I hope so!), it will be an ideal site to conceal the bulk of my antennae without the problems of having to cross the road to reach the large land parcel to my south which had been my original plan. I have to admit a bit of disappointment in primarily hearing mostly Japanese stations. Not knowing the language, and finding the programming rather dull didn't really thrill me. I do hope that other more exotic dx will be in the cards in the future. Here are my loggings, including a single interesting Time signal logging from last night.

Walt Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Haida Gwaii (Queen Charlotte Islands), BC.

- 180 **RUSSIA** Radio Rossii, Petropavlovsk, Jul 7 11:57 - A much better morning right from the start! Good signal levels from this channel. Most of the other Russian far east stations on LW are blocked by numerous aeronautical beacons.

- 180 **RUSSIA**(c) Jul 21 12:18 - Poor to fair reception of this LW station.
+ Jul 22 10:59 - A much better morning with a much superior signal. Maybe I should have arisen earlier!
+ Jul 24 Probably the best I've heard them these past 4 mornings, with Russian religious talk. Not quite armchair, but a very decent signal. (Salmani, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 208 **ALASKA** OYN Nome, Alaska, Jul 3 0508 - Loop broadcast of this NDB at fair level stating that the pilot weather briefings are suspended until 1400Z (0600 local). Rare to hear these taped loops further south. (Salmani, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 209+ **ALASKA** Aviation Beacons, Jul 23 10:59 - An interesting sideline to dxing here on the Charlottes is listening for Aviation beacons, and especially those that have voice transmissions which I never hear in Victoria. This morning I was able to hear six different transmissions. My database appears to be woefully out of date, so I'll need to search more up to date sources. Help finding these would be appreciated. On 209 kHz, the following was heard: 'The transcribed aviation weather forecast is suspended.' I have OYN, Nome listed on 208. Will need further research. Furthermore, I also heard the same message on 260 kHz. My sources do not list any Alaskan on 260. The closest is RL, Riboo WA and EU Frank, Eugene OR. More study is needed. Aviation weather for Alaska was heard on 277 kHz. Weather for Kodiak Island, Bristol Bay, Cook Inlet, etc. I have ACE Kachemak, Homer AK listed. 355, also has the same aviation weather. Nothing listed on 355, but 356 lists HHM Hotham, Kotzebue, AK, FOX, Fox AK, and GRP Granite Point, AK. More research again needed! 394 is listed as RWO Woody Is., Kodiak, AK. They mention that, 'pilot weather reports are requested'. Included weather for Dutch Harbor, Eastern Bering Sea, the Aleutians, and the Gulf of Alaska. Finally, 411 was heard well with aviation weather. Nothing listed in my databases, but 412 lists FXW Farewell Lake, AK. Included weather for Dillingham, Kodiak (temperature on 13 deg F.... Brrr!). (Salmani, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 245+ **ALASKA**, 11:15- Aerobeacons Jul 24 I don't have my database with me for LW aerobeacons, but I heard quite a few more voice Aerobeacons. Here's the list: 245: 'Transcribed aviation weather broadcast is suspended'. Fair. 251: Aviation weather for Bethel, Kodiak, etc. 338: Aviation weather for Valdez Harbor field, Valdez city (missing), Cordova, etc. 371: Aviation weather, and synopsis for the Western Aleutians, Central Gulf coast, Kodiak Is, Bristol Bay, etc. poor. 379: Area forecast for Kodiak Is. Good. With 6 yesterday, and 5 today that's 11 total. I've only heard 2 or 3 of these services in the past. I'm not 100% sure that they're all in Alaska but I suspect so.
- 393 **ALASKA** TOG Togiak, Ak, Jul 3 0511 - ATIS information from presumed Togiak, Ak at poor to fair level. (Salmani, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 530 **ALASKA** ADK, Adak, Jul 22 11:52 - First time heard here (although regularly heard in Grayland, WA). Fair to good with ADK in Morse.
- 580 **ALASKA** KRSA Petersburg, Jul 3 14:20 - Excellent reception with inspirational Christian music. (Salmani, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
+ Jul 5 06:02 - Local weather, followed by ID: 'Making a difference, KRSA'. Very good reception. - 1314 **JAPAN**, 12:15-, JOUF, Osaka Jul 24 Weak, though in the clear. 50 kw listed strength. Usual Japanese talk. Why do Japanese stations play very little music, at least in the mornings. All I kept hearing was talk! A bit on the boring side, especially if my Japanese is not that great.
- 1332 **JAPAN** JOSF, Nagoya, Jul 7 12:42 - Fair reception with Japanese talk by a man and woman.
+ 12:00-, Jul 24 Fair to good reception of this 50 kw station. Japanese talk by OM.
- 1366 **JAPAN**, 12:00-, NHK2 Jul 24 Take your pick of 4 NHK2 stations on this frequency, all at 10 kw. Fanfare, 3 + 1 time pips. Fair strength. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 1386 **JAPAN** NHK2, Jul 7 12:45 - Initially in slow English, with mention of Australia and New Zealand, but switched to Japanese, so presumably an NHK2 station with language lessons. Fair to good. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
+ Jul 23 12:26 - Weak NHK2. There are several listed.
- 1404 **JAPAN** JOQL Kushiuro, Hokkaido, Jul 23 12:28 - Poor to fair reception, with music then Japanese talk. 5 kw listed on this probable logging.
+ 12:18- JOQL, Kushiuro Jul 24 Fair reception with female vocal. I'm thinking this Hokkaido station is the most likely. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 1413 **JAPAN** JOIF, Fukuoka, Jul 23 12:51 - Fair talk by OM in Japanese. Listed at 50 kw.
+ 12:01-, JOIF, Fukuoka Jul 24 Good reception with Japanese talk by YL. 50 kw listed.
- 1422 **JAPAN** JORF, Yokohama, Jul 23 12:29 - Japanese talk by a YL. I'm assuming this to be Yokohama with 50 kw. Fair reception. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
+ 12:19-, JORF, Yokohama Jul 24 Good reception with Japanese talk by OM. 50 kw listed. Nice signal!. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 1440 **JAPAN** JOWF, Sapporo, Jul 7 12:47 - Strong reception in Japanese.
+ 12:21-, JOWF, Sapporo Jul 24 Reminds me that it's worthwhile to check the 10 kHz channels. This 50 kw Hokkaido station was well over any North American cochannels.
- 1449 **JAPAN**, 12:21-, JOQM, Abashiri Jul 24 5 kw listed for another Hokkaido station. Weak Japanese talk. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 1503 **AUSTRALIA** 2BS Gold, Bathurst NSW, Jul 3 12:38 - Tentative logging of an Australian accented male at poor to fair level. I suspect this is the most likely, although 3KND, Melbourne or NZ could still be possible, but less likely.
+ Jul 22 11:40 - Initially a strong het and weak audio, but improved. Played oldies (western), so not Radio Sport. I'm assuming then, 2BS. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
+ Jul 22 12:51 - English programming, and a guess on my part.
- 1503 **JAPAN** NHK1?, Jul 7 12:49 - A presumed logging with a radio play in Japanese. Good reception. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
+ 12:02-, JOUK, Akita Jul 24 A low powered NHK1 transmitter. My guess is Akita with 10 kw.
- 1548 **AUSTRALIA** 4QD, Emerald, Jul 23 12:32 - Good reception with 'ABC Radio' heard. Listed as 50 kw. Continued good reception when rechecked at 13:01.
- 1557 **AUSTRALIA? NEW ZEALAND? ?2ZH**, Havera or 2RE, Taree, Jul 23 13:05 - Not sure which English speaker this station represents. Play by play sports program. Either Aussie 2RE Coastal Radio Taree, NSW with 2 kw, or 2ZH Havera, NZ also 2 kw.
- 1566 **KOREA (SOUTH)** HLAZ, Jul 7 12:54 - Excellent reception this morning in Japanese.
+ Jul 21 13:10 - Strong signal with Japanese Christian broadcast. Still fair at 13:21, well after local sunrise. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
+ Jul 23 12:34 - Only fair to good reception of this regular, along with another cochannel station. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 1575 **UNKNOWN** unid, Jul 22 12:55 - Fascinating. I just tuned to this frequency, and immediately heard in English, 'National Anthem', and into a possible short NA. Faded rapidly, but not before I thought I heard 'Armed Forces'. Who could this be? Ideas please? AFN from Japan??. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 1575 **UNKNOWN** (c) 12:46-, unid Jul 24 I'm puzzled by this frequency. There was a weakly heard station on this frequency. Never strong enough to positively ID. I'm sure it's not the VOA. I've heard them from home frequently, and this doesn't sound that official. If I stayed on the Charlottes, I'd make it a point to monitor it every morning. Recall I heard some unusual English here the other morning. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 1584 **JAPAN** NHK 1, Jul 7 12:57 - Very weak but parallel to 1503. Not sure of location of transmitter. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 1593 **JAPAN**, 12:04-, JOTB, Matsue or JOQB, Niigata Jul 24 Not sure which, as both are NHK2 transmitters at 10 kw. Good levels but suffering from splatter.

TIS stations aren't usually heard here, but this morning there was one for what sounded like: 'Whittier to Bear Valley Memorial Tunnel' Open 5:30 am to 11:15 pm. Propane restricted to 100 lbs. All vehicles under surveillance. Enforcement by local and state authorities. Thank you for driving carefully. Speed restricted to 25 mph. Can someone identify who this is? I don't have any TIS stations listed for Alaska, so I'm assuming a station in the lower 48. Help please! (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 1683.21 **AUSTRALIA** Radio Club, Jul 3 12:43 - Presumed logging of Sydney (Lakemba), NSW with 400w. Listed as 24 hr Greek, although the music sounded somewhat Arabic/middle eastern. Weak audio. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 1701.06 **AUSTRALIA**, Jul 3 12:44 - Two stations here. I always marvel at the strength of these flea-powered Aussies on this channel (and always slightly off frequency). When the rest of the band is dead, there often still is audio on this channel to North America. The dominant station is Radio 1701, Brisbane with Hindi music (listed as 100w) over cochannel probable NTC Radio 16, Silverwater, NSW with Australian accented English programming (this one I don't normally ever hear). (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 1737 **PAPUA NEW GUINEA** KUT (Beacon), Jul 21 10:42 - weakly heard at this time.
+ 12:08-, KUT Jul 24 Beacon station heard only weakly today.
- 2310 **AUSTRALIA** VL8A Alice Springs, Jul 3 12:55 - Very good reception with usual ABC programming, parallel to slightly weaker 2325 VL8T Tennant Creek, and 2485 VL8K Katherine (the latter with a ute cochannel spoiling the frequency).
+ Jul 21 10:44 - Very good reception with cricket play by play. Parallel to weaker 2325 VL8T, and 2485 VL8K (with it's characteristic humm). (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 2850 **KOREA (NORTH)** KCBS, Pyongyang, Jul 21 10:47 - Good to very good reception with a Korean play. Not the usual martial style for a change. Parallels heard include: 3220 (with cochannel), 3350 (loud buzz), 3959.73 (fair), and 9665.50 (buzz).
- 2959.96 **INDONESIA** RPDT Manggarai, Ruteng, Flores, Timor, Jul 3 12:55 - Fair to good reception of this reliable Indo with Indonesian talk. Always very impressive for 300w listed.
- 3235 **PAPUA AND NEW GUINEA** Radio West New Britain, Jul 3 13:00 - S7 signal with EZL C&W music. No ID at the TOH. Female DJ at 13:02 was answering a listener's call: 'Hello?, hello?, hello?' I couldn't make the caller out at all. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
+ Jul 21 10:52 - Not many PNGs on the air this morning. Good reception with local choir. Note that the 2 Christian stations are only poorly propagating...ie 4960 and 7120, with the later only being present as a het. Did they move frequencies already, as they had planned? Possibly Wantok Radio Light adjusted their NVIS antenna to reduce propagation further afield.
- 3249.55 **KOREA (NORTH)** Pyongyang Broadcasting Station, Jul 3 13:05 - Strident Korean OM and YL. Good reception, and parallel to much stronger 3320.17 and 6250.06 (which was also very strong except for a cochannel intermittent buzzing utility).
- 3255 **SOUTH AFRICA** BBCWS, Jul 21 04:18 - BBCWS in English with a radio play. Fair reception via Meyerton. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 3279.54 **ECUADOR** La Voz del Napo, Jul 21 10:55 - Good reception with Spanish programming.
- 3290 **PAPUA NEW GUINEA** Radio Central, Boroko, Jul 21 10:56 - Good signal level, but mostly used USB to avoid an intermittent ute on LSB. Local vocals, and Pidgin talk. S7 signal. No TOH ID, but switched to the National news at 11:02. At 11:54, there was a time check for 6 minutes to 11:00. Later USB had a Russian fisherman net. At 12:01, Central province was mentioned as well as '3290 kHz in the 90 meter band', and signing off until '12:00 tomorrow afternoon'. Then the PNG anthem, and off at 12:03.
- 3325.02 **INDONESIA** RRI Palangkaraya, Borneo, Jul 3 13:10 - Presumed logging with Indonesian talk. Fair to good reception. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 3345 **INDONESIA** RRI Ternate, Moluccas, Jul 3 13:11 - Good reception with Indonesian talk by a YL. There was orchestral music and then a choral anthem (sure sounded like a NA), at 13:15 but then the YL came back on and continued on with the usual Indonesian muffled audio.
- 3365 **PAPUA AND NEW GUINEA** Radio Milne Bay, Alotau, Jul 3 13:19 - Presumed logging with Afro-American vocals at fair to good level. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 3935.07 **NEW ZEALAND** ZLXA, Jul 3 12:50 - Much better heard here, than in recent years in Grayland or Victoria. Good reception with relay of National Radio discussing American involvement in Iraq. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 3976.05 **INDONESIA** RRI Pontianak, Borneo, Jul 3 13:24 - Very good reception with EZL Indonesian music. OM announcer accepted a call, mentioning 'program', and 'bye'. Then several 'hello', but with no answer. Pontianak mentioned at 13:31:20.
- 4604.96 **INDONESIA** RRI Serui, Jul 21 12:04 - RRI news, with reports from the field. Mentioned Bandeh Aceh. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)

- 4753.45 **UNIDENTIFIED ?**, Jul 21 04:23 - I have no idea who is on this off frequency at this time in AM mode. Weak but in the clear. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 4775 **SWAZILAND TWR**, Jul 21 04:15 - Good reception with German religious broadcast. I'm back on the Charlottes for four days. This time, I erected 3 antennae: My original mini-Beverage at 350 degrees and terminated at the north end, 30/210 unterminated 400' miniBeverage, and a 120' random wire at 70/250 degrees. I noted the latter was often best on the tropical bands.
- 4789.98 **INDONESIA** Radio Fak-Fak, West Papua, Jul 3 13:40 - Very good reception with a speech being carried with clapping with excellent audio, then back to the studio with the usual muffy audio. Then low modulation talk by OM with piano background. Spoiled by CODAR.
- 4850 **INDIA AIR** Kohima, Jul 3 13:46 - Rather good reception, but nothing special, in presumed Hindi with talk by YL. 'Service' mentioned. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 4890 **GABON RFI**, Jul 21 04:31 - French programming but barely audible.
- 4930 **SAO TOME VOA**, Jul 7 05:30 - Fair reception with English VOA programming, but lots of atmospheric static. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- + Jul 21 04:32 - Good signal with VOA English programming. Strongest station on the band.
- 4965 **ZAMBIA** Christian Voice, Jul 21 04:33 - Fair reception and marred by summer static. American sounding religious programming in English.
- 5019.89 **SOLOMON ISLANDS SIBC**, Honiara, Jul 21 10:03 - Pidgin news, with mentions of Honiara, Prime minister, national parliament. ID for SIBC, Honiara at 10:07:30. Voice of Salvation also mentioned at 10:13. Always a real pleasure to listen to them!
- 5025 **CUBA** Radio Rebelde, Jul 21 04:34 - Not on the air when first checked at this time, but present at a weak level at 10:00 with Buenos dias, and mentions of North America and Cubano. Must be using either a back up transmitter or antenna system.
- 7390 **RUSSIA** Golos Rossii, Jul 21 12:15 - Russian Orthodox programming with a S9 + 10 signal, and then a Russian religious ballad. Still have to get used to hearing religion from the state broadcaster in Russia! Transmitter is in Vladivostok, so accounts for the phenomenol strength. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 9996 **RUSSIA**, 04:17-, RWM Jul 24 Another offshoot to regular SW dxing. Noted an unmodulated signal on 9996 so I offset to 9996.2 to hear in LSB (or use CW). Double pips from the 9th to the 14th second. Data transfer started at 04:20 until 04:24:55, and then again from 04:25:00 to 04:29:55. A steady carrier tone from 04:30 until 04:37:55, and then RWM repeated over and over again in Morse from 04:38 until 04:40, and then back into regular unmodulated time pips. CW mode works well to listen to them. Excellent level. Transmitter, I think is in Moscow. I wonder how to demodulate the data stream. Didn't sound like any mode I've heard before. Any ideas?. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)
- 11965 **ASCENSION IS.** Star Radio, Monrovia, Jul 21 21:23 - ID as, 'You are listening to Star Radio from Monrovia on the FM and the shortwave'. S6 signal and in the clear. Easy to follow English. (Salmaniw, Tow Hill, Queen Charlotte Is, BC)

GRAYLAND REPORT – John Bryant

Here it is.... I've still not had a chance to REALLY listen to the recording of the 648 UNID.... Will report further on that as appropriate. This "reads better than it was" with only one TP signal ever being really above "fair." That was the 639 Fiji, that boomed in on the second morning. Aw well.... Was still wonderful... and seeing Don and chatting a good bit for the first time in a year was great, too. We've yet to hear from Bryan Clark and I wonder how the South Africans are doing.

- 576 **AUSTRALIA 2RN** Sydney, Jul 22 1255 - EZ listening music until TOH, then ABC time pips and into ABC News. Fair level. Also heard July 24. (Bryant-WA)
- 576 **NEW ZEALAND 1XLR**, Southern Star, Hamilton, Jul 23 1236 - Heard // to much poorer 657, Wellington. Fair level with usual quiet pops/EZL music program hosted by a male announcer. (Bryant-WA)
- 594 **AUSTRALIA 3WV** Horsham, Jul 22 1232 - Noted here with fair signal and only wrote down 'man talk.' Sorry. (Bryant-WA)
- 594 **JAPAN JOAK** NHK1, Tokyo, Jul 24 1207 - Heard briefly at poor level in definite JJ. (Bryant-WA)
- 612 **AUSTRALIA 4QR**, ABC MS Brisbane, Jul 22 1233 - First noted at 1233 on first AM of DXpedition. Heard all three AMs, sometimes at good level. (Bryant-WA)
- 639 **FIJI** Fiji BC, Lautoka, Jul 23 1240 - Heard with a HUGE signal at max dawn with a (7th Day Adventist?) church service in Fijian. The hymns were wonderful. The tradition of world-class Polynesian choirs is alive and well in Lautoka. Heard also at much reduced level on July 24th. (Bryant-WA)
- 648 **UNID N.Z.** or Australian Station, Jul 24 1248 - Heard a light music program which ended with a string of commercials and into a 10 minute religious program at the top-of-the-hour. After looking at the program for this week on NZ's Radio Rhema, it is unlikely to be them. The other strong possibility is 2NU in Tamworth, Australia. The 'commercials' could have been PSA's, but I doubt it. There is also an AFN station in Okinawa on this frequency. Will listen to my recording of this fair to poor signal several times in the days to come. Ideas???. (Bryant-WA)
- 675 **AUSTRALIA 2CO**, Albury (pres.), Jul 24 1217 - Presume this old friend noted in passing with male announcer speaking in Australian. (Bryant-WA)
- 693 **JAPAN JOAB** NHK2, Tokyo, Jul 22 1123 - Heard with // program to 774 at poor level. Over 30 minutes before sunset at the transmitter. Also heard July 24. (Bryant-WA)

- 702 **AUSTRALIA 2BL** ABC MS Sydney, Jul 22 1230 - First noted at 1230. This ABC station was the most reliable during the DXpedition. Heard all three AMs, sometimes at quite good level. (Bryant-WA)
- 738 **AUSTRALIA 2NR** Grafton, Jul 22 1235 - Heard here well with two men in Aussie EE. Heard ABC News at 1300 at lower level as the band began to fade with local dawn at Grayland. Heard also July 23. No sign of Radio Tahiti on either AM. On July 24, heard both stations, separately, within a one hour stretch at dawn. (Bryant-WA)
- 738 **TAHITI** Radio Tahiti/RFO, Mahina, Jul 24 1218 - Noted here at good level with news/features in FF until 1220, then into traditional Tahitian drumming of the form that accompanies their famous high-speed hula. Ah, the mental picture!. (Bryant-WA)
- 774 **AUSTRALIA 3LO** ABC MS Melbourne, Jul 22 1304 - Noted here in place of the Japanese. All alone at good level with ABC News. Heard also 7/23 and 7/24. (Bryant-WA)
- 774 **JAPAN JOUB** NHK2 Akita, Jul 22 1050 - First noted during an odd Japanese opening almost an hour before sunset at the transmitter. Were running a program in a Southeast Asian language in the several minutes prior to TOH. At the hour, NHK time pips and into the news in JJ. Heard mixing with the Aussie on 7/23. Fair level both times. (Bryant-WA)
- 783 **NEW ZEALAND** Wellington Access Radio (prob.), Jul 22 1240 - Probably this one noted throughout the DXpedition with various EE and ethnic programs. Heard all three mornings as the most reliable New Zealand station. (Bryant-WA)
- 792 **AUSTRALIA 4RN** Brisbane, Jul 23 1300 - Good with inst. mx until just prior to TOH when male announcer mentioned ABC. Into ABC pips and then a sudden fade. I presume that ABC News followed. Also heard on July 24th. (Bryant-WA)
- 828 **AUSTRALIA 3GI**, Sale, Jul 27 1231 - Noted in passing with Aussie talk. Fair level with the NHK station beneath. (Bryant-WA)
- 828 **JAPAN JOBB** NHK-2, Osaka, Jul 24 1204 - Noted here at fair to good level // weaker 693, Tokyo with interview of a Yank speaking EE. Weird for a newscast... JJ questions, Yank EE answers. (Bryant-WA)
- 954 **JAPAN JOKR**, Tokyo, Jul 22 1127 - Noted here in passing with fair level at well before sunset at the tx. Two men talking in JJ. (Bryant-WA)
- 1035 **NEW ZEALAND 2ZB**, NewsTalk ZB, Wellington, Jul 24 1230 - Heard here with DU talk, followed by a commercial string with mentions of New Zealand and several cities. Fair level. (Bryant-WA)
- 1134 **JAPAN JOQR**, Tokyo, Jul 24 1155 - Heard here briefly at poor level with definite JJ talk by male. (Bryant-WA)
- 1197 **JAPAN JOWL**, Ashikawa, Hokkaido, Jul 22 1102 - Presume this 3kW STV relay was the one carrying news in JJ just after 1100. At least 30 minutes before local tx sunset. Fair level. (Bryant-WA)
- 1242 **JAPAN JOLF**, Tokyo, Jul 22 1129 - Also noted with poor level in JJ as part of the pre-sunset at the transmitter opening. (Bryant-WA)
- 1287 **JAPAN JOHR** Sapporo, Jul 22 1110 - Noted in passing with good level. News/comment by two males in JJ. Thirty minutes or so before tx sunset. (Bryant-WA)
- 1332 **AUSTRALIA 4BU** Bundaberg (pres.), Jul 24 1240 - Presume this from our old friend, with the usual light rock programming hosted by a male announcer. (Bryant-WA)
- 1548 **AUSTRALIA 4QD** Emerald, Jul 23 1321 - Fair to poor near band fade with Aussie talk by male. I believe this was a sports roundup. Also heard on July 24. (Bryant-WA)
- 1557 **AUSTRALIA 2RE**, Taree, Jul 23 1324 - Clearly an Aussie country music program hosted by a male announcer. With multiple mentions of 'Country Music' and possibly 'Country Music Radio,' this signal lasted until 1346 with at least threshold audio... almost an hour after local dawn at Grayland. Thought that this might be the new 5-call country station listed in Portzer's PAL, but on-line investigation after I returned home makes this almost certainly 2RE. Heard also at band fade on July 24. (Bryant-WA)
- 1566 **AUSTRALIA 3NE** Wangarata, Jul 22 1247 - First heard here near max dawn on the 22nd, mixing with HLAZ. Good level with their usual Old Time Rock and Roll programming. Elvis and 'Hound Dog' never sounded so good. By 1325 band fade was all alone and still good level. Heard at similar level on 7/23. (Bryant-WA)
- 1566 **REP. OF (SOUTH) KOREA** HLAZ, Cheju Island, Jul 22 1115 - Noted at good level in Asian language well over an hour before sunset at the transmitter. Heard throughout the DXpedition. It was a toss-up as to whether one of the two would be alone or whether the would be mixing. (Bryant-WA)
- 1593 **JAPAN** NHK2 Synchros (Shimane/Matsue), Jul 22 1136 - Noted here // 774 with fair level before end of the per sunset at transmitter opening. (Bryant-WA)

2005-2006 IRCA ALPHABET SOUP DX CONTEST RULES

The object of this year's IRCA contest will be to hear up to ten stations with the same letter in its call letters. Only the third letter of the calls is eligible for the contest. Examples: WPMP, the M is the eligible letter. In KODI, the D is the eligible letter. A station can be located in the US, Canada, or Mexico.

Each station will be worth one point, with a maximum of 260 points (26 letters x 10 stations = 260 total points). The contestant with the most total points at the end of the contest will be determined the winner. Entry reports need to be in alphabetical order, and must include the call letter and frequency, along with the location of the station, and date and time heard.

The contest will begin at 0001 on September 1, 2005 and end 2359 on May 31, 2006. In the event that a contestant reaches 260 points, or completes all the letters available, the contest will end at that time. If no one reached 260 points at the closing time, the contestant with the highest amount of point will be declared the winner. In the event that two people have the same number of points, the person that reached that number first will be the winner.

The contest will be open to all IRCA members in good standing. Entrants will be disqualified if they cease to be members of the club. You may join the contest at any time during the year.

All loggings must be made within 25 miles of your main DX location. Normally this is your home, for students this might be your college dorm. If a person moves during the contest they may start over at the new location.

Stations must be in the normal 530-1710 kHz band, licensed by the U.S., Canada or Mexico. TIS and utility stations are not eligible for contest purposes. To count a U.S. station, you must hear the actual call letters. To count a Canadian or Mexican station, you must hear the actual call letters or hear a recognized slogan plus location. Loggings may be first time heard, or relogs of stations heard before. If a station changes call letters it may be relogged and be counted.

Your contest report of stations heard in any particular month must be postmarked by the 5th day of the following month. For example, a station heard on October 12th must be submitted by November 5th to be eligible. Failure to do this will disqualify the item in question for points. Contest entries must not be sent along with WDXR DX tips as they easily become lost when filed away in the WDXR file. Contest entries may be sent e-mail or postal mail to the address above. E-mail entries must not be "attached files."

The contest manager will have the final word on all station and interpretation of all rules, including disqualification of a station for scoring or a member from the contest.

Standings will be updated on the 15th of each month and results published in the next available bulletin subject to normal deadline delays. The final standings will be tabulated on June 15, 2006 and will appear in the July bulletin, subject to space in that bulletin.

The contest manager may join the contest, but will be ineligible for the prize. There is no entry fee for the contest.

Entry in the contest implies consent to all rules, including those which may appear later as necessity dictates. If you have any questions please write.
