Newman also heard the test from his perch near WTTM. Bob Young in Milbury, MA also managed to pull the sweep tones out of the noise and the voice ID that ended the test at about 12:30AM.

But there was also disappointment mixed with the joy in Mudville. Gerry Bishop in Niceville, Florida tried for the test, but reported too much QRM from WNOX and others.

A big thank you for this test to Rene and WNTP! Hope we can count on another one later this season.

#### BCT/CPC Report

The past DX season marked many important milestones in regards to DX Tests. The International Radio Club of America decided to merge it's CPC position with that of the National Radio Club, effectively giving one point of contact to the broadcast industry for DX Tests.

It was also decided to rename the position to better reflect it's mission. We now refer to this position as the "Broadcast Test Coordinator". The IRCA generously provided new stationary and business cards that reflect the new position and help to establish a professional appearance.

Other important changes included a greater reliance on personal contacts through the membership, with the BTC filling more of a supporting role. Now instead of concentrating on sending out requests for tests blindly, we start by asking members to put us in touch with their contacts at local stations, or we assist them in their own efforts to schedule tests.

Assistance from the club comes in the form of providing Morse Code ID's, Sweep tones, and other test materials. In some cases, we have also taken on the responsibility of printing and sending out QSL cards. Our efforts are now directed at making the tests as easy as possible for stations, requiring minimal effort on their part.

This past DX season saw 15 DX tests conducted, including an international test by CCR 1020khz in Grand Turk, which was heard well on the East Coast. and one night that saw four stations testing on the same evening! A graveyard frequency test by KEVA 1240khz was heard across the country, despite the jumbled conditions of this frequency, which speaks to what a difference Morse Code can make it pulling a station out of the noise.

But challenges also face us, with many tests this year coming on short notice, making it more difficult for members without access to the e-mail lists to participate. To combat this problem, the BTC also operates a "flash notification" system where postcards are mailed to members who request short term notification, but only three members have availed themselves of this service.

It seems clear that we will have to continue to adapt to changes in the broadcasting industry that make it ever more difficult to schedule tests. More and more tests will be conducted on short notice, making it essential that DX'ers use all the tools available, especially e-mail lists to stay informed. Some stations also cited legal concerns, wanting to avoid even the appearance of causing interference to other stations by conducting tests at daytime power levels, despite our pointing out that such tests are legal.

Both engineers and management are less likely to be amateur radio operators or even radio hobbyist themselves, making them less sympathetic to our requests. To combat these problems, we've taken several steps:

1. Our broadcast test coordinator as spoken at two meetings of the Society of Broadcast Engineers, playing clips of rare DX tests, explaining the hobby, and asking for future tests. As a result of these meetings we already have commitments for two new tests in the coming season.

We've encouraged other members to reach out to their local chapters as well, and have offered to supply materials for their use.

2. We have begun to approach stations with the idea of a :60 second "mini-test" format. Basically a commercial that can be inserted into the stations overnight inventory, that would run Morse Code ID's and sweep tones near the top of the hour. Some stations have expressed interest in this format, since it does not require engineering support nor does it affect their commitment to overnight programming.

3. Members in both clubs are now encouraged to exploit their own contacts with local engineers and station managers to request tests. We supply guidance and advice, and will interface directly where needed. These types of contacts accounted for perhaps 1/2 of all the tests conducted last season.

4. BTC has spoken widely in print publications and on the e-mail lists about the need to treat stations with greater respect. Not demanding QSL's, reporting "cheaters" to the FCC, or other actions that might negatively affect the image of hobbyists with the broadcast community.

DX'ers have to adapt to the changing nature of broadcasting, and strive to create a positive image with stations.

Suggestions for improvement are always welcome. I look forward to the coming DX season and contributing to both clubs.

The FCC on Friday granted permission to GLR Networks to deliver Spanish-language programming to XTRA-AM/Tijuana-San Diego — a step in the expected transfer of control of the 690 kHz powerhouse's programming and sales agreements from Clear Channel to Madrid-based Grupo Prisa S.A., which will later acquire the station outright through a Mexican subsidiary. No date has been released from either company regarding the format flip of XTRA, currently Adult Standards as "The Fabulous 690." XTRA-AM's signal can be heard throughout Southern California and much of Baja California Norte, Mexico. (RW-CA)
