2005 Convention Report Mike Sanburn

The 2005 IRCA convention went as scheduled in Anaheim CA from August 25th to 27th

Thursday, the first order of business was a station tour marathon to the inland empire beginning with the tower site of KWRM-1370, then on to Riverside for a studio tour of KTDD-1350, KKDD-1290. KDIF-1440 and KGGI-99.1 FM. From there, the next stop was the Carousel Mall in San Bernardino for the KCAA-1050 studios. Then, local tower sites for KEZY-1240, KTDD-1350 and KTIE-590. Heading West towards Rancho Cucamonga, the group viewed the 4-tower array of KSPA-1510. At this point, the group split with some continuing on westward to visit the KTNQ-1020/KTLK-1150

towers and others returned to the Hotel. Many thanks to Bob Wien who went above and beyond the call of duty by mapping out the stations and conducting this road trip. On Thursday night, many of us went to the local Outback Steakhouse and feasted on a fine dinner.

The next day, our carayan of 3 silver cars headed down to the studios of KBRT-740 where we were given a friendly and informative look around. We also received some nice handouts on the way out the door, including coverage maps. The final tour was the KFI tower in La Mirada currently transmitting from their auxiliary tower since the tragic plane crash of last December 19th which took down the main antenna. Friday evening some of us grouped together for pizza or pasta, then Bob Wien put on a PowerPoint slide presentation depicting local and distant radio stations, towers and fun facts about the city of Anaheim. Each night of the convention, we had an outstanding view of the fireworks show at nearby Disneyland.

donated. Also, thanks to Steve Jarvis for providing the picture discs of classic verifications. Thanks to all who participated!

I look forward to attending and hosting more conventions in the future. The sad footnote to this convention is that as folks were departing on Sunday, hurricane Katrina was beginning to bear down on the Gulf Coast. Our thoughts remain with those people and their struggle. 73

Bruce Conti DXpedition via ABDX (used by permission) Camden, Maine, Camping DXpedition - September 15-17, 2005

The target for this DXpedition was the Caribbean and Latin America with auroral conditions expected due to an x-class solar flare, so antennas were aimed in that direction. No deep South Americans, but still a few new ones logged with Venezuela dominant on many frequencies. Some transatlantic hets were noted early each evening from the usual suspects at 1359, 1431, 1521, 1548, and 1584, but time wasn't wasted securing audio and identifying them. Any TA hets faded with the setting sun. This DXpedition had its share of mishaps. Although hurricane Ophelia was tracking well to the south, there was still heavy rain both nights, especially Friday night into the morning when the tent sprung a few leaks. At the end of the DXpedition, while pulling in the 800-m wire, it snapped. Retrieving some 400m of wire in the woods wasn't an option in the pouring rain, so it remains to be found for a future DXpedition if not scavenged by a bush-whacker or hunter before then. Meanwhile it's going to take a couple of days for everything to dry out. All times are UTC.

Station Controller Designate Corina Bishop told MercoPress that more than a hundred suggestions were put forward and it was felt that the name Falkland Islands Radio Service, which was suggested by a few people, "...will continue to show that the station plays an important part in community life here." She said she has received "mixed reactions" to the new name. "There are those who didn't want it changed and still don't but there are some people who are pleased with the change and some who are simply pleased that it wasn't too radical." ASIA AND PACIFIC

ALASKA: The tuning house for KICY-850 was destroyed by fire on August 17, knocking the station off the air for several days. The station's transmitter, towers and other facilities were not affected and the station will be able to resume broadcasting using a single tower. It does not expect to have the directional array back up until summer 2006. See http://www.covchurch.org/cov/news/item4432.html for more information. Notes from Alaskan vacation 15-26 July (bp)

- 840 KCKC Big Lake, confirmed silent, not heard while in the area and has been deleted from FCC database
- 950 KSWD Seward, had been silent, but is now active. 24 hour non-stop country music, no ads or announcements except for occasional IDs
- 980 KZXX Kenai confirmed silent, not heard while in the area and has been deleted from FCC database
- 1020 KAXX Eagle River is silent, though still listed in FCC database
- 1110 KAGV Big Lake-Houston, was silent. According to www.daveandlauraonline.com, KAGV started broadcasting in late 2004. Less than a month later, the transmitter building was flooded, and some of the equipment was damaged. The station had hoped to be back on by March. No mention of a revised target date.
- 1170 KJNP is apparently not 24hr. Noted off at 2 or 3 am LT while in Healy, but stayed on past midnight 7/19. Their web site says they're on about 19 hours/day, so sked might be 0500-0100 +/- local time.
- 1500 Seward. TIS noted here while in Seward w/parking info. etc. Very low power.
- 1610 WPHC769 Anchorage, TIS at University of Alaska Anchorage campus, parking and other info about campus activities, "WPHC769, Wolf Radio for University of Alaska Anchorage". Good-fair throughout Anchorage.

1610 KOE700 There is a TIS near the entrance to Denali National Park, with park info etc. "KOE700. the Radio Voice of Denali National Park".

AMERICAN SAMOA: KJAL-580 was off-air for 5 months with cyclone damage, returned to air early June 2005 using reduced power of 2.2kW. Presumably this has also delayed move to 630. WVUV-648 has been on-air during 2004-2005 with very low power. Application for STA in 2004 was lost by FCC, so WVUV has asked for reinstatement of move to 720 and existing call letters. (David Ricquish)

AUSTRALIA: It didn't take 'Billybroadcasting' long to incorporate his new radio property into the 2SM Supernetwork. So as you will hear Port Macquarie/Kempsey (531kHz), Coff's Harbour (639kHz) & Orange (1089 kHz) and are now parallel with the others using 2SM as the hub. I guess the elevator music has been eliminated off of the hard drive. (Chris Martin, mwoz)

927 6NR Perth has gone to FM 100.1Mhz

1026 4MK Mackay now 4AA

1044 5CS Port Pirie has gone to FM & has been replaced by 5AU Port Augusta //1242.

INDIA: The Asian-Pacific region's biggest broadcasting studio was inaugurated on Tuesday (23 Aug) by Information and Broadcasting Minister S. Jaipal Reddy. Built on a plinth area of 13,895 square meter, the new five-storied Broadcasting House and the 18,958 square meter 11-storeyed Doordarshan Bhawan Tower B house state-of-the art studios and modern centrally air-conditioned offices. The new complex will be used by the All India Radio home services, the News Services Division and the External Services Division. It has 26 fully automated transmission studios, and all recording, editing and playback equipment, including mixing consoles and master routers, are in digital mode. The newsroom is paperless and equipped with state-of-the art facilities. There are also six dubbing rooms, five control booths, two radio conferencing rooms and one Captive Earth Station. Each of the 26 transmission studios include a digital audio work station, two CD players and a digital mixer. Ten of the 26 studios are equipped with digital phone-in units with a facility to conference up to 12 callers on ISDN and PSTN lines. (http://sify.com/news/ via Mukesh Kumar)

NEW ZEALAND: 1548 Palmerston North is no longer silent. It's now on air [August 1] with Coast brand from TRN. This format is 24/7 from studios in Auckland and locally inserted ad breaks. Maximum allowed power for this station is 3.162kW. (David Ricquish)

VANUATU: The New Zealand Government has given funds for 2 new MW transmitters, one for Vila area, the other for Santo area, and both will be installed by September 2005. Each will be DRM capable. In handing over funding, the NZ High Commissioner [Ambassador] said that FM and TV might be 'nice to have', but medium wave 'is an essential part of a functioning democracy'. MW broadcasts in many parts of the Pacific are in danger of shut down from high power costs [usually diesel generators], lack of technical expertise, weather damage and old equipment. Currently, Radio Cook Islands 630, SBC Samoa 540 and SIBC Honiara 1035 are all running at half or reduced power because of power costs, Nauru 1323 is off air, KJAL American Samoa 580 is on reduced power after a cyclone, WVUV American Samoa 648 has been operating only at very low power awaiting an FCC frequency and tower change and part of Papua New Guinea's MW network is being rebuilt with Japanesé aid. The comments from the New Zealand government reflect a real concern that neighbor island broadcasters are under severe pressure to survive. Both RNZI and Radio Australia now provide much of the technical and training expertise needed to keep stations on air as far away as the Marshall Islands and as close as Tonga and Niue. This 'aid' is expected to expand in the future. The model emerging is for island stations to get help buying new DRM capable MW transmitters so they can relay RNZI DRM [from later this year] and RA DRM [2006] broadcasts to local repeater FM stations whilst providing a stable MW signal for continued reception on analog radio sets. (David Ricquish HCDX)

EUROPE, AFRICA, AND MIDDLE EAST

BENIN: Trans World Radio has started construction of a new medium wave station. See update at http://www.twrafrica.org/0060.asp. (TWR Website via mwc)

DENMARK: Danmarks Radio decided that the LW and MW transmitters in Kalundborg would be closed down - and so DR will stop using 243 and 1062 kHz. The final decision on such a closure must however be taken by the Ministry of Culture. Currently DR is obliged to use LW and MW. A decision on the closure of the transmitters in Kalundborg will probably take effect as of January 1st 2007. The foreign language services (in English, Arabic, Serbo-Croatian, Somali, Urdu and Turkish) will be terminated by the end of December 2005. (Stig Hartvig Nielsen, mwc)

GERMANY: 666 Rohrdorf - since 4 July no longer 24h.The silent periods of this transmitter are the same as introduced for 828 and 1485 a while ago, i.e. Mon-Fri 2100-0300 (winter 2200-0400), Sat+Sun 2100-0500 (winter 2200-0600). This means that for the first daily transmission hour still MDR Info will be carried, since SWR contra relays MDR Info Mon-Fri 2100-0400, Sat+Sun 2100-0556 (also here in winter one UT hour later of course). (Kai Ludwig, via Arctic)

Bernhard Weiskopf reports that the 711 kHz transmitter at Heidelberg, shut down in 2004, has already been demolished. Only the small transmitter building still exists. (Kai Ludwig, Arctic)

Kai Ludwig reports: "Deutschlandradio has officially announced that its longwave transmitter at Zehlendorf on 177 kHz and the medium wave transmitter at Berlin-Britz on 855 kHz will be *permanently* switched to DRM mode on Monday 29 August. 990 kHz will be kept in AM mode and in future carry the special programs that were previously carried on 177 and 855 kHz. These include sea area weather forecasts. Apparently the special programs on 177 kHz will continue on that frequency after the conversion to DRM. It's possible that 177 kHz will switch back to AM for these programs, but I would not expect this." (R Netherlands Weblog)

Today (29 Aug) at 07:57:05 [UT?] the Zehlendorf tx on 177 switched to DRM and did not revert to AM for the sea weather forecast at 0905, still carried on this frequency. Here is a recording of the very last minute in AM (caution: do not turn up the volume too much towards the end, it gets guite loud): http://www.radioeins.de/_/meta/sendungen/apparat/050827_a3.ram. FAROE ISLANDS: Acc. to info from the operator Føroya Tele, the transmitter in Akraberg on 531 is run with 100 kW. Three times a day, during the main newscasts of Útvarp Føroya in the morning, noon and evening, the power is raised to 200 kW. (Bernd Trutenau-LTU, mwc)

ISLE OF MAN: Former BBC Radio 1 DJ Mike Read, currently working for the commercial station Big L - Radio London, has been named as one of the presenters on the new longwave station in the Isle of Man. A report on the Isle of Man Today website says that bosses of the station have confirmed that Read will be in the lineup along with former Radio Caroline presenters and 'at least one Manx Radio personality'. The report quotes Isle of Man International Broadcasting Chief Executive Paul Rusling as saying there has been a six-month delay to the planned launch date, but the station will be on the air in the New Year as the antenna and transmitter suppliers have confirmed both will be ready for transmission by January. The on-air name of the station, which will broadcast on 279 kHz, remains a closely guarded secret, but there are many other details on the station's corporate website http://www.iomib.com/. (via Steve Whitt, mwc)

MAURITANIA: Army troops, including members of the presidential guard, seized control of the state radio and television in the capital Nouakchott early today. All state media broadcasts were interrupted from 0500 UTC following the army takeover, which came as President Maaouvia Ould Taya was out of the country attending the funeral of King Fahd of Saudi Arabia. Radio and television remained off the air all morning, but the Mauritanian news agency resumed operation in the afternoon, and reported that President Maaouyia Ould Taya has been ousted, and a military junta will rule in his place. BBC Monitoring observed the TV station back on the air shortly after 1400 UTC, reading the same statement, and the radio service was reported back on the air with Quran recitations. The ousted President was reported to have landed in Niger on his return from Saudi Arabia. (August 3, Radio Netherlands Media Network Weblog)

NETHERLANDS: New Dutch radio station cost half a million euro to set up The new Dutch radio station Radio Voetbal (Radio Football) which is due to begin transmissions on 1332 kHz medium wave on 1 September has cost about half a million euro to set up, according to its founder Koos Appelboom. Speaking to De Telegraaf, Appelboom said that he has personally invested about half the money, and the rest is from a group of financiers who wish to remain anonymous. Appelboom says his idea of selling 15 minutes of airtime to football supporters for 25 euro is already a success, judging by the number of applications he has received, which he says has exceeded his wildest expectations. (Řadio Netherlands Media Network Weblog)

In a e-mail verification from Jaap van 't Riet on Talparadio, he wrote that Radio 10 Gold on 1008 kHz in Flevoland, Netherlands get a new transmitter at the end of this year. Also this new transmitter can transmit DRM mode. (Ge Huijbens, via mwc)

RUSSIA: Moscow / S.Petersburg. Radio TEOS - new fr. 1134 kHz (ex.963 kHz) - Moscow and 1089 kHz S.Petersburg. (JesusChrist.ru / Vasily Gulyaev, Astrakhan / MIDXB #426)

SWITZERLAND: The Swiss German-language public network Musigwelle 531 has changed its name to DRS Musigwelle as from today. The program format has also been revised, with more live programming and extra news bulletins. DRS MusigwAalle also takes over a limited number of programs previously broadcast on sister network DRŠ 1. The change of name is connected with the promotion of Digital Audio Broadcasting (DAB) in Switzerland. MusigwA¤lle is available on 531 kHz, DAB and cable. The MW outlet is due to close in 2008, and the station will then only be on DAB and cable. (R Netherland Media Network Weblog)

UNITED ARAB EMIRATES: Ending the parallel transmission of BBG's Radio Farda at the Dhabbaya site on both 1170 and 1575 in the last couple of months, the 800kW transmitter on 1170 has been switched to Radio Sawa. (Bernd Trutenau-LTU via mwc)
