Tests are off to slow start this season, but we're working hard to arrange more. To start us off, we've got a Western test and a rare simultaneous test from two stations!

(The station was heard almost 5 miles from Lansdale on a recent trip to the area so it does get out very well!).

**KKLF 1700khz DX Test Results.**

This test certainly proved that even short duration tests can meet with much success!

Gerry Bishop was the first to report the test, logging the code and sweep tones starting at six minutes past midnight from his shack in Niceville, Florida.

Next in was Dave Hochfelder in Central NJ, who logged the test under the more dominant station from Alabama. Doug Pifer in Albany, Oregon logged in with the first Western US reception of the test, hearing both codes and sweep tones.

Steve Francis added Tennessee as the fourth state to copy the test, and Les Rayburn heard the test despite a lot of local QRM from an electric fence in Alabama. The state total continued to grow as Russ Johnson logged the test in Lexington, North Carolina.

Tom Jasinski heard the test from his shack in Shorewood, IL, as did Pete Dernback who pulled the Code in from St. Louis. Pete also reported heavy interference from Spanish station KBGG and gospel from Alabama's WEUV.

Rick Shaftan also struggled with WEUV, but pulled out code and sweep tones at last. Patrick Martin keep his batting average for DX Tests in the superstar range, by easily copying the test from Seaside, OR. "Willis" noted the test from his home in Old Fort, TN, as did Mike Westfall in Los Alamos, NM who logged the test on a car radio in his wife's car, no less!

Saul Chernos also had a successful reception on a car radio from Toronto, adding Canada to the mix. **Coloneldx@webtv.net** noted the test, "well heard" at his home in Louisville, KY.

Steve Ratzlaff logged the test using his AR-7030 receiver and a 1600 foot longwire from his home in Elgin, OR, while an Icom R70 and a Quantum Phaser were the weapons of choice for Mike Hardester who heard the test in Jacksonville, NC.

Greg Myers easily heard the test from his home in Largo, FL. Like many DX'ers he also tried for the 570 KLIF, but had no luck due to the strong Cuban station on that frequency.

Tom Kenny heard the sweep tones and code from his home on the Jersey Shores near Toms River, NJ. He passed along his thanks to all involved in the test, as did most DX'ers who reported.

Barry McLarnon seems to hear everything from his shack in Ottawa, Ontario, and this test was no different. He reported logging the sweep tones and code starting at 0106 EST. Shawn Axelrod keep the heat on Barry, by logging the test from his home in the Great White North as well....

Rene Tetro heard "faint sweep tones and Morse code, but no voice" from his home in Lansdale, PA. Bill Harms "managed" to hear the test from his home in Maryland, struggling with poor equipment, including a Drake R8B, K9AY antenna and a Quantum Phaser. Considering his handicap for using such inferior gear, it's a wonder he can hear anything! :)

Nigel Pimblett reported the test from his home in Dunmore, Alberta... but noted that he still needed WEUV whose powerful signal hampered reception for many of us in the East. Proving that one man's DX is another man's pest....

Marc DeLorenzo overcame the Gospel music to capture the test signals from his home in Cape Code, MA. Frank Aden reported "weak code and sweeps" from the great Western state of Idaho. Bill Block in Prescott, Arizona was able to log the test using his R-390A and an EWE antenna.

Glen Hauser heard the test well from his site only 400km away from KKLf, and reported that the test signals did not run on sister-station KLIF on 570 (which explains why we couldn't hear it! Maybe we can sweet talk Hue Beaver into running a test on 570 soon too!)

Others finding happiness with this test were Greg Coniglio in NY, and on the opposite coast, Art Peterson added California to the list of states hearing this test! He logged it despite heavy QRM from XEPE, noting that the test continued past it's scheduled time.

IRCA Guru Phil Bytheway kept his recording running past the scheduled time too and was glad that he did. Just as he was about to give up, Morse Code flowed out of the recording! Does anyone else miss Phil's great e-mail newsletter? -Les

Craig Barnes in Wondervu, Colorado even managed to snag a voice ID during the test despite interference from KBGG. Rounding out those who enjoyed this widely heard test.

In the category of "maybe", came reports from folks like Jim Renfrew in Buffalo, NY who reported hearing just the sweep tones, or Pete Taylor in Tacoma who reported hearing bits of code at 0106, but felt like his file would need audio processing to have any hope of extracting an ID.

Mike Stonebridge in St. Isidore, Alberta reported a mix of three stations that allowed him to only hear the sweep tones of the test. Better luck next time, Mike!

True disappointment came for some DX'ers though. Dennis Vroom battled a huge signal from XEKT from his home in Vancouver, WA without any luck. Martin Foltz in Mission Viejo also struggled without success to hear the test over the powerful Mexican stations.

JD Stephens didn't manage to log the test, but not because of propagation or interference, he simply got his nights mixed up! He had his recorder all ready to go, but for Friday night.... one day early. On a positive note, he did log KKLf on its' regular schedule and will be sending an MP3 recording of that ID.

**Soapbox:**

Wow big sweep tones in the recording! Those are way more effective than cw. -Russ Johnson

Got home at 0122 EST and the morse code is coming through fine. -Patrick Martin

If the cw got any slower I would have went to sleep. -Willis, Old Fort, TN

The code and also the sweep tones really made it through. Would not have logged this [test] without! -Saul Chernos

The sweep tones easily cut through the dominant "talkback weekend" program station. The morse code sometimes was easily heard as well. -Steve Ratzlaff

Severe QRM from presumed WEUV with gospel. Imagine such a strong signal with "only" 1kw >:-o -Mike Hardester

WEUV was dominant but I heard some of the morse but I must say the sweeps really break through as I could hear them very well.

Thanks to all involved in getting this DX test accomplished. -Tom Kenny

I find it hard to believe that WEUV is dropping to 1 kW night power.... -Barry McLarnon

No voice announcements made it but the sweep tones cut through like a hot knife through butter! -Marc DeLorenzo

**BTC Comments:**

This test is one of the most widely heard in recent memory. Signals ranged literally from Coast to Coast, with reception in both New York and California. A total of 18 states and three providences of Canada logged the test, and this is just passed on the initial reports!

It's become clear that the famous "NRC Sweep Tones" cut through the noise to an even greater extent than Morse code, and we'll push for their use in all future tests. For the record, the Morse Code was sent at 5wpm and 10wpm. For those of us who can copy code at 20 word per minute or faster speeds, five words per minute can seem slow, but I think it cuts through noise better.

It's also clear that the 570 station KLIF is needed by many, so we'll try to twist Hue Beavers arm to see if we can arrange a test for that frequency as well.

I've just realized that I haven't really done any SRS or SSS with the expanded band so I will have to give that a try soon. Now up to 625 heard here. I heard 1339 up in Gary so half of that will be 670, a decent number for a goal, hi. My third highest log is 308, up in Wisconsin Rapids, so I am just over double that. Of course, that 308 was heard in six months. It was 12 years in Gary, and 6.5 years here so far. I just picked off the weather and ID for Air Progressive Atlanta, so make it 626 heard, hi. 73

Virtually a 10 (perfect signal) with Chinese religious programming. In fact I continued to here this station for several more hours, finally giving up at 17:18, still with a decent carrier present! (this is after 10 am local!). (Salmaniw Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)  
 + 1011 10/16 good w/English religious talk alternating w/Korean translation. (bp WA Oct 2005)



1575 **THAILAND** Ban Pachi, VoA, Oct 14 1040 - Noted here throughout the DXpedition, often at excellent levels. (Bryant-WA Oct 2005)

+ 1128 10/14, ending Radio Saranrom pgm good but fadey, 0429:40 VOA ID in English, into Burmese pgm. Still good w/inst music 1529, then started 30 minutes of special English 1530. (bp WA Oct 2005)

+ Oct 15 15:15 - VOA's 1000 kw transmitter often gets out very well on the coast. I tuned in to English lessons until 15:15, but what lessons. This is a direct quote from one of the lessons (imagine where you might employ these sentences!): (woman): I didn't know you had a brother. (man): I didn't either! (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

+ 1314 16 Oct. "the Voice of America, VoA" commercial style jingle (!) at good strength; another jingle at 1316... contact information then read out in SE Asian language; mention of Malaysia before this? (NHP-WA)

+ Oct 16 13:17 - Vietnamese service at very good level, giving the internet site (Vietnamese Service... .com), email address: [vietnamese@voanews.com](mailto:vietnamese@voanews.com), and the postal address, although the numbers were not in English: VOA Vietnamese Service, Independence Ave SW, Washington, DC. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

1593 **CHINA** CNR1 Unk. Location, Oct 15 1305 - Noted here at good level in standard CC talk // 5030 kHz. and fighting it out with the normally dominant NHK2 Synchros. (Bryant-WA Oct 2005)

1593 **JAPAN** Matsue, JOTB, 1320 10/14, local ID after weather, fair-poor. (bp WA Oct 2005)

1593 **JAPAN** NHK2 Synchros, Oct 14 1109 - Heard here most mornings of DXpedition, though usually only poorly. // 774 Nothing at local ID times. (Bryant-WA Oct 2005)

1602 **JAPAN** Fukuyama 1320 10/15, JODD ID after local weather break, fair. (bp WA Oct 2005)

1602 **JAPAN** NHK2 Synchros, Oct 15 1332 - Heard here at fair level // all of the other NHK2 signals. Came up 10 minutes too late for local ID! (Bryant-WA Oct 2005)

+ Oct 15 15:20 - Take your pick of 15 or 20 low powered Japanese NHK2 transmitters. Fair level. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

1610.007 **USA** TIS Willapa Harbor, Oct 14 1650 - 1610 Willapa Harbour. Good but off frequency, 6 miles south is the quaint community of South Bend. etc. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

1737 **PAPUA NEW GUINEA** KUT Kutubu, 10/15 1152 utc, beacon. (Ratzlaff Oct 2005)

2959.97 **INDONESIA** RPDT Manggarai, Oct 16 1106 - Just started my last session at Grayland for this visit. Manggarai is present with weak audio with talk in Bahasa Indonesia by YL. Fair at best. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

3219.97 **PAPUA NEW GUINEA** Radio Morobe, Oct 16 1108 - Good reception with English modern Christian song (I just pray on my knees...). Some static crashes, but otherwise very enjoyable. Pidgin at 11:13 with 'Morobe' heard. Radio Morobe FM 105 heard at 11:13. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

3223 **INDIA** AIR Shimla, Oct 16 1424 - Still hear at 14:25 despite reported change to 4980. Typical AIR programming at fair level. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

3235 **PAPUA NEW GUINEA** Radio West New Britain, Oct 16 1115 - Also good reception of this old favourite with Sunday night programming. Western Christian vocal. Minor static crashes. Pidgin announcements at 1118 'regular listeners', etc. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

3245 **PAPUA NEW GUINEA** Radio Gulf, Oct 16 1120 - Radio play about a violin. S5 signal in the clear, but with some static crashes. Generally an easy to follow program. At 11:22:40 an ad for 'yourstruly.org', the sponsor of this program. Local dj at 11:37 was very muffy, although the music in the background was flawless. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

3250.03 **NORTH KOREA** Pyongyang Broadcasting Station, Oct 15 15:42 - Very good reception on several SW frequencies (and in // to 657 MW): 3320.21 (very good), 6250.136 (good if you use LSB to avoid the upper ute). 6378.776 (good to very good) with a pretty Korean vocal sung by a young woman, and not at all strident as is so usually the case. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

3260 **PAPUA NEW GUINEA** Radio Madang, Oct 16 1126 - Relatively weak compared to the other PNGs this morning, and suffering more from the static crashes. Mostly all western music, with rather tinny audio. Fair to good overall. More pleasant to listen to in AM than my usual side band, and more intelligible. Time to move on! (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

3275 **PAPUA NEW GUINEA** Radio Southern Highlands, Oct 16 1132 - The weakest so far this morning, at poor to fair levels only and too weak to make much out this morning. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

3305 **PAPUA NEW GUINEA** Radio Western, Oct 16 1143 - Only fair reception this morning. Lots of PNGs, but I've heard them in the past at much better levels than this morning. 3290, Radio Central noted not on the air this morning. As is so often the case, the music is well modulated and clean, while the announcer (at 11:47) seems very anemic. A local language, not English, nor Pidgin from the sound of the language, though, although I did hear 'number one', 'number two', and up to 'number 8' so far. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

3315 **INDIA** AIR Bhopal, Oct 16 1425 - Typical Indian music at 14:26, so haven't yet moved to announced 4810. Fair to good. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

3315 **PAPUA NEW GUINEA** Radio Manus, Oct 16 1151 - Possibly some transmitter trouble. I did hear a YL just as I tuned there, but only hear dead air now. Not confirmed then this morning. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

3325 **PAPUA NEW GUINEA** Radio North Solomons, Oct 16 1154 - Strongest by far this morning, and well over cochannel RRI Palangkaraya, with easy listening music. S9 + 10 at peaks.

Oops, the RRI station is in fact the dominant station, with Love Ambon at 11:58, but the PNG station is audible underneath. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

3335 **PAPUA NEW GUINEA** Radio East Sepik, Oct 16 1157 - Another strong performer with a nice strong signal. I rechecked here a few minutes later, and they are clearly signing off with the PNG anthem at 12:02, but instead of signing off, the National news in English came on in progress! Strange. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

3344.98 **INDONESIA** RRI Ternate, Oct 16 1204 - No sign of Radio Northern. Instead good reception from this RRI station with national news (// to 3325, but with delay). (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

3365 **PAPUA NEW GUINEA** Radio Milne Bay, Oct 16 1207 - Only weakly heard despite a strong carrier (or perhaps an OC from a ute over top?). 3355 Radio Simbu not heard, but possibly might have signed off before the TOH. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

3384.99 **PAPUA NEW GUINEA** Radio East New Britain, Oct 16 1209 - Late Saturday night radio program at very good levels. Also noted a loud open carrier on 3375, so I'm thinking that Radio Western Highlands was on, but signed off at 12:00. No sign of Radio Eastern Highlands on 3395. Also nothing on 3905, the frequency for Radio New Ireland. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

3390 **INDIA** AIR Gangtok, Oct 16 14:27 - Typical Indian music, so haven't yet moved to 4870 as announced. Poor level only. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

3578.74 **INDONESIA** RSPK Ngada, Bajawa, Oct 16 1255 - Poorly heard, but there at this time. I'll listen for the top of the hour for anything discernible. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

4739.68 **VIETNAM** RADIO Son La, Oct 16 1212 - On nominal 4740, but tuned in at 4739.68 with a very strong signal with very distinctive vocal music and Vietnamese type dialect. A ute plopped on right on top of them making listening a little less than perfect, but still powerful. Both Guy Atkins (who pointed them out, thanks!) and I heard 'Son La' clearly right after I tuned in. They left the air right at 1400 and the sick transmitter whistles disappeared immediately. Very strong. Too bad they were so distorted! (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

4760 **INDIA** AIR Port Blair, Oct 16 1233 - I'm not positive this is Port Blair, vs Leh, but usually the former is reported. Much weaker than 4775, but at fair level with talk by OM not in English. About average reception. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

4775 **INDIA** AIR Gauhati, Oct 16 1225 - For me, best ever reception of Imphal, with their Northeast Regional Service. Occasionally marred by a running water ute, but only briefly. In the clear otherwise and cleanly modulated with a male speaking, not in English. English news briefly at 12:30, and then into a Christian sounding hymn at 12:32 (vey much akin to what you might hear on PNG stations!) I'm still amazed how well they are heard this morning. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

4820 **INDIA** AIR Kolkata, Oct 15 16:10 - Heard at fair level under cochannel Xizang PBS, Lhasa. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

4905 **TIBET** Xizang PBS, Lhasa, Oct 15 16:20 - Presumed to be Xizang with a very unusual choir. The singing sounds like Inuit to me. Good reception and // to 4920. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

4970 **INDIA** AIR Shillong, Oct 16 1314 - North Eastern Service at very good levels, and perfect ID in English at 13:15 into Indian music. Best ever!!! Thank you, Guy Atkins for pointing me this way! (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

5010 **INDIA** AIR Thiruvananthapuram, Oct 15 1558 - Fair to good reception, with LSB again preferred to avoid a ute. In English, the announcer went on to announce the evenings program of music. Then a concert of Indian music began. In parallel to 4760 (fair), presumed to be AIR Port Blair. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

5905 **CHINA** CRI, Oct 15 14:55 - Russian programming from Kashi, China and listed as 500 kw, beamed at 60 degrees to Asia. The MW parallels of 963 and 1323 were stronger! Off at 15:00. (Salmani Oct 2005, Grayland, WA)

5920 **RUSSIA** GTRK Kamchatka, Oct 17 0522 - I was busy typing my loggings for the last 3 nights at Grayland, and while doing so I've monitored 5920. Although WBOH dominates, the Russian is audible underneath, and mentions Kamchatka repeatedly, so I'm assuming this to be a local program, and not a network Radio Rossii feed. (Salmani Oct 2005, Victoria, BC)
