Both WAPI and WJOX will air one insert at the TOH. :59 minutes fixed. Both stations will air a 2nd sixty second long test each hour according to the schedule below: WAPI's 2nd test will come at :30 past the hour, each hour between midnight and 3AM. WJOX's 2nd test will "float" between :19 after and :34 minutes each hour between midnight and 3AM, depending on programming.

Some follow up information on the upcoming DX Test, quoted directly from the station staff:

The first will run on December 27th (Tuesday Morning) at 12:59 AM CST with the last at 2:59 AM CST. This will be repeated on Wednesday December 28th and Thursday, December 29th.

Note: This applies to WAPI only in regards to the "second test" on each night. WJOX has a floating format, meaning the local break comes between :19 and :34 minutes past the hour. Test starts late on Monday night-Tuesday morning.

As indicated in the original posting, I'll be handling QSL requests (for the test only) for the station(s). Verification will require a recording in almost all cases. With the test being on sixty seconds in length, I think it will be nearly impossible to verify reception based solely on a description and timing.

E-mail is my first choice, with snail mail a very distant second. Expect for it to takes months to receive a snail mail verification. We will produce a JPEG file suitable for printing that will be e-mailed to all correct reporters. Mark Subject line: WAPI/WJOX RECEPTION REPORT

On January 8th, 2006, **CHWO/AM740 in Toronto** will be celebrating its 5th anniversary on the air. Although the station has been on the air since 1956, it moved to 740 in 2001 providing with a much larger signal and audience. In all of those years, it has remained a family run station and the adult standards format has never changed.

The Ontario DX Association has been the QSL manager for the station since it's move and has received more than 330 reception reports from as far as Finland, Jamaica, Washington State and all points in-between.

Once again, the ODXA and CHWO will be presenting a special QSL for January 8th, 2006.

The upcoming WAPI/WJOX DX Test will be our first practical demonstration of a new format suggested by Fred Vobbe of the National Radio Club last year.

Fred's idea was that more stations might be willing to conduct DX tests if they did not require a change in overnight programming. Instead, we would request the stations to run a :60 second long DX test in one of their available "local" inventory slots.

With programs like "Coast to Coast" for example, the local station is allowed a certain number of local spots to run during the program. Stations often have a hard time selling the late night spots and often run PSA's, station promos, etc. instead.

Fred's idea is to take advantage of that time, by having a station send Morse Code IDs, sweep tones, etc. Since the test occurs on several nights, instead of one, you also have a better chance at having good propagation to the area at least one night.

WAPI/WJOX will run two of these :60 second long "mini-tests" each hour, for three hours each night

WAPI/WJOX will run two of these :60 second long "mini-tests" each hour, for three hours each night on three nights in a row. That means you'll have 18 chances to catch each station. Of course, they won't change their power or antenna pattern!

I highly recommend recording the tests using software like Total Recorder. In the case of WJOX, you'll need to record the entire time period for each hour between :19 and :34 minutes past the hour, since the exact time of the test isn't "fixed" but rather "floating". WJOX runs a sports talk format, and is heavily automated.

It's also interesting to note that the station agreed to this test only during the period of December 25-31st, since this is one of only two periods each year where the station is not "rated". The other is the week of July 4th. This allows for popular hosts to take vacations without an affect on the ratings of their show.

If you're thinking about asking a station to help us out with a DX test, this may be the best time to ask them. Hope we all enjoy this test, and I can't wait to see how these type of test work out vs. the more familiar full blown tests.

(from the IRCA eGroup – but informative to all – pb) Pete Taylor's suggestion about presenting a professional appearance when approaching stations is one that we've taken to heart when reaching out for DX tests. Let me clarify some points however:

1. The "Inventory Inserts" are not a replacement for full duration tests. Rather a reflection of the real world problems facing stations, and a novel solution to getting tests from that stations that cannot or will not run traditional tests.

Short notice tests of all kinds are the future. DX'ers need to subscribe to e-mail lists to stay up to date and be sure they don't miss tests.

2. While a promotional kit is a great idea, it doesn't take into mind the realities of broadcasting. CE's are often managing multiple stations, and turn over among personnel is high.

This season alone, I've had two CE's who had already agreed to doing tests leave their place of employment. This leaves us without a test... and the Broadcast Test Coordinator back to square one. No club could afford to mail and re-mail promotional kits to the stations.

For years the CPC position basically consisted of writing a form letter to dozens and dozens of stations annually asking for DX tests. This approach worked well when station staffing was fairly permanent, most CE's were also hams and understood DXing, QSL's, etc.

Nowadays, I get about a 5% return of "cold letters", though I continue to send a dozen or so per month. Most of the returns consist of "no longer employed here" or "we have obligations for our overnight programming and cannot interrupt those commitments", etc.

Much better luck is had with phone calls, e-mails, and best of all personal contacts and relationships.

3. I support the idea of a "QSL Manager" for stations. A great way to start might be to have DX'ers with the time, experience, etc. to volunteer their services to the Clear Channel stations in their towns. since they receive a large number of such requests.

This personal relationship can then be parlayed into convincing the station to also run a DX test. If they already have a good relationship with a DX'er then it isn't that much of a reach.

But Pete Taylor is right that such volunteers must be professional in their approach.

4. Unfortunately, I mainly hear the "horror story" side of QSL requests from station managers. Some DX'ers are pushy, rude, and overbearing in their quest to get that paperwork.

Personally, QSLing isn't a big part of my enjoyment of the hobby. If I have an MP3 file with the station ID, that is much better "proof" of reception than any card...but I do get them when I can...display them with pride, and enjoy them.

But I do think QSL'ers need to be very realistic about their request. You're asking someone to do

you a favor. Take time out of their day to answer a letter from someone who enjoys something they likely don't understand.

Never be rude and remember that your actions reflect on all of us, good and bad.

I encourage all DX'ers to get to know their local broadcasters. Attend an SBE meeting or ask around at ham club meetings to see if others know engineering staff. If you're polite, most will be flattered by your interest. Buy the poor guy a lunch and talk about how he got into radio. Even if he isn't a ham, chances are he'll understand our love of radio on some level.

Then use that relationship to help all of us by asking for a test. Remember we're happy to provide test material, do QSL chores, or whatever it takes to make a test work.
