Programming: Morse Code ID's, Sweep Tones, Voice ID. Notes: Test will continue for an undetermined amount of time, possibly several weeks so hopefully

many DX'ers will find favorable propagation at least one or two nights prior to the end of the test. The station has also stated that they will be doing transmitter maintenance at some point within the next two months, and may be able to accommodate a full power (2.5KW) test at that time. More details as they become available. Nevada is a rare state for many of us in the East, so enjoy this rare chance!

780: WIIN Ridgeland MS flips from regional Mexican "La Gran D" to talk "Win 780."
820: KUTR aylorsville/Salt Lake City UT drops its female-focused talk format and flips to contemporary Christian (Mormon) "Soft Sunday Sounds," picking up the format already heard Sundays on sister KSFI 100.3 Salt Lake City and fulltime on KSFI's HD2 channel.

1180: KYDZ Bellevue/Omaha NE returns to the air with Spanish, under temporary FCC authority. (KYDZ was one of several stations supposed to go dark after five years as part of the transition to the expanded AM band; its owner, Waitt, along with several other X-band licensees, is petitioning the FCC to change those rules.)

1190: KFXR Dallas TX segues from "Lone Star Country" to "Cowboy 1190." It's still being simulcast (for now) on KMGS 1160 Highland Park TX.

1220: WRIB Providence RI is silent; it will return with a religious format later this year under new ownership.

1240: WVOS Liberty NY returns to the air with country, simulcasting WVOS-FM 95.9 Liberty NY. 1250: KCUE Red Wing MN flips from news-talk to classic country "Bluff Country."

1490: WANA Aniston AL flips from "Thunder Country 92.7" (simulcasting WTDR 92.7 Talladega AL) to ESPN sports "ESPN 1490."

1530: WCKY Cincinnati OH flips from progressive talk to "Homer 1530" sports today, swapping formats (but not calls, as had previously been reported) with WSAI 1360 Cincinnati OH.

1570: KBCV Hollister MO signs on with Bott Radio Network religion.

Dr. Richard E. Wood passes on the following:

(Per verification dated 7/3/06): A short note here to let you know that KMPH 840 Modesto is now on the air; 5000 watts day and night with different directional patterns day and night. Programming is soft R&B for the moment. The old KTRB 860 format of talk, CNN News and infomercials should return in a few weeks. KTRB-860 is off the air until the new transmitter sites are built for San Francisco. 860 should return to the air by the end of the year. I will let you know when that happens (Steve Dresser, KMPH-TV/AM, KFRE-TV, KTRB-AM) (REW-HI)

Dr. Richard E. Wood also passes on the following: Hilo, Hawaii has a fifth AM broadcasting station (not counting talking houses and the like). URH, University Radio Hilo, 1640 was noted for the first time July 9 and announces at 24 hr. NSP, with a format of alternative Radio Hilo, 1640 was noted for the first time July 9 and announces at 24 hr. NSP, with a format of alternative rock. All in English, no Hawaiian language, accent or music. Typical ID's and promos are: "Hilo's URH AM 16-40", "East Hawaii's music alternative, University Radio Hilo", "You are listening to University Radio Hilo, broadcasting worldwide 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. We are University Radio Hilo, "East Hawaii's leading rock radio", "Don't forget folks, listen to University Radio Hilo, URH, Hilo, Hawaii", "The morning show 6 AM to 12 noon on 16-40 URH worldwide, East Hawaii's music alternative", and "You are listening to University Radio Hilo, worldwide, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, we are URH". (REW-HI)

(Note: Richard asks ye BI editor what is the license status of this station, and are complete calls KURH)? Ye

editor found the following on a Hawaii newslink website:
LOW POWER AM FROM UH HILD: The University of Hawaii has its first radio station. Low power AM radio station URH (UHH Radio) at 1640 on the AM dial started broadcasting this spring. The non-profit radio station features a format of free form music similar to what is offered at KTUH at the UH Manoa Campus. The volunteer disc jockeys pick the music. A station spokesperson said that they aim to go to 3KW like their UH Manoa counterpart in the future. The station is also streaming their content at their website: http://radio.uhh.hawaii.edu/#. (RW-CA) (Station is not listed on radio-locator.com, so not an 'official' callletter type station but a low power college station). (RW-CA) (ye editor)

Gary Larson sends along the following via John Johnson of Billings, MT:

1570 KBCV MO, Hollister. Per a tape of the station from a friend in the area, on 6/11 and 6/12 KBCV was on the air with RS 12 noon 6/12. Most likely parallel to 103.9 FM. Was told by friend an office and studio location was to be opened in Branson. (GL-CA)

Ye editor sends along the following from Bruce Portzer of Seattle, WA via IRCA reflector:

KDOW-1680 Seattle noted with legal ID 0700 PDT 6/21. Still Spanish, ex-KTFH. I'm not sure when the change took place, but it's already in the FCC database and another local DXer heard the new calls late last week. (BP-WA)

Ye editor sends along the following from Radio and Records dated 6/30/06:

WCKY, WSAI To Swap Signals In Cincy
Clear Channel/Cincinnati's WSAI (1360Homer, The Sports Animal) on July 7 will swap dial positions with liberal Talk clustermate WCKY, a move that puts "Homer" on a booming signal audible throughout much of the East Coast after sundown. "Moving Homer to 1530AM will enable us to broadcast The Sports Animal at 50,000 watts, "said CC/Cincinnati Director/AM Operations Darryl Parks. "Increasing the station's reach gives us the opportunity to better serve the huge demand for Sports radio in the region." (RW-CA)

Pat Martin sends along the following from W. Curt Deegan of Boca Raton, FL: 1700 WJCC Miami Springs, Florida, continues to broadcast daily after returning to the air as was reported on 6/6/6 by Tony Simon. WJCC had been off air as I reported on 2/26/6, and presumed gone forever. Scott Fybush suggested this was part of the X-band license relinquishments. Now they're back all day and though not hearable here, possibly all night, with no signs of an FCC license.

A check of the FCC AMQ DB returns nothing, but searching for DWJCC in the General Reports, turns up

an entry I don't know how to square with the existing situation:

As I understand it, DWJCC means the license has been deleted. As can be seen though, the expiration date, status, and status date would seem to indicate the license is still potentially valid. Of course these entries may just be left as they last were when the license was deleted. That still doesn't explain why the station is back on the air. I have read of a legal effort to reinstate some of the relinquished X-band licenses, could this be a premature move back on air as part of that action? Is it possible the originally licensed owners are not behind this latest reincarnation of WJCC?

1210 WNMA Miami Springs, also operated by Multicultural Radio Broadcasting, is not // 1700. The format of 1210 is Spanish Talk, while 1700 WJCC has been broadcasting a very pleasant mix of English and Spanish music with little else besides station IDs. Prior to leaving the air on 2/26/6, WJCC was // 1580 WSRF Fort Lauderdale, with its Caribbean format. And prior to that time of // operations, WSRF had been off the air for an extended period before returning 2/3/6, after the hurricane Wilma caused outage that began 10/24/05. Now, 1700 is not // 1580, nor as I say, 1210.

All rather confusing, but strangely interesting as the stations do their programming dance. (PM-OR)

Ye editor sends along the following from Rich Toebe of Vacaville, CA:

This morning KTRB 860 is running a loop around 15 minutes long with a condensed history of the station... they mention that KTRB is scheduled to sign off from Modesto, CA 73 years to the day they signed on. Check out the website www.modestoradiomuseum.org as they say KTRB signed on June 19, 1933. They are

signing off at 9 am on Monday, a half an hour from now as I write this.

They also mention the coming of the new 840 KMPH facility (not KPMP as FCC list shows). The company also operates KMPH-FM (KTRB and KMPH once simulcasted) and on TV26. (RW-CA)

Dennis Gibson passes on the following:
Has the XEQIN on 1160 deal quieted down now or was it ever a big deal? I'm not on the IRCA or ABDX lists anymore. I thought it would be a big deal with KCBQ getting tweaked off. The CGC Communicator says "A Letter to the Editor in CGC #740 (mine) expressed concern that XEQIN's new signal on 1160 kHz could cause interference to KCBQ, 1170 kHz, San Diego. In response, a San Diego-based broadcast engineer reports that he does not receive an 1160 kHz Mexican signal in East San Diego County, and only a weak 1160 in La Jolla. Tentative conclusion: The new signal on 1160 should not be a problem for KCBQ on 1170. (DG-CA)

Pat Martin sends along the following:
Well, besides KGO testing IBOC, KNEW-910, KQKE-960, KCBS-740, KCBC-770, and KIID-1470 are running IBOC. Also KCVR-1570. There might be others too. So far only KEX and KHHO in the NW, but I am sure that will change too. With KJR, KIXI, KPOJ, etc all going that way. KHHO is IBOC, but I don't notice it here, with KPAM on 860 & KSWB on 840. I get KHHO OK, but no IBOC noise noted. (PM-OR)

Pat Martin sends along the following from Larry Stoler (locale unknown):
According to Radio and Records, The FCC has dropped the topic of HD radio from today's proceedings. It is believed they will be concentrating on the breakup of Adelphia Communications a once big cable company. Time Warner Cable and Comcast have agreements to absorb the remains of Adelphia but they need FCC clearance in order for this to happen. The topic of HD radio will be taken up in the future however no specific date has been mentioned as to when the commission will explore this matter. (PM-OR)

Loggings of Indonesia, The Philippines, Sri Lanka, Ecuador and Chile have now brought my total countries heard since reactivating late last year to a still-modest 31. Note that 3 of the 5 are in the Southern Hemisphere; the others just slightly north of the Equator; so they are typical early-summer loggings. In fact, the Ecuadorian, Guayaquill-1350, a port city, is in almost nightly and has become the third most regular S. American after the Brazilian powerhouses 1220 and 1280. As most of you know, I love Latin Americans, and since The Philippines are the only Latin country in Asia, I also love the commercial stations there, which strongly resemble Latin American stations and use innumerable works of Spanish origin. Indeed, some Filipino composers write songs in Spanish to this day. And the most Hispanic city is Cebu City, from which I hear DYAB-1512. Walt Salmaniw in BC has heard it too, so it might be the best bet for other mainland North Americans. On states, my total notched modestly upwards to 26, with recent loggings of predictable WLAA-1580 for FL and unexpected WRVA-1140 for VA which produced an ID but not enough for a report. CFRB-1010 was again heard that night. It's a paradox; I've heard always rare WRVA, only heard once back in the 1980's and WQEW-1560 is common, even atop KNZR-CA, whereas Eastern clear channels which were quite common in the 1980's, like WBZ, WFAN (back then WNBC), WABC, WCBS and, yes, WLS have yet to be relogged. Maybe the late summer or fall will change that. Meanwhile, I have plans to relocate back roughly to where I was in the 80's and build beverages there. Most directions except NW should be possible, and I don't need NW anyway as it brings me unwanted Oahu and the rest of HI. Richard, thanks for searching for my unID Mexican with call XEH-540. As you said, the FCC AM query website for Mexico must be behind the times, as I have since ID'ed it as XEHS Las Mochis, Son, whose coastal location makes it a prime source of stations here, with XECU almost always dominating 1450 (KVEN is #2) and XECF usually on 1410. As I'll be building beverages soon, anyone with advice is welcome to write, or even visit. I have no experience in termination, switching, phasing, etc. and no such equipment yet. I'll be glad to buy any commercial or homebrew units you might have for sale.

I was up at a TFC meeting near Zionsville, Indiana Saturday morning and instead of running the expressway back, I wandered my way down the west side of Indianapolis. On 56th Street, just west of Georgetown Road and east of Lafayette Road, I happened to look over at the south side of the street and spotted the WXLW-950 towers. I was not expecting to see them -- I didn't even know the location of them until then. It was a shock and, since I was traveling about 40mph at the time, I just spotted the three towers and a big sign plus a small building which didn't seem occupied--almost abandoned even-- before I was out of sight from them. I can't even tell you if the towers were in a straight line or triangular in pattern. Now I understand why they show up as being 14 miles from the house. Next one to find is WTLC-1310 which is strong enough here to make 1300 and 1320 uncomfortable to listen to. I can hear stations there but they won't be ones I can sit back and listen to while doing other things. It shows as being about 5 miles northwest of here. By the way, the truckstop I was at was just a stone's throw from the WIBC-1070 towers off I-65 northwest of Indy. I had the radio on last night 7/15 to listen to WKZO-590 for the end of the Detroit Tigers game (they won, of course) and, afterwards, I noticed there was country music mixing in with the talk from WKZO and WVLK It turned out to WJMS MI for my first station logged here from Michigan's upper peninsula. Brings me up to 681 heard now. Next deadline will be on 7/29, then it will be a four week gap until the next deadline. Have a happy rest of the summer, hi. 73.

Severe storms blew through the St. Louis area on the evening of July 19, and again during the lunch hour on July 21. Just after 2000 ELT, the storms blew through my QTH. Winds were as high as

80 miles per hour in some parts of town, I could have felt wind gusts at my QTH as high as 60 miles per hour, shaking my TV and FM antennas. I lost power at my QTH for sixteen hours as a result of the storm; it was restored after 1200 ELT on July 20. After the storms blew through, I scanned the AM and FM dials. On the AM side, most of the stations were immediately knocked off the air; the sole exceptions being KFNS 590, KMOX 1120, WSDZ 1260 and KATZ 1600. KTRS 550 lost two towers of its four-tower array; the station is now operating with a special temporary authorization of 5,000 watts day and 1,250 watts at night, both non-directional. KTRS was back on by 2200, in time to start a Cardinals game delayed by the storm. WIL 1430 was back on by 0100 on July 20; KJSL 630 and KXEN 1010 was back on by the next morning. WEW 770 was also back on the air the following morning; they had apparently signed off for the night by the time the storm hit. Limited-time KFUO 850 lost its IBOC exciter; they were noted in analog format, with WCBW 880 having a much better signal. WGNU 920, KSIV 1320 and KSLG 1380 were back on within 48 hours. KJSL 630 was knocked off again after another storm came through on 7/21; they were back on within six hours. WRYT 1080 was also knocked off by the second storm; KHOJ 1460, which simulcasts WRYT's Catholic programming, remained on the air. On the FM side, KDHX 88.1 lost its studio after the storm; they were back on by 0900 7/20, operating the studios in hard-hit south St. Louis on a backup generator. KCLC 89.1, WLCÁ 89.9, KSIV-FM 91.5, KSD 93.7, WFUN-FM 95.5, KYKY 98.1, KLOU 103.3, KMJM 104.9 and KSLZ 107.7 were knocked off the air, along with a full-power and two low-power television stations. As I write this (2046 ELT 7/21), KSTL 690 and the full-power TV station, KNLC channel 24 (and it's digital counterpart on channel 14) were still off the air. Most of that was due to power outages throughout the St. Louis area. I was operating my Amateur Radio station on just a battery-powered handheld transceiver, monitoring the local Skywarn net on 146.940 MHz. The next morning, I replaced the history notes and lighter news stories on my morning drive show on WSIE 88.7 with information on traffic signals without power, cancellations due to the heat and power outages (it was 97 degrees F the next day) and a boil order for my local area. On the AM side, I did notice WLRM 1380 in KSLG's absence at 0050 ELT on July 20 with Progressive Talk, legal ID into Urban Gospel music. The talk show did not originate from Air America, however. During Friday's storm, the warning sirens sounded in Madison County, IL (I also attend classes at Southern Illinois University Edwardsville); I had to help get the students and faculty to the ground floor of the classroom building I was in as quickly as possible. After Wednesday's storm, I also had to check on my mother frequently; she suffers from ALS (or Lou Gehrig's Disease). This has been the longest 48 hours I've gone through in recent memory. 73 and good DX from Eric (N0UIH)

It was a bit of sadness for me that Keflavik AB, Iceland and its AFN station closed. When I got there in 1958, it was TFK-1530 and sister TFK-TV. When we got off the plane, it was on to the station for the "Welcome aboard" program. Each of us stood on the spot and recited our name and hometown. We had an Air Force nurse along. When she got in front of the camera, the announcer said "Welcome abroad." They didn't cut it out before airing it on radio and TV that evening. The AM station was rather noisy and the TV snowy. I was in charge of Explosive Ordnance Disposal and had little time for radio as the Army shot on their range during the summer, the Air Force flew the old F-89s loaded with airto-air rockets and the Navy flew anti-submarine missions, usually bombing killer whales for practice. In between we disposed of tons of explosive ordnance which was stored outside and deteriorated in a hurry. I did have an AM radio, passed on by somebody going back to the states. Besides TFK, I could get the BBC home service on one frequency. That was it! I finally took up semi-serious DXing the following year in Germany. 73s to you all from Col. DX.

Not much time spent with the radio these past couple of weeks. I did listen to 590 one night for the Tigers BB game (yes, they just keep on winning: it's been a great season, hi) and could hear traces of C&W under them, presumably WJMS. Also, WKZO was mixing with an unID SS station. I assume it was Cuba but not sure. I was up in Michigan for the reunion on 7/22. As Gary mentioned a few weeks ago, I made sure I listened to WAKV-980. As usual, great music. They call themselves "The Memory Station". It's like the Music of Your Life format. I was able to hold them Saturday evening down to almost Coldwater, on I-69 just above the Indiana state line. I am not into chasing stations or towers, but Sunday morning, I happened to run across the WTVB-1590 station just south of Coldwater, where the business route I-69 swings north from the expressway towards town, on old US 27. Three towers, lined up running north-south. On Friday, 7/28, I was passing thru Martinsville, Indiana and spotted a building with the WCBK call letters, but no towers there. I was coming back from Linton, Indiana where, still, I had no trace of WBTO-1600. I have to believe they are silent and have has been for some time. Both going up to Michigan and coming back, I had the car radio tuned to 860 for WMRI-860 and their MoYL format. I was surprised that I lost them in the Van Wert, Ohio area (I went north along the east side of Ohio state line), and didn't really pick them up again coming back until I was along the side of Fort Wayne on I-69. They must be more directional towards the south than I realized. I suspect they must be having to protect WKAR-870 up in East Lansing, Michigan, and perhaps CJBC-860 Toronto as well. It is a month to the next deadline, then back to two week intervals again. I may try a little TV DX in the meantime if this hot humid weather keeps up. 73.

2006-2007 IRCA Lucky 7 DX CONTEST RULES

The object of this year's IRCA contest will be to hear as many stations as possible from your DX location. A station can be located in the US, Canada, or Mexico.

Each station will be worth one point, except if you are "Lucky" enough to hear a station on a gravevard frequency it will be worth "7" points. The contestant with the most total points at the end of the contest will be determined the winner. Entry reports need to be in frequency order (530 to 1710), and must include the call letter and frequency, along with the location of the station, and date and

The contest will begin at 0001 on September 1, 2006 and end 2359 on May 31, 2007.

The contest will be open to all IRCA members in good standing. Entrants will be disqualified if they cease to be members of the club. You may join the contest at any time during the year.

All loggings must be made within 25 miles of your main DX location. Normally this is your home, for students this might be your college dorm. If a person moves during the contest they may start over at the new location.

Stations must be in the normal 530-1710 kHz band, licensed by the U.S., Canada or Mexico. TIS and utility stations are not eligible for contest purposes. To count a U.S. station, you must hear the actual call letters. To count a Canadian or Mexican station, you must hear the actual call letters or hear a recognized slogan plus location. Loggings may be first time heard, or relogs of stations heard before. If a station changes call letters it may be relogged and be counted.

Your contest report of stations heard in any particular month must be postmarked by the 5th day of the following month. For example, a station heard on October 12th must be submitted by November 5th to be eligible. Failure to do this will disqualify the item in question for points. Contest entries must not be sent along with WDXR DX tips as they easily become lost when filed away in the WDXR file. Contest entries may be sent e-mail or postal mail to the address above. E-mail entries must not be "attached files."

The contest manager will have the final word on all station and interpretation of all rules, including disqualification of a station for scoring or a member from the contest.

Standings will be updated on the 15th of each month and results published in the next available bulletin subject to normal deadline delays. The final standings will be tabulated on June 15, 2007 and will appear in the July bulletin, subject to space in that bulletin.

The contest manager may join the contest, but will be ineligible for the prize. There is no entry fee for the contest.

Entry in the contest implies consent to all rules, including those which may appear later as necessity dictates. If you have any questions please write.
