 Re KMPH-840 Modesto, CA, v/l dated 7/16/06: "Regular programming has yet to begin. We are currently finalizing the Day and Night directional patterns for KMPH 840. The station is 5,000 watts day and night. KMPH 840 is operating under Program Test Authority from the FCC while the directional patterns are being adjusted. Once that project is complete and the FCC approves, regular programming will begin. KMPH is using the 5 towers at the former KTRB 860 transmitter site near Waterford/Riverdale/Oakdale, CA. The transmitter is a brand new 5000 watt solid-state Harris. The backup transmitter is KTRB's original transmitter installed in 1979, a 10000 watt Continental tube-type transmitter. The music (you heard for a while) on KMPH was "The Vibe" format from our former FM station, KVBE 107.5 Hanford, CA. Our company purchased KCML 107.5 in 1992. On March 13, 1993, KMPH 107.5 Newsradio went on the air. For 6 years the station was all-news, 24 hours a day. Then talk programming was introduced. So Newsradio became "News-talk radio". After 13 years of News and talk, 107.5 changed to KVBE "The Vibe" with R&B and Old School music. The station was sold to Univision in April of 2005 and turned into a Spanish (Mexican) oldies station, as it is today, "Recuerdo".

The slogan is "Hot Talk 1510". The station has officially dropped Christian variety from the Here's Help Network; HHN still continues on crosstown WCBW 880.

KTRS loses two Ill. towers in storm  
Radio station KTRS said Thursday that two of its four broadcast towers in Madison, Ill., toppled over during Wednesday night's storm, resulting in an emergency broadcast license granted to the station by the Federal Communications Commission. The FCC granted KTRS 550 AM a six-month license to broadcast in the evenings at 1,250 watts in a "nondirectional," or 360-degree, manner from one of its two remaining towers. KTRS typically broadcasts at night at 5,000 watts in a directional manner to the north, south and west, according to a release. KTRS officials said in a statement that the changes will not affect its listeners throughout the Midwest during the day nor those in the St. Louis metropolitan area at night. However, the radio's evening signal will be weaker beyond the St. Louis metropolitan area until the towers are repaired, according to the release. (MS-CA)

Fresh radio show debuts in valley, Progressive talk arrives on AM dial, Keith Matheny, The Desert Sun, August 8, 2006

Monday's debut of progressive talk radio in Palm Springs ironically reminded RR Broadcasting general manager Mike Keane of when his company brought another, then relatively unknown radio personality to the Coachella Valley's airwaves in 1988 - Rush Limbaugh. "It took time for people to catch on and for the word to spread (with Limbaugh)," Keane said. "I expect the same thing will happen here." Rush is now an icon of conservatism and talk radio. And the Air America programming now broadcasting locally on KPTR, AM 1340, is from the exact opposite side of the political spectrum. But Al Franken, Stephanie Miller, Randi Rhodes and other Air America hosts have some advantages Limbaugh didn't, Keane said. Air America is already a known quantity, airing on stations nationwide and on XM Satellite Radio. And rather than having to find a group of listeners, one already exists locally, Keane said. "There's an audience for this type of talk radio," he said. "They've been asking for it and hungry for it for quite a long time. We feel this will give them a voice they have been looking for." Palm Springs resident Stuart Lynn, past president of Democrats of the Desert, called the debut of left-of-center talk radio in the valley "a brilliant step forward." "(Local talk radio) has all been one-sided up until now," he said. "This will bring a balance of perspectives that will really benefit us all." Franken welcomed KPTR as an affiliate during his broadcast Monday. Keane said the station had an unspecified number of listener e-mails Monday "that are happy and congratulating us on the launch." No negative comments had been received, he said. Local conservative talk radio personality Scott Crofut of Palm Desert, on KGAM, AM 1450 on Saturdays, likened Air America to a sinking ship, noting its low national ratings and that it is leaving its flagship station in New York for a smaller station in September. "I think the numbers speak for themselves," he said. But Air America could have some local popularity, Crofut said. "We do have a blue, left-wing population in Palm Springs. It makes good business sense," he said. Crofut added he has personal reasons to welcome Air America to the local airwaves. "I'm a conservative comedian," he said. "This is going to give me all kinds of material without much effort." Keane said it's possible local progressive talk shows could eventually be added to the Air America lineup, depending on how things go. "The market is predominantly conservative talk radio," he said. "It's still in their favor; it's just now there is a liberal voice." (DP-HI)

Air America Radio and Access 1 Communications Corp-NY announced yesterday that Air America Radio will be leaving WLIB 1190 in New York and begin broadcasting on WWRL 1600 AM on September 1. The announcement was made by Jim Wiggett, acting CEO of Air America Radio and Chesley Maddox-Dorsey, president & COO of Access 1. "We are excited about our new affiliation and the platform this move will establish for Air America in the years ahead," said Wiggett. "We look forward to forming a long term and strong relationship with Access 1 Communications." "We are thrilled about our new partnership with Air America," said Maddox-Dorsey. "It is important that we partner in offering the nation's largest radio market a strong, progressive voice." (DP-HI)

Radio broadcasters adopt digital format, Posted 8/2/2006 3:51 PM ET, By Seth Sutel, Associated Press  
JERSEY CITY — From his 16th floor office at WKTU-FM, program director Jeff Zuchowski can take a breathtaking view across the Hudson River of Manhattan. Just the setting for programming the only country music station in New York, with favorites such as Beer for My Horses and Life Ain't Always Beautiful. And if that seems like an odd combination, just think of what regular listeners might say, considering that KTU is known for playing dance music. "You don't see a lot of cowboy boots and country hats walking around Manhattan," allows Zuchowski, who goes by Jeff Z. But he insists that country has a "cult following" in the Big Apple. Few people may be listening for now, but the "side" channel that makes KTU's country music broadcast possible is just the kind of new offering that radio broadcasters are hoping will help revive their

industry as they adopt next-generation digital broadcasting technology, or HD Radio. Thanks to the compression of data that's possible with digital technology, a station that uses HD Radio can send up to four different signals while still using the same frequency it already broadcasts on. HD Radio also claims to have CD-quality sound on FM and FM-quality sound on AM stations, as well as better reception and the possibility of broadcasting data such as song titles and artists names, like satellite radio does. Think of the better picture quality and extra features you get from a movie on DVD instead of on videotape. Plus, it is possible to offer many other services such as news, sports and weather updates or even buying songs. However, with only a tiny number of the units sold so far — executives say just tens of thousands are in use today — the listenership is far too tiny to be measured. Zuchowski acknowledges that HD Radio is an "infant stage." But that hasn't stopped many stations from starting up HD side channels, which the stations have promised to keep commercial-free for the next year in hopes of luring in listeners. In New York, WCBF-FM 101.1 — which caused an uproar when it switched from oldies to the eclectic "Jack" format — airs oldies on its side channel; WQHT-FM, an urban station, broadcasts classic hip-hop on its side channel. The changes come as radio is facing brutal competition for listeners' time from iPods, the Internet and satellite radio. Also, advertising revenues have been sluggish, and were flat in the year to date through June compared with the same period a year ago, according to the Radio Advertising Bureau. Many see great potential for HD Radio, even if the benefits may be years off. "At this stage of the game, it's purely a building process," says Jerry Lee, the owner of WBEB-FM in Philadelphia. Lee, one of the last individual radio station owners in a major market, said HD radio is costing his station now, but he expects it to be profitable in five to seven years. The upgrade to HD Radio is far cheaper than launching a new radio station, and involves adding equipment that allows digital signals to be piggybacked onto a station's regular frequency. Lee said he spent about \$200,000 to upgrade his station's systems to broadcast in HD Radio, and added a side channel. Bob Neil, the CEO of Cox Radio Inc., the fourth-largest radio broadcaster in the country, said he would eventually convert all of the company's FM stations but would hold off on doing the AM stations since that technology "still has a couple of bugs in it." Neil said he expected the digital upgrade to occur far faster than the radio industry's last major technology change — the adoption of FM, which first hit the airwaves in 1953 but didn't take a majority of radio listenership from AM until 1977. Digital radio has been in the works for several years, but is just starting to gain traction this year. "Like everything else in the world, things move faster now," Neil said. "I think we're looking at a five-year horizon before it gets on the radar for consumers, and 10 years before it becomes any kind of major factor in listening." Here's the catch. Just like Harry Potter had to find the secret platform 9 3/4 for the train that took him to Hogwarts, you need a special radio receiver to hear the HD radio signals. And for now, the units are not that cheap. Bob Struble, the CEO of iBiquity Digital Corp., the company that makes the technology for HD Radio, estimates that tens of thousands of receivers have been sold so far. But with prices falling rapidly and HD broadcasts rolling out in more markets, Struble expects nearly half a million units to be sold by the end of the year. When they first came out two years ago, HD radio units cost more than \$800 — clearly a price for early adopters of new technology. RadioShack Corp. and now sells a Boston Acoustics unit for \$299 and is planning to introduce its own model for \$199 in the fall. "We feel we need to have less expensive offerings out there," RadioShack spokesman Charles Hodges says. Online electronics store Crutchfield sells the Boston Acoustics unit, as well as car and boat HD radios and tuners starting at \$199 which can upgrade compatible car stereos to receive HD signals. Peter Ferrara, CEO of the HD Radio Alliance, an industry group charged with promoting the adoption of HD Radio, says stations in 28 markets began broadcasting HD side channels at the beginning of the year and 22 other markets have either launched since or will do so soon. Most are major media markets. Ferrara's group is also in charge of spending a pool of radio advertising time worth \$200 million that member stations have chipped in for promoting the new technology, as well as the new receivers. Now the trick is getting people to tune in. While radio companies remain very profitable, Wall Street is worried about their long-term prospects. Analysts hope the industry will do more than just adopt digital broadcasting as it comes to grips with rapidly evolving consumer listening habits. "My long term answer is, of course it will become the standard," says David Bank, a financial analyst at RBC Capital Markets. "But will it change the industry in the short term? I don't think so." What's more, radio needs to do more to make its programming more compelling, he said. "I don't see the technology itself is a solution. The technology needs to be married to better content," Bank says. Then, the biggest question of all: Will it make money? Matt Feinberg, the senior vice president for radio at the media-buying agency Zenith Media, sees potential in having many more types of radio stations. That gives advertisers more choices to target exactly the audiences they want to reach, something advertisers like about cable TV. But first, Feinberg says, let's make sure people are listening. "It has to have distribution and assimilation," he says. "At that point we start to look at it." (DP-HI)

Say what? Clear Channel throttles liberal talk radio, By Rick Bird, Post staff reporter  
The "revolution of talk radio" and "Homer: The Sports Animal" are trading places. Clear Channel Cincinnati, which owns eight stations locally, announced Friday it is swapping the dial positions of its liberal talk and sports talk stations. Effective July 7, the liberal talker, which carries Jerry Springer's 9 a.m.-noon "Springer on the Radio," will move from WCKY-AM (1530) to the significantly less powerful WSAI-AM (1360). Homer, meanwhile is moving from WSAI to the WCKY frequency. For tri-state fans of each station, the move doesn't mean much except having to perhaps reset some car radio buttons. But it is significant in that it indicates local Clear Channel officials feel the sports talk format is more marketable than the progressive talk genre and deserves the more powerful frequency. WCKY, the new Homer home, has a 50,000-watt signal that can be heard over much of the eastern seaboard and into the Deep South. It is the second most powerful radio signal out of Cincinnati behind WLV's 50,000-watt clear channel signal. WSAI is classified as a regional 5,000-watt signal that adequately covers the tri-state, but not much more. "Homer is a format and brand that over the last number of years has showed ratings success, showed revenue success," said Darryl Parks, operations managers for Clear Channel's Cincinnati AM stations. "On 1530, we felt we could increase the ratings and increase the revenue." The decision to make the frequency flip perhaps reflects the ratings fortunes of the two stations in the past year. Since launching the progressive talk format in January of 2005, WCKY has not made much of a ratings splash, barely cracking the top 20 stations out of some 30 rated in the Cincinnati market. In the latest Arbitron survey covering the first quarter of 2006, the station had just a .09

share in total audience, the lowest since the format launched. Meanwhile, Homer found its total audience double last fall to a 2.4 share and triple among 25-54-year olds, likely driven by the resurgence of the Bengals. With the Reds now seemingly on the rise, too, Clear Channel officials figured that the sports talk format showed the greater potential for growth and therefore deserved a more powerful signal. The future of the liberal talk genre, still struggling in many markets, remains in doubt. Most of the programming comes from New York-based Air America, now in more than 80 markets since launching in April of 2004. Even in major markets, its affiliates are often on the lower-powered stations. WCKY was one of the bigger signals carrying Air America shows, such as Al Franken and Randy Rhodes. Those involved here with selling Springer's show say the dial switch doesn't mean that much. "It's no big deal to Jerry. He's still just excited to be on," said Pat Barry, the former DJ, TV weather personality and talk host who is in charge of marketing "Springer on the Radio." The signal strength won't affect local sales efforts, he said. "Where can't you hear 1360? Remember when it was No. 1?" he said referring to the WSAI glory days in the '60s when it was a top-40 pioneer commanding shares that sometimes amounted to 40 percent of the local radio audience. Parks said, for now, Cincinnati Clear Channel is still committed to the liberal talk format, although he thinks it could use some tinkering. "I think in all of progressive talk - there is shrillness to it. I think there needs to be much more of a humanistic angle to it. Do I see it succeeding in the long run? Yeah." Clear Channel has slowly built its Homer sports talk brand since August of 2000 when the station landed the rights to carry Bengals games. It has a developed a strong local sports talk cast that features the morning drive "Two Angry Guys" of Richard Skinner and Tom Gamble (both former Post sports reporters), Jeff Piccoro from 9 a.m. to noon and Lance McAllister in the afternoon drive slot. "Homer was created as an anchor station built around the Bengals. It's become much more over the years with the local hosts," Parks said. "They have done a wonderful job as talk hosts and bringing breaking sports news to the station and talking topical Cincinnati sports." Putting the sports talker on a more powerful dial position also raises the issue of whether it might regionally compete and cut into ratings of Clear Channel's top-rated WLW, which also is a prominent sports talk outlet as the home for the Reds and Andy Furman's high-profile evening talk show. Parks noted Clear Channel already competes with itself in the market with conservative talker WKRC, often a direct competitor of WLW with conservative daytime talk hosts Mike McConnell and Bill Cunningham. "There is no reason for us not to take a viable product and put it on the best delivery system," Parks said about the Homer move. "A lot of people might say we are going to dig into ourselves. I look at it as growing the pie bigger." Clear Channel owns eight stations in the Cincinnati market: AM outlets WCKY, WKRC, WLW, WSAI and FM stations WEBN, WOFX, WKFS and WVMK. (DP-HI)

I checked out these two stations UT July 18, and BOTH ARE STILL ON THE AIR, seemingly operating normally.

KUSH, 1600 is normally audible at home in the daytime, and quite a bit better on the east side of Enid on a caradio. At 0105 UT (8:05 pm CDT, 1835 LMT), well before sunset with the temp still 100+, skywave was booming in with 1600 dominated by KRVA in the DFW market, Asian Broadcasting (see separate report). So I tried again the next morning when all the skywave should be gone, but at 1356 I was still getting something distant on 1570 and 1660 KXTR. Nevertheless, at 1400 UT, 1600 bore a singing ID sounding like KUSH, and then Oklahoma News Network. No other Okies on 1600, but to be absolutely sure I checked again at 1500 & 1600 got definite full IDs from KUSH. Also has ONN on the half hours.

KALV, 1430, Alva: same situation. Has a null toward Tulsa and hence Enid, but on caradio in Enid I was able to ID it at 1455 and again at 1615 UT, when I counted a SAH of 6 Hz, presumably with Tulsa's buzzer. Still not hearing IBOC from that on 1420 or 1440 here, the latter being essentially empty daytimes except for local line noise, etc.

So have KUSH and KALV not received the FCC notification that they are kaput? Or just keep running, hoping FCC will not find out? The same FCC notice had two other deletions, 1240 Idabel and 1560 Sallisaw, but both are out of range here (Glenn Hauser, Enid, OK, DX LISTENING DIGEST)

\*\* OKLAHOMA. IBOC daytime monitoring observations in and near Enid UT July 18:

640, WWLS Moore-Norman, with heavy buzz on 630 and 650, also audible under the DFW station on 660. AND on 640 itself (slightly).

1000, KTOK, OKC, is definitely IBOC, with buzz on 990 and 1010, also audible under KOKP 1020 Perry, when checked at 0110 UT (before LSS in July), and at 1611 UT. KTOK is not listed as IBOC, and may have just started. I will not listen to them enough (analog) to know if they are promoting "HD"

1300, KAKC Tulsa; 1380 KMUS Muskogee-Tulsa; 1430 KTBZ Tulsa --- cannot detect any IBOC on adjacent frequencies. Only KAKC has a listenable analog signal here.

This list updated June 30, <http://topazdesigns.com/iboc/station-list.html> does not show KTOK 1000 or KAKC 1300, just three OK stations, WWLS 640, KMUS 1380 (green, meaning had it but currently turned off), and KTBZ 1430

Even iBiquity's own listing [http://www.ibiquity.com/hd\\_radio/hdradio\\_find\\_a\\_station/OK/ StnMarket#stationlist](http://www.ibiquity.com/hd_radio/hdradio_find_a_station/OK/ StnMarket#stationlist) shows only WWLS-640 and KMUS-1380! (Glenn Hauser, Enid, DX LISTENING DIGEST)

\*\* OKLAHOMA. Haven't heard it from home, but there is now a TIS at Great Salt Plains State Park, NW of Enid. On my bandscan 15 km N of Enid around 0100 UT July 18, I was hearing a long loop on 1610 mentioning birdwatching there, Byron Fish Hatchery, etc., giving phone number, website. Last time I was at the park, spotted a TIS-type pole along Hwy 132 E of the park at the entrance to the camping area, but it was not on the air then (Glenn Hauser, Enid, DX LISTENING DIGEST) (GH-OK)

**Art Blair** sends along the following (from Inspire Magazine):

Opponents force Mexico Christian radio station off air. Some 85,000 people listened faithfully to Radio Nueva Vision in Nogales, Sonora. At times the station reached the No 1 spot in the ratings. The station was directed by Hector Manuel Lopez Delgado, a lawyer and pastor of Rivers of Living Water Christian Center, and leader of international evangelistic ministry La Unción (The Uncion). The radio ministry began in February 2002, renting 24 hours a day on XEHN (1130 am) with 1,100 watts. It was supported by offerings. Mexico does not allow churches to own radio or television stations, although there is hope that the next government may change the law. The strong spiritual impact of its programs, including only Christian music from 7:30pm at night until 6am, attracted the entire community, including the criminal element. Little anonymous notes began to appear stuck onto the pastor's car, warning him to "watch out". Messages such as "Things are going to be bad for you and your family" also appeared. Vulgar telephone threats became common. The pastor decided to tone down some of the prayers on the radio, to have his car watched, to try to travel in the company of other pastors and generally to watch out for trouble. The radio programs helped people to withstand gales of evil. Listeners frequently called in to ask prayer for community needs, for protection against witchcraft and other occult practices, for healing. Pastor Lopez said that they saw miracles - people healed of cancer and sight restored to the blind. Then attacks began in earnest. Twice in 2005 someone climbed the mountain to the transmitter and destroyed all the cables connecting the antennas. On both occasions the station went off the air for an entire week. Trying to be charitable, Christians thought perhaps someone wanted to rob the cables for their copper. One night the pastor was leaving the church with his three children, his wife, and other believers when a very tall and heavy man jumped him from behind, throwing him down. He intended to kill Lopez, he later confessed. The Christians began to pray and finally were able to subdue the man, who began to foam at the mouth and shake, apparently from powerful spiritual forces upon him. Opponents put a price on the life of the pastor with the intent of destroying the radio ministry, the church and its influence. Concerned members of the church formed urgent groups of fasting and prayer. On June 16 this year came the final blow. Vandals climbed the mountain to the transmitter with axes and other tools and destroyed the entire installation. Radio New Vision was off the air definitively. When the Christians went to the authorities to denounce the attack, they were told: "The other events definitely were not to steal the copper." Once when pastor Lopez was on the other side of the border in Nogales, Arizona, he received an anonymous call on his cell phone saying: "We know that a group of narcos (drug traffickers) and Satanists is against you". Pastor Lopez said his passion for preaching the gospel comes from having persecuted the church for many years; describing himself as "perverse and terrible", he said he came to belief in Christ 20 years ago after he was miraculously healed of cancer. In 1992, he began Rivers of Living Water on the Mexican side of the border; on the other side, he recently began its US equivalent, The Uncion. For now, however, his Radio New Vision has been silenced. (AB-CA)

Central Valley radio stations sold, Chico, Redding stations bought by area broadcaster, deal bring \$17.5M in cash.

Ten Central Valley radio stations - four licensed to Chico and the remainder to Redding, have been bought for \$17.5 million in cash by Mapleton Communications LLC of Los Angeles. The seller is Regent Communications Inc. of Cincinnati. Mapleton currently owns Central Valley radio stations in Visalia (KLOQ) and Merced (KBRE; KABX; KLOQ on a frequency separate from the Visalia station; KHPO; KYOS and KTIO). Federal Communications Commission approval of the sale is required - something that is routine and normally takes about three months. The radio stations changing hands are: KNNN-FM; KSHA-FM; KRDG-FM; KRRX-FM; KQMS-AM; KNRO-AM; all licensed to Redding, and KFMF-FM, KALF-FM, KZAP-FM and KQPT-FM, all licensed to Chico. With a total of 27 radio stations in California and Oregon, Mapleton says it is California's third largest radio operator in terms of owned and operated radio stations. (AB-CA)

Maybe this outlet was the one used to carry the Polisario Front on occasions as the signal strength & bearing is pretty much the same. (Carlos Gonçalves 21.04.2006 via BE, Arctic)

981 - New MW Transradio Telefunken 100 kW transmitter inaugurated at TDA site Ouled Fayet on Feb 28, 2006. (wb, wwdxc BC-DX July 3)

**BELARUS:** Engineers in Kalodziscy started reactivation work on the MW transmitter; it will operate on 873. (open\_dx – Sergey Alekseychik-BLR, via RUS-DXsignal May 31, via Ullmar Qvick)

**BENIN:** On 4 July 2006 in Cotonou, Benin, a license signing ceremony took place allowing Trans World Radio to begin broadcasting the gospel on medium wave (AM) from within West Africa. a truly historic moment. Find out more... <http://www.twrafrica.org/0083.asp> (frequency will be 1566 bp) (TWR website via Steve Whitt, mwc)

**GERMANY:** long announced "Oldiestar Radio" testing 1575 from Burg near Magdeburg. Still in AM, but their intention is to go DRM asap. With WDR on 1593 operating in DRM that would lead to the situation, that our transatlantic-channels 1570, 1580, 1590 and 1600 are history then. What a bloody nuisance for european MW-DXers! More about the station here: [www.olderstarradio.de](http://www.olderstarradio.de) Truck Radio 531, also from Burg, seems to use increased power now. Both 1575 and 531 with a S9+40 signal here, about 70 km west of the transmitter site. Now it's only 261 to be revived, and the mess is perfect. (Martin Elbe, mwdx 2 Aug)

They want to broadcast in DRM Mode, so they have to cancel AM operations and they now ask new authorizations to be in DRM (Christian Ghibaudo, France, Jun 27, DSWCI DX Window July 12 via DXLD)

**GREECE:** 1260 Rhodes - The IBB station since 26 April is no longer carrying IBB programmes. The ERT relay remains at 0900-1400. (ARC)

**LITHUANIA:** Radio Racja (Poland) is leasing airtime on the following MW transmitters to reach listeners in Belarus: 0600-0700 Vilnius (LTU) 612 100kW, 1700-1900 Sitkunai (LTU) 666 500kW (from 1 August), 1900-2100 Koszecin (POL) 1080 350kW. All prgr's are in Belarusian. (Bernd Trutenau, mwdx 30 July)

**MONTENEGRO:** The United Nations has admitted the Republic of Montenegro as its 192nd member on 28 June, so now it is officially a new country. The parliament of Montenegro declared the country's independence on 3 June and the parliament of Serbia accepted the declaration two days later. (press reports via Arctic)

**NETHERLANDS:** The Radiocommunications Agency Netherlands, part of the Ministry of Economic Affairs, has decided to withdraw four of the six mediumwave licenses issued in 2003 to Quality Radio BV. The reason is that Quality Radio has failed to deliver regular program services on four of the six frequencies, and the Radiocommunications Agency says this is an inefficient use of the spectrum. The frequencies affected are 828, 1224, 1035 and 1557. The Radiocommunications Agency has published a 49-page PDF file (in Dutch) containing copies of internal correspondence concerning all six frequencies originally awarded to Quality Radio BV. It includes the full text of the long letter to Quality Radio BV's owner Ruud Poeze explaining the reasons for the decision on each frequency. The Radiocommunications Agency says it carried out monitoring of the frequencies on 4-10 October 2005 and again on 31 March and 2-3 April 2006. The Agency notes that no transmissions were

observed on 1395 between 4 and 10 October 2005. This was a few weeks after the transmissions of UK broadcaster Big L from the Trintelhaven site were abruptly terminated. The letter to Ruud Poeze also mentions that the Agency received a letter from Mr Poeze on 6 October 2005 requesting that the use of the temporary transmission site at Trintelhaven for 1395 be extended. It also reveals that Mr Poeze was visited by staff of the Radiocommunications Agency on 22 Feb 2006 and told them that he wanted to transfer the license for 1395. The current status of that license isn't clear from the published documents. One other frequency was licensed to Quality Radio - 1584 - and this has not been withdrawn. (Andy Senniit <http://blogs.rnw.nl/medianetwork/> 29 July)

**NORWAY:** The Kvitvøy station stopped its transmissions of NRK programming on 1314 at 2200 UT, i.e. local midnight; actually they switched off the transmitters when the new day was already a few seconds old. Not any announcement or even special programming, just the regular P1, with SBG coverage until 2100 and a country music show after the 2100 news. Wonder if really nobody cared or if rather management had verboten to do something. A recording of the very end is in the "station sounds" section of the yg. (Kai Ludwig, Germany, June 30, DXLD)

**SOUTH AFRICA:** According to a report in the press yesterday, Radio 702 is to close down its AM tx on 702. The station has already commenced broadcasting on 92.7 Mhz to greater Johannesburg. Radio702 will also begin broadcasting on 106 Mhz in Pretoria. There will be a 12 month window period where the station will be allowed to broadcast on both mediumwave and FM frequencies, but will retire its AM transmitter on 702 sometime next year. Sister station 567 Cape Talk, from Cape Town, will continue to operate on 567. (Gary Deacon, via mwc 26 Jul)

**UNITED ARAB EMIRATES:** Acc. to Thomson's "RadioNews", Summer 2006, Thomson Broadcast & Multimedia is going to install a third 800kW transmitter at Dhabbiya, to operate on 1539 with a 2-tower directional antenna system. The transmitter is planned to be operational at the end of Jan 2007. It is expected that also this new transmitter (like the transmitters on 1170 & 1575) will be leased by the International Broadcasting Bureau (IBB). (Bernd Trutenau via mwdx 5 Aug)
