The station plans to run a short duration (5 minute long) DX test each Sunday morning (late Saturday night) starting October 1st at Midnight Eastern. Listen for Morse Code ID's. sweep tones and more. Complete information including how to QSL the test are listed below.

The test will continue until further notice, but hopefully well into the Winter season, giving a lot of DX'ers the chance to put this station into their logs! More tests to follow, we're working on some rare ones!

WNJC 1360khz Vineland, NJ DX Test: Date(s): Sunday Mornings (Late Saturday Nights) October 1st, 2006. Time: Midnight until 4:00AM Eastern Time. Modes of Operation: Transmitter Testing. 4,000 Watts, Non-Directional. Programming: Morse Code ID's, Sweep Tones, Voice ID,

Notes: Transmitter testing following repairs to the array after Tropical Storm Ernesto. Station will test until at least 4AM, and possibly later.

CKDO DX PROGRAM: There will be a special five-hour "DX Program" from CKDO Oshawa Ontario on its new frequency of 1580, from 2100 EDT Thursday 5 October to 2 AM EDT Friday 6 October. This program is timed to coincide with the 60th anniversary of the station, to the exact date.

CKDO first signed on October 5, 1946 with 100 watts on 1240. (CKDO = Durham and Ontario counties). The calls became CKLB on Dec. 19, 1949, when ownership changed to Lakeland Broadcasting (ckLB). Calls later became CKAR, and a few years ago reverted to the original CKDO. The station moved to 1350 on Dec. 31, 1955. Thus with its recent official move on Aug. 14 to 1580, the station concluded more than 50 years service on 1350. For those who do not realize, 1580 was one of the clear channels allocated to Canada in the North American Regional Broadcasting Agreement of 1941, and CBJ Chicoutimi QC operated on that frequency from March 22, 1942 until it moved to 93.7 in 1999.

There will be a special toll-free number given out over the air, and phone calls from distant listeners will be encouraged. It is anticipated that some former DJs from over the years will be participating. The 1580 frequency uses the same directional pattern day and night favoring east and west, at 10,000 watts.

The programming has been organized by Wayne Plunkett (long-time DXer) and Douglas Kirk (owner of Durham Radio Inc.).

Let's hope for good conditions so this program can be heard coast-to-coast in North America, and maybe beyond!

Dale Park sends along the following: From the New York Daily News 8/31/06: Air America no longer a 'LIB-eral network

The progressive network Air America tonight scoops up the slings and arrows it aims at President Bush and moves them to its new home a few blocks downtown. Starting tomorrow, Air America will be heard on WWRL (1600 AM), ending a 29-month run at WLIB (1190 AM). WLIB was the network's original flagship station when it launched on March 31, 2004, but the two parties could not work out a new agreement to continue. Not all Air America programming will be picked up on WLIB, which will retain its own morning show, from 5-9, with Sam Greenfield and Armstrong Williams. Air America picks up with Jerry Springer, 9 a.m.noon; Al Franken, noon-3 p.m.; Randi Rhodes, 3-7 p.m.; Sam Seder, 7-10 p.m., and Mike Malloy, 10 p.m.midnight. Air America also has several weekend shows that may be carried on WWRL. The move to WWRL will reduce Air America's coverage in some parts of the metropolitan area, since WWRL's signal isn't quite as strong as WLIB's and there are areas where it is hard to pick up. Questions continue to circulate about the financial health of the network, which has experienced cash crises and relatively high turnover of executives. The company has consistently said it is here to stay. Part or all of its programming is heard on about 90 stations and is available on satellite and the Internet. Its ratings in most cities are modest, partly due to the fact it is often heard on smaller AM stations, rather than the giants that carry the Rush Limbaugh-level commentators. While Air America has been criticized for one-note Bush-bashing, its hosts dispute that characterization and point to the conservative radio focus on President Bill Clinton in the 1990s. Supporters say that whatever its ultimate fate, the network has given liberals a voice on the previously barren radio airwaves and has helped galvanize progressive groups on the Internet and elsewhere. WLIB, meanwhile, will become a full-time black gospel station as of tomorrow, producing its own programming. It will go without deejays for the first few weeks while it introduces the new format. (DP-HI)

Uplifting format WLIB (1190 AM) will be spreading the gospel beginning Friday. After 29 months as the local outlet for the Air America liberal talk radio network, the Inner City-owned station will be offering "Praise and Inspiration." The format will be all-music with no hosts for a few months. According to published reports, hosts will be added. Besides bringing a format that's been off the air for close to nine years in the area, WLIB is doing something unusual in the current radio landscape: playing music on an AM station. WLIB is now simulcasting urban adult contemporary sister station WBLS (107.5 FM) overnights, and the sound quality hasn't been good. In an interesting twist, the last full-time gospel station in the area was WWRL (1600 AM). WWRL will pick up Air America programming on Friday. New voice in town WHTZ (100.3 FM), the Clear Channel-owned Top 40 station, welcomes JJ Kincaid to the afternoon drive slot on Sept. 12. Kincaid, a hot jock in Dallas, replaces Paul "Cubby" Bryant, who is now waking up with Whoopi Goldberg over at Clear Channel's dance outlet WKTU (103.5 FM). This bodes well for new program director Sharon Dastur. Z100's last hire from Texas, Shelley Wade, has signed two contract extensions since taking over the midday slot at the station in July 2001. Over at WOR (710 AM), Joe Bartlett replaces Ed Walsh on "The WOR Morning Show." Bartlett joins co-host Donna Hanover starting Monday. Swimming upstream WBJB (90.5 FM), the radio station at Brookdale Community College in Lincroft, has upgraded its Web stream. The new Web link for the stream is www.90.5thenight.org. The station has been a longtime supporter of local musicians. The Virus spreads Opie and Anthony will host the Traveling Virus comedy show at 7 tonight at the PNC Bank Arts Center in Holmdel. The duo's return to terrestrial radio on WFNY (92.3 FM) mornings has paid off for CBS Radio. The summer book trends, released by Arbitron Monday, show the pair with a 4.2 share of listeners 18 to 34. Each share point represents a percentage of radios in use of the 15.3 million available listeners in the New York metro area. Although Goldberg was on the air for only the last month of this summer trend, WKTU showed a small gain in the mornings with listeners 25-54, going from a 2.9 to 3.0. It's also worth noting that some stations don't even subscribe to the summer book since its findings are not used to set ad rates as the fall and spring books do. The summer book ratings will be released Oct. 16. The ratings period ends Sept. 20. Program notes "Jazz at Lincoln Center" with host Ed Bradley will begin its 14th season Sept. 28 with the Lincoln Center Jazz Orchestra joined by Mulgrew Miller and Marc Cary. The show airs locally at 6:30 p.m. Mondays on WBGO (88.3 FM). Israeli-born jazz vocalist Ayelet Greenberg draws on rhythms from around the Middle East. She'll be on "Soundcheck," which airs at 2 p.m. weekdays on WNYC (93.9 FM), on Sept. 5. Greenberg will talk about her song cycle inspired by the erotic biblical love poem "Song of Songs." At WFUV (90.9 FM) the music of New Orleans will be celebrated throughout the day Tuesday, which marks the first anniversary of the coming of Hurricane Katrina. At 8 p.m., the Fordham University adult album alternative station will air "Dirty Dozen Brass Band: Going On Again," which features the band's interpretation of Marvin Gaye's "What's Going On" in the wake of the disaster. The show will be hosted by New Orleans resident Harry Shearer, a comic best known for his work in the Christopher Guest films "This Is Spinal Tap" and "A Mighty Wind." -- Claudia Perry. (DP-HI)

And on BC, a question for BC'ans: does the "Sun Coast", a term heard on CFPR, refer to the northwest coast of BC, around Prince Rupert, or the entire coast including Vancouver? The Sun Coast is mentioned in local news after the CBC national newscast ends 5 minutes after the hour. Also those who (like me) haven't heard CJBC-860 should look now before the new Friscan wipes it out. As CFRB is often heard here. CJBC. CHWO and other Torontonians should be possible. Now in mid-September, the Middle East is back, led by R. Farda, UAE-1575. Alaska's KNOM-780 is amazing; often equal to my local KHLO-850, with KFQD-750 good and KBBI-890 a weak third. My new R75, nicely modified by Steve Ratzlaff, is working well and I rarely use the old FRG-100. I like the freedom to select LSB or USB without BFO kicking in. Select USB and the piercing het, apparently from Fiji-1151, against KTLK-CA 1150, disappears immediately. Can't be sure of the identity of the possible Fijian, however, as I have heard no audio from it, though I did a few years ago. Whatever it is, it is much louder and fades far less than Tahiti-738 or any other South Pacific station. Manmade noise, perhaps from computers or cable, is very severe here now. sometimes confining my DXing to the high end of the band, 1450-1700. Sorry I missed this year's convention, but saving money to move to a noise free location and build Beverages takes priority.
