Modes of Operation: Transmitter Testing. 1,000 Watts, Non-Directional. Programming: Morse Code ID's, Sweep Tones, Voice ID. Notes: Transmitter audio chain testing. Listen for station jingles, special music, and other wild card items that may be transmitted by Paul Walker. Don't discount the ability of graveyard stations to be heard during DX tests, as we've had widespread reports during some past tests. (KEVA in WY!)

Grayland Summary

Here's a summary of what we heard Saturday and Sunday morning at Grayland. Chuck, Nick, Steve and Bill - feel free to add your own catches and comments to what I've noted.

Conditions both mornings were good. I thought Sunday was slightly better than Saturday (contrary to what John Bryant and others experienced), but there was room for reasonable people to disagree.

Some of the highlights for me:

Friday night - a couple of TA signals but no audio to speak of. 1134 came close, and there was an intriguing carrier on 1476 at about 0305UTC, that left us scratching our heads (nothing there with much power except a UAE station).

Saturday Morning - Voice of Russia Chinese service on 1251. A tantalizing station on 729 possibly in Vietnamese or something, mostly with interviews and phone conversations, quite loud at times with somewhat distorted audio. No ID noted but possibly a long tone heard when we tried at the TOH. In fact, they ran a phone call across the hour. Another tantalizing station on 1179 mixing with Japan. We couldn't place the language, possibly a Chinese dialect (non-Mandarin) or a SE Asian language. Hebei RGD on 1278 with an ID at 1230UT. Vietnam 675. Taiwan Fisheries station 738. HLKG-738 with an ID at 1500. Plus many other Chinese, Japanese, and Korean stations.

Sunday Morning - JOCK-729 with local ID 0959. NHK1-846 //594. Something mixing with Japan 1242 at 1119 UTC. I caught a few words of English so it may have been Vietnam's foreign service. Monster signal from CRI Russian service on 963. The 1179 station again. No IDs noted but there were a couple sets of pips recorded on the hour (one probably was JOOR, the other our unid).

Hopefully we can ID this one based on what we've recorded. South Korea 567 1467 558 603 1341 1044 711 1305 et al. Something in Chinese mostly under (sometimes equaling) KFBK, possibly with English, possibly with an ID 1400. Thailand 891 at about 1345. A station in Russian and a station in Chinese mixing with presumed KTBI (religious show) on 810, with no sign of KGO at 1410. Probably the same one Pat & John heard. Jiangxi 729 at 1418, no ID noted but had a long string of ads with Jiangxi mentioned several times. An NHK2 station with a local ID at 1500 signoff. Unfortunately I didn't catch the call. I have it on minidisc, but it may be too weak to ID. This on a channel where everything is 1 kw or less. Hubei RGD 774 quite good at times after JOUB signoff. ID heard 1537 after several minutes of nonstop ads (these people are really getting a good handle on capitalism). Plus a bunch of the usual stuff. There was a post sunrise enhancement into China that lasted past 1600 or almost 2 hours after local sunrise. The CNR stations on 945 and 981 had amazing signals up until around 1600, and the Korean on 1170 was still dominating the channel at 1545UT.

In all, a nice DXpedition. Good but not spectacular by Grayland standards. I'd give the weekend about a 7 on a scale of 1 to 10.

There are stations which I receive regularly, but which other IRCAnians who are closer to them never seem to report. I look for them in vain in the loggings columns. I'd like to ask club members to check them and report them, if heard. They include regional Mexicans which I hear almost every night - XEFW Tams-810, XELT Jal-920, XEMR N.L.-1140, XECU Sin.-1450 and XEQI N.L.-1510. The new IRCA Mexican Log, 11th ed., lists XEFW and XEQI as low-powered at night, but I estimate them at 50 kw. The other is WDHP-1620, an almost nightly powerhouse. Until recently, it carried BBCWS relays after midnight, USVI time (AST), but that easily-recognized format now seems to have been dropped. Luckily, its on-the-hour IDs are still lengthy and specific; announced //WDDA-1290 is still unheard here. Such a clear, powerful signal for 1kw, when even the super powered Cubans like 640, 670, 710 and 1180 are inaudible. August and most of September were dull months here, with high levels of manmade noise from the big new expensive homes which now surround my modest abode. But 9/30 brought Brazil back, last heard in July. The two dominant Brazilians, 1280 and 1220, were the only two, but they were welcome. In the early evening, a vast swathe of the Western Hemisphere, from Copacabana to the Bering Strait, was audible simultaneously, with KNOM-780 noted earlier than ever before, dominating KKOH. The Ave Maria made this Catholic station easy to ID. Mainland DXers are reporting KICY-850 with possible increased power, but still no sign here thru my fairly weak local KHLO. (Richard, I would love to hear WDHP-1620 here, but, unfortunately, WHLY-1620, in South Bend is, at most, 136 miles north of me--rce)

CKDO-1580 was definitely on, at least for part of the time period. I almost forgot about it, partly because I didn't need the station, and partly because I had three hours of class that evening (and three hours Wed am) and planning on being somewhere Thursday morning. I didn't listen for any of the phone numbers, etc. Reception wasn't the best here as we were supposed to have had storms during the day and they never surfaced but the QRN for it did. I haven't listened much this week due to the baseball playoffs. I have waited 19 years since the last time Detroit was in the playoffs so I have been listening to that instead. My younger sister lives 300 miles north of Detroit and was having problems getting the game until I told her that ESPN radio was carrying it. She has a little bit of the DXer in her (picked up from me and our father) but not to the degree that many of us have the drive to be looking for stations. She apparently has trouble with reception up there. I did a little bit of SSS Friday night (before landing on the ballgame) and managed to nail WVOP-970 GA carrying a high school football game. Strong signal. Seemed to be favoring the deep south during SSS Friday night. 73. P.S. This was typed before Detroit won on Saturday, so I will be listening to the games with Oakland this week instead of SSS. Tues and Wed. games start at 15:00 ELT--maybe I will get a little DX in. Class Wed. Night, so that is out. No word on the games in Detroit.
