"Inventory Insert" 60 Second Long Test. 0.003kw Non-Directional. (One night may include a brief full daytime power test.) Programming: Morse Code ID's, Sweep Tones, 60 Second Long "Inventory Insert" during local breaks. Notes: Transmitter audio chain testing. Exact times of the inserted spots will be given closer to the test time period. In general, look for the test to run near the Top of the Hour (TOH.) The extreme low power of this station at night should make this one a nice challenge!

Our thanks Scott Bailey of WMRO, who's always been very DX Friendly! And also to Paul Walker, who helped to arrange vet another test for all of us.

News from Scott Bailey at WMRO. The "Inventory Insert" DX test is now running each night from Midnight until 4AM Central Time. It runs at approximately :05 minutes after the hour, right after CNN news.

They're running only their legal nighttime power of 0.003kw non-directional, so this one is going to be tough. Despite that, I heard them with ease from Birmingham, including their normal, legal voice ID at the TOH. Sweep Tones and Morse Code were easy copy.

According to Scott, the test will likely continue to run for months. At some point, if they have maintenance, we may be able to get a limited test at daytime power levels.

WODI 1230khz Brookneal, VA DX Test. Date(s): Sunday Morning (Late Saturday Night) Starting October 1st and continuing until further notice. Despite continuing noise problems, 10/10 was one of the finest nights of my 49-year DX career. It brought back memories of the wonderful Alaskan receptions I used to get with Beverages and an offgrid location near here in the 1980's. My best discovery then was KIYU Galena, which I heard on the day it came on the air, on 910. Using my antennas, I triangulated its location as being between Nome and Anchorage. That was correct! It was recently off the air (in its remote location, it's hard to maintain) but luckily back on, heard with its usual NPR. I knew it would be a good AK night when KNOM-780 dominated KKOH-NE early in the evening. Mainland DXers, try to listen for the Hail Mary at 0530; it's distinctive and should cut through KKOH there. Another throwback to the 80s was KJNP-1170 King Jesus North Pole, whose magnificent log cabin studios I visited back then, the most attractive radio studio I have seen. Other AKs were new, never heard before: KBYR-700 and notably KGTL-620. No directional antenna, phasing or nulling was required to eliminate my ridiculously weak local KIPA-620 at 11 miles in the same direction. Like a Homeric hero, KGTL wiped it out. I can't wait for the CP'ed new Anchorage on 1330 to hit the band, and I'm really trying hard for AK graveyarders. I'm surprised I didn't hear KICT through or even over my local KHLO-850, as KOA often wipes it out. I didn't make a note of the day but I did catch a good signal from WOKY-920 WI just as SRS was beginning one morning this past week. It wasn't needed, but it was the station I listened to most of the time when I was living in Milwaukee. I miss the station but not really the city. 73.

Over the years, those of us who've been lucky enough to DX at Grayland, WA, have usually used Beverage antennas. After all, there's room, but the location itself is a good one for hearing trans-Pacific signals; there isn't anything else to the west but the Pacific Ocean. So every once in awhile, somebody will try something else, usually returning to the Beverages after making some comparisons. Some that I have been aware of are the K9AY and Ewe, as well as a couple of different ALA loops, and a couple of active whip antennas. The K9AY and Ewe, though directional, suffered from the poor ground conductivity of the site, and didn't always deliver great signals, while the ALA100 tended to respond at least as well to the domestics as it did to the trans-Pacifics (though better on the LW TPs), and the whips suffered from electrical noise, though Guy Atkins has done well

with one in an electrically quiet campsite. A few weeks ago, at Grayland I put up a Flag antenna, with remote termination (Vactrol; it's Mark Connelly's design) and with the bottom wire only a few centimeters above the dirt. The Flag is not a ground dependent antenna, so in spite of the still dry ground, it stacked up very well against the Beverages, even if it produced nothing like their raw signal level, something like 3 S-units down. But there were many occasions throughout the night where the broad null of the Flag towards our domestic stations caused it to have more readable DX signals than Beverages did. Only as the sun came up did the Beverages show themselves completely superior, as at that point, one needs all the signal one can get on the fading overseas stations. The Flag just didn't cut it then, and started to hear locally generated noise. But, in general, this could be a fine antenna for those who can DX at the shore, want to hear trans-oceanic signals with attenuated domestics, but have restricted antenna space available.

Bill Harms writes: "I can wrap up my Grayland DX experience in one word. OVERWHELMING! Yes, it was overwhelming. But even more important to me was the camaraderie and the swapping of DX stories. It was great to renew friendships which reach back almost 30 years and meeting people whose names I had only seen in print and spoken to on the phone. We had a good time discussing the technical aspects of DXing. Chuck Hutton loaded his receiver tuning and recording software on my laptop. The software imprints the frequency and time on the recording and this allows the DXer to able to more easily identify their DX when the listen to the recordings later.

As far as DX goes, I can not determine how good the DX was compared to other sessions because this was my first experience, but I was told it was above average. We heard plenty of stuff from NE Asia, and several stations from other regions on the other side of the Pacific. We only heard a handful of DU stations (Aussies on 702, 774, and 1548 etc.), but the number of stations from Asia more than made up for it. Alaska did okay with about 10 or so stations heard. I had a lot of fun looking for the Koreans and Japanese stations that I heard when I lived in Korea. I managed to unravel a dual ID for the two KBS stations on 1044. We still had stuff coming in way after our local sunrise. (Hubei 774, KBS on 972 and 1170 to mention a few.) What was really astounding to me was the fact that the TP signals dominated the North American stations on the channels which matched up the 9 kHz and the 10 kHz scheme. Some of them were completely on top.

I am already looking forward to the next time.
