KRSN 1490khz Los Alamos, NM Maintenance Test. Date(s): Sunday Morning (Late Saturday Night) January 28, 2007. Time: 0100-0110, 0200-0210, & 0300-0310 Mountain Time. Ten minute long test period at the top of each hour. Modes of Operation: Special DX Test. 640 Watts, Non-Directional. Programming: Phonetic voice ID's, Morse Code ID's, Sweep Tones. Notes: This will be a challenging test, as KRSN is on an STA that allows them only 640 watts. The antenna is a short (about 80 foot) folded unipole mounted on a 150 foot tower. The top of the tower supports several bays of cell phone antennas.

KRSN has a new Harris transmitter, which they will be testing.

A recording of the test is requested. The following formats (only) are acceptable: .MP3 or .WAV for e-mail attachments. Audio CD or cassette for Postal reports. If a recording is not available, please include a detailed description of your reception including the sequence of test elements, description of sweep tones, etc.

Our special thanks to Mike Westfall, N6KUY for working so hard to arrange this test with his local graveyard station. Also our gratitude to both Dave and Gillian Sutton, the station owners for scheduling their maintenance around the needs of the DX'ers!

Received an inquiry from a DX'er who wanted to know exactly how we went about handling verifications/QSL's when the Broadcast Test Coordinator is handling the reception reports for a DX test. It's a fair question, so here goes:

Our process works like this---I review the reports (and hopefully recordings) and try to determine if the station was in fact heard. If I cannot confirm the reception, I inform the DX'er of that. They can then "appeal" this to Brandon Jordan, who acts as an independent "check and balance". He can overrule me and issue the card, or agree with me...in which case, it's an unconfirmed logging.

We never do QSL's or verifications without the permission of the station, but they usually do not review the reports directly. We always send the station a summary of the loggings, and sometimes we'll send out a CD of the recordings that we've received.

Most stations don't have the time, or resources to handle verifications, so they're happy to have us do them. In many cases, tests would be impossible to arrange otherwise. I would encourage you to develop the ability to record your loggings. Using a computer, it's easy and cheap (free) to record things directly to MP3 these days. It makes reports much easier to verify---most of our question marks come from "paper loggings". I have only a minimum amount of details about the WWNH test, for example...so I have to piece meal a log together from recordings of others and then check the paper logs last. It's time consuming----

In those cases, were I am able to record the test directly or get detailed logs from the stations, the whole process is much easier, but in many tests. I have to construct a time line of the test based on the recordings of others. That makes "paper logs" very difficult to check and I do them last.

The most valuable item in my shack is a software program called "Total Recorder", which costs \$11 bucks, and can completely automate your overnight DXing. Many DX'ers record the TOH period using this software, on each hour, and then review their recordings the next day. I've added over 100 stations to my log using this method. www.highcriteria.com.

You can also use it's scheduling function to record a DX test automatically and save it to MP3.

Others have complained that having the BTC verify the reports makes them "less valid" or desirable than those from the station. I defend the practice in two ways:

- A. If it makes getting a test possible, then it's worth it. Any test is better than no test, including those who do not or cannot QSL at all.
- **B.** I've personally worked at two radio stations and one TV station. I've seen Chief Engineers open reception reports and send out verifications without ever listening to the recordings or checking log details. They literally "rubber stamp" them, because that is the least trouble for them.

That's one of the big reasons why you have coast to coast receptions of Part 15 stations, or other nearly impossible DX feats going on. These DX'ers often receive verifications of their receptions!

In our case, we actually do listen to the recordings, check the log times and descriptions against program content, etc. We've denied dozens of reception reports this season alone---how many CE's are taking that kind of time and trouble to protect the integrity of the QSL?

Hope this helps everyone to better understand how we're going about all this. - Les

WESTERN HEMISPHERE

CARIBBEAN: Here the new version (2.0) of the Caribbean Radio Database: http://geocities.com/
pyzx/caribe_2.0.xls
It produced after several years of TEP monitoring in Brazil and some research on the web and magazines. For North Americans the database can be applied for Tropo/Es to Carib. (Flávio Archangelo, HCDX) (This is an FM & VHF/UHF list but it still might be of value to some members. bp)

DOMINICA: I stopped in Dominica on a cruise in spring of 2006. While wandering around the city of Roseau I saw the building that houses the DBS offices and studio. I was taking a few pictures when a woman came out of the building carrying a briefcase and clipboard. She said she worked at the station and agreed to answer a question I had. I asked her about the fact that as our ship pulled into the harbor that morning I was unable to detect their AM signal on either 590 or 595. She explained that the AM transmitter consumed a lot of electricity and was mostly off the air due to electricity cost. She did offer that it was on the air early on Sunday mornings for a church broadcast where the church covered the cost of operating the AM transmitter. Much of the electricity on the island comes from hydroelectric sources. There are some high lakes in the mountains feeding waterfalls that have been redirected to power generators. The rest of their power comes from petroleum that is imported by ship from Trinidad and which is very expensive.

The FM side of DBS was interesting in that a frequency at the upper end of the FM band (107 MHz) was used for their studio-transmitter link. A Yagi beam about 40 feet above ground sent the signal to a mountain top where it was retransmitted on 88.1 MHz. Many other frequencies were also in use around the island as shown on the billboard (88.5, 89.5, 103.1, 103.5) above the office/studio building. I presume these are translators fed by the 88.1 signal. (Joe Buch via DXLD)

MÉXICO: Fred Cantú, who is continuously improving his website on broadcasting in México, now has added a listing by frequency for AM broadcasting stations. **http://www.mexicoradiotv.com/frec_am.htm**. He has also, for stations in Distrito Federal, cited powers for AM & FM stations. As with every list involving Mexican stations, Cantú is ahead on many listings ... for example, XECT-1190 in Monterrey now is "Contacto 1190" with a news/information format. I'm continuing the process of updating the list I produced a couple of years ago. I'm up to 900 kHz on the retype (fortunately, it's a re-edit rather than an absolute retype.) A couple of observations ... unlike in the United States, there have been virtually NO new medium wave stations in México in the past decade, but many, many frequency changes as stations move from the upper end of the dial to the lower end. Half the stations in México now below 950. The FCC data base has undergone a wholesale revamping for México and has become useful again, though there are still many stations that haven't been updated and many more that have listings on both old and new frequencies.

EUROPE, AFRICA, AND MIDDLE EAST

DENMARK: On February 14 2006 at 2330 the 300 kW transmitter in Kalundborg operating on 243 will be switched off for the last time. And starting February 15th there will be a strong reduction of airtime on the 250 kW transmitter in Kalundborg operating on 1062. This is the new schedule: 0445-0507 0730-0807 1045-1130 1645-1716 2145-2205 (All times in UTC). I believe that the transmitter will be switched on some 5 minutes prior to these s/on times and may also stay on the air a couple of minutes after official s/off times. The programs to be carried are: 0445-0451: Weather forecast, 0451-0500: // DR P4, 0500-0507: News (// DR P4), 0730-0740: Gymnastics, 0740-0745: Interval signal, 0745-0800: Weather forecast, 0800-0807: News (// DR P4), 1045-1100: Weather forecast, 1100-1130: News (// DR P1 and DR P4), 1645-1700: Weather forecast, 1700-1716: Navigational warnings, 2145-2200: Weather forecast, 2200-2305: News (// DR P4). The news in Danish from KNR, Greenland, currently heard Mo-Fr 1755-1800 UTC will be discontinued on 1062 and will only be available on DR P1 (on FM and the internet). The reason for the closure of 243 and the reduced schedule on 1062 is the fact that hardly anyone in Denmark listens to LW and MW - and due to the high cost of running the transmitters. EGYPT: A change on the MW scene in Egypt!! Checking the MW frequencies around 1930 UT today 8/12/2006 I noticed that (news Radio) Idha at al-akhbaar is on 1071; previously that frequency used

to have (Greater Cairo radio) Idha`at al-kahira al-kobra, but sounds like the change took place as greater Cairo radio is on FM band, so the media people want to have the news radio more audible for listeners all over Egypt, not only on FM band in Cairo.

FINLAND: YLE Radio Finland, Pori 963 closed down the MW station officially on 31 Dec 2006 at 2159. The last hour consisted of Finnish language debate about the Pori SW-center, the Finnish national anthem and YLE interval signal. It is a really sad decision that YLE decided to shut down 963. Finnish truck drivers are very angry right now. MW 558 from Sandhamn in Helsinki will continue as a service to the Baltic Sea. All the YLE SW services are also closed down from the 1st January 2007.

IRELAND: The Broadcasting Commission of Ireland (BCI) said on October 26th that it has received five applications for the provision of a new quasi-national Christian and religious sound broadcasting service on the AM band. One of the applications is from United Christian Broadcasting, who previously operated an unlicensed station on medium wave in Ireland. All applications will be made available for public inspection from Monday 13 November. From that date, they can be viewed online at http://www.bci.ie/ (Andy Sennitt via MWC) 252 - RTE will install a Transradio DRM- capable system at its Summerhill transmitter site. The system includes a Transradio TRAM 300L transmitter and DRM-DMOD2 exciter. Factory acceptance tests are due in mid-December 2006 and RTE expects to have the transmitter in operation by the end of the first quarter of 2007. (Radio World International edition Nov 2006 via Medium Wave Report, Dec BDXC-UK Communication via DXLD)

The BCI recently advertised for a Christian/Religious service to operate primarily on medium wave with some FM fill-in. The bidders have all been in touch with RTE's transmitter group who advise that the new service could operate from Tullamore on 612 once 567 closes at the end of Medium Wave News 52/08 35 January 2007 2008. This is interesting as RTL is currently co-ordinating use of 567 for a DRM service. The old Moydrum site just outside Athlone is not an option. There may be some use of 1278 for Dublin and Cork. In parallel with this development RTE has ordered a new DRM capable transmitter for 252 in Summerhill. The power is 300 kW (AM) so I suspect that DRM would use about 100 kW. RTE expect to have the new transmitter installed by mid 2007, probably still in AM mode. If RTE does switch fully to DRM then it may require Algeria to limit its power output otherwise the UK coverage may be curtailed to the west coast. (Kevin Ryan, Medium Wave News, Jan 07)

Herman Boel, of the European Medium-Wave Guide, has just reported receiving word that RTE Ireland are to close down all MW operations by the end of 2007. This would mean the end of 567 and 729 from that country, although I must confess I thought that 729 had closed down a considerable amount of time ago. Herman suspects this will mean the end of all high-power MW operations from Eire. (Paul David, mwdx 6 Jan)

I just got the following interesting answers from RTE: 1) Yes we do still broadcast RTE Radio 1 on 729 with an ERP of 10kW, 2) RTE has no plan to shut down either 567 or 729 at this point in time. 3) RTE has no plan to shut down LW on 252 at this point in time, and of course we are looking at DRM as a possibility among others. (Herman Boel via Paul David, mwdx 8 Jan)

NETHERLANDS: The Radiocommunications Agency Netherlands has announced that holders of medium wave licenses may now apply for a modification to the license to allow them to use the Digital Radio Mondiale (DRM) system. The Agency highlights three benefits of DRM over analogue: Greatly improved audio and reception quality. The possibility of transmitting additional data services Lower power is necessary (less environmental damage and lower energy costs). The Agency also points out the disadvantage that listeners first have to buy a new DRM receiver. For existing medium wave license holders, there are three options: Continue broadcasting in analogue (no further action necessary), Replace analogue with DRM, in which case the license holder needs to request a modification to the existing license, Replace analogue with a so-called SCS (Single Channel Simulcast) transmission allowing analogue and DRM modes to be broadcast on the same frequency, which also requires a license modification. (Source: Radiocommunications Agency Netherlands) Andy Sennitt comments: At the 2005 International Broadcasting Convention in Amsterdam, I was told

informally by a colleague from the Radiocommunications Agency Netherlands that the Agency was keen to get DRM on the agenda as soon as possible, so this announcement is not a surprise. I imagine that option 3 (Single Channel Simulcast) will appeal to license holders, certainly for the next few years when very few DRM receivers are in use.

ZIMBABWE: The Zimbabwe government will start rehabilitating and upgrading the existing radio and television transmission network this year while possibilities of expanding coverage are being explored. Acting Minister of Information and Publicity Cde Munyaradzi Paul Mangwana told The Herald recently that the Government had made provisions for the upgrading and rehabilitation of existing infrastructure in the 2007 budget and work is expected to commence in January. The move follows complaints that there was limited or no radio and television coverage in remote parts of the country, forcing people in the affected areas to receive external transmissions. (This can be interpreted to mean that the Government doesn't want people listening to non-government voices.) (Medium Wave News, Jan 07)
