Date(s): July 1st, 2007 Thurs July 15th, 2007 (Low Power 96 Watts ND). July 14th & 15th (High Power 2500 Watts ND). Time: 00:00AM until 04:00AM Pacific Time. Test material of Morse Code and Sweep Tones will air twice per hour between Midnight and 4AM daily. The station runs a Spanish Christian format as "La Voz Christiana 1550".

Test Material: Morse Code ID's, Sweep tones, and a "QRSS" (Slow Speed Morse Code ID'S). The QRSS signal is encoded at 2.5khz. Dot length is 3 minutes in length. QRSS once per hour during the low power portion of the test, and twice per hour during the high power 2.5kw nights. You can attempt to detect the QRSS signal using only your radio, computer soundcard and some free spectrum analysis software from **www.weaksignals.com**. Download the software called "Argo".

Modes of Operation: Normal, except when test material is running near TOH and BOH. Night time power of 96 watts ND. July 14th & 15th ONLY- Full power of 2500 watts ND.

Programming: Morse Code ID's, Sweep Tones, Voice ID. QRSS 2.5khz Slow Speed Morse Code

Notes: Please do not telephone the station during the test or afterwards. The test is being done by remote control and automation.

Reception reports are desired via e-mail (first choice) and snail mail (only if e-mail is not available) Station would prefer to receive recordings of the test (MP3, CD, or cassette). Submit reports to: les@highnoonfilm.com. Please put "KXTO DX Test" in the subject line.

For those who wish to experiment with receiving QRSS (slow speed Morse Code) transmissions prior to the KXTO Test, Brandon Jordan who runs the very informative **www.dxtests.info** web site has posted a sample file that will closely match the actual file for the test. It's available at: http://www.dxtests.info/\_files/KXTO%2010%20Minute%20File.wav.

Keep in mind, that what you're really looking at is a audio frequency spectrum analyzer, not RF. You're feeding an audio signal from your radio (headphone jack, or other output) into one of the inputs on your computer soundcard (Mic, Line, etc.) and then viewing what that audio looks like.

Using this technique it's possible to detect slow speed Morse Code signals well below the noise, sometimes as much as -20db! Using this technique, world wide reception of the KXTO DX test may be possible.

In advance of the test, I'd concentrate on looking at the carrier signals of various AM stations using USB, LSB, and CW modes. Adjust levels on the receiver output, soundcard input, etc. until you get nice, clean images that are free of distortion. It's easy to overdrive the soundcard with too "hot" of a signal.

The actual transmission will be at 2.5khz and you should be able to literally "read" the dots and dashs of the QRSS transmission spelling out, K-X-T-O.

In Morse that looks like: K= Dash Dot Ďash, X= Dash Dot Dot Dash, T= Dash, O= Dash Dash Dash It's a great mode, and potentially a nighttime IBOC-Beater! You can learn lots more at: http://www.w0ch.net/grss/grss.htm.

There has been a bit of discussion about the use of QRSS in the upcoming KXTO 1550khz test in July. Most of this has taken place on the ABDX E-mail list. Noted DX'er Harry Helms pointed out, quite correctly that true QRSS is a CW mode.

It involves the switching on and off of the carrier signal of the station. Thus a 2.5khz tone modulated on the AM carrier of KXTO is not true QRSS and likely will not generate the same remarkable performance that true QRSS does.

My speculation about its potential benefits are in fact, just that. Speculation. KXTO will transmit a 2.5khz tone that will result in two very narrow carrier signals at 1547.5kHz & 1552.5kHz. Using the Argo software and narrow bandwidths, these two signals should be detectable, potentially at much lower levels that aural reception of sweep tones and standard Morse Code.

Using this material is an experiment. Will it significantly improve the ability of DXers to receive the test at great distances---we're not sure. Will it allow detection of the signal -20db under the noise as true CW QRSS does? Almost certainly not.

But I think it's an important experiment and I'd love to see as many DXers as possible attempt to receive the signals. In the future, I'll refer to long duration Morse Code ID's on AM stations as "Quasi-QRSS" to be more precise.

For those attempting reception, Brandon Jordan pointed out the following:

I listened to the QRSS file today, and the code on the file is 5 second dots and 15 second dashes, with 5 second spaces. One repetition of the Code ID takes 3 minutes total.

My thanks to both Harry Helms and Brandon for catching my errors. Here's hoping that everyone gets a chance to hear (and see) the KXTO test!

680 (KNBR) <u>CA</u>, San Francisco 6/2 0500-0600 with open carrier, 2 Mexican stations audible underneath, one playing 70's music, one playing 80's/early 90's. ID sounded like "la mismo" or "la ritmo," then "seis ochenta" (880). Hermosillo??? (RW-CA)

- 880 KHNR <u>HI</u>, Honolulu 6/12 1422 noted apparently at full strength relaying sister station KGU-760 with "Focus on the Family" until 1427, ID and slogan "Hawaii's Christian Voice," environmental tips, into "Voice of Prophecy." Recheck 6/14 1600 & 2305 found it very weak relaying unknown station (not KGU) or KHNR-FM). (5P-HI1)
- 920 KSHO <u>OR</u>, Lebanon 5/21 0005 man said K-Show," NOS type oldies. Fading in & out, totally alone in the static on Drake with Radio Shack loop. Seldom heard. (GH-OR)
- 1160 ?KHPP? <u>IA</u>, Waukon 6/14 0040 KSL briefly off, apparently a technical problem. Very weak True Oldies Channel station running non-stop oldies. Several ID's "The True Oldies Channel" and "At this radio station, we just love the oldies." At one point at 0050 heard what sounded like a "K-HOP" ID. There are 3 oldies stations on 1160 listed, PA, KY and IA. Conditions were not that great and IA is closer. Plus of the three, KHPP is the only one listed with "The True Oldies Channel" format, so very likely it was them. Listed as 880w day/26w nights. KSL came back on at 0055. (PM-OR)
- 1230 KOZI <u>WA</u>, Chelan 6/1 0015 heard male give ID in the mix then back down into the slop, on SP-600 with E-W wire. Not heard for a while. (GH-OR)
- 1240 KTIX <u>OR</u>, Pendleton 6/1 0045 ESPN sports talk and ID barely above unID Mexican menace for a moment, on SP-600 with N-S wire. Very seldom heard. (GH-OR)
- 1320 KSCR <u>OR</u>, Eugene 5/17 0115 man said "Eugene-Springfield's sports leader." Fair signal with unID's far under, SP-600 with N-S wire. Last heard 6/04. (GH-OR)

W/out nulling WDOX. "rides in" on WDOX carrier. In every day! [Taylor-NC]
- 670 CUBA Radio Rebelde, La Habana & Villa Clara, JUN 9 1530 - 2 carriers here beneath WPMH Claremont/Portsmouth every day. Nulling WPMH makes them too weak to copy. W/out nulling WPMH, tried comparing 2nd audio to R. Rebelde-11655. Found that the audio correlates w/11655. Not sure that 3rd carrier down is La Habana or a domestic as La Habana - Greenville is a groundwave path almost all the way; but never hear a third audio, just Rebelde, [Tavlor-NC]
  - + JUN 17 1000 Tuned in this morning at 1000 to find WPMH absent. SS on channel which I thought to be Rebelde. Tried checking 11,655 kHz for //, but it was absent, too. - 1039.62 VENEZUELA La Voz de Carabobo, YVLB, Valencia, JUN 8 0046 woman in Spanish; separable from 1040 jumble. [Connelly\*R-MA]
- 1170 **BRAZIL** unID city, JUN 8 0104 man with impassioned Portuguese preaching briefly broke atop the R. Sawa and (presumed) HJNW mix. Mossoro most likely in early evening per Newfie logs; Curitiba and Mandaguacu are also theoretically possible. [Connelly\*R-MA]

\*\* Charles comments on 6/17 670 kHz reception: "This may be a manifestation of what I call the "Bermuda Effect." Noted in Bermuda 1978 - 1981, this consisted of such far in-land US stations as WLW-700 and WJR-760 going into the usual dawn induced fade-out of skywave; HOWEVER, to begin FADING BACK IN and at fair level at high noon, Bermuda time! I conclude this is due to some sort of sea/land refraction that bends low-angle spacewave (not skywave) back toward the ocean to be propagated long distance."

I also received some interesting comments from Ray Moore in FL regarding strange CX on 5/17. Here are is his initial correspondence:

Ray Moore: "On May 27 there were a number of good TP carriers. 1575 was strong, on the verge of audio. I have logged Thailand many times there in DEC/JAN but never a peep after FEB. 1467 also was strong. 1566 was weak, 1557 fair carrier, 738 good carrier. 1503 was strong, on the verge of audio, assumed ZL R Sport heard often in past seasons. The opening was too short to do any DF after scanning the band and I wondered if it was possible these were Asians at this unlikely time of vear.

This reception was on my portable station which I have on my desk. It consists of a 2010 with a special Kiwa 2.5 kHz filter feeding a SUPER SCAF audio filter. Antenna was 23" spiral loop."

After further investigation. Ray submitted the following conclusion on 6/10:

Ray Moore: "Careful listening the last few mornings on my homebrew receiver now convinces me that these were DU carriers. Makes more sense. I was so busy checking additional frequencies for other stations during that brief opening that I didn't have time to do any DF. However, most recently very weak carriers on 1575 and 1476 DF as ZL or southern VK.

Equip: Homebrew receiver with 4 IF stages and cascaded 2.1 kHz mech filters, exalted carrier 2nd Det into a SUPER SCAF switched capacitor audio filter at 200 Hz for carriers, 23" and 35" spiral passive loops. Receiver has an 8 dB, +40 dBm preamp, switchable in/out, and a sharp, tunable preselector, also switchable,"
