Sat+ 7/1-15/07 0300-0700 1550 KXTO Reno NV (Walker)

Date(s): July 1st, 2007 Thurs July 15th, 2007 (Low Power 96 Watts ND). July 14th & 15th (High Power 2500 Watts ND). Time: 00:00AM until 04:00AM Pacific Time. Test material of Morse Code and Sweep Tones will air twice per hour between Midnight and 4AM daily. The station runs a Spanish Christian format as "La Voz Christiana 1550".

Test Material: Morse Code ID's, Sweep tones, and a "QRSS" (Slow Speed Morse Code ID'S). The QRSS signal is encoded at 2.5khz. Dot length is 3 minutes in length. QRSS once per hour during the low power portion of the test, and twice per hour during the high power 2.5kw nights. You can attempt to detect the QRSS signal using only your radio, computer soundcard and some free spectrum analysis software from www.weaksignals.com. Download the software called "Argo".

Modes of Operation: Normal, except when test material is running near TOH and BOH, Night time power of 96 watts ND. July 14th & 15th ONLY- Full power of 2500 watts ND.

Programming: Morse Code ID's, Sweep Tones, Voice ID. QRSS 2.5khz Slow Speed Morse Code Notes: Please do not telephone the station during the test or afterwards. The test is being done by remote control and automation.

Reception reports are desired via e-mail (first choice) and snail mail (only if e-mail is not available) Station would prefer to receive recordings of the test (MP3, CD, or cassette). Submit reports to: les@highnoonfilm.com. Please put "KXTO DX Test" in the subject line.

For those who wish to experiment with receiving QRSS (slow speed Morse Code) transmissions prior to the KXTO Test, Brandon Jordan who runs the very informative www.dxtests.info web site has posted a sample file that will closely match the actual file for the test. It's available at: http://www.dxtests.info/ files/KXTO%2010%20Minute%20File.wav.

Keep in mind, that what you're really looking at is a audio frequency spectrum analyzer, not RF. You're feeding an audio signal from your radio (headphone jack, or other output) into one of the inputs on your computer soundcard (Mic, Line, etc.) and then viewing what that audio looks like.

Using this technique it's possible to detect slow speed Morse Code signals well below the noise. sometimes as much as -20db! Using this technique, world wide reception of the KXTO DX test may be possible.

In advance of the test, I'd concentrate on looking at the carrier signals of various AM stations using USB, LSB, and CW modes, Adjust levels on the receiver output, soundcard input, etc. until you get nice, clean images that are free of distortion. It's easy to overdrive the soundcard with too "hot" of a signal.

The actual transmission will be at 2.5khz and you should be able to literally "read" the dots and dashs of the QRSS transmission spelling out, K-X-T-O.

In Morse that looks like: K= Dash Dot Dash, X= Dash Dot Dot Dash, T= Dash, O= Dash Dash Dash It's a great mode, and potentially a nighttime IBOC-Beater! You can learn lots more at: http://www.w0ch.net/arss/arss.htm.

There has been a bit of discussion about the use of QRSS in the upcoming KXTO 1550khz test in July. Most of this has taken place on the ABDX E-mail list. Noted DX'er Harry Helms pointed out, quite correctly that true QRSS is a CW mode.

It involves the switching on and off of the carrier signal of the station. Thus a 2.5khz tone modulated on the AM carrier of KXTO is not true QRSS and likely will not generate the same remarkable performance that true QRSS does.

My speculation about its potential benefits are in fact, just that. Speculation. KXTO will transmit a 2.5khz tone that will result in two very narrow carrier signals at 1547.5kHz & 1552.5kHz. Using the Argo software and narrow bandwidths, these two signals should be detectable, potentially at much lower levels that aural reception of sweep tones and standard Morse Code.

Using this material is an experiment. Will it significantly improve the ability of DXers to receive the test at great distances---we're not sure. Will it allow detection of the signal -20db under the noise as true CW QRSS does? Almost certainly not.

But I think it's an important experiment and I'd love to see as many DXers as possible attempt to receive the signals. In the future, I'll refer to long duration Morse Code ID's on AM stations as "Quasi-QRSS" to be more precise.

For those attempting reception, Brandon Jordan pointed out the following:

I listened to the QRSS file today, and the code on the file is 5 second dots and 15 second dashes, with 5 second spaces. One repetition of the Code ID takes 3 minutes total.

My thanks to both Harry Helms and Brandon for catching my errors. Here's hoping that everyone gets a chance to hear (and see) the KXTO test!

CHHA Toronto – Technical change

1. The Commission approves the application by San Lorenzo Latin American Community Centre to change the authorized contours of the Type B community radio programming undertaking CHHA Toronto, by increasing the daytime transmitter power from 1,000 watts to 10,000 watts.

2. The increase in power will restore the CHHA radio signal to areas that lost coverage following the relocation of the transmitter approved by the Commission in Broadcasting Decision 2007-301.

Will be interesting to see how this station will do on sunrise/sunset skip with the power increase. (PM-OR)

** Charles comments on 6/17 670 kHz reception: "This may be a manifestation of what I call the "Bermuda Effect." Noted in Bermuda 1978 - 1981, this consisted of such far in-land US stations as WLW-700 and WJR-760 going into the usual dawn induced fade-out of skywave; HOWEVER, to begin FADING BACK IN and at fair level at high noon, Bermuda time! I conclude this is due to some sort of sea/land refraction that bends low-angle spacewave (not skywave) back toward the ocean to be propagated long distance."

I also received some interesting comments from Ray Moore in FL regarding strange CX on 5/17. Here are is his initial correspondence:

Ray Moore: "On May 27 there were a number of good TP carriers. 1575 was strong, on the verge of audio. I have logged Thailand many times there in DEC/JAN but never a peep after FEB. 1467 also was strong. 1566 was weak, 1557 fair carrier, 738 good carrier. 1503 was strong, on the verge of audio, assumed ZL R Sport heard often in past seasons. The opening was too short to do any DF after scanning the band and I wondered if it was possible these were Asians at this unlikely time of year.

This reception was on my portable station which I have on my desk. It consists of a 2010 with a special Kiwa 2.5 kHz filter feeding a SUPER SCAF audio filter. Antenna was 23" spiral loop."

After further investigation, Ray submitted the following conclusion on 6/10:

Ray Moore: "Careful listening the last few mornings on my homebrew receiver now convinces me that these were DU carriers. Makes more sense. I was so busy checking additional frequencies for other stations during that brief opening that I didn't have time to do any DF. However, most recently very weak carriers on 1575 and 1476 DF as ZL or southern VK.

Équip: Homebrew receiver with 4 IF stages and cascaded 2.1 kHz mech filters, exalted carrier 2nd Det into a SUPER SCAF switched capacitor audio filter at 200 Hz for carriers. 23" and 35" spiral passive loops. Receiver has an 8 dB, +40 dBm preamp, switchable in/out, and a sharp, tunable preselector, also switchable."

AM DX Portables - How They Stack Up The Radio Shack DX-398 & 12-150, and Realistic DX-400 By Scott A. McArdle. KCOOW

Well, it was a nice warm, sunny, spring afternoon, in May of 2007, I'd taken the day off, and I thought it would be a good time to run a test or two outside on the patio using some of my AM radios to see which one would pull in KRLD NewsRadio 1080 in Dallas the best. This station, in the daytime, is not easy to pull-in here at my location (north of Oklahoma City, approximately 250 air miles from KRLD's antennas). In the nighttime, it's not a problem pulling in this station. I also thought I would enlist the help of my Radio Shack loop antenna, which I had always thought was a non-working, copy-cat version of the Select-A-Tenna, which I have used on numerous occasions and with which I have obtained fantastic results. This was an antenna sold at Radio Shack sometime in the late 90's to early 2000's. It has a jack on the back of the antenna labeled "antenna out," but I have never quite figured out why in the world it is there or what it is for. Where in the world is that one page instruction sheet I probably once had? I know, it's buried in with all the other manuals, pamphlets and radio papers I've got stacked up somewhere. I originally thought that this jack was used to hard wire the

antenna to the radio being used. But, after trying that and seeing that it had no effect whatsoever on reception, I gave up on it. Maybe you can run the jack out to an external antenna and the capacitor will work along with it as sort of a pre-selector. For this test, I simply placed the loop antenna in close proximity to the radio being tested.

The three radios I tested were: the Realistic DX-400 shortwave/am/fm receiver, which I had purchased new sometime back in the mid 80's; the Radio Shack 12-150 Extreme Range AM radio with the digital readout and the pretty blue light, which I'd purchased new at Radio Shack a couple of weeks ago; and finally, the Radio Shack DX-398 shortwave/am/fm receiver which I had purchased new, sometime in the early 2000's.

Let the testing begin. First, the DX-400 with no loop antenna. Nothing heard on 1080, not even a heterodyne or a weak signal, just the usual static. Well, now it's time to try the loop along with it. As is the case normally when using the Select-A-Tenna with my other radios, I had thought that once I put the loop on the right side of the radio, broadside of the loop perpendicular to the radio, I would see an improvement. Nope, I was wrong, only a slight increase in background level. Then, I took the loop, still from the right side of the radio, and encircled the whole radio, which fits inside the loop, about 1/3 of the way from the right side of the radio. Bingo... there was KRLD, NewsRadio 1080. But, only barely. Not good enough copy to listen to, as I couldn't make out most of the words. I was thoroughly disappointed with this radio as I had guessed it would perform much better, especially since it was sitting on the table, outside on the patio, away from all man-made noise and power lines. Well, now it's on to the next radio.

Now it was time to try the new, Radio Shack "Extreme Range" radio I had recently purchased at one of the local Radio Shacks, model number 12-150. To begin, as with the first radio, I tried pulling in KRLD without the loop. Nothing, just static. I then tried it with the loop on the right-hand side of the radio. Nothing, I then tried it on the other side of the radio, the left side. Still, nothing. What in the world is going on here? I'm beginning to wonder whether this radio has an internal loop inside it. Why wouldn't anything work? I then dead-centered the loop to the back of the radio, perpendicular to it, and lo and behold, I saw an improvement. There was KRLD, weak but audible. Copy this time was better than with the DX-400. How is that possible? This was supposed to be a cheap radio with a pretty blue light that lacked sensitivity due to its employment of the digital readout mechanism. I still do not understand why I was only able to get a signal once the loop was put behind the radio. Will someone please come up with an explanation? Does the radio's internal loop antenna run not lengthwise across the length of the radio? There's got to be a rational explanation, I just can't imagine what it is. Despite this, there's just something about this radio that I like, but I don't know what it is. Yes, I do! It's the fact that once it's put on a frequency, you don't have to keep fine tuning the tuning knob. In fact, you can't fine tune it. Once put on 1080, that's where it stays. That's nice. I'm not used to that when using portables to AM dx with.

The last radio to test was the Radio Shack DX-398. Everything's so tiny on this radio, it's a labor just to make sure my fingers are hitting the right buttons. First, the test without using the loop. I hear something! Sounds like a weak carrier. Alright, now I'll bring in the loop's assistance. I placed the loop on the right side of the radio, perpendicular to it, and there was KRLD NewsRadio 1080, very readable, with some static, but pleasant enough to listen to. A nice enough signal to have probably hooked-up the radio to my patio speakers and had NewsRadio 1080 blasting away on the patio. About this time, I thought, hey, why not go inside and see how well KRLD is coming in on the Kenwood TS-940S general coverage amateur transceiver using my 75 meter full wave loop antenna which usually is a pretty good set-up for AM dx'ing and pretty hard to beat overall, performance-wise. I turned on the ol' reliable 940 and heard KRLD with some static and buzzing, but it was not as easy a copy as with the DX-398 using the Radio Shack loop antenna out on the patio. Hey, I think I'm on to something here!

Stay tuned for the next installment. Wait a minute, will analog AM signals become ancient history someday? Better run those tests you've always been wanting to run, now! Best 73's de KC0OW.
