When: Friday, August 31, 2007 through Sunday, September 2, 2007.

Who: Members of the NRC and WTFDA and their families are invited, as well as anyone interested in domestic radio.

Auction Items: We're working on an address to accept auction items that come in by mail.

Registration: Cutoff date for registering with the club(s) is August 15, 2007; with the hotel, August 20,

Here are details of what is planned for the 2007 National Radio Club Convention. First of all, we are holding a joint convention with the Worldwide TV-FM DX Association, the WTFDA. And they will be hosting this first joint venture in Boise. Idaho over the Labor Day weekend, with Frank Aden as the Master of Ceremonies. Some of you may know Frank as a pre-eminent historian of Idaho broadcasting, both radio and TV.

Now, those of us who have attended NRC Conventions have always paid a large registration fee that included a banquet on Saturday night. This year, at Frank's suggestion, we are not including the price of ANY meal in the registration fee. This keeps the registration cost low and lets each attendee select each meal, and where to eat.

This Rodeway Inn hotel has been used in years past for radio conventions so we know it will have just the amenities we need, and if the weather cooperates, there is a large area around their outdoor pool that should be a great place to tune for stations you've only ever dreamed of hearing from your east-coast or mid-west home.

The program will begin on Friday morning around 11 o'clock with a tour of a Boise television station, and Frank has arranged it so the group can sit in and watch how their noon newscast is put together and broadcast. Friday night. Frank is going to speak on the history of Idaho's earliest radio and TV stations.

Saturday will be filled with a tour of the local radio transmitting sites around Boise for those who want to see where the signals are coming from. For others, the hotel meeting room will be open for musing and swapping stories or demonstrating what you have brought with you to the convention. In the evening after dinner, we will hear about how our two clubs are doing. Frank Aden will present some video about the DuMont Television Network, and that will be followed by the annual auction.

Sunday will include the annual "Candy Quiz" for the early risers, followed by the annual "National Radio Club Examination" for those who wish to compete for a free full-year's membership in the NRC. There should be time for a visit to 7100-foot Deer Point where the Boise FM and TV transmitters are located in the hills just outside of town.

Sounds pretty good, right? Well, here's what to do:

1. Call the Rodeway Inn (Rodeway Inn, 1115 N. Curtis Road, Boise, ID 83706) now at 208-376-2700 for your room reservations. Be sure to tell them you will be attending the National Radio Club convention. Remember that the program events start Friday morning. August 31, and the convention winds up after lunch on Sunday. September 2. You can stay longer, of course, but I know many people like to beat the Labor Day traffic rush on Monday. The room rate, including tax, for one person is \$67.75 -- but the great news is that two can stay in the same room for exactly that same total price! And a third person can be in the room for only an additional \$8; \$20.34 if you want a roll-away bed. So three people could split a room for less than \$30 a night if you want to make those arrangements.

MOST important: You MUST make your room reservation by August 15. We will be checking with the Rodeway Inn that day to make final plans for the weekend.

2. You should also send in the Convention Registration payment by August 15. Be sure to include vour name, mailing address, a phone number and vour e-mail address if you have one. We need all those things so we can notify you of any last-minute change in the plans. The Registration fee is \$15, and if you're bringing a spouse, the spouse will only be charged \$10! Children get in free.

The fee should be made payable to the National Radio Club, PO Box 5192, Sun City Center, FL 33571-5192. You may also register and pay via Paypal from our website http://www.nrcdxas.org; just follow the links. If you use the mail, be sure to allow enough time to get your payment to us by August 15 so we don't cut you off.

3. You can start mailing things for the annual auction at any time. The mailing address for auction items is: Mr. Frank Aden, 4096 Marcia Place, Boise ID 83704.

We're looking forward to seeing everyone at this exciting new location and hope it will mark the beginning a new and fresh thinking for how conventions should be run in the future.

This is a Grifton Daytime Bandscan, and is based on ground wave reception only, with the exception of some highbanders whose skywave is a permanent, year-long manifestation.

This was initiated on 6/18/06, but benefits from knowledge of the band acquired from 9/86 - 10/01. Despite their repetitiousness, I insisted on listing "unknown carriers" because they "tantalize" and present targets that I hope to identify eventually.

Equipment used to compile this bandscan:

1. Drake R8B with internal preamplifier bypassed, 2. Worcester SM-2 Space Magnet II. Because of the gain of the SM-2's amplifier, the S-unit readings (x) are "generous" by about 10 dB.

I hope this will encourage neighboring-state MWers to compile and submit their own detailed bandscans. Comparisons would be very interesting.

Greetings everyone,

TP DX is beginning to turn around a bit with a fair signal from JOUB. Also some further observations from Nick Hall-Patch's Japanese trip. So away we go....

Nick writes "Although during good Asiatic conditions in western North America, we hear low hets from various off channel North Koreans, Chinese, and maybe others, listening in Japan rarely revealed such hets. For the most part, the offending stations are covered up by Japanese domestics that are rarely more than a Hertz or two off channel. Using Spectrum, one could "see" those hets, but it was usually impossible to identify the source. Here's a couple of the rather late loggings from the trip that might be of interest:

720 RUSSIA, Yuzhno-Sakhalinsk, VOR 4/23, Noted with strong signal, man speaking Japanese at various times after 1200 UTC, strong signal, could no longer here North Korea. Big Moskua ID by woman at 1300 UTC and website mention, after repeated chimes (Great Gate at Kiev" from Mussorgsky's Pictures at an Exhibition, my wife tells me), ending with the same piece in big orchestral production the final time. Heard in Hirosake, but also other locations. (NHP)

- 801 **NORTH KOREA**, Hwadae, Pyongyang Bangsong, 5/1 at 1100 UTC, seemed //3320 with talk by man, about 300 hz low and varying all over 10-15 hz worth in a few seconds. This was heard in Erimo Misaki. (NHP)
- 1323 **CHINA**, CRI 5/4 at 1300. This was heard on a farm near Hiyoshi, about an hour north of Kyoto, in retrospect, should have checked at some other locations. CRI chimes, then same theme repeated with horns, CC ID, and into KK talk. According to Bill Harms (thanks, Bill!!!) the KK ID is "Chung-guk Guk-je Bang-song imnida" and the announcer also stated the program schedule at 0600-0800 and 2000-2400 on 1017....1323, 13620, 5965, 7290... the times stated would be local presumably. Did not hear the Russian service of CRI, though both apparently are on the air at the same time, according to recent monitoring by Mauno Ritold using a web controlled receiver in Japan. (NHP)
- JAPAN, Nakamura JORB relay 2055 5/7. Repeated chimes leading up to the 2100 NHK2 sign on (something not likely to hear in North America except on web receivers) JORB ID was dominant over several others just before pips on the hour, then into EE lessons. Heard in Kyoto. (NHP)
- JÁPAN, NHK2 synchros 5/9 1319 got cacophony of individual station IDs at 1319 UTC while listening from Kyoto, not possible to pick out anything from that mess. The ID's are definitely synchronized, though the programming appears to be. Normally, it sounded like just one station. (NHP)

There is a bubble jammer on 1053 (presumed the South Korean) noted various times and locations, mostly under JOAR, similar sounding jammers were noted on 657, 972, and 1080 at various times. A sort of a growl was heard on 648, not a het, possibly also a jammer.

Equipment used was a Dymek DR333 receiver, a 6 meter perimeter ALA 100 loop strung up in various window frames, and a laptop for various receiver control and signal analysis programs. Interesting, electrical noise was fairly low in most places, most usually in a small minshuku (sort of a Japanese bed and breakfest) near central Kyoto. In general, the smaller places in wooden buildings were the quietest in spite of often having electrical wiring whole appearance would cause its in the average inspector.
