VENEZUELA: Administrative actions against 50 radio stations in Venezuela http://english.universal.com/2009/07/27/en_pol_esp_administrative-acto_27A2548883.shtml. Diosdado Cabello, the Venezuelan Minister of Public Works and Housing and director of the National Telecommunications Commission (Conatel), said that so far about 50 radio stations have been advised that administrative proceedings have been filed against them. He added that the owners of the stations will be entitled to the right to defense, depending on their offenses. "How can the people who illegally used a radio frequency or a frequency not licensed by the State defend themselves? They are infringing the law; let us see how they can defend themselves, as they can hardly argue any defense," said Cabello. (Zacharias Liangas, HCDX 28 July)

The following stations were closed down by the government this weekend. It would seem that the CNB Network, clearly oppositional to the government, was closed for political reasons. As for the remainder, several other causes are possible. More closures are expected soon.

BHUTAN: Bhutan Broadcasting Service on 6035 is running on low power using the old transmitter as the new transmitter was giving some problem & is currently off air. Weak signals noted this morning. (Alokesh Gupta, New Delhi, 28 July, HCDX)

HAWAII: China Radio International has replaced country music on KHCM-AM 880 in Honolulu in an agreement between station licensee Salem Media of Hawaii Inc. and R&C Productions Inc. both California based. Station parent Salem Communications Corp owns radio stations known for primarily Christian and conservative programming.

R&C President Billy Chung claims the programming does not promote communism or come from the communist perspective. "CRI has more than 100 reporter centers around the world," staffed by American reporters as well as reporters and hosts from other countries. He noted the international cast of hosts and reporters on the new website at <http://www.am880.net>.

CRI programs are primarily in Chinese – predominantly Mandarin but also some Cantonese as well as English, Korean and Japanese. Chung said, "In the future we will probably have some local programming".

"R&C approached Salem seeking the arrangement," said Jeff Coelho, Salem Media general manager. "It does two things: It generates revenue and fills a little bit of a hole, for Chinese programming in Honolulu," he said last week. Emergency messages have been prepared in Chinese, for instance.

CRI programming is on in more than a dozen US radio markets. "We researched it diligently," Coelho said. "They're just testing all the programming for the next two weeks. What you hear is not the final product." (Honolulu Star Bulletin via RNW)

INDIA: To make its presence felt over the web, All India Radio's Shillong station has launched a website, www.airshillong.org in May 2009. Commenting on the purpose of launching a website, AIR Shillong station director N Shadap says, "The website was launched in the last week of May. This is to enable transparency and enable people to know what our initiatives are. It would keep the listeners updated about programs on a daily basis and increase our listenership base." The website has an

updated commercial rate card for advertisers to keep a tab on the advertising rates online. There is a categorization of program for spot buys and sponsorship of in house programs with rates varying according to the duration. The website also mentions the rate of booking and rates for hiring the AIR studio in the Meghalaya capital. Airshillong.org has information on the concessions available for different advertisers, like a 15 per cent discount to state and central government departments, 15 per cent to public sector undertakings, 50 per cent for spots on blood donation, leprosy, cancer, AIDS etc. The website was outsourced and was designed in coordination with the AIR officials. Still working on adding more content to the website, AIR Shillong plans to integrate interactivity with listeners in the near future. AIR Shillong is one of the few stations to have ventured into an individual website for their station after the Information and Broadcast Ministry resolved in late 2008 to create website for each AIR station. VANUATU: Anyone else hearing Vanuatu on 1179 at higher level. Last week I logged it at the best level yet. Only the second time I've heard it. May be their good friends in China have donated them a 5 Kw rig (Chris Martin, Brisbane, 31 July, MWOZ) VTBC are using two new 10kW transmitters supplied by NZ Aid – 1125/1179. RNZI technical people were at VTBC recently getting the new DRM capable SW transmitter on air as well and have generally been making sure that everything around that's meant to work is running properly. This may be why 1179 is suddenly sounding better. (David Ricquish, mwoz)

EUROPE, AFRICA, AND MIDDLE EAST

FRANCE: Trans World Radio (TWR) is pleased to announce the successful completion of a major antenna upgrade to North Africa as of April 9, 2009. The upgrade greatly improves both coverage and signal strength, increasing the number of potential listeners in the region to 40 million people. Prior to the antenna modification, TWR's signal too many North African people groups, particularly those in the Northern Atlas mountains, was nearly indistinguishable above the interference caused by electromagnetic radiation from growing cities. Today, the reception is loud and clear. The transmission is now beamed towards the Atlas Mountains in a concentrated beam, as opposed to the earlier, wider-angle signal toward an area with not much interest in reception. The transmitter power for 1467 kHz remains at 1,000,000 watts. One North African listener says, "The signal is better than before. I know that this improvement not only helps us hear the gospel message, but also allows many more in all of North Africa to listen to these programs now." Trans World Radio envisions North Africa committed to Jesus Christ, and broadcasts strategic programming to North Africa in Arabic and Berber dialects such as Sous, Tamazight, Tarifit and Kabyle. ITALY: I heard a new Italian station on 1566 kHz on June 22, 2009 at 1628UTC. ID: "Challenger Radio" incl. Morse message: "CHRISTUS". Religious programming in Italian. Weak-to-Fair signal was later covered by a Greek pirate station. I was observing another very weak signal in the background with a speech sounding like German (too poor to be sure). Because of identical fade-ins and fade-outs it seemed to be in connection with the signal of Challenger Radio. (Karel Honzik, CZE, mwc 23 June)

KENYA: The Kenya Broadcasting Corporation (KBC) is to stop using short and medium wave frequencies so as to save on costs, writes Dennis Itumbi for journalism.co.za. Information Permanent Secretary Dr Bitange Ndemo said the frequencies were consuming too much power and were already overtaken by technological advances. The national broadcaster has also committed to reduce its power bills by at least Shs. 25 million (\$330,000) as a way of dealing with its debts. After a meeting with the Parliamentary committee on Energy, Communication and Information, he said a review of spending at the KBC would be conducted so as to make it more competitive. LITHUANIA: Yesterday evening I heard Radio Liberty (Radio Svoboda) on 1386 kHz in Belarusian: July 16, 2009, around 1900UTC. The signal was very strong, probably via Siktunai, Lithuania. (Karel Honzik, CZE, 16 July mwc) Yes Karel, daily on air July 13-18. Also Sunday only bcst, 1386 2000-2030 Bozy Glos program <http://www.zilionis.lt/rtrv/radio-am.php?e>. MALAWI: Per communications just received from James Burnett, Regional Engineer at Trans World Radio, their TWR Malawi partner has committed to getting the Malawi shortwave relay station on the air by the end of the year. (Brandon Jordan, HCDX)

PORTUGAL: R Sim, a channel of the R Renascença group has been experiencing some problems at their Muge site, where the MW operation is served by 3 Harris transmitters, viz. 1 x 100 kW (typically at 60-80 kW only) (currently under repair) and 2 x 10 kW, i.e. the ones that are being used now, but even these are radiating noise on several spurs to either side of the fundamental frequency, 594, and the modulation level is simply lower & worse than one might expect, quite worse than on any of the

SILOVENIA: 594 kHz and FM: Since June 22nd, 2009 the Slovenian stations Radio Odmev and Alpski Val are producing a joint program called Primorski Val aired from 2000-1600 Local Time on the frequencies of both stations. Local programs of Radio Odmev and Alpski Val are now only on-air between 1600-2000 Local Time. So the schedule for 594 kHz is: 1600-2000 LT Radio Odmev / 2000-1600 LT Primorski Val. SPAIN: Now I am hearing Euskadi Irratia on 1386. This should be the EAJ363 transmitter in Bilbao as recently registered at the ITU on this frequency (ex 1071). I am receiving the other two tx in its usual freqs: EAJ562 San Sebastián on 1161 (this one will move to 1476) and EAJ162 Vitoria on 1197. (Mauricio Molano, HCDX, 18 June)

SWITZERLAND: SRG, Switzerland's public broadcaster, will close down also its last remaining medium wave outlet on 765 as of 2011. Abandoning medium wave is part of a program of cost-saving measures approved by SRG's administrative council on 22 June. Under this program there will also be no increases of salaries for SRG staff members in 2010. Real estates not directly needed for programming purposes will be sold, others will not see any further investments, besides necessary repairs. The budgets for promoting HDTV and DAB will be decreased. This program results from an expected increase of SRG's debts from 200millions CHF to 790 millions CHF in 2014. It does not solve SRG's financial problems but still leaves a deficit of 40 millions CHF per year. This could be eased by increasing the incomes, here SRG suggests not only to raise the license fees but also to remove certain limits for advertisements, especially the bans to put them on their online services and to disrupt TV shows for spots. Swissinfo (the remains of Swiss Radio International) will be "optimized", which could possibly mean that it will be eliminated as unit on its own and the website be produced by SRG's existing Bern (German) or Geneva (Rumanian) studios. As other way to solve the financial problems SRG already suggests other possible cost saving measures. This scenario includes closing down DRSIVrus and World Radio Switzerland, cutting costs at the Italian radio stations, limiting the HDTV output and abandoning the EuroNews project. A next step, if this is not enough, would be closing down also one of the Italian radios, Option Musique and DRS Musikwelle, cancelling all HDTV activities and leaving the 3sat (together with Germany's ZDF and Austria's ORF) as well as TV5 (together with France, Belgium's RTBF and Canada's CBC) networks. UNITED KINGDOM: All the UK's national radio stations and many local services will stop broadcasting on analogue by the end of 2015, according to ambitious switch-off targets unveiled by the government today. The Digital Britain report, published today, said announced a "Digital Radio Upgrade" that would see services on national and local digital audio broadcasting (DAB) multiplexes stop broadcasting on analogue. Vacated FM spectrum will be filled by a new tier of ultra-local radio consisting of small local commercial and community stations.
