### **A Requiem**

A few weeks ago, this column featured an article, "Adding a MW Antenna Port to Tecsun DSP Ultralights" by John Bryant. Sadly, it was the last of a great many articles of John's that have been published over the years in the IRCA Technical Column. On February 8, 2010, while preparing his Stillwater, OK home for sale, he was severely injured in a fall from a ladder, and passed away the following day. Once the news appeared, a very large number of appreciations of him appeared over the following days on the various e-lists.

I hope that the membership will indulge me in not just dedicating this column to John, but to actually devoting it to an appreciation of the man, by both myself, and the many others who penned their feelings on the IRCA e-list. John was a long time personal friend to both myself and to my family, but it will be obvious from the following that he touched the lives of a great many in the hobby.

For those who didn't know him well, he was born in Oklahoma City in 1941, and went on to train as an architect. After a few years in practice, he became a university professor in the subject, and eventually became the head of the School of Architecture at Oklahoma State University in Stillwater. with a specialty in Far Eastern architecture. In his youth, he was interested in shortwave listening, which likely encouraged his lifelong interest in other cultures. Although his hobby interests took a back seat to his career, he returned to shortwave listening in the '80s, eventually developing a strong interest in medium wave DXing with the encouragement of various members of IRCA. He was always enthusiastic about finding ways to maximize DX, particularly in the use of specialized antennas and

guality receivers. However, he was never satisfied with just finding out the best way to hear those distant stations, he lived up to his instincts as a teacher to try to share his findings with as many others as possible.

He saw himself as a facilitator as much as a teacher, encouraging others that had more expertise in a subject than he did to share their findings as well, although it often meant hard work on his part to bring an article not his own to fruition. One of the finest examples of this was his editing of the Proceedings of the fine tuning radio club, which wasn't just a collection of articles of interest to DXers, they were articles that went through an academic style peer review process, and written by the most expert authors that John could find. It was his skills as an organizer that lead to the discovery of the Grayland motel, a location that would allow Beverage and other antennas at their coastal location, and to the Grayland invitational DXpeditions, that filled the pages of this and other DX magazines, and eventually websites, with exotic DX.

His planning for retirement led him and Linda, his wife, to purchase property on Orcas Island in Washington State, where they designed and built a house that, coincidentally, happened to be in a location very suitable for the reception of Asiatic DX stations. It is a matter of great sadness that he was not able to live out his retirement years as he had intended, enjoying the company of his wife, as well as the beautiful surroundings of their home, not to mention, the DX.

Many responded on the IRCA e-list to the news of John's passing, and I felt it would be a fitting tribute to the man to reproduce those here. Many other appreciations appeared on other lists.

The unpleasant news of John's sudden passing comes as a deep personal shock to both Guy Atkins and me, since we both knew him very closely, and have enjoyed years of his close friendship and guidance. This has included joint DXpeditions, joint technical projects, article drafting partnership, etc. Although Guy certainly enjoyed a much longer friendship with John, during the past two years John and I had become very close in our cooperative partnership to found, organize, promote and direct the Ultralight Radio segment of the AM-DXing hobby.

John had a natural talent for organization, something that a wildly enthusiastic (but extremely diverse) ULR enthusiast group desperately needed in late 2007. Our small group was definitely outside of the "mainstream" of the AM-DXing community at the time, and many of the established DXers viewed us with a high degree of skepticism - doubting even the concept of serious DXing with pocket radios. To John's credit, although he was certainly one of the "established DXers," he kept an open mind about our enthusiastic movement, and discovered (like most of us) that Ultralight Radio DXing was indeed thrilling... thrilling enough to rejuvenate his interest in the hobby itself.

Freely donating his superb organizational talent to the Ultralight Radio cause. John was instrumental in the creation of the Definitions Committee, Awards Committee and Contest Committee. When the Yahoo Ultralightdx group was founded in early 2008, John's expertise and experience were essential in establishing the vibrant and fast-growing forum that we enjoy today. John and I constantly shared ideas about the challenges facing the Ultralight Radio movement, such as the impending exhaustion of file space on the booming Ultralightdx site. Although we occasionally had our differences of opinion, we enjoyed a very deep level of mutual respect, based upon our cooperative success (along with many others) in building up this vibrant sub-group of the AM-DXing hobby. Ironically John had recently made the decision to become a full-time resident of Washington State, and both Guy and I were looking forward to spending more time with him.

There isn't much more to write at this point, since like Guy I am still in a state of shock over this very unpleasant news. Please join us in expressing your condolences to his family, when the details of the ceremony are posted. (Garv DeBock, Puvallup, WA)
