FROM: Pittsburgh Post Gazzette WAVL-910 Apollo station WAVL-AM (910) has switched format from Christian contemporary music to a syndicated conservative news talk format billed as "Liberty 910." The lineup includes "America's Morning News" (6 to 9 a.m.), a news headline program from the Washington Times. The rest of the daily schedule includes syndicated talk hosts Bill Bennett (9 a.m. to noon), Neal Boortz (noon to 3 p.m.), Dave Ramsey (3 to 6 p.m.), Clark Howard (6 to 9 p.m.), John Batchelor (9 p.m. to 1 a.m.) and "Red Eye Radio" (1 to 5 a.m.) The station will air the NASCAR Nationwide Series and Sprint Cup races on weekends.

FROM: Radio Info dot COM Washington Station owner Andy Skotdal says the county wants to "eliminate AM radio" The towers at KRKO, Everett, WA (1380) were vandalized and destroyed last year by an alleged eco-terrorist and Skotdal wants to re-build. But according to the station website, the Snohomish County Council would make that impossible with Amendments 30 and 30A to the law. Skotdal claims Amendment 30 is "designed to eliminate AM radio in Snohomish County by preventing us from rebuilding our towers at the same size when they wear out." While 30A "prevents us from moving our towers to a location identical to where we've been for decades, in the event new technology or changes in the industry allow us to provide a better signal." The Engineering Board of Radio-Info.com is concerned about this trend, both in Snohomish County, northeast of Seattle, and elsewhere. Federal laws usually trump local ones, but asserting that right can take many months.

FROM : Fredericksburg dot COM JUST WHEN YOU thought summer was over, here comes another blast of hot air. Even after this late-September warm stretch passes, there will be plenty of heated debate and discussion on The Game. Fredericksburg's new all-sports radio station (WYSK-AM 1350). A quick disclaimer: The Game is owned by The Star Radio Group, part of The Free Lance-Star Publishing Cos. Still, there's no question that the station fills a void in this area. Until now, the only local sports broadcasts have been WFLS-FM's NASCAR races and WGRQ-FM 95.9's coverage of Redskins and University of Virginia football. WGRQ dropped its high school football game of the week a few years back, and the local cable station (most recently owned by Adelphia) went out of business in 2009. Plus, many of the sports talk stations in D.C. don't have signals strong enough to be heard clearly here, especially if you're south of town. And if (heaven forbid) you're not a Redskins fan, you probably don't care to tune in to WJFK-FM 106.7, where Albert Haynesworth's fitness and Donovan McNabb's contract qualify as obsessions, to the exclusion of almost any other topic. Need tips for your fantasy league team? Want to vent about the Steelers, Packers, Red Sox, LeBron James or Kyle Busch? Now you have an outlet to listen and give your opinion. The Game carries ESPN talk programs such "Mike and Mike in the Morning" (6-10 a.m.) and Colin Cowherd's "Herd" (10 a.m.-noon), plus Jim Rome's syndicated daily show (noon-3 p.m.) and Saturday college football studio shows. Also featured is Westwood One's coverage of NFL games and Major League Baseball's entire postseason schedule. "The Game" will carry an NFL doubleheader every Sunday, plus the Sunday and Monday night games--with the exception of Redskins broadcasts, which are aired locally on WGRQ. Said station general manager John Moen: "People in this area are passionate about sports, and this area has no sports station. There isn't a sports brand as powerful as ESPN, so we're filling a need with the absolute best product available."

FROM: John Johnson in Billings, MT BILLINGS, MT STATIONS KURL (730 AM) AND KYYA (93.3 FM) EXCHANGE FINALIZED: CONNOISSEUR MEDIA GETS 730 AM, ELENBAAS MEDIA, INC. GETS 93.3 FM Westport, CT - September 28, 2010 - Connoisseur Media, LLC today announced the completion of an exchange of assets between itself, Elenbaas Media, Inc. and Cherry Creek Radio whereby Connoisseur Media now owns 730 AM licensed to Billings, MT, and Elenbaas now owns 93.3 FM, also licensed to Billings, MT. This disposes of the remaining Billings assets of Cherry Creek Radio, and was covered as a part of the recent sale to Connoisseur. "We are delighted to be able to add 730 AM to our expanding Billings cluster," said Connoisseur GM, Cam Maxwell. "This will make Connoisseur Media the largest radio operator in the region with six stations in the Billings market." The station receives new call letters, heritage KYYA will now be used to identify 730 AM. With a signal that covers southern Montana and northern Wyoming . Connoisseur Media is moving its News Talk lineup, currently on KBLG 910 AM, to the bigger coverage area as the new News/Talk 730 KYYA AM. Coming this weekend, 910 AM re-launches as Fox Sports Radio 910 KBLG. In addition to News/Talk 730 KYYA AM and Fox Sports Radio 910 KBLG. Connoisseur Media also operates the following radio stations in the Billings market: KRKX-FM, "Big Sky Country", at 94.1, KRZN-FM, "The Zone", a rock station at 96.3, KWMY-FM, classic hits "MY 105.9", and KPLN-FM, 106.7, a modern hits music station also known as "The Planet". "Elenbaas Media. Inc. will retain the KURL call letters in the deal." Elenbaas said. "We want to continue to use KURL considering our long history with our listeners and to reassure them that the format that they're used to will not change except for the radio frequency." About Elenbaas Media: Elenbaas has managed KURL since 1982, and bought KURL in 1994 from Christian Enterprise, Inc. They will still have an AM presence in Billings with KMZK-AM (added in 1997), a contemporary Christian music station, which will now also be on translator 97.5 FM. About Connoisseur Media: Founded in 2004, Connoisseur Media has rapidly expanded through both acquisitions and new licenses granted by the FCC and owns or operates 24 stations in Billings, MT, Bloomington, IL, Erie, PA, Huntington, WV, Omaha, NE, Wichita, KS, Des Moines, IA, Rapid City, SD, and Bismarck, ND.

John also notes : KURL call letters have been on 730 Billings , MT since they started in the late 1950s. I remember when they started and their top 40 format with music surveys, etc. Push Button One on your Radio Dial. Their religious format has been on the air for years. KMZK will be their AM outlet, Call letters moved to

93.3. (Odd, KURL had FM years ago, sold it, then wanted to return to FM, now they are). The KYYA 93.3 calls move to 730. I've only heard the simulcast KBLG-910 calls on 730, but the change should happen tomorrow with 910 taking on Fox
