From: Radio Info dot com KION 1460 A California talk host is indicted in an alleged fraud scheme Radio-Info previously reported last December that the FBI raided the Monterey, California home of syndicated financial talk show host Barbara Alexander, the owner of mortgage and investment companies and host of the weekly financial radio show "MoneyDots", based at KION-AM (1460). The raid was related to an investigation into a complaint filed by a former employee. The Wall Street Journal reports the Securities and Exchange Commission is now looking into the case, to see if Alexander may have misappropriated as much as \$2.5 million. The Journal says Alexander allegedly "lured investors who thought their money would be used to fund short-term loans secured by real estate. Alexander collected about \$7 million from 50 investors through her firm, APS Funding Inc." Alexander was one of three people charged by Federal prosecutors in the case.

From: Mailtribune dot com KTMT 580 The local sports fan who, for a while, was starved for radio programming, can prepare for gluttony. A second 24-hour sports format hit the airwaves this morning as Radio Medford-Grants Pass turned KTMT (580-AM) back into an ESPN-Radio affiliate. KTMT was the home of ESPN for 10 years before the format was changed in April 2005 to a Spanish-language station. Now the ESPN blimp is flying again — literally — over the radio group's headquarters on Rossanley Drive. "We had to dust it off," laughed Joe Mussio, general manager of Radio Medford-Grants Pass, "but we kept it." Mussio announced the change Thursday. KTMT joins KEZX (730-AM) in the local sports market. Opus Broadcasting's KEZX, an affiliate of Fox Sports Radio Network, came on the air in January 2008, ending a 22-month drought of full-time sports programming in the area. When ESPN was taken off the air five years ago and replaced with the area's second Spanish-language format, then-Radio Medford Vice President and General Manager Ron Hren cited the growing diversification of southern Oregon and the company's desire to reflect the marketplace. The same reasoning is given now as the radio group builds on its expanding sports persona. Mussio has worked at Radio Medford-Grants Pass for seven years and has been the general manager for nearly four. The decision to go back to ESPN, he said, was made in the summer after the company acquired the rights to broadcast Oregon State athletics and found a home for Crater in its lineup of high school coverage. Radio Medford-Grants Pass has six signals and carries the games of two major colleges (Oregon State and Oregon) and four high schools (North and South Medford, Ashland and Crater). "It's just where the direction of the company has gone in supporting local sports," said Mussio. "It only made

"It's just where the direction of the company has gone in supporting local sports," said Mussio. "It only made sense to have sports products in the building and to change the format back to sports. And the ESPN product was a no-brainer." The backlash when the company pulled the plug on ESPN five years ago was "by far more than we thought it would be," he said. Hundreds of e-mails, letters and phone calls from listeners indicated displeasure. In the years since, Mussio said, he heard repeatedly from people who wanted ESPN back on the air. Similarly, there figures to be angst over the loss of the Spanish-language network.

"They're losing a quality station and there will be a void," said Mussio. "From the standpoint of being able to cater to every demographic in the community, it's tough. We want to be in the best operational position to mirror the community. We'd love to cater to every personal need and taste, but we can't do that with only six radio signals." Mussio believes the area can support two sports radio stations, noting that it did so for the Spanish-language audience. But, he added, ESPN is the "premier sports delivery vehicle," and Radio Medford-Grants Pass has carried major sports even after it dropped ESPN, like the most recent NBA Finals and Super Bowl. "We've always been very supportive of sports in the community," said Mussio. A message was left at Opus Broadcasting after business hours Thursday. ESPN will have a weekday lineup of live talk

shows, beginning with "Mike and Mike in the Morning," followed by "The Herd" with Colin Cowherd, "The Scott Van Pelt Show," "The Doug Gottlieb Show," "The Brian Kenny Show" and "AllNight" with Jason Smith.GameNight and SportsCenter are on in the evenings.

From: Mlive dot com WGVU 1480 GRAND RAPIDS -- WGVU's Real Oldies (1480-AM), the country's first National Public Radio-affiliated radio stations to play rock music, is celebrating its first birthday. WGVU's Real Oldies, which also is on 850-AM in Muskegon, marks its one-year anniversary on the air. The station is commercial-free and a service of Grand Valley State University. It's made up of experienced radio veterans Bill Bailey, Len O'Kelley, and Bob Mason as on -air personalities. "We are so very excited to make it a year and have covered all expenses. That's rare," said O'Kelley, who also serves as the program manager in addition to his 2-6 p.m. on-air shift. The station's oldies format appeals to baby boomers or anyone who enjoys listening to doowop, soul, Motown, early rock and roll, the surfer sound, or British invasion. The playlist includes over 5,500 records. "There is such a time and place connection with our songs," O'Kelley said. "Listeners always seem to remember where they were and what they were doing when listening to an oldie."
