KAPL PHOENIX, OR A monetary forfeiture in the amount of \$5,600 to Applegate Media, Inc., licensee of KAPL(AM), Phoenix, Oregon, for willfully violating Section 73.3539 of the Commission's Rules by failing to timely file a renewal application for the Station, and for willfully and repeatedly violating Section 301 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, by engaging in unauthorized operation of the Station after its authorization had expired. On December 20, 2007, the Bureau issued a Notice of Apparent Liability for Forfeiture in the amount of \$7,000 to Licensee for these violations. As noted in the NAL, Licensee's renewal application for the Station's license term was due on October 1, 2005, four months prior to the February 1, 2006, license expiration date. Licensee did not file the application until March 2, 2006, and provided no explanation for the untimely filing of the renewal application. Licensee submitted a response to the NAL on January 10, 2008. In its Response, Licensee asserts that the proposed forfeiture should be reduced because Licensee has a history of overall compliance with the Rules. On February 28, 2006, the Licensee filed a request for special temporary authority ("STA") to continue Station operations, pending consideration of the late-filed renewal application. The staff granted the STA Request on March 8, 2006. In the STA Request, the Licensee indicated that it inadvertently failed to file a timely license renewal application for KAPL(AM) due to a change in station managers and administrative assistant. The forfeiture amount proposed in this case was assessed in accordance with Section 503(b) of the Act, Section 1.80 of the Rules, and the Commission's Forfeiture Policy Statement. In assessing forfeitures, Section 503(b)(2)(E) of the Act requires that we take into account the nature, circumstances, extent and gravity of the violation and, with respect to the violator. the degree of culpability, any history of prior offenses, ability to pay, and such other matters as justice may require. Licensee notes that it has a history of overall compliance with the Rules. Commission records confirm this, and thus we will reduce the forfeiture on this basis from \$7,000 to \$5,600. We have considered Licensee's Response and the record of this case in light of the above statutory factors, our Rules, and the Forfeiture Policy Statement. We conclude that Licensee willfully violated Section 73.3539 of the Rules and willfully and repeatedly violated Section 301 of the Act. However, given Licensee's history of overall compliance with the Rules, we reduce the forfeiture amount to \$5,600.

FROM: THE OTTAWA CITIZEN Radio station Oldies 1310 is ditching its music programming in favor of an all-news format to take on cross town rival CFRA. The announcement was made Tuesday by station officials and the format switch is effective Oct. 18. The station will be called 1310News. Oldies 1310 featured familiar tunes from the '50s, '60s and '70s, but, in a competitive Ottawa radio market, the AM station languished in the ratings, often barely registering more than a two-per-cent share of the overall radio audience. The station sacked longtime morning host Bob Derro, 52, last week in a move that was a precursor to the format changeover. "We're going this route because we see an opportunity in spoken word and with this particular format, so we're very bullish that it's a good way for us to go," said Scott Parsons, executive vice-president of Rogers Radio Ottawa. He said there's been a gradual decline in music programming on AM stations as more revert to talk and news formats. He said 1310News will join seven other Canadian stations across the Rogers network with an all-news format. He said the station will offer news, traffic, sports, business and entertainment reports, as well as weather updates. The station will also be launched with a full web service and be available via computer through live streaming. He said the station plans to hire at least 30 new employees, including on-air and behind-the-scenes staff. Parsons said he doesn't see the new station as a replacement for an established station such as CFRA

# The NRC AM Antenna Pattern Book

The Sixth-Edition Pattern Book now includes daytime and "Graveyard" frequency patterns for the first time. For those stations which operate with 50 kW (and higher in Mexico) non-directional (designated U1 in the AM Log), the day 'pattern' is shown to approximately the predicted 0.5 m V 1M coverage limits, while the night pattern is illustrated approximately 1.5 times larger. Stations in Alaska and Hawaii are listed on separate pages at the end of the book. The basic list of U.S. and Canadian stations comes from the 26th Edition of the National Radio Club's AM Radio Log. Mexican stations in the states bordering the United States plus those stations elsewhere which are easily heard in the U.S. and Canada are also included. All data is up-to-date as of November 1, 2005.
