It's hard to believe that it's been 29 years since I got my DXing into high gear. Starting out on shortwave in October 1981, I graduated to the AM broadcast band just two months later. I got into FM DX by the spring of 1982 and TV DX during the following summer. I DXed from 1981 to 1988 from the old Lamplight Lane QTH, which is two blocks southwest of my current QTH, and logged some 400 AM stations. From 1988 to 1991, I DXed from Woodstock, GA in southern Cherokee County, logging some 150 AM stations. I logged just 50 AM stations from my third QTH in Marietta, GA, across the county line in Cobb County. The Georgia QTHs were ideal for FM and TV DXing, and afforded me a taste of what kind of DX I would experience when I arrived at my current QTH in June 1992. The highlight of my Georgia stay was hearing several St. Louis FM stations on November 15, 1988. That night, I logged St. Louis area stations on 90.7, 92.3, 93.7, 99.1, 102.5, 105.7 and 107.7. I pulled in the 92.3 despite a semi-local from Chattanooga. The station in Canton, GA was on 105.5 then, and didn't move to 105.7 until May 1989. During my stay in Georgia, I logged St. Louis area AM stations on 550, 590, 630, 690, 770, 850, 1120, 1260, 1380 and 1430. By contrast, at my present location, I've logged Atlanta area AM stations on 640, 680, 750, 790, 920, 970, 1010, 1040, 1080, 1190, 1260, 1380, 1480, 1550 and 1570, FM stations on 92.9, 94.1, 96.1 and 101.5, and analog TV stations on channels 17, 36, 57 and 69. As of this writing, I have logged 1,137 AM stations, 1,080 FM stations, and 543 analog TV stations since I started those logs in July 1992. I started my NOAA Weather Radio log in January 2001, and logged 88 stations from 15 states. I started my digital TV log in September 2005, and logged 122 stations from 14 states. Next year will mark 30 years in this hobby; I will be celebrating 20 years as a licensed Amateur Radio operator in 2012. While I've been busy with putting together DX Monitor, I've also found time to hit the dials. I missed the October 16 DX test from WGBW 1590 Two Rivers, WI, but I did log them on October 29 at 2047 ELT with Oldies, "The True Oldies Channel" slogan, Scott Shannon with a tidbit on airport security, into local ads and a weather forecast read by Mark Heller. WGBW dominated over WVNA and KYNG. I often wonder how many of us have kept a note of which graveyard stations are received on each channel more than others, especially at night. Take, as an example, my location. On 1230 during the daytime, WHCO Sparta, IL dominates, although I can put a tight null on the station to pull in either KWIX Moberly, MO or WJBC Bloomington, IL. At night, the most frequently heard station in recent months has been KZYM Joplin, MO. On 1240, WTAX Springfield, IL usually dominates, although I can hear KFMO Park Hills, MO in the background. The digital interference to 1240 from WSDZ 1260 Belleville, IL is moderate with a slight leaning toward severe status. At night, I most often hear WENK Union City, TN and KBIZ Ottumwa, IA. On 1340, KXEO Mexico, MO is the dominant during the daytime, even in AM Stereo. I can occasionally put enough of a null on them to hear WSOY Decatur, IL. At night, I most often can hear WLOK Memphis, TN in addition to KXEO and WSOY. On 1400, KJFF Festus, MO dominates, but I can put a tight null on them to hear KFRU Columbia, MO. At night, I most frequently hear WGIL Galesburg, IL. On 1450, WFMB Springfield, IL is often on top: occasionally (when they're on), KYLS Fredericktown, MO comes through, even with splatter from KHOJ 1460, whose transmitter site is some 10 miles west of my location. At night, I most frequently get KIRX Kirksville, MO. Semi-local WQQX is parked on 1490, and has a good signal during the daytime. However, I can put a tight null on them to hear KTTR Rolla, MO. At night, I most frequently hear KDMO Carthage, MO. On the local front, WSDD 100.3 is now licensed to Bridgeton, MO; I thought that CP would never get on the air. The station is now a Class C3, downgraded from a Class B at Alton, IL. The station broadcasts a Modern Adult Contemporary format. The low-definition digital count is now down to three in St. Louis; KATZ 1600 has dropped it for interference reasons. No one will be happy until KFUO 850, KMOX 1120 and WSDZ 1260 drop digital permanently, 73.
