DX TESTS

Paul Walker reports three DX tests scheduled for February:

Saturday February 12 - At precisely 0100 and 0200 CST (0700 and 0800 UTC):

KHMO 1070 Hannibal, MO

Will test with morse code, sweep tones and voice announcements for 5 minutes at the top of the first hour with its 5KW/3 tower day pattern and 5 minutes at the top of the second hour at its 1KW/6 tower night power.

Saturday February 12 - From 0300 to 0400 CST (0900-1000 UTC):

WLIQ 1530 Quincy, IL

Will test for 20 minutes using morse code, sweep tones, voice announcement, special music, sound bites, etc, at its 1400W Non-Directional Day Power, then for 20 minutes at is 290W Non Directional Critical Hours Power, and then for the final 20 minutes it will test at its once-proposed 3 Watts Non

Directional Night Power.

Saturday February 19 -- From 1am to 2am CST (0700-0800 UTC)

WLRB 1510 Macomb, IL

Will test for the first 30 minutes using morse code, sweep tones, voice announcement, special music, sound bites, etc, at its 1KW Non Directional Day power and for the final 30 minutes with much the same content at its 250W Non Directional Critical Hours Power.

So please be patient, as Mr. Glaenzer is the Chief Engineer for 16 radio stations in Missouri and Illinois.

FROM: KRTV dot COM Montana's oldest radio station, KEIN, is off the air, and it may not be back on anytime soon. The station, located at 1310 AM, went off the air late last week. According to property owner Creed Evans, someone broke into the transmitter facility on Vaughn Road on January 16, switched off some breakers, and killed the signal. The Cascade County Sheriff's Office investigated the break in, but were not able to develop any chargeable suspects in the case. Munson Radio president Steve Dow owns the FCC license for KEIN; he told us he tried to get the signal back on, but he's locked out of the transmitter building. According to court documents, the reason Dow is locked out is because of an October court judgement that gave him 30 days to vacate the premises. The ruling was made in favor of Evans, who filed suit against Dow for failing to maintain insurance and make repairs on the facilities. While Evans owns the facilities, he lacks the technical expertise and the authority to turn the signal back on. Both Evans and Dow told KRTV they want to get KEIN back on the air, but the parties have yet to speak to each other regarding the matter. The station featured a "Music Of Your Life" format, playing big band, swing, American standards, and vocalists such as Frank Sinatra. Rosemary Clooney, and Harry Connick, Jr.

FROM: RADIO INFO dot COM Rogers Broadcasting re-brands their sports outlets in Toronto & Calgary In a move to enhance the "Sportsnet" brand it uses on regional TV channels, Rogers Broadcasting has rebranded their top-rated sports outlets in Toronto and Calgary as "Sportsnet Radio." Toronto's CJCL-AM (590) and Calgary's CFAC-AM (960) have each dropped their two-word "The Fan" moniker and will be known as "Sportsnet Radio The Fan 590" and "Sportsnet Radio The Fan 960." Rogers Broadcasting President Scott Moore says "We're excited to bring the strength of these two brands together. Both the FAN and Sportsnet resonate with passionate local fans. Our fans want to talk about and interact with their local teams. We offer the best place to do that." The move will link the radio stations with Rogers Broadcasting's "Sportsnet" specialty network, consisting of four regional sports TV channels and their national "Sportsnet One." No onair changes are expected with the re-branding.

FROM: DAYTONA BEACH NEWS JOURNAL A local radio station on the air since 1947 was silenced for more than 20 hours after vandals broke into a transmitting tower and smashed expensive equipment, owners of WROD 1340 AM said. Daytona Beach police and the FBI are investigating. The vandalism was discovered at 5:30 p.m. Sunday, said Joe Hopkins, an owner and general manager of the station. Hopkins said vandals cut a lock at the gated tower at Beach and Wilder streets. They broke into a locked box. The intruders dropped a rock on a device called an antennae tuning unit. "I'm hoping it was just a random act of vandalism," Hopkins said. Police did not provide any information on the crime Monday. Hopkins said he was able to fix the damage and put the station back on the air at 2 p.m. Monday. The station plays rock music from the 1950s, '60s and '70s. It was Daytona Beach's No. 1 radio station through the 1950s and 1960s, and continues to be on the air 24 hours a day. WROD, which is the Official Radio Station of the Daytona Cubs, was bought by Hopkins of Daytona Beach and fellow investors in 2008.
