FROM : Radio Info dot Com \$2 million sale in Columbus, Ohio, where St. Gabriel moves from 1580 to 820. The local Catholic St. Gabriel Radio first appeared in the Columbus market in 2005, leasing time on WVKO at 1580. Today it announces that it is acquiring WOSU-AM (820) from Ohio State University, so it will own its flagship station. WOSU-AM has 5,000 watts daytime and 790 watts at night. WVKO, at a much higher dial position, has 3,200 watts daytime/290 watts nighttime. St. Gabriel says **on its website** that they will now be "reaching over 40 counties and four million people in the state of Ohio." Ohio State recently bought a second FM in Columbus (the original WWCD) and no longer needs WOSU-AM. St. Gabriel, led by Marc Hawk, is paying \$2 million cash at closing. Brokers: Public Radio Capital for seller Ohio State, and Greg Guy of Patrick Communications for buyer St. Gabriel Radio.

FROM: Radio Info dot Com CBS can put L.A.'s KFVB (980) in a trust, and forbid a format change. Mt. Wilson FM Broadcasters owner Saul Levine has challenged several moves by the big owners in the Los Angeles market, and he has long maintained that CBS shouldn't be allowed to own two TV stations, six radio stations, and also have KFVB-AM kept in a divestiture trust. The situation dates back to May 2002, when CBS's predecessor Viacom wanted to buy KCAL-TV. The decision was made to spin KFVB, and the FCC gave the company a six-month temporary waiver. But many years went by, and in February 2010, CBS revised the terms of the proposed trust to conform to recent FCC precedents, and it added language that prohibited the trustee from changing the format. That element is what KKKO owner Saul Levine was challenging, arguing that it amounted to CBS holding a "cognizable interest" in KFVB. Friday (9/9), the FCC denied Levine's petition for reconsideration.

FROM: INSIDE RADIO Economy silences North Carolina AM. There's not much media out in the Smoky Mountains of far western North Carolina, where WRGC, Sylva, NC (680) is the only commercial station licensed to Jackson County, 40 miles west of Asheville. Art Sutton's Georgia-Carolina Radiocasting Company took WRGC silent at the end of August, notifying the FCC that it had temporarily suspended operations due to "financial concerns." In a letter posted on the station's website, WRGC blamed "this incredibly difficult economy" for making it "impossible...to secure the local advertising support needed to continue providing Jackson County a full service community radio station." WRGC's studio/transmitter site lease is up at the end of 2011, and the station says it hasn't decided how or if it will return to the air after that. WRGC is licensed for 1-kw days, non-directional, and 250 watts at night, directional; it has a construction permit, expiring in December, for a move down the dial to 540 with 5-kw days, 210 watts at night, non-directional.

FROM: INSIDE RADIO FCC blesses power-saving AM transmission method. Back in the days when utility power cost a fraction of a cent per kilowatt-hour, AM broadcasters didn't worry too much about the efficiency of their transmitters. But with rates in remote areas like Alaska and Hawaii now pushing 50 cents per kilowatt-hour, the FCC has now signed off on "Modulation Dependent Carrier Level" technology that promises to make AM transmitters anywhere from 20-40% more efficient. The technology (which also goes by proprietary names such as "Dynamic Carrier Control" and "Amplitude Modulation Companding") isn't new – it's been used on AM in Europe and elsewhere for years, and shortwave broadcasters and amateur radio operators have used versions of it for decades. It's also been authorized for experimental use in Alaska, where high power bills are a particular burden in rural areas. Not all engineers are excited about the technology; on older radios. Even the FCC itself acknowledges that the reduction of an AM signal's carrier level when there's no audio being modulated may degrade stations' signal-to-noise ratios and reduce audio quality. They also say it may complicate HD Radio transmission. But the manufacturers supporting the

technology – including Harris and Nautel, which say they're ready to put MDCL-compliant transmitters on the market right away – say their studies show any degradation would be minimal. Broadcasters seeking to use MDCL technology can now ask the FCC for a waiver of Rule 73.1560(a), which normally prohibits a station from operating at less than 90% of its licensed power. The Commission notes that it expects stations using MDCL to turn the technology off, as needed, to allow other stations to take accurate field-strength measurements.

FROM INSIDE RADIO Alberta AM moves to FM. The roster of small-town AM signals in Canada continued to dwindle last week as Newcap shifted CFOK, Westlock, AB (1370) over to the FM dial. On the air since 1975, CFOK was a 10-kw signal carrying classic hits; its replacement on FM is CKWB (97.9), running 27-kw DA/307'. The new FM signal has flipped to country as "97.9 the Range." Once CFOK's simulcast period ends and the AM signal goes silent, it will leave just 20 AM stations on the air in Alberta, with at least one more already in the process of shifting to FM.
