F.C.C. FINES

WFGN(AM) Gaffney, South Carolina Hope Broadcasting, Inc FCC finds that the Licensee apparently willfully and repeatedly violated Section 73.3539 of the Rules, by failing to file timely license renewal applications for the Station, and apparently willfully and repeatedly violated Section 301 of the Act, by engaging in unauthorized operation of the Station after its authorization had expired. Based upon the review of the facts and circumstances before them, the FCC concluded that the Licensee is apparently liable for a monetary forfeiture in the amount of ten thousand dollars. They did grant the Station's May 25, 2011, license renewal application.

From: RADIO INFO DOT COM Country Music DJ Hall of Fame member Charlie Douglas reportedly passed away on Thanksgiving day. His career included stints at WWL New Orleans and WSM-AM Nashville, among other stations. He was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1994. According to his bio on the Country Radio Seminar Web site, Douglas created the original all night radio show for truckers. He also recorded a few trucking songs of his own. He began his radio career in 1953 at KLIC Monroe La. He first became a program director in 1956 at KOCY Oklahoma City. Douglas moved frequently and worked in Asheville, N.C.; Buffalo N.Y.; San Antonio; Dallas; and Houston, among other markets. In 1970, he joined WWL and created the Road Gang, the first all night country music show that was directed specifically at truck drivers. After 13 years, he joined WSM as host of The Music Country Network. He served a president of the Country Radio Broadcasters for two terms. Douglas retired from radio in 1995 to devote his full attention to Compact Disc Express (CDX), a music promotion firm he had been operated with partner Paul Lovelace since 1991

FROM: RADIO INFO DOT COM A rare format flip to commercial-classical, in Wilmington, NC Davis Media already does "Bach FM" in its home market of Williamsburg, VA, and it begins its LMA-to-buy with Sea-Comm in Wilmington by flipping Spanish "Radio Maxima" WSFM, Carolina Beach (1180). The coastal North Carolina "Bach FM" is the combination of daytime AM WSFM and its 250-watt FM translator at 95.9. The other stations being purchased by Davis Media are classic rock "103.7 The Bone" WBNE, Wrightsville Beach. Adult alternative "Penguin" WUIN, Oak Island at 98.3. And the "Big Talker" simulcast of WNTB, Topsail Beach (93.7) and WLTT, Bolivia (106.3).

FROM: RADIO INFO DOT COM Sacramento news/talker KFBK (1530) gets an FM simulcast at 92.5 Clear Channel will flip the simulcast switch tomorrow (December 1), creating "FM News/Talk 92.5 and AM 1530 KFBK." The station is about to turn 90 years old on February 2, and in the 1980s it was the incubator for the Rush Limbaugh talk show. Its current lineup includes Limbaugh, Tom Sullivan, Kitty O'Neal, Amy Lewis, Ed Crane, John McGinness and Kelly Brothers. The station losing out is modern AC "My 92.5" KGBY. Clear Channel market manager Jeff Holden says adding an FM signal "will give a younger audience access to one of the most influential stations in not only Sacramento, but all of Northern California." The KFBK website is here. Here are the most recent three Arbitron PPM monthlies: KFBK-AM has moved 6.5-5.7-5.5 between August and October, and ranks fifth with age 6+ AQH listening, just behind Entercom's Rock KRXQ (6.5-6.7-5.6). While modern AC "My 92.5" KGBY has remained steady, 3.1-3.0-3.0, with a cume of about 370.000.

FROM: SFGATE DOT COM A big shakeup is coming to KGO radio: Many of its most recognizable voices are being let go as the station, which can be heard up and down the West Coast, switches to "all-news" format from 2 p.m. to midnight starting Monday. "What we are doing is adding a tremendous amount of news content to KGO," Paul Hosley, the station's news and program director, told us late Thursday shortly after the staff was notified of the changes. Among those who will leave the station are talk-show veterans Gene Burns, Gil Gross, Ray Taliaferro and John Rothmann. Ronn Owens, who reportedly has one of the highest-paying

contracts in radio, will continue his popular show from 9 a.m. to noon. Brian Copeland will also keep his weekend show. The switches come amid major turbulence in the Bay Area media market. KGO's one-time dominance in the a.m. Arbitron ratings has taken a big dive in recent years as increasing numbers of listeners have switched to satellite and Internet radio. Just two months ago, Citadel Broadcasting sold both KGO (810 AM) and its sister station, KSFO (560 AM), to rival Cumulus Media, which already owned four other stations in the market, including all-sports KNBR (680 AM).

FROM: ALLACCESS DOT COM CLEAR CHANNEL is shuffling the lineups at its Talk stations in SAN FRANCISCO, and the net effect is the move of the liberal "Progressive Talk" format presently on Talk KKGN-A (GREEN 960) to the HD-2 channel of Oldies KKSF (OLDIES 103.7), with call letter changes and programming swaps on the two AMs. After the JANUARY 3rd changes, Talk KNEW-A (FOX NEWSRADIO 910 AM) will retain its format but pick up the new calls KKSF-A and the slogan "SAN FRANCISCO'S TALK 910 KKSF." ARMSTRONG AND GETTY will continue to be simulcast in morning drive with sister Talk KSTE-A/SACRAMENTO, followed by DIAL GLOBAL'S CLARK HOWARD 10a-noon, FOX NEWS RADIO'S TOM SULLIVAN noon-3p, and what is being billed as "The BAY AREA's Only Live and Local Afternoon Drive Talk Show" in the 3-6p slot, with a talent search currently underway for the slot. What is now KKGN-A (GREEN 960) will pick up the FOX NEWS RADIO affiliation and KNEW-A calls, and will pick up PREMIERE's GLENN BECK for mornings (presently noon-3p on 910 AM), syndicated DAVE RAMSEY 9a-noon (also from 910 AM), PREMIERE's RANDI RHODES remaining from the GREEN lineup for noon-3p, and FOX's JOHN GIBSON moving over from afternoons on 910 to the same slot on 960. The current KKGN lineup, including DIAL GLOBAL'S STEPHANIE MILLER and THOM HARTMANN, PREMIERE'S RHODES (simulcast with 960), and syndicated NORMAN GOLDMAN, will be heard (as "FM PROGRESSIVE TALK") on KKSF-FM-HD-2 and online. Dir./Operations DON PARKER said, "SAN FRANCISCO has a long heritage of great Talk programming and talent. We saw the opportunity to expand our footprint in this crucial arena as we head into an election year and a population increasingly engaged in local, state, and national events and activism. 'SAN FRANCISCO'S TALK 910 KKSF' will provide a forum for lively debate from a variety of perspectives. anchored by our successful morning team of ARMSTRONG & GETTY and more live, local focus in afternoon drive."

FROM RADIO JOURNAL New AM in suburban Toronto.

Conventional wisdom may say the AM band is dying in Canada, but someone forgot to tell Elliott Kerr. The sports agent has won CRTC permission to put a new AM signal on the air in Mississauga, the city of more than 700,000 that borders Toronto to the west, and he's got some big plans for the little signal. Kerr's new AM station will run 2-kw days, 280 watts at night, non-directional from a tower site near the junction of Highways 401 and 403 at Mississauga's north end. He's promising an all-live, all-local schedule of news and talk covering local Mississauga events and politics, all on a signal designed to be weak enough not to compete against the big signals serving the millions of potential listeners in nearby Toronto.

FROM RADIO JOURNAL In Tucson, Clear Channel takes on existing FM competition.

It's been four years since Journal Broadcast Group entered the FM talk arena in Tucson with the launch of KQTH (104.1). Despite a relatively weak signal (3-kw/328' class A from a tower along I-10 north of downtown), "The Truth" has challenged Clear Channel's established KNST (790) in the ratings – and now KNST is fighting back on KQTH's FM turf. As of Monday, it's simulcasting on KTZR, Green Valley, AZ (97.1), which had been running a Spanish hits format. Like Journal's 104.1, Clear Channel's 97.1 is far from a full-market signal: it's a rimshot class A running 1750 watts/614' from the mountains southwest of town, missing the more talk-friendly suburbs north of Tucson. Those areas can still hear KNST on its full-market AM signal, which runs 5-kw by day, 500 watts at night, directional. (Meanwhile, Clear Channel moves KTZR's former Spanish programming down the dial to 1-kw KWFM on 1450, replacing an all-comedy format.)

FROM RADIO JOURNAL Buckley talks in Bakersfield. There's nothing wrong with the 25-kw day/10-kw night signal at Buckley Radio's KNZR, Bakersfield, CA (1560), but there is talk competition in the market from American General Media's KERN, Wasco-Greenacres, CA (1180). Now Buckley's trying to get an edge in the talk race by adding an FM simulcast: KNZR is now being heard on KSMJ, Shafter, CA (97.7). That's a 4.1-kw/397' directional class A signal transmitting from a site in the oil fields northeast of town, and while it doesn't replicate the AM station's big signal, it's more than adequate in most of the low-rise Bakersfield market.

FROM RADIO JOURNAL Townsquare adds FM yak in Yakima. Amidst the rolling hills of central Washington, Townsquare Media's KIT, Yakima (1280) covers its market just fine with 5-kw days/1-kw nights, non-directional. But even in Yakima, the listening trend is moving to FM, and Townsquare is following suit: on November 17, it began simulcasting KIT on KQMY, Naches, WA (99.3), flipping it from adult hits "My 99.3." That, too, is a class A signal, running 790 watts/899' from the hills west of Yakima, and it provides full-market coverage of the fairly compact Yakima market.

FROM: INSIDE RADIO DOT COM Cumulus gives KGO all-news makeover. Just days after Clear Channel announced it was shuffling its San Francisco talk stations, Cumulus Media's "NewsTalk Radio 810" KGO is shifting to what will essentially be an all-news format for much of the day. Only late-morning talk host Ronn Owens will remain, with all-news carrying the rest of the day, from 5am until midnight. The change begins Monday. For decades KGO has been a news-intensive station and program director Paul Hosley tells the San Francisco Chronicle they're going to add a "tremendous amount of news content" to the station. Since the introduction of PPM to the San Francisco market, KGO has seen its perennial first-place finish

become a thing of the past. In the November Arbitron ratings it fell to No. 7 (6+) with a cume of just 621,000. Rival all-news KCBS, which CBS Radio recently began simulcasting on the FM dial, was No. 2 with a 6.3 share and a cume of 1.2 million. KGO staff learned of the changes Tuesday, the same day Clear Channel said it would launch "San Francisco's Talk 910" KKSF on January 3. Its morning drive timeslot is still vacant and that could create an opening for Gene Burns, Gil Gross, Ray Taliaferro or John Rothmann all of whom were reportedly dismissed as part of the KGO relaunch.

2011 has gone by so fast, and while I've achieved several milestones in my DX career. I've also had to deal with a tragedy in my own family. On April 4, 2011, just before I was getting a DX Monitor ready for Fresh, my oldest brother lost his two-year battle with cancer at just 50 years of age. It was very tough on my family, especially on my mother, who already has enough to deal with having been battling a form of Lou Gehrid's Disease for nearly a decade and a half. That's enough of the bad stuff. I achieved several DX milestones in the past year. The first milestone was a state milestone on AM, achieved at 1700 ELT on January 3. That was when I logged WKZI 800 Casey for my 100th Illinois AM station at the location mentioned above. On February 17, I achieved another milestone when I logged KYSM 1230 Mankato, MN at 0158 ELT for my 1,200th AM station. On June 10, I achieved an FM milestone when I logged CKLY 91.9 Lindsay, ON at 2040 ELT via E-skip propagation for my 1,100th FM station. On July 24 at 1730 ELT, I logged my sixth country on analog TV when I logged Televicentro on VHF Channel 2 from Managua, Nicaragua via double-hop E-skip propagation. On August 2 at 0159 ELT. I logged my 100th NOAA Weather Radio station when I heard WXK81 on 162.400 MHz from Onondaga, MI. On October 21, I marked another milestone when I celebrated 30 years in the DX hobby. The most recent milestone I achieved was AM station #1,250, which came on November 11 at 1730 ELT with the log of WOSU 820 Columbus, OH. I logged this one at night when I lived in Woodstock, GA. On the AM side, I count call letter changes, while such changes are not counted on FM, analog/digital TV and NOAA Weather Radio, in accordance with WTFDA standards. On all bands, city of license and frequency changes are counted. For example, on AM, I would count local 550 as three separate stations (KUSA, KSD and KTRS), but won't count the local on 97.1 as three separate stations. The only call I would count is the call that was on the frequency when I moved back to the St. Louis area in 1992 (KHTK). I would not count as separate stations 97.1 with the calls KXOK or KFTK. Perhaps the most significant changes I made this year was to the method I

record my DX. Since 1990, I've been taping my DX with cassettes and a cassette recorder. This year, I added an MP3 recorder to my Magix Music Maker recording program after only being able to record DX on the computer in the Wave (WAV) format. I also added an account on Box to share my DX recordings with other DXers. As of December 1, 2011. I have logged 1,253 AM stations from 43 U.S. states and the District of Columbia, seven Canadian provinces, eight Mexican states and Mexico City. and 19 countries (including the U.S., Canada and Mexico). In addition, I've also logged 1,146 FM stations from 46 U.S. states (the only Lower 48 states I haven't heard on FM are CA and WV) and the District of Columbia, eight Canadian provinces (haven't logged British Columbia or Newfoundland), six Mexican states and Mexico City, and Havana, Cuba. On analog TV, I've logged 556 stations from 40 U.S. states and the District of Columbia, seven Canadian provinces, two Cuban provinces, eight Mexican states and Mexico City, and six countries (in addition to the U.S., Canada, Mexico and Cuba). On digital TV, I've logged 143 stations from 15 U.S. states. And finally, on NOAA Weather Radio (162.400-162.550 MHz), I've logged 100 stations from 18 U.S. states and 27 NWS Weather Forecast Offices, I'm within striking distance of three goals in 2012; AM station #1.300, FM station #1,150 and digital TV station #150. I hope everyone has a Merry Christmas, Happy Hanukkah, Happy Kwanzaa or, if you want to simplify it, a Happy Holiday season. 73.
