FROM: RADIO JOURNAL No new tower for Birmingham's WAGG (610) Back in the day, the station at 610 on the AM dial dominated the Birmingham, Alabama radio scene. WSGN was the big top-40 station that boasted voices such as Rick Dees, Scotty Brink and Roger W. Morgan, all booming out with 5,000 watts by day, 1,000 watts by night from a very widely-spaced two-tower array that straddled the Alabama state fairgrounds. But the rise of FM in the 1980s was bad news for 610, which ended up doing black gospel as WAGG. "Heaven 610." And then came the final indignity: the devastating windstorms that hit central Alabama in April took down one of the two WSGN/WAGG towers, leaving the station unable to run its full nighttime directional kilowatt. WAGG owner Cox Radio has decided not to try to rebuild the fallen tower, telling the FCC that annexations have caused the city of Birmingham to sprawl far beyond the station's signal reach at night, and that the environmental obstacles to rebuilding are substantial. WAGG's application for fulltime nondirectional operation from the remaining tower calls for 5-kw days (unchanged) and 610 watts at night.

FROM: RADIO JOURNAL New AM in Duluth. There are several decent low-dial fulltime AM facilities already serving the "Twin Ports" of Duluth, Minnesota and Superior, Wisconsin, and now they're about to get some company way up at the top of the dial. Kermit Carlson has been granted a construction permit for a new signal on 1560 licensed to the Village of Superior, Wisconsin, an independent community (population 595) just south of the larger city of Superior. Carlson's CP, already granted the calls WIVS, calls for a new array of six 157-foot towers at a site a few miles south of Superior. With 5-kw days and 4-kw nights, the new WIVS, if built, will cover both Superior and Duluth with a fulltime signal.

FROM: RADIO JOURNAL St. Gabriel Catholic radio upgrades in Columbus. For the last few years, the St. Gabriel group has been leasing WVKO. Columbus. OH (1580) from Bernard Ohio LLC for its Catholic programming. But while that 3.2-kw day/290-watt night signal struggles to cover the central part of the state's third-largest market. St. Gabriel has now moved on to a much bigger new home: it has acquired the former WOSU(AM) from the Ohio State University. As of last week, St. Gabriel is programming 820 under new calls WVSG. By day, the 820 signal from the university golf course (a site St. Gabriel is leasing from OSU) covers most of the central part of the state with 5-kw nondirectional; at night, 820 uses 790 watts from a six-tower array southwest of Columbus. WOSU gave up its AM signal (which had been in university hands since 1922) after acquiring a second FM frequency in the Columbus market (all-classical WOSA 101.1) and moving the AM station's news-talk format to WOSU-FM (89.7).

FROM: RADIO JOURNAL End of the line (for now, at least) for three Carolinas AMs. Renewal applications were due at the end of August for stations in North Carolina and South Carolina, and three AM stations failed to file for renewal. Last week, the FCC notified Golf Capital Broadcasting's WQNX, Aberdeen, NC (1350), Spirit Broadcasting's WGTM, Wilson, NC (590) and Cornell Blakely's WKMG, Newberry, SC (1520) that their licenses had been cancelled and their callsigns deleted. That's often not a permanent death sentence, and it's likely that at least some of those signals will return to licensed status eventually, albeit with some FCC fines attached.

FROM: RADIO JOURNAL Tower down in the Florida Keys. WKIZ, Key West, FL (1500) normally operates with 250 watts fulltime from a three-tower array built on a shallow coastal shelf off Stock Island, the next island east of Key West. But at the end of November, that shelf shifted - and the center tower in the WKIZ array came tumbling down. The station is now operating under special temporary authority with 62 watts fulltime from one of the remaining towers while it works on rebuilding the array.

FROM: RADIO INFO DOT COM Clear Channel-San Francisco announces talk lineups at 910 and 960 Gene Burns and Len Tillem, both former KGO (810) hosts, are joining Clear Channel as part of the revamped "Bay Area's Newstalk 910." Here's that roster: At 910. Armstrong & Getty remain as the morning drive show. simulcast from Sacramento sister KSTE (650). They air 6-9am. No talent set yet for 9am to noon. Then the syndicated Tom Sullivan, noon-3pm, followed by "Radio Lawyer" Len Tillem (3-4pm) and Gene Burns (4-7pm). Burns says "while it has been fun having the holiday month off. I am very anxious to get back to discussing both the issues of the day, and the [three-hour weekend] Good Life, on 'Dining Around.'" The current lineup at 910 is Armstrong & Getty, Dave Ramsey, Glenn Beck, John Gibson, "Market Wrap" with Joe Ansari, Alan Colmes, John & Jeff and Phil Hendrie. Clear Channel is moving the "KNEW" call letters off of 910 and placing them on 960. At 960, the new KNEW, the schedule as of January 3 will be Glenn Beck, 6-9am. Dave Ramsey, 9am-noon. Randi Rhodes, noon-3pm. Norman Goldman, 3-6pm. Market Wrap, 6-7pm. Stephanie Miller, 7-10pm. And Thom Hartmann, 10pm-1am. Clear Channel Director of Operations Don Parker says "recent changes in the talk radio market gave us the opportunity to adjust our plans for 960 KNEW", meaning the realignment at Cumulus Media's KGO toward more hours of all-news. Parker says "we are excited to broaden KNEW's position to appeal to a wider variety of Bay Area listeners." 960 was previously progressive talk "Green 960" KKGN. Both stations will be available on Clear Channel's iHeartRadio.

The BBC is to scale back its proposed cuts to local radio stations across England, which have a combined weekly audience of more than 7 million listeners, after a storm of protest from listeners and MPs. The plans, which would shrink the budget for the BBC's 40 local stations in England by £15m with the loss of 280 jobs, has generated more complaints than any other aspect of the corporation's Delivering Quality First initiative, designed to save £700m a year. Such is the strength of feeling among MPs, more than 50 of whom attended a private members' debate about the cuts at Westminster Hall last month, that the issue will be debated in the main chamber of the House of Commons next week. It is understood that the BBC Trust has received "thousands" of responses

about the proposed cuts. The trust, which is running dual public consultations about local radio and the broader cuts initiative, declined to comment. (BBC news via Steve Whitt 26 November, 2011)

The station said: "We believe that the broadcast of the Muslim Lifestyle service will increase the diversity and choice of relevant services available to listeners to analogue radio in the service area of our 1377 kHz transmitter." The changes would substantially alter the character of service so Ofcom has opened a consultation with a closing date of December 22nd. Asian Sound won the license out of four applications in 1995 (three Asian formats and an English service backed by Marcher Sound Group) and is based in Manchester. I began radio listening in 1957 near Endicott, NY, and have continued to DX from several locations in Northern California, the Big Island of Hawaii, and now Belfast, in Western NY. In addition to MWDX, I do some SWBC DXing and absolutely love to chase the pirates! I'm also a licensed ham but don't get on much. I've used many different radios over the years (but never had a HQ180, darn it); I'm currently using a slightly modified Icom R75 with a choice of wire antennas. Just picked up another part roll of wire and want to try an "on the ground" antenna. Most recent catches were WVMT - 620 and ZIZ - 555 (one day I'll get enough to send a report). In 2010 I sent two reports (WELD and WDER) and was amazed to get 100% response; I thought most stations (especially small ones) wouldn't know what a verification was any more. To augment my listening I got the latest NRC Log and Antenna Books and would like to update a couple slogans and point out a few errors. First, the Log: On 940, WKGM (Smithfield, VA) uses "YOUR Ministry Station" (not THE). On 960, WATS (Sayre, PA) sometimes says "The Voice of the Valley, Choice 102". On 850, KFUO is listed as D1 but shows 5000 watts day and night. Now the Antenna Book: The 610 thru 640 maps have the day and night pattern lines reversed (day lines for night patterns and vice versa) which could be confusing. On 980 stations #49 and #51 have TWO night patterns (!). On 1190, there are TWO #11s (Annapolis should be #15). And finally, on 1420 the #26 is orphaned without an arrow to point at the actual station location. Hope this helps someone; I've been an editor and am not just being picky. Good DX to all.

I found the recent article in Lee Freshwater's column in IRCA that discussed issues involving AM radio having problems attracting listeners and/or keeping them intriguing. Blaming poor reception on a variety of electronics is almost laughable. It's true that nearby electronics and building interiors in work environments can certainly hinder reception by causing noise and QRM. Some frequencies are more vulnerable than others, but this is only part of the problem. One of my more remarkable catches was hearing Noblesville, IN on 1110 at work, the only time I've ever heard them, suggests even in an electronic setting catches can still be heard. Talso recall hearing Cedar Rapids on 1450 in the basement of the old WMHE 92.5 on a Hallicrafters receiver they had there, with plenty of electronics around. Poor Edison transmission lines also contribute to the problem, but I would suggest that the radio broadcasters should look no further than themselves for blame, too. Let's look at the facts. Today's transistorized portable radios are better sets than those I started DXing and listening to 45 years ago. I have boom boxes whose radio and cassette recorders are of high quality, often better for taping AM than FM, belying claims to the contrary. Same goes for car radios. True, some car sets in the 70s and 80s wee not so good, but in recent years car radios have vastly improved. My Buick had AM Stereo, my Buick Century an excellent AM/FM radio, both of top quality. AM stations sound quality were on par to FMs. Often I hear as good DX on the car radio as I do on my primary home portables. So what then is the issue with the AM spectrum? One problem that occurred was when the Daytime Broadcasters Association along with the NAB lobbied the FCC to allow most daytimers to broadcast at night, often with micro powers. While this allowed these stations an ability to keep listeners over a broadcast day, their on air presence caused nighttime reception to be degraded. This coupled with more stations getting licensed on the clear and regional channels also further downgraded nighttime reception. The clears are now just glorified regionals, and regionals now are no better than higher power graveyard sounding frequencies and, well, the local channels are still a cluttered mess, perhaps even worse than decades ago. Now toss in the advent of HD Digital IBOC, depending on a station, they send adjacent channel QRM either tens or hundreds of miles out from their transmitters effectively jamming adjacent stations thereby destroying sky wave reception. Its effects are insidious. Even if one nulls the offending IBOC station, it can still attack the adjacent channels. Citing WWJ-950 Detroit, their nighttime signal in Toledo is not very good. I often hear the Cuban ticker and CFAM Altona, MB on 950; also one evening

WBES Charleston, WV and WYWY Barbourville, KY totally covered WWJ and yet their IBOC still destroyed 940 and 960 for me. This failed technology ruins reception across the dial (or perhaps that is the radio owners) filling the AM band with white noise. How can this be a good thing? As one scans across the band, it makes for an unpleasant deal, and for sure the average potential listener hears it too. Besides, are digital radios even being bought? The broadcasters long ago planted the idea that music sounds better on FM than AM, a myth that has created generations of listeners to choose FM over AM. The broadcasters have further alienated loyal older audiences by pulling good music formats off AM, or off the radio entirely. Furthermore AM stations have lost coverage by failing to maintain grounding radials. Sound quality has often been compromised by not having good signal processors either. Radio owners don't even bother to promote AM stations anymore. Little wonder then that listeners have left AM in droves; it's mysterious that the broadcasters want to study this for solutions. As the old saying goes, "we've seen the enemy and it is lies here. Hope your Christmas was superb and your New Year even better. 73s.
