DXpedition to Gabriola Island

Nick Hall-Patch

I spent a few days recently on Gabriola Island off Nanaimo, BC, about 120km north of my home in Victoria, BC. I was able to place a Flag antenna facing 340 degrees a couple of hundred meters from Georgia Strait, a body of salt water that is open to the north for another 30 km or more, and even at 300 degrees, looking at Vancouver Island there is 6 km of open water. A Flag has a beamwidth of 140 degrees; so much of Western Europe and East Asia was included in its pattern.

The first evening (14 January UTC) wasn't too spectacular. There were a couple of TA carriers, but I was spending a lot of time tracking down noise sources in the cabin and turning them off, at least temporarily, I left the SDR recording a bit overnight, but there was little sunrise enhancement from East Asia except at the top of the band, 1566 and 1575 with reasonable audio, by 1534UT, a man talking on 1557 and a man on 1593 also, fair at best, so it was like a good morning at home for this time of year. Signal strengths on the big NHK low band stations seemed better at 1000 and 1100 UT however.

The second evening (15 January 0100 UTC) showed various TA carriers, including ones on every channel from 1485 to 1602, but mostly weak; 1215 and 1575 had the strongest carriers, with audio traces, so not too bad to start with, and some audio was noted on 1089 around 0130UT. But conditions had deteriorated by 0200UT, the only audio at that point was poorly heard on 1269, and things got no better after that. Again the SDR was left recording, but except for HLAZ-1566, there was not very good sunrise enhancement.

Things got a little interesting the following day. Reports of Alaska being heard in Scotland inspired my curiosity, so I fired up the radio at midday local time. A very wispy carrier on 1575 was heard at 2025UTC (local noon is 2000UT). Pretty much imaginary audible carrier (but very visible in the Spectran audio display program) on 1539, plus a visible only carrier on 1503. By 2220UT audible carriers were heard on 1503, 1512, 1539, 1548 and 1575, though 1575 was down in strength from earlier. Remember, local sunset is near 0100UT at this time of year, and by that time, carriers were everywhere, with audio (not great readability much of the time, but this is a poor TA season) on 1575, 1539 and 1503, that turned out to be Iran! Other, more European audio turned up as the evening wore on, and then faded away long before European sunrise, but the spectacular over the pole DX was around local sunset. Again, the following morning was nothing to get excited about; JOUK-1503 was abnormally strong around 1540UT, and the NHK2 synchros on 1593 and 1602 were heard weakly signing off at 1540UT also, with no sign of the usual China on 1593.

Obviously, a little bit of water path is a good thing, especially when, as others were reporting, there was a low level of trans-polar absorption. Hearing midday carriers from the Middle East is not normal at all for this far south. even in mid-winter.

- 1206t FRANCE, Bordeaux-Néac, France-Info. 0130 1/16. FF talk by woman, poor strength; aided by some dead air on CJRJ-1200. (NHP-BC)
- 1215 **UNITED KINGDOM**, various sites, Absolute Radio. 0200 1/16. Pop mx, fair to poor strength, no ID across hour, likely this, (NHP-BC)
- 1269t GERMANY, Neumünster, Deutschlandfunk. 0159 1/15. Poor with man talking, Germanic inflection. Two short and one longer pip on the hour, all the same pitch, but too poor for any ID. I may have missed a pip, as I'm pretty sure that 3 and 1 has also been heard. (NHP-BC)
- 1314t **UAE**, Al Dhabiya, Radio Farda. 0132 1/16. Mostly a carrier, but at 0132, I have about 5 seconds of very weak signal, a man perhaps reading nx, seemed //1575. Neither WRTH 2011 nor EMWG list this as being R Farda at this time, but Mauno Ritola assured me that they're now Farda, and should appear that way in WRTH 2012. First time heard. (NHP-BC)
- 1503 IRAN, Bushehr, IRIB-1. 0121 1/16. Nil to fairly good, deep voiced man intoning something followed by a moment of stringed music, repeated on the webstream about a minute later. This continued for a couple of minutes, with man talking over music, best signal about 0122, when it was quite listenable. 0125 with Middle Eastern vocal mx, mangled somewhat by 1520's IBOC. Faded by 0130, killing any hope of an ID on the Iranian hour. Wonderful surprise. (NHP-BC)
- 1539t UAE, Al-Dhabbaya, VOA Radio Aap Ki Dunyaa. 0122 1/16. Woman and man talking in Middle Eastern sounding language, poor to fair. Soon faded. (NHP-BC)
- UAE, AI Dhabiya, Radio Farda. 0101 1/16. Man talking, followed by pop mx, fair at best, and 1575 parallel with Farda webstream. Frighteningly good strength w/ Persian pop by 0118, gradually fading after 0120, but returning w/fair to good strength from time to time. At 0300, 3 short and one long pips were heard, all the same pitch, followed by what appeared to be news, but only poor to fair strength by this time. (NHP-BC)
