WLS(AM), Chicago, Illinois In this Notice of Apparent Liability for Forfeiture, the FCC assess a monetary forfeiture in the amount of forty-four thousand dollars against Radio License Holding XI, LLC or the, licensee of Station WLS (AM), Chicago, Illinois, for its apparent willful violation of section 317 of the Communications Act, as amended, and section 73.1212 of the Commission's rules. These provisions generally require a licensee to make sponsorship identification announcements whenever it broadcasts matter in return for money, service, or other valuable consideration.

KQMG and KQMG-FM, Independence, Iowa; and Owner of Antenna Structure #1053693 In this Notice of Apparent Liability for Forfeiture and Order, the FCC finds that KM Radio of Independence, LLC, licensee of Stations KQMG and KQMG-FM, in Independence, Iowa, and owner of antenna structure number 1053693 also located in Independence, Iowa, apparently willfully and/or repeatedly violated Sections 11.35, 17.51, and 73.3526 of the Commission's rules,1 and Section 303(q) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, by failing (with respect to both of its stations) to: maintain operational emergency alert system equipment; exhibit required obstruction lighting on the Tower; and maintain and make available a complete public inspection file. Furthermore, specifically with respect to Station KQMG-FM, we find that KM Radio apparently willfully violated Section 73.1560(b) of the Rules by operating Station KQMG-FM with more than authorized transmitter output power. After adjusting the possible forfeiture based on the Licensee's limited financial resources, we conclude that KM Radio is apparently liable for a forfeiture in the amount of ten thousand dollars. In addition, no later than thirty (30) calendar days from the date of this NAL, KM Radio must submit a statement signed under penalty of perjury that it has repaired its EAS equipment and tower lighting, it is operating within authorized power limits, and it is maintaining two complete public inspection files for Stations KOMG and KOMG-FM.

With the tagline, "Compartiendo Esperanza. Siempre Contigo." (Sharing Hope. With You Always.), Radio Moody Chicago will broadcast daily on WMBI-AM 1110. "There are approximately two million Hispanics living in Chicago and with no Spanish-speaking, Bible-based Christian radio station serving them, we believe this station and its programming will fill a significant need for this community," said Collin Lambert, vice president of Moody Radio. "We are excited about this initiative and look forward to hearing from listeners how Moody is ministering to them."

The Hispanic community is the nation's largest and fastest-growing minority group, making up 26 percent of the total population in Chicago. Radio Moody Chicago will provide concrete biblical teaching, address relevant issues affecting Hispanics and provide the hope of Jesus through inspirational music native to the Hispanic culture. "Through this effort Moody is recapturing its original vision for reaching the Hispanic community and expressing a renewed commitment to serve them," said Elsa Mazon, project manager for Radio Moody's Programming. "We want to bring hope and encouragement to our Spanish-speaking brothers and sisters and there is no better time than right now." In addition to original Spanish-speaking programming, Radio Moody Chicago will utilize existing Moody Radio ministry partners with Spanish-based teaching such as *Turning Point* with Dr. David Jeremiah, *Grace to You* with Dr. John MacArthur and *Insight for Living* with Dr. Chuck Swindoll.

Think Dave Ramsey, only in Spanish. There's no irony there, since "EI Show de Andres Gutierrez" comes with the support of Ramsey, with whom the former San Antonio radio talker began working in 2009. Small business owner and entrepreneur Gutierrez has also appeared on NBC's Telemundo network, discussing financial matters. Last fall, he garnered more visibility for his daily radio talk show, and now the Nashville-based Ramsey operation formally introduces his 11 a.m. to noon live talkie (with multiple re-feeds). Dave Ramsey EVP Suzanne Simms says Andres offers "compelling radio to the Hispanic community while bringing them the same service-oriented content that Dave has been doing for years." The show is already airing in markets like Atlanta (WAZX/1550), Charlotte (WGSP/1310) and Seattle (KNTS/1680).

They've had a web presence (www.rnk.gov.kh)since mid-2010, initially with a live stream of their 96 FM service, however that's now been replaced by streams of the National [918 kHz] Service (observed 2225-1600 UT) and a youth channel called Wat Phmom FM (observed 2255-1600 UT), named after a Buddhist temple in the capital. INDIA: Akashavani Mangalore is gearing up for a qualitative change in the manner in which it broadcasts its programs by going digital in the near future. What it means for listeners is crystal clear transmission quality for programs. The engineering staff of Akashavani is making an all-out effort to complete installation of equipment so that broadcast can go digital latest by April, Ramesh said. Akashavani, Mangalore, which also broadcasts its programs with the help of a 20-kW AM transmitter in Brahmawar in Udupi is planning to replace it with digital radio mondiale. PAKISTAN: Pakistan Information Minister Dr Firdous Ashiq Awan and Senator Ismail Buledi inaugurated a 100 KW high power mediumwave transmitter of Radio Pakistan Tarbat on Wednesday. Speaking on the occasion, the Information Minister - who was in Karachi due to a technical problem with the aircraft that was due to take her to Tarbat - said the transmitter will provide easy access to news and entertainment to the people of far flung areas of Balochistan. She said this project reflects the priority and importance the government accords to the people of Balochistan.

The Director General of Radio Pakistan, Murtaza Solangi, said that installation of the transmitter had been completed at a cost of over 164 million rupees (US\$1.8 million). He said the station will cover a vast area of Balochistan during the day and can be heard in UAE, Iran, Oman and other Gulf countries. In daytime the station can cover a radius of 300 km, and triple that during nighttime. (Radio Pakistan and agencies, via RNW blog)

The newly inaugurated transmitter at Turbat broadcasts programs at frequency 981 from 7 am to 10 pm daily. It will be fully operational soon after some technical adjustments. (email from Radio Pakistan to Bruce Conti)

PHILIPPINES: A Philippine MW-station of UNTV relay during the Autumn was finally heard with a full ID "UNTV Radyo La Verdad Tapat at Totoo 13-50" on Jan 18th. GERMANY: Several German stations were closed in early January: On 30 December 2011: 1413 SWR, Ulm, On 31 December 2011: 1539 ERF Mainflingen and 1593 WDR Langenberg (DRM), On 8 January 2012: 576 SWR Mühlacker; 666 SWR Rorhdorf; 828 SWR Freiburg; 1017 SWR Wolfsheim (Andy Sennitt, RNW Media Network 29 Dec)

ITALY: 900 and others - Since the beginning of this year, RAI has stopped the "Notturno Italiano" programmer that was heard every night from the MW transmitters of Milan, Rome and Naples. This show was created in 1952 and was dedicated to Italian music and songs. It was also farmous for including short news bulletins in Italian, English, French and sometimes German on the top of the hour. According to observations, RAI has now replaced the "Notturno Italiano" with a simple relay of the RAI 1 programmer on MW, so the transmitters remain on the air throughout the night. (Arctic)

SOUTH AFRICA: The Radio Pulpit relay from Johannesburg has stopped in Cape Town on 729 kHz from beginning of January 2012 (John Plimmer, mwdx, 18 Jan)

UKRAINE: The National Radio Company of Ukraine (NRCU) plans to continue broadcasting on mediumwave with the help of DRM transmitters.

Two channels of Ukrainian radio will go on broadcasting on mediumwave with new DRM digital radio transmitters; this was stated by the Chairman of the State committee for television and radio broadcasting Alexander Kurdinovich in an interview to Telekritika".

"Taking into account that the National radio company does not have a systematic network for FM broadcasting and will not have it due to the lack of frequency resources, and the insane competition with commercial broadcasters, it was decided to transfer a minimum of two programs of the NRCU to broadcasts on mediumwave", he explained. "It is a question of purchasing 15-16 modern digital radio transmitters DRM format, which can work in both digital and analogue radio broadcasting. By placing them on the whole territory of Ukraine, we will be able to provide access to the National radio of at least 85-90% of the population ", noted Mr. Kurdinovich.

According to him, the replacement of obsolete analogue transmitters will save money, since the new transmitters consume three times less electricity. He specified that the funds for this re-equipment are not provided, but they must be received at the expense of centralized distribution of capital expenditures. "There is an instruction of the President of the Ukrainian Cabinet of ministers and the Ministry of finance to make specific proposals for this. We have prepared all the technical documentation, the project of creating such a network. The only thing that remains for us is to get financing, announce a tender and purchase transmitters. The problem will be solved seriously and for a long time. After the transition to a digital broadcasting standard we would have created a normal digital radio network", underlined the chairman of Goskomteleradio.

UNITED KINGDOM: One-third of BBC Radio Scotland's production staff will lose their jobs and two news programs will be dropped in the latest wave of BBC cost savings, it is claimed today. The Herald Scotland (Glasgow) reports that staff at Pacific Quay in Glasgow, the BBC's HQ in Scotland, were told vesterday that eight radio production journalists there, out of 27, and three more in the BBC's base in Edinburgh would lose their jobs in the coming year. And the broadsheet claims that two radio news programs - Scotland at Ten, which reports from Holyrood, and Newsweek, the analysis of the week's news which is broadcast on Saturdays - will also be scrapped as part of the changes. The Herald says the move has been prompted by the BBC's Delivering Quality First savings drive, which will result in the loss of 2000 jobs as £670 million is saved across the BBC in the next five years. It says Newsweek will be replaced by a new Saturday version of Good Morning Scotland, which will become a six-day-a-week operation. The Herald quotes Scottish Government Culture Secretary, Fiona Hyslop, as saying she continues to have "deep concerns" over the impact of the changes. According to The Herald, a spokesman for the BBC said that Ken MacQuarrie, director of BBC Scotland, had outlined staff cuts last year and vesterday's announcement was part of that cuts plan. He is quoted as adding: "These are part of the plan that will save 100 to 120 staff positions over the next four or five years, and we hope to do that, as much as is possible, through voluntary redundancy. "We already broadcast a great range of political coverage. Scotland at Ten has a small audience. We are now trying to concentrate on speech programs during the day, and music at night and this change fits into that plan." (www.thedrum.co.uk. Via Steve Whitt, Medium Wave Circle)

The week of January 30 was very warm; four straight days of temperatures over 60 degrees F allowed me to take the Superadio III outside during daylight hours during three of those days for DX. On January 30, I was able to catch KZQZ 1430 off the air due to technical problems with their 50 kW daytime service. It was just my luck that I had sunset conditions three and a half hours before the sun went down. With KZQZ off, I pulled WYMC 1430 Mayfield, KY in at 1509 ELT with a promo mentioning the Web site and a phone number in Area Code 270, into Oldies format. WYMC's Oldies format is the more common one heard these days, with songs from the 1960s through the early 1980s, unlike KZQZ's format, which runs from the 1950s to the early 1970s. The two dominant stations on 1430 in KZQZ's absence were nighttime semi-regular (with KZQZ nulled) WXNT 1430 Indianapolis, running conservative talk, and WPLN 1430 Madison, TN, running BBC World Service. On 1440, WGEM Quincy, IL has a good signal; I did hear WPRS Paris, IL mixing with WGEM at 1521 with a Country format and ID. WPRS 1440 is my 105th Illinois AM from my QTH. On 1420, WOC and WIMS traded places dominating, similar to the conditions during hours of darkness. I finally heard one of my closest unheards when I pulled in KRLL 1420 California, MO (located in central Moniteau County for you mapheads) with a Classic Country format and "Classic Country 1420 KRLL" ID at 1538 ELT. There were also two unidentified stations on 1430, one playing country music and the other playing current hits. WRAM 1330 Monmouth, IL, which I note in the evenings on occasion with 50 watts, was heard on day power over WVHI at 1556 with Classic Country and "Continuous Classic Country 1330 WRAM" slogan. I had minor ACI from KSIV 1320. Before sunset, I pulled in WVSG 820 Columbus, OH (ex-WOSU) with EWTN Global Catholic Radio programming at 1655, mixing with WCPT. WBAA 920 West Lafayette, IN heard with "All Things Considered", local and national underwriting announcements at 1657, with WGNU nulled while I was trying to pull in WMOK. The overnight hours of January 31 (DXing indoors) brought KMOZ 1590 Rolla, MO with promos and a Bott Radio Network ID at 0230; first time noted on 85 watts night power. The afternoon of January 31 brought in WJBC 1230 Bloomington, IL with Web site mention, local news headlines, legal ID for the AM and WJBC-FM 93.7 Pontiac, IL into CBS News at 1458. I nulled out WHCO to pull in this station. I remember when I could pull in KWIX Moberly, MO in WHCO's null. WILL 580 Urbana, IL was noted with a farm report, weather forecast and "WILL, University of Illinois Extension" ID at 1509. WILL had a fair signal with ACI from KFNS 590. KJXX 1170 Jackson, MO was noted with an ID and Adult Standards at 1550; a poor signal was noted in a WLBH null, with ACI from WLDS 1180. Before going inside, WWVA 1170 Wheeling, WV was noted at 1705 with ID, traffic report and Sean Hannity. During the overnight hours of February 1, I noted WGUS 1480 Augusta, GA with a hard rock format, Web site format and "95 Rock" ID (WCHZ 95.1) at 0149. I also noted WGUS on February 3 at 0359 with a hard rock format and AM-FM legal ID. During the daylight hours of February 1, I noted WHOW 1520 Clinton, IL at 1410 with local ads, a talk show on horse care, Web site promo and a mention of both the AM and the FM (95.9). The signal was good to fair, mostly over KRHW, although the latter had an equal signal at times. WIND 560 Chicago was noted with conservative talk, ID and local ads at 1452. WIND came in over KWTO, with ACI from KTRS 550. WCIL 1020 Carbondale, IL noted at 1457 with an ID by Rush Limbaugh, into the final moments of Rush's show before returning to a simulcast of my closest unheard, WJPF 1340. KVDW 1530 England, AR was overpowering WCKY with no sign of WLIQ at 1549; Little Rock ads and Urban Gospel music were heard. I caught a bilingual legal ID from WRTO 1200 Chicago, IL at 1559, as well as promos in Spanish. WRTO was alone on channel with no ACI from KQQZ 1190. Two new lowa stations were noted before 1700 ELT; KLNG 1560 Council Bluffs was noted with a legal ID mentioning Omaha, NE into the "Rhema for Today" program at 1645; they were taking out KTUI, WPAD and KGOW. KSIB 1520 Creston, IA noted with help wanted ads, mention of Area Code 641, local ads and country music at 1651, taking out KRHW and KOKC at times. The outdoor DX sessions wrapped up with relogs of WLIJ 1580 Shelbyville, TN and WIGN 1550 Bristol, TN. A new station was noted at the very end: WHFB 1060 Benton Harbor, MI heard over KYW at 1719 with local ads, "All Talk 1060 WHFB" ID and the Jerry Doyle show. Some of the new logs heard after the three afternoon outdoor DX sessions: WDBZ 1230 Cincinnati, OH noted with ID at 2038 on February 3, poking through several others. KXOI 810 Crane, TX noted on February 4 at 0201 with legal ID in English, "Radio Alabanza" ID and Contemporary Christian music in Spanish. A fair signal was noted over WHB and WGY. XEPZ 1190 Ciudad Juarez, Chihuahua was noted on February 7 at 0105 with Nortena music and "Radio Nortena" ID in Spanish. A fair to poor signal was noted, taking out KQQZ at times. KWTL 1370 Grand Forks, ND noted on February 7 at 1756 with EWTN programming, promos and a legal ID, mixing with WLLM and KWRT. KOSE 860 Wilson, AR noted at 0152 on February 9 with Classic Country format and ID; fair to poor signal over several others with CJBC nulled. I last noted this station in 1996, when it was licensed to nearby Osceola. As of 1300 ELT on February 10, I have 1,285 AM stations in my logbook. 73.
