F.C.C. FINES

In this Notice of Apparent Liability for Forfeiture (NAL), we find that Equity Communications LP (Equity), the licensee of AM Station WCMC in Wildwood, New Jersey (Station), apparently willfully and repeatedly violated Section 73.49 of the Commission's rules (Rules)1 by failing to enclose the Station's antenna structure (Antenna Structure) within an effective locked fence or other enclosure. We conclude that Equity is apparently liable for a forfeiture in the amount of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000). On October 18, 2011, agents from the Enforcement Bureau's Philadelphia Office inspected the Station's antenna structure located on West 19th Avenue in Wildwood, New Jersey. The agents observed that the Antenna Structure, which is located in a residential neighborhood and has radio frequency potential at its base, was not enclosed by an effective locked fence or other enclosure. Although there were remnants of a fence, the portion of the fence that remained did not restrict access to the base of the antenna structure. The agents immediately contacted the Station's President and General Manager (President), who claimed that a hurricane had washed away a portion of the fence. The agents advised the President to either cease operating the Station until a fence could be installed or install a temporary fence to restrict access to the base of the antenna structure, 3. On October 25, 2011, an agent re-inspected the Antenna Structure and found that the Station was broadcasting and the fence around the antenna structure was in the same condition as it was during the October 18, 2011 inspection. The next day, the agent spoke with Equity's President, who stated that he was in contact with a contractor about installing a fence. The agent reiterated to Equity's President that he should install a temporary fence until a permanent fence can be installed. On October 28, 2011, Equity's President sent an e-mail to the agent, along with photographs, stating that a temporary chain link fence had been installed

In this Notice of Apparent Liability for Forfeiture and Order (NAL), we find that JMK Communications Inc. (JMK), licensee of AM Station WPWC, in Dumfries, Virginia (Station), apparently willfully and repeatedly violated Section 73.49 of the Commission's rules (Rules)1 by failing to enclose the Station's antenna structures within effective locked fences or other enclosures. We conclude that JMK is apparently liable for a forfeiture in the amount of seven thousand dollars (\$7,000). We further direct JMK to submit, no later than thirty (30) calendar days from the release date of this NAL, a written statement signed under penalty of perjury stating that the Station is now in compliance with Section 73.49 of the Rules. 2. On September 2, 2011, in response to a complaint, an agent from the Enforcement Bureau's Columbia Office inspected the Station's four-tower array in Dumfries, Virginia.2 All four antenna structures have radio frequency potential at their base. The agent observed that one of the antenna structures had no fencing at all around the base of the structure, while the other three antenna structures had only partial fencing around their bases, thereby allowing unrestricted access to all the structures. The level of deterioration observed by the agent indicated that the fences had been in that condition for a significant period of time. The agent also observed that there was no perimeter fence around the property where the antenna structures were located.

WRUF, WMOP Team For Gainesville-Ocala ESPN Radio Affiliation UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA Sports WRUF-A (SPORTS RADIO 850)/GAINESVILLE, FL has gained the ESPN RADIO affiliation for the market in a partnership with FLORIDA SPORTSHALK LLC, owner of Sports WMOP-A-W261BA (ESPN SPORTS RADIO)/OCALA. The new simulcast will result in a single ESPN affiliate for the market, ESPN 850/900, launching TODAY (6/29); WMOP programming was previously heard in GAINESVILLE on WGGG-AM. The lineup includes ESPN RADIO's "MIKE AND MIKE IN THE MORNING" 6-10a (ET), followed by market veteran ADAM REARDON 10a-noon, WMOP's STEVE RUSSELL noon-2p, ESPN RADIO's SCOTT VAN PELT 2-4p, WMOP's LARRY VETTEL 4-6p, the UF student-run "THE CHEAP SEATS" 6-7p, and ESPN programming after 7p. "We are thrilled about these new partnerships with ESPN and WMOP," said UF College of Journalism and Communications Div. of Multimedia Properties Executive Director RANDY

WRIGHT. "Creating a single broadcast schedule for the entire GAINESVILLE/OCALA market with ESPN, local sports talk, and GATOR and local sports events gives fans throughout the region a single place on the dial to listen to all their favorite sports programming." "FLORIDA SPORTSTALK is extremely pleased to announce this partnership with the UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA College of Journalism and Communications," said FLORIDA SPORTSTALK President GORDON SMITH. "With these combined efforts we can bring sports programming to our citizens like no other outlet in north central FLORIDA." "The College continues to look for opportunities to enhance the educational experience of our students," said UF College of Journalism and Communications Dean JOHN WRIGHT. "This ESPN affiliation will provide even more broadcasting and online experiences for our journalism and communications students. In addition, our plans to broadcast more high school football and basketball games live in these markets will give our students experience in broadcasting and producing live sporting events."
