Volunteers are needed for the following:

**REPRINTS...** Print and mail reprint articles as well as burn and distribute the CD and DXM DVD's. Must have CD & DVD burning software. Does not take a lot of time, if you keep a good stock of CD's and DVD's. I take a day and burn a pile of 25 or so. That usually lasts a long while. Then all you do is box them up and mail them. We do so few "paper reprints", I have been just printing them on my laser printer as needed... A large order could be taken to a printer. The last update to the reprint list was around 2001, so we are over do for another update.

**AWARDS :** Not much to do here except for printing out the HEALD award every year. . No one has applied for the DX awards for many years.

**BRD INFO:** Collect updates from 1000000 watts, AMLOGBOOK DOT COM, FCC, and other sources. I have been doing this each issue, but it could be every other issue. This column probably takes more time than any other of my IRCA duties. I spend a great deal of time going over the daily FCC action report, as well as copy pasting many articles that are sent to me. Altho I have not needed to, the club will pay for the 100000 watts subscription as long as you agree NOT to share it.

**PUBLISHING :** Get address list from Lynn. Create labels and envelopes. Send (email) PDF file from the EIC to the printers, Pick up, Staple, Fold, stuff, then mail. It takes me about an hour to do the labels and envelopes. I usually do the envelopes on Wednesday morning before leaving for work. I pick up the DXM at the Printers on Wednesday night on my way to dinner. I staple, fold and mail on SATURDAY AM. It takes about an hour to fold and staple. It helps when you have a wife that assists you. You can set your own schedule as long as the issues goes out on or before the masthead date. You will also need to send out sample issues as needed.

- 560 **MÉXICO**, XETZ, Zacatecas, Zac. 1119 8/25. Canned promo for FM 93.3, then live YL DJ with phone numbers, mentions Zacatecas, music. Weak but clear signal; where are all the other Mexican and US stations? Held up past 1130. Cantú nails it: 560 XEXZ + FM 93.3 5,000 1,000. (GH-OK)
- 560 **MÉXICO?** 1155 9/3. 6:55 TC by YL, mentions "La Triple O", so I'm hoping there is an XEOOO listed, but not, nor any other triple-letter call. Nor any triple-anything on FM related to 560. (GH-OK)
- 570 **MÉXICO**, XEJB, Monterrey, NL. 1124 8/16. News by M&W alternating, mentions Montemorelos, Nuevo León, 6:24 timecheck, also mentions Monterrey. No doubt per Cantú it is: "570 5,000 500," and 630 XEFB was also in. (GH-OK)

- 630 **MÉXICO** [and night]? 1122 8/16. Fair XE signal here where XEFB Monterrey usually dominates, with promo for some sports event on 'La Invasora 99.7' but also on XEFB, sibling station; spoken by that SHVA = super-hype voice actor, heard on so many Mexican and American stations. Also heard him this morning at same time on Fort Worth 1270 and Kansas City 1250. Wonder who he is; must be earning a mint. Maybe there are others super-hyping in the same style. (GH-OK)
- 640 **MÉXICO**, XEJUA, Ciudad Juárez, Chih. 1131 8/13. ID for "R Uno, Chihuahua". Nice to hear something else from Chihuahua than Cantú: "640 XEHHI R Uno Hidalgo del Parral, Chih. 10,000 1,000." Today's Enid sunrise is 1148 UT, getting 5-6 minutes later every week. (GH-OK)
- 650 **MÉXICO**, XETNT, Los Mochis, Sinaloa. 1113 8/13 with 'Buenos Días, Yardeross show on "R 65, 106.5" singing ID. I wasn't sure of that word until I found it on their program schedule [http://www.chavezRcast.com/?page\\_id=395](http://www.chavezRcast.com/?page_id=395) for 4-6 am [MDT] with Alberto Guerrero, "El Fogatero". I still don't know what a yarderero and a fogatero are, nor does my dictionary, nor does Google translate; local slang. Fogatero probably has something to do with fire, arsonist? He sets fire to yards? (GH-OK)
- + 9/1. R 65 ID just as I tune in; a regular from Los Mochis, Sinaloa. (GH-OK)
- 660 **MÉXICO**, XEACB, Ciudad Delicias, Chih. 1205 9/1 kept talking about carnitas, and Mercado Morelos. While there are such markets all over Mexico, a previous log of Oct 5 last year with more details correlated that with: XEACB. However, current Cantú has amended this to: 660 XEACB La Lupe + FM 98.9, 3,000 1,000. (GH-OK)
- +† 0601 9/3. Chihuahua state anthem by tenor and chorus; the keyword to copy is "chihuahuenses". So it's the only 660 in the state. (GH-OK)
- + 0600 9/6. Full ID from the only Chihuahua 660 station, and then state song. The third time I've heard it recently without confirming that it's still the ID in the volatile Mexican R scene. (GH-OK)
- 680 **MÉXICO**, XEFO, Chihuahua, Chih, Éxtasis Digital. 1206 9/3. NA, then ID mentions "Chihuahua, México", QRM, so Cantú: 680 XEFO + FM 92.5, 5,000 250. (GH-OK)
- 680 **MÉXICO**, XEORO, Guasave, Sin, La Mera Jefa. 1206 9/1. "Noticias en Punto" is all I get, but searching on that + 680 leads to (beware of autolaunching audio) <http://megamediosguasave.org/index.php> which does have such a newscast at 6-8 am, and another at 1-2 pm MDT, so it is per Cantú: 680 XEORO + FM 93.7 1,000 500. (GH-OK)
- + 1159 9/6. Full ID from "La Mera Jefa", including: "93.7 y 680," "la R que manda," "Megamedios, Guasave, Sinaloa." 1201 'Noticias en Punto.' But did not catch any call letters. (GH-OK)
- 700 **MÉXICO**, XEDKR, Guadalajara, Jal. 1115 8/25 weak but steady and unQRMed signal mentioning "1110 AM, R Red," so it's the Guadalajara 10 kW relay, XEDKR. (GH-OK)
- + 1158 9/6. R Red ID and promo, temp as 14.7 degrees, presumably at the flagship hi-altitude DF station XERED, while 700 is XEDKR in Guadalajara; weak but alone on frequency. (GH-OK)
- 710 **MÉXICO**, XEDP, Ciudad Cuauhtémoc, Chih. 1115 8/13 with that preacher in Low GG. At tune in the accent is so strange that at first I think he's switched to some Indian language until I start to recognize a few standard German words and my mind lox into it; over at 1126 with "XEDP, La Ranchera de Cuauhtémoc" SID; and at 1130, full ID giving priority to their new FM: XHDP 89.7, then XEDP 710. (GH-OK)
- + 0600 8/18. Looking for Mexican NAs, but instead hear a different one: since lyric mentions "chihuahuense" I am confident it is Chihuahua and therefore the usual dominator XEDP. A good time to hear the state anthem any night. There was also an unusual lo het on the frequency; R. Rebelde reverberators were nulled. (GH-OK)
- + 1109 8/25. XEDP is still playing the Chihuahua anthem with male singer; then female sings a prayer of some sort; 1111 sign-on or full ID; 1112 right into ranchera music, so no Mennonite preacher today Saturday in Low GG or SS. (GH-OK)
- 720 **MÉXICO**, XEDE, Sattillo, Coah. 0226 9/1 I am trying for KDWN Las Vegas NV, as suggested by Kaz just before local sunset pattern change. I get a good null on WGN, but no KDWN, just SS music, and at 0230 fades up for full super-hype ID from XEDE, where it's 31 degrees at 9:30. Not quite collinear with WGN, so if I try to null XEDE I get WGN again, no KDWN. (GH-OK)
- 730 **MÉXICO**, XEHB, Hidalgo del Parral, Chih. 0503 9/3. Mixture of at least three SS on the R in the bathroom as I am brushing my teeth, positioned to favor N-S paths, yet I make out a "La Ke Buena" slogan mixing with XEHB and W (XEX); then one of them playing NA. Cantú shows Ke Buena is westward and the least of the nine Mexicans now on what was once a clear channel: 730 XEEBC Ke Buena + FM 97.9 Ensenada, B.C. 1,000 250. These modern Mexicans don't know how to spell Qué. (GH-OK)
- + 0502 9/4. "Ke Buena señal, Rrama, 107.1 FM y 730 AM, son las once" dominating frequency, into music; loops SSW. We have a mystery here: must be something new. Last night at 0503 I also heard "La Ke Buena", and assumed it was XEEBC Ensenada BCN, the only listed Ke Buena on 730. But this TC for 11 pm (if correct) means it has to be in one of only four states now on MDT/CST: Nayarit, Sinaloa, BCS, Chihuahua. Unless it's relaying a network feed with wrong frequency and time (like R. Fórmula 970). But that would come out of the DF where it's medianoche. That rules out XEEBC in UT-7; also, their FM is on 97.9. Extensive affiliate list for Rrama: [http://www.Rrama.com.mx/secciones.php?sec\\_id=32](http://www.Rrama.com.mx/secciones.php?sec_id=32). Shows that and the only 107.1 is in Chilpancingo, Guerrero, but this goes with AM 680. Rrama group encompasses many slogans, some appearing in many markets, some unique. Is any 'Ke Buena' necessarily a Rrama brand? Cantú, IRCA and WRTH show the only 730s in the UT-6 states are: XEHB in Hidalgo del Parral, Chihuahua, a regular here and easily I deduced with "R Viva Villa", 50 kW days and probably at night too. And: XELBG in Loreto BCS, R Gigante, 10 kW daytime. Nothing on 107.1 in Cantú matches up. Maybe on another night I'll manage to catch a geographical ID. Rrama makes it a Mexican, but beware: SS could also be a US "Que Buena", cf. OKLAHOMA 1270. NRC AM Log shows the "only" US SS on 730 is KSVN, Ogden UT, 66 watts at night, "La Mexicana." (GH-OK)
- + XEEBC, Ke Buena + FM 97.9 Ensenada, B.C. 1,000 250. Glenn, about a week ago I have a recording on 730 and just prior to 1102 UT, a La Ke Buena signs on coming atop XEX (TDW) and mentions Hidalgo del Parral Chihuahua. Could this be a format switch with 700 XEGD or did you also have XEHB for certain and are they still R Viva Villa? Perhaps I had a third station, but it seemed to be only two. I'll replay my recording carefully a few more times and if needed pop it on Real DX for someone 100% fluent to listen to? Hmm... might make sense for me to email Cantu a MP3. (NK-IL)
- + The mystery is solved about where "Ke Buena" is coming from. As suggested by Neil Kazaross, IL/WI, it is in fact a new name for XEHB in Hidalgo del Parral, Chih, ex-R Viva Villa. Rather sorry to find that colorful name in homage to Pancho Villa has been retired (or moved elsewhere?). 1200 9/5, expected VG signal on SRS, but no NA is played, just hyper Mexican music. 1201, full ID including "XEHB-FM, 107.1, 25 kW, Hidalgo del Parral, cadena internacional, Rrama." This very recent change is not showing up yet in the listings, notably Cantú, rechecked at 1400 UT. Neil says he's asked Fred about it. Ke Buena is listed there on 700 instead: 700 XEGD Ke Buena + FM 90.3 Hidalgo del Parral, Chih. 5,000 1,000 so we wonder if the formats on 700 and 730 have been swapped? But it's not that simple as the FM frequency doesn't match the announced 107.1 heard on 730. And 107.1 is not listed for anything in that city. I also check 700 at 1200 UT, and a much weaker signal has a low-key discussion in Spanish, 1203 mentions Coahuila, but that's all I could get, source unknown. It's not clear if XEGD and XEHB are jointly owned, lacking weblix for either in Cantú by-state listings. Martin Foltz, who is compiling the next IRCA Mexican Log, is checking whether the other Ke Buena on 730, in Ensenada BCN, retains that slogan. In fact, the only Hidalgo del Parral station in the Rrama affiliate list is yet another one: Hidalgo Del Parral R MIL XEHPC 1000. (GH-OK)
- 740 **MÉXICO**, XECW, Los Mochis, Sin. 1158 9/1, I am hearing some mariachi music when KRMG Tulsa is nulled, 1159 rewarded by ID for a 25 kW FM en Los Mochis, Sinaloa, and also 740. Cantú shows: 740 XECW + FM 96.5 Los Mochis, Sin. 5,000 1,000. A new one here; KRMG 25 kW night pattern has a deep null at 278 degrees, close to us, tho we can always hear it; major night lobes are 245 and 97 degrees. KRMG daytime 50 kW begins at 1200 UT in September, ex-1145 in August. (GH-OK)
- 750 **MÉXICO**, XECSI, Culiacán, Sin. 1211 9/3 "750, Éxtasis Digital, Sinaloa", then choral NA. Cantú: 750 XECSI Éxtasis Digital + FM 89.5, 5,000 250. (There is another Éxtasis Digital on 750 in Acapulco.) (GH-OK)
- 750† **MÉXICO**, XEOH, Ciudad Camargo, Chih. 1205 9/5, after NA, Chihuahua anthem, no ID but into CV of some official from the steel industry, Horacio Campaña Acosta, must be this guy originally from Sinaloa, matching CV items: <http://sinaloensesejemplares.com/horacio-campa%C3%BAa-acosta/>. Then, president Calderón gobierno federal PISA also mentioning Secretaría de Educación Pública. Relying on Cantú. Station must be 750 XEOH + FM 96.1 Cd. Camargo, Chih. 1,000 750. Altho I see he has now expanded his cross-border listings to include 5 US K-call stations in El Paso del Norte, under Ciudad Juárez, including the one on 750, KAMA, with Univisión América. I assume KAMA has not "gone Mexican" to the extent of playing their NA and state anthem; but you never know. Surely there's no law against a US-licensed station doing so, altho there probably is a law prohibiting Mexicans from playing the Star Spangled Banner or Deep in the Heart of Texas. (GH-OK)
- 760 **MÉXICO**, XECSI, Culiacán, Sin, Exstasis Digital. 1202 9/6. Full ID for XECSI, also mentioned an FM, and defined the format as featuring música en inglés. Then played choral NA in Spanish. Cantú: 750 XECSI + FM 89.5. 5,000 250. (GH-OK)
- 760 **MÉXICO?** 8/28. Full ID in Spanish, but too much QRM to get a clue, then plays choral Mexican NA. There are two Sonorans and a Chihuahuan in the UT-6 zone. (GH-OK)
- + 0534 9/3, "la música que te gusta," 11:34 TC. So it has to be one of these two in the UT-6 zone, per Cantú: 760 XEES Antena + FM 102.5 Chihuahua, Chih. 10,000 1,000, 760 XEEB La Preciosa + FM 98.5 Cd. Obregón, Son. 5,000 1,000. Since Antena 760 is a newstalk format, one might lean toward the other; except XEES program schedule <http://www.antena760.com/programacion.php> shows they play music overnight and after 'La Hora Nacional.' (GH-OK)
- 770 **MÉXICO**, XEREV, Los Mochis, Sin, Los 40 Principales. 1201 8/28. 'Gloria' song with SS lyrics from WSW; 1206 ID mentioning "104.3, Los 40 Principales" and into rock with EE lyrics. Thus per Cantú it is again: 770 XEREV + FM 104.3 5,000 100 and again I can't believe this good signal dominating the frequency on sunrise skip can be on night power, tho the Sinaloans pretend it is 6 am by the local advanced clock. (GH-OK)
- + 1204 9/6. After NA, 2 or 3 funny voices, 1205 mentions "Cadena 40 Principales". (GH-OK)
- 780 **MÉXICO?** 0504 9/4, state anthem, but which? underneath WBBM opening 'When R Was' and the open carrier from KSPI Stillwater OK. Assuming played at local midnite, all 8 Mexicans on 780 are in the UT-5 zone. (GH-OK)
- 790 **MÉXICO**, XENT, La Paz, BCS, R Fórmula. 1207 8/28 amid QRM, SS talk mentioning "Estados Unidos" (in a way the Mexicans would, not ourselves), 1208 choral Mexican NA starts rather late,



- finished already at 1210, mentions R Fórmula. Cantú shows: 790 XENT + FM 97.5 La Paz, BCS, 10,000 750. There is another R. Fórmula on 790, but only 250 watts from Guadalajara. Sunrise there is 1236, and in La Paz 1302 UT, but this loops WSW, and I'm quite sure it's XENT. Besides, Guadalajara would be antehoming around 1100 UT. (GH-OK)
- + 1206 8/31. Choral NA, 1207 sign-on by XENT, Grupo Fórmula in La Paz BCS, also mentions 25 kW on FM 97.5. More definite than my Aug 28 log; still QRM from news station in EE, ad for Springdale Ford, ie KURM Rogers, Arkansas again. (GH-OK)
- + 1216 9/4, R Fórmula ID making SAH with US station, presumably XENT again from La Paz BCS, rather than Guadalajara at this hour. I got a late start on SRS today as the bottom of the band had already outfaded; T-storm crashes occasionally on the lower frequencies too from just across the border in Kansas. (GH-OK)
- 830 **MÉXICO?** 1121 8/13. ID as "100.9, la nueva estrella de R Zócalo," several PSAs and ads, one mentioning Colonia Roma, so along with Zócalo I naturally think it's the DF station, but then at 1123 mentions Saltillo with 100.9 promo, and 6:24 TC. Consult Cantú: Nothing on 830 in Saltillo, Coahuila; but there is La Norteña XEIK in Piedras Negras. And there is a 100.9 in Saltillo listed as XHSA, La Reina. Grupo Zócalo is not in the DF at all; we find out all about this by googling to this story from last October: <http://noticiasdeRdelmundo.blogspot.com/2011/10/mexico-otorgan-2-nuevas-fm-nucleo-r.html>. Says they got two new FM frequencies for Piedras Negras, 96.7 and 100.9, XHVM and XHIK, to be on the air in six months, in keeping with the "migration" from AM to FM. So I am getting XEIK, not turned off yet, simulcasting XHIK 100.9. Neither of the new FMs is listed yet in Cantú's Coahuila page under Piedras Negras: <http://www.mexicoRtv.com/coahuila/index.htm>. (GH-OK)
- 870 **MÉXICO?** XETAR, Guachochi, Chih, La Voz de la Sierra Tarahumara. 1201 8/31. Choral NA, 1202, sign-on "desde el corazón de la cultura indígena", alternating SS and local language(s), with indigenous music, but XETAR calls pronounced in SS only. Same lite SAH circa 5 Hz as heard 48 hours earlier when KLSQ Nevada was dominant. Looking forward to better reception of this interesting daytime station, especially its full sign-on. (GH-OK)
- + 1217 9/4. IFE PSA, XETAR ID barely audible, very poor and about to fade out. (GH-OK)
- 900 **MÉXICO?** 1208 9/3. TC for "6 y 8 en 106(?)," so which 900 station in the UT-6 zone has an FM in the 106s? Cantú shows the only one in MDT/CST is: 900 XEDT Hits FM + FM 98.3 Cd. Cuauhtémoc, Chih. 5,000 1,500. So that trumps the FM connection presumably misheard: "Punto tres" instead of "ciento seis." (GH-OK)
- 980 **MÉXICO.** XEFQ, Cananea, Son, La Voz de la Ciudad del Cobre. 1203 8/24. News and weather originating from the DF, loops more west than south, and suspect it's the IMER station I have heard before, per Cantú: 980 XEFQ, 2,500 500. (GH-OK)
- + 1202 9/1. Live announcer from La Voz de la Ciudad del Cobre (Copper City), greeting a new day and a new month, informal slogan "canal 98", mentions IMER, 5:03 am, 21 grados, all over music bed. (GH-OK)
- 990 **MÉXICO.** XECL, Mexicali, BC, La Rocola. LSR Enid at 1157. 1202 8/24 tune-in, dominant signal from XECL Mexicali giving full ID, Rocola. Cantú shows higher nite power! 990 XECL, 1,400 3,000 I was also getting Mexicali on TV last night, coincidentally? (GH-OK)
- 1130 **MÉXICO?** 1201 8/24. I can hear a weak Mexican NA under LA or KS station. Presumably at 6 am local, so in the MDT/CST zone, not CDT. That means BCS, Sinaloa, Nayarit or Chihuahua. That means one or the other of: 1130 XELUP R Lupita Tepic, Nay. 1,000 D 1130 XEMOS W R + FM 94.1 Los Mochis, Sin. 1,000 250 per [http://www.mexicoRtv.com/frec\\_am\\_1100-1390.htm](http://www.mexicoRtv.com/frec_am_1100-1390.htm). Nayarit is rare here, and Sinaloa common, FWIW. (GH-OK)
- 1140 **MÉXICO.** XEMR, Monterrey, NL. On new religious format 0559 8/2, now regular. Full SS ident 0606 over KYDS [Las Vegas NV] as "XEMR... watts de potencia... R Esperanza" (Bryan Clark at Mangawhai (Northland), New Zealand with AOR7030+, EWES to North, Central & South America, 100m BOG to NE and Alpha Delta Sloper antennas, Aug NZ DX Times via DXLD.) (GH-OK)
- + 0500 8/9. I suspend SW monitoring to try to catch a definite ID from XEMR. Initially good dominant signal belying the "nothing to the north" pattern, music which stops at 0500 with no ID, right into Mexican NA, choral multiverse lasting until 0505; finally, when it has faded a bit, very quick and hard to copy ID by YL, with self-imposed QRMusic, but includes XEMR, 1140-AM, 50 kilovatts, street address (apparently a mandatory part of legal IDs in Mexico), and right back to music. Did not hear "R Esperanza" mentioned. (GH-OK)
- + 0506 8/28. After NA, too-quick full ID from XEMR, just caught "R Esperanza, emisora manantial, del grupo...", right into gospel rock praise music. Continues to dominate frequency even tho pattern shows all signal goes south. (GH-OK)
- 1480 **MÉXICO?** 0507 8/31. Choral Mexican NA under talk from presumed KQAM Wichita. 0508 segué to soprano with a state anthem, I've heard before but can't remember which one. By announcement at 0510, too much QRM to copy. There are four possibilities in the CDT zone. (GH-OK)
- 1560 **MÉXICO.** XEJPV, Ciudad Juárez, Chih. 0530 8/9. ID "en R Viva," timecheck for 11:30, into a song about salvación. Barely atop the pileup of signals here, loops rather E/W and wonder if a US station? No, Googling leads right to XEJPV, which Cantú lists as a 1 kW daytimer, but it's almost midnight! 1560 XEJPV, 1,000 D IRCA Mexican Log of 2011 however has it as 10 kW day, maybe 1 kW nite; WRTH 2012 shows it as 1 kW fulltime. (GH-OK)
- 1700 **MÉXICO.** XEPE, Tecate, BN. 0110 9/15. Live p-b-p of San Diego area high school football. High up on the S-Meter and dominating at local sunset. (Barton-AZ)
