WKNR CLEVELAND OHIO

Fined four thousand dollars for willfully and repeatedly violating Section 73.1216 of the Commission's rules by broadcasting information about a contest without fully and accurately disclosing all of its material terms. Enforcement Bureau received a complaint alleging that, from approximately November 2007 until September 2009, the Station conducted a "bogus" contest called "Who Said That?" (Contest) during the "Really Big Show," which, during the time period at issue, aired weekdays from 10:00 a.m. to noon. In particular, the complainant alleged that the Station "dropped talking about prizes" during the course of the Contest. On June 19, 2009 and August 26, 2009, the Bureau sent letters of inquiry to the Licensee regarding the contests. In response to those LOIs, Good Karma admitted that on a regular basis during early 2007 through the summer of 2008, and then sporadically thereafter until September 4, 2009, the Station aired a "bit," or program feature, called "Who Said That?" during "The Really Big Show with Tony Rizzo." Good Karma stated that, during broadcasts of the Contest, the Station aired a voice recording of an unnamed individual in the sports world and listeners called in or sent an e-mail to the Station to try to correctly identify the speaker. The Station would award prizes to listeners who correctly identified the speaker. Once a listener called in and successfully identified the speaker, the Station would select a new audio clip for listeners to identify and the Contest continued with the new clip. This practice continued regularly until the Station aired the last clip in the fall of 2007. Good Karma noted that no one correctly identified the speaker of the clip for more than twenty months. The Licensee explained that from the fall of 2007 until the summer of 2008, the Station aired a prize announcement during each weekday, two-hour program and notified listeners that additional prizes would be added each week. The Licensee admitted, however, that the Station did not announce the entire list of accumulated prizes, and was instead "identify[ing] the new prize and emphasiz[ing] material prizes in the package." The Licensee admitted that for over a year during the course of the Contest (from the summer of 2008 until September 4, 2009), the Station stopped announcing prizes, unless a listener called in and tried

to guess the identity of the voice in the last clip. According to Good Karma, by September 2009, some originally-identified prizes were no longer available. Although the Station did not announce any change in the prizes, Good Karma claimed that if a listener had correctly identified the speaker in the last clip, the Station would have offered a similar package of prizes to what was originally announced. In view of the record evidence, the NAL proposed a forfeiture in the amount of four thousand dollars against Good Karma.

So it's: XEBX 5,000 500 per Cantú, not the other Coahuilan: XESAC Milenio R + FM 99.3 Saltillo, Coah. 1,000 900 altho link to XEBX website http://www.grdradio.com.mx/laprimera.html now goes to a squatting site, so maybe there has been a change. (GH-OK)
- 620 MÉXICO, XEBU, Chihuahua, Chih, La Norteñita. 0525 9/24, rhyming slogan "ahorita la Norteñita, B-U, 91.7 FM y 620 AM." Cantú: XEBU + FM 91.7 5,000 1,000. (GH-OK)
- MÉXICO, XEHHI, Hidalgo del Parral, Chih, Los 40 Principales. 1203 9/26, partial ID mentioning Principales and FM 99.something, which fits only for this in Cantú: XEHHI + FM 99.3 10,000 1,000. (GH-OK)
- MÉXICÓ, XEFZ, Monterrey, NL, ABC R. 1128 9/20, a guy speaking slowly and deliberately unlike most SS, apparently a local political commentator, mentions that ex-president "Gustavo Díaz Ordaz vino a Nuevo León", ie came to NL, implying that he is located there. Still going past 1131, 1138 as QRM is growin. On that flimsy evidence I make it tentatively per Cantú: XEFZ 10,000 1,000. (GH-OK)
- 720 MÉXICO, XEJCC, Cd Juárez, Chih, Extremo 7-20. 1209 9/26, mention R Centro 10-30, but then "7-20 Extremo", and song, per Cantú: XEJCC 1,000 1,0000 [sic]. Also CCI from another SS further east, probably XEDE if not KSAH. All these logs marred by lightning crashes from storms further east in OK. (GH-OK)
- 730 MÉXICO, XÈHB, Hidalgo del Parral, Chih, Ke buena. 1147 9/21, automated TC for 5:47, full ID/promo for La Ke Buena, 107.1 FM y 730 AM, Radiorama Parral, with street address, another TC for 5:48, more K.B. promotion by a child's voice. The former R Viva Villa, as now updated in Cantú: + FM 107.1 50,000 1,000. (GH-OK)
- 730 MÉXICO, XEX, México, DF. 0508 9/23, sports talk in SS looping SSW, mentioning el torneo, fútbol mexicano. Instead of usual XEHB heard on this frequency, it's XEX in its latest format, deportes, as TDW, standing for Televisa Deportes W why not TDX? Evidently the prime XEW brand overrides it. Despite all the other Mexicans and Americans allowed on 730 now at night, this one is still allegedly 100 kW non-directional day and night {but it really doesn't dominate.} (GH-OK)
- 750 MÉXICÓ, XECSI, Culiacán, Sin, Éxtasis Digital. 0559 9/25, Mexican NA, 0601 on to a state anthem, 0603 no ID but a patriotic Mexican PSA, then 0604 ID as Éxtasis Digital, 89.5 FM y 750 AM; loops NE/SW. So of two ED's on 750, it's not XEKOK in Acapulco whose FM is on 107.5, but per Cantú: XE/CSI + FM 89.5 5,000 250. (GH-OK)
- MÉXICO, XEES, Chihuahua, Chih, Antena. 0558 9/21, choral NA loops NE/SW and cannot null out KCCV ID from Kansas City. Based on direction and likelihood that this would be played at local midnight = UT -6 zone, can only be: XEES + FM 102.5 10,000 1,000, Per Cantú. FYI, I also consult the IRCA Mexican Log and the WRTH 2012 but only Cantú is online, easy to copy and presumably or at least possibly updatable. (GH-OK)
- MÉXICO, XEWGŘ, Monclova, Coah, Exa FM. 0504 9/25, a state anthem is playing, SAH with WBBM mostly nulled; seems to be N-S but too much QRM; 0505 timecheck as 12:05 and full ID, but all I could copy for sure was power of 10,000 vatios. In Cantú that fits for: XEWGR + FM 101.1 10,000 250. And who wants to admit their puny night power even at midnight? And the only other 10 kW on his list is a daytimer in Oaxaca, much further and less likely. (GH-OK)
- 800 MÉXICO, XEROK, Ciudad Juarez, R Cañón. 1207 9/27, no problem surpassing KQCV OKC when nulled, "XEROK, R Cañón, la estación más potente del norte de México, 50,000 watts", then opening newscast called "Calibre 800", over and over, "el mejor noticiero de la radio". Not sure about that name, maybe contraction of "canal libre"? which this hardly is, any more. As for the name "Cañón", not in the sense of canyon, a deep depression in the landscape, but in the sense of blasting in like a cannon. Surely there are some other 50 kW stations in northern Mexico; back when it was 150 kW the claim would have been true, unless XERF was then 250 kW. (GH-OK)
- MÉXICO, XEIK, Piedras Negras, Coah, La Norteñita. 1202 9/21, mentioning several AM and FM frequencies, including Piedras Negras, 92.9, Monclova, and a call-letter website which I won't quote as copied since it doesn't work. It's the Coahuila cluster as discussed in a previous log, this one: XEIK 5.000 D. (GH-OK)
- MÉXICO. 0600 9/25, NÁ is playing. Based solely on the likely presumption that it's local midnight, ie UT-6 zone, of the 14 or 15 stations on 860 in Cantú it's one or the other of these two: XEZOL 860 Noticias Cd Juárez, Chih. 1,000 500 or XENW Máxima + FM 103.3 Culiacán, Sin. 1,000 250. (GHOK)
- MÉXICO, XETC, Torreón, Coah, Kiuu. 1205 9/27, crime news referring to Torreón and sister city Gómez Palacio, ergo per Cantú: XETC + FM 91.1 10,000 1,000. I am still curious where that strange non-SS name Kiuu comes from (and which I have yet to hear mentioned on the air). Google translate detects it as a Filipino word but can't translate it from that. Google itself finds that Kiuu is also a place in Kenya; there is a Facebook.com/Kiuumexico which has just celebrated its first birthday. It has something to do with K-pop as in South KK music. Related? But I don't find any mention of XETC there. Here's website of the station along with FM 91.1:

 http://www.kiuu.gremradio.com.mx/. Logo of a circle with a tail implies it is merely a way of misspelling the letter Q in EE so it will be pronounced in SS as if it were EE. Could be it is also masquerading as a US station with an unofficial K-call (like some Canadians do), so is there a real

KIUU in the USA? Not on AM or FM, says FCC. (GH-OK)

- MÉXICO, XEDT, Cd Cuauhtémoc, Chih, Hits FM. 1218 9/27, SEP and IFE PSAs, "lo mejor de la música country, Hits -" (lightning crash), and then a C&W song in EE; WSW. So it's one of my regulars, as in Cantú: XEDT + FM 98.3 5,000 1,500. (GH-OK)
- MĚXICO, XEFQ, Cananea, Son, La Voz de la Ciudad del Cobre. 1228 9/26, IMER promo mentioning FM y AM, which is all we need to easily ID once again XEFQ, 2500/500 watts on sunrise skip (LSR Enid = 1223 today.) (GH-OK)
- MÉXICO, XECF, Los Mochis, Sin, La Mexicana. 1211 9/24, news about Mexico, TC for 6:11, promo, mentions Angostura in news; loops WSW. Per Cantú the only possibility in UT-6 zone is: XECF + 93.3 FM 10,000 500. Overcoming the CCI and the 2ACI from local KCRC 1390 is an achievement, with only 500 watts? Maybe it's officially daytime there, tho not really. And there is a city called Angostura in Sinaloa, tho I am sure there are others. Maybe means "narrow place." (GH-OK)
- UnID. 1204 9/24, romantic music in SS, "la música continúa sin comerciales, en María(??)". Not at all sure of that name, probably wrong. Seems to be from east-west, but I also need to null local KFXY 1640 which is SSE, so that may be skewed. Could be KSVE El Paso TX, NRC AM Log listed with romántica format; not the other US SS station KBJD Denver which is religious. Could DXer Vance in El Paso confirm activity status of KSVE? However, it's hard to imagine such stations announcing proudly as non-commercial. New XEARZ in Mexico City has been doing just that, per reports. As in non-profit, per Cantú: "XEARZ Zer R 5,000 watts. Permisionada (sin fines de lucro) pero parte de Grupo Zer." (GH-OK)

MICRONESIA: For over three years, Chuuk State's V6AK Radio Broadcast Station (listed on 1593 khz. bp) has been ineffective in keeping to its 18 hours of daily broadcast tradition as a result of problematic electrical system at its facilities.

Mr. Angelino Rosokow, Chief of the Division of Public Affairs that regulates the radio station, explained that the problem stems from the power line that hooks the station to the "island power" as a result of erratic power distribution to the expanding residential area where a few government offices are also placed. Yet, as the State Government faced an acute financial crisis that paralleled the period the radio station broke down, the much needed repair had to be delayed indefinitely.

According to Mr. Rosokow, the radio station has resorted to operating for only four hours a day the past few years and switched from using "the island power" to using a "back up power generator" to avoid a complete shut-down and further damage to the station's broadcast system.

Many in Chuuk have also said that using a generator to run the station is simply unsustainable and that the station has had times when it could not operate due to unavailability of fuel provision or spare parts for the generator.

However, Mr. Rosokow was keen on pointing out that the situation is going to be resolved in the very near future as Chuuk State has been granted funds from its Infrastructure Maintenance Fund (IMF) portion of Compact grants to procure power regulator equipments and needed accessories for the radio transmitter and to secure a professional contractor to assist V6AK Station in fixing the problems. This restoration project.

which has already started, would enable the station to reconnect to the island power after corrective measures are fully in place, affording the station a steady power source in the long run and with preventive capacity to compensate against electrical fluctuations.

Mr. Eliseus Akapito. Chief of the Office of Planning, said that the V6AK repair project is one of three current "maintenance" projects for Chuuk State with funds from the State's share of the IMF. The other two projects are the Mwaan Elementary School on Weno Island and the Southern Namoneas High School on Fefen Island. Other school maintenance projects from the same funding source are in the pipeline according to Mr. Akapito.

Chuuk State has contracted the Maui based T&T Towers Company for the V6AK restoration project according to the Office of Planning. (Yap State Government website, 26 March 2012,
