The IRCA MEXICAN LOG lists all AM stations in Mexico by frequency, including call letters, state, city, day/night power, slogans, schedule in UTC/GMT, formats, networks and notes. The call letter index gives call, frequency, city and state. The city index (listed by state, then city) includes frequency, call and day/night power. The transmitter site index (listed by state, then city) tabulates the latitude and longitude of transmitter sites. This is an indispensable reference for anyone who hears Mexican radio stations. Size is 8 1/2" x 11".

If the US Postal Service (USPS) gets its way, it will no longer sell International Reply Coupons (IRCs) after January 27, 2013. According to the October 23 edition of the Federal Register, there is not sufficient demand for the USPS to continue offering IRCs to customers; however, per the Universal Postal Union (UPU) regulations, the USPS must continue to exchange and redeem IRCs that have been purchased in foreign countries and presented at USPS facilities. Comments on this proposed change will be accepted through November 23, 2012. IRCs provide foreign addressees with a prepaid means of responding to inquiries, solicitations or other types of communications -- such as QSL cards -- that are initiated by US senders. IRCs are exchangeable for postage stamps by postal administrations in member countries of the UPU. Each IRC is equivalent in value to the destination country's minimum postage price for an unregistered airmail letter. The purchase price is in the US is currently \$2.20 per IRC. (via ARRL Letter, 8 Nov)

On November 10, 2012, the clocks in Libya were to be turned back one hour from 02:00 (2am) to 01:00 (1am). This move changes Libya's time zone from UTC+2 (Eastern European Time) to UTC+1 (Central European Time). During winter the time in Libya will be like those neighbour countries west and south of it, such as Tunisia, Algeria, Niger and Chad. (Timeanddate.com via Alan Roe, HCDX)

NETHERLANDS: 1557 VahonFM, Hindustani Radio from The Hague went on the air on October 6, 2012. They are announcing a 24-hours service. SOUTH AFRICA: New Afrikaans language station on 729 from Cape Town: 729 am "Radiokansel" http://www.radiokansel.co.za/ At the moment playing music only. Not // to 657. Signal strength about the same as 567 Cape Talk (John Plimmer, mwdx 11 Nov)

SWITZERLAND: Voice of Russia will apparently cancel its use of 558 kHz in Switzerland after less than two years. http://german.ruvr.ru/frequenzen/ shows for this frequency now an end date of 31 Dec 2012, mentioned in on-air announcements as well. These transmissions started on 1 April 2011 after Voice of Russia was the only broadcasting organization interested in mediumwave frequencies in Switzerland at all. They originate with a power of 200 kW from the Cima di Dentro facility, abandoned by SRG in 2008. http://www.giangrandi.ch/electronics/broadcast/ceneri.html Note how the equipment is installed in an underground shelter here as well, like it was the case at Sarnen and Lenk, too. Wonder if it is still the transmitter inaugurated in 1979, guess it is indeed. Note also the aux antenna, which I already saw confused for a dipole for 1566 kHz, which it not is. UNITED KINGDOM: The BBC's hopes of saving money by switching off local radio broadcasts on AM came unstuck in Liverpool when 600 listeners complained about the loss of their medium-wave service.

BBC Radio Merseyside was one of four local stations in England that shut down their AM service to test the response from the listening public. The AM service was replaced for five weeks with a pre-recorded message telling listeners to retune to FM, digital audio broadcasting (DAB) radio or online.

Hundreds of outraged listeners contacted the Liverpool-based station to complain. The closedown in the three other areas – Nottingham, Kent and Hereford & Worcester, was said to be less problematic, however. Such was the scale of the response on Merseyside that some BBC insiders suggested the practicality of a wide-ranging switch-off of local radio on AM was now being rethought.

The BBC wants to end nearly all local radio broadcasts on AM as part of the cost-saving measures outlined in Delivering Quality First.

This pilot scheme was intended to assess the impact of a switch-off of the medium-wave signal, and how many listeners would be unable – or unwilling – to listen to the stations via other means.

The adverse listener response in Liverpool also highlights the scale of the challenge posed by digital radio switchover, which would see all BBC national and large regional stations go digital-only.

Of the BBC's 39 local radio stations in England, 14 are not currently available on DAB radio.

A second trial has now begun at two further BBC local radio stations.

A BBC spokeswoman said: "As part of its final conclusions on Delivering Quality First, the BBC Trust agreed in principle that MW would be switched off across the BBC Radio network, including local radio but excluding Radio 5 Live and the Asian Network, except where listeners depend upon it as an alternative to FM. "Before any decisions are taken, we want to understand what the impact on listeners might be in different areas of England, and are conducting some trials to establish that."

The BBC is already implementing extensive budget cuts across its local radio stations in England as part of DQF, including a country-wide evening show which will be syndicated across all 39 stations.

But wider-ranging cuts were rebuffed by the BBC Trust after protests from listeners and MPs.

The BBC local stations' combined average weekly audience in the third quarter of this year, the latest for which figures are available, was 6.7 million, down from 6.8 million in the previous quarter and 7.2 million in the same period last year.

This statement appears in the UK regulator Ofcom's 'Broadcast Update' for October, published today

Ofcom has varied the Wireless Telegraphy Act issued to Babcock Communications Ltd, which covers a number of different analogue radio frequencies, to remove Babcock's authorisation to use the 648 kHz frequency previously used to broadcast the BBC World Service. The licence was varied by Ofcom because the authority conferred by the licence to use the 648 kHz frequency was for certain purposes only, which have now fallen away.

Subject to international co-ordination, this frequency will now be available for use by community radio licensing in various parts of the UK, in addition to FM and other AM frequencies that are already potentially available for this purpose. However, we note that the characteristics of 648 kHz, being at the lower end of the AM band and therefore requiring relatively large masts and transmitter sites, may make it less suitable for community radio than other AM frequencies.
