LEARNING AND SHARING: 2013 - TWIN CITIES

The National Radio Club and the International Radio Club of America, in conjunction with the Minnesota DX Club and

the **Worldwide TV-FM DX Association**, take great pleasure in announcing their joint "DXer" convention will be held in Minneapolis, August 1st through the 4th, 2013. Your hosts: Mark Durenberger (NRC), Mike Sanburn/Phil Bytheway (IRCA).

Called **LEARNING AND SHARING: 2013**, the conference will combine formal tutorials and technical sessions, gab gatherings, a DXpedition and ideas on how to enhance radio listening. Show-and-tell, new antenna designs and DX stories will be combined with information on receiver improvements and propagation.

The highlight of the convention will be one of its venues: The Museum of Broadcasting. There we'll see first-hand more than a century's worth of communications artifacts, operate a live Spark-Gap transmitter, learn about the history behind our hobby and see how broadcasts were made from the Museum's vintage radio studio.

The combined auction is going to be a big one this year; the Museum and others will be auctioning some nice communications gear.

Optional tours during the three-day Convention include area radio stations and the Mall of America.

The hotel selected for the 2013 Convention is the Holiday Inn Bloomington South Airport Mall in Minneapolis. Reservation and Registration information will be published shortly.

PAN AMERICAN DX

- 640 MÉXICO 0642 12/10 "40 Principales 99.3" and time check for 11:42. Therefore, per Cantú: 640 XEHHI Los 40 Principales + FM 99.3 Hidalgo del Parral, Chih 10,000/1,000. I couldn't help but notice the entry right below it showing another 640 is now 50/25 kW! As yet unheard: 640 XENQ NQ + FM 90.1 Tulancingo, Hgo. 50,000/25,000. Must be a recent upgrade; new WRTH 2013 still lists XENQ at only 10 kW, "La Superestación". Why beef this up instead of just completing the migration to FM only? (GH-OK)
- 780 MÉXICO 0109 12/8 dominant signal is news in Spanish, WBBM completely nulled, and this one peaks slightly west of due south. Ciudad Victoria mentioned several times; 0111 "la premera pausa de la hora" and jingle I could not understand. Pause-announcements include a meeting this week in Toluca about labor law; promo for "La Hora Nacional" Sunday at 10 P.M., "México unido en una sola señal", ie: "every radio station is obliged to carry this weekly government hour", then a minute or more of just instrumental music. 0114, plugging contact methods for the show, phone report from Ciudad Victoria. Obviously, this is from Tamaulipas, where Ciudad Victoria is the state capital, but there are two 780 stations in the state: XEMTS in Tampico, "Formula NotiGape," and XESFT in San Fernando, "La Triple T". Cantú's link shows a link to both group sites, neither of which mentions a station on 780! XESFT is more often heard, but I'm leaning to XEMTS based on the emphasis on news. OTOH, XESFT is slightly further west than XEMTS which is close to due south from here. Low rumbling audio het growing from something else, as the het with WBBM is subaudible. (GH-OK)
- 1030 MÉXICO 0610 12/13 live talk show mentions "en Chihuahua" matter-of-factly, and so likely but not certainly: 1030 XEYC Radio Fórmula, Ciudad Juarez, Chih. 5,000/500 as in Cantú; WSW direction is right. (GH-OK)
- 1040 MÉXICO 0657 12/12 romantic music in Spanish from SW/NE at first dominating WHO, but that soon faded up making 3.5 Hz SAH. With WHO nulled, at 0659 UTC for 12:01, no ID into choral Mexican NA; 0702 some ID but losing out to QRM. Then heard the Mexican NA again, must be from another station in the same zone. 0704 after that, a full ID with H's in the calls. From Cantú, there are only two in the UT -7 zone: 1040 XEHES "Romantica" + FM 94.1 Chihuahua, Chih. 5,000/250 and 1040 XEGYS "La Primera" Guyamas, Son. 5,000/250. (GH-OK)
- 1260 MÉXICO XEL Mexico, DF 0921 12/28 noted with local ads, Adult Contemporary music, "XEL" ID in Spanish. Fair to poor signal in WSDZ null. #10 from Mexico City. (EB-MO)

Gary, congratulations on your retirement. You mentioned in your letter with this report that you are working with kids who weren't born when you started working there. I am working with a kid who is younger than my grandson. A couple of thoughts came to me while typing up Gary's comments. (he doesn't e-mail them but rather mails them so I can keep my typing skills up to par, hi.) One thought is that the broadcasting industry is reflective of the American system in general. That is, various segments are becoming more widely owned and investor owned so that management is more and more aware of the stockholders looking over their shoulder demanding a short-term financial return on their investments. How does it get done? Partly by adding more stores and by wringing out as much expense from the system. Secondly, by offering what your competitors are offering. Ever wonder why almost every drug store now has a drive-thru window?? That's why the radio stations all need IBOC or the same format. Try to explain to the stockholders why you don't have a sports format or a news format in a city when the station which has it has the top-rated station in the market. I do understand why most stations want to be full-time. It's like giving away your audience each night to someone else when you have to sign off at dusk. That thought came to me over the past several days as I put his Forum aside instead of typing it. This one came to me as I was typing it. My background is the trucking industry. The early history of trucking back in the 1920's, 30's and 40's were of men who owned one truck and were hauling freight between a couple of points. Eventually, they added a few more trucks (and a larger area) and had perhaps 20 to 50 of them. As they grew older, their children came into the business as well and took over the companies as the parents retired or died off. The grandchildren, however, were not so interested in the trucking business and went about their own ways. The result was that the companies either were sold off to another company or shut down completely. Yes, new companies came along and started up but not as many as those who left the industry. Newspapers are another industry which went the same way. Both have shrunk to a degree nobody would have imagined only 20 years ago. One of the reasons is that the passions of the individual owners is gone. AM radio is on the edge of this now as

well, I think, if it hasn't already fallen over the edge. The first radio stations were smaller ones and mostly one person operations. Then the local newspapers got into the business but it was still fairly local operations. Yes, bigger stations in the bigger cities but many of the smaller towns had their own stations who thought local -- and that was the key to an industry which was growing. But the second generation and even more the third generation of the original owners have gotten out of the business leaving it to the big chains. As a result, the local aspect of the business is gone and so is the interest of the listeners as well as the loyalty of the listener -- and of the station to the listener. It's no longer my station. It's a station and, because of that, the owners are having to keep switching formats trying to attract more listeners who don't really see a good reason to stay around long. I don't have an answer on how to fix the problem because it's a reflection of society in general. It's Wal-Mart, Target and Kohl's slugging it out, except it's radio instead of general merchandise. Banks seem to doing the opposite with a lot of community banks starting up and surviving. Again, it's that local emphasis. As a side note, I understand that Swing 1270 in Buffalo, NY is changing from big band type format to all sports now because of a corporate decision as opposed to a local decision on it.
